Describe how these funds will be used and how the City and citizens of Tybee Island will benefit.

In our daily lives we pass by structures on our island that once housed generations of military personnel. Fort Screven's Building 102, is one of the few remaining original structures that offered enlisted men a place to gather socially or in prayer. According to history, the building was completed in 1912. Over the years it was known as "The Post Enlisted Men's Club and Gymnasium" and "Tomachichi Hall and Chapel." Building 102 was awarded to Savannah Beach in 1944 when the war department declared it surplus. A deed states that American Legion Post 154 acquired the building from Savannah Beach on May 15, 1946. How fitting that Post 154, after seventy-three years, continues to call Building 102 home. Moreover, Post 154 has maintained the legacy of this building's inherent purpose – a facility for social activities, for fundraisers, a community hall welcoming active and retired military, Tybee residents, and tourists. Our building is a key gathering point for all of Tybee Island and the surrounding communities on many levels of service and events. The future successes of the events in the Post 154 building hinges upon may elements – environmentally and aesthetically. A key element to any facility open to community service and events is its audio video system. The first of the year we were faced with a failed sound system. The current system, which is almost 30 years old, breathed its last output of the spoken word in January at Friday bingo! Compared to today's technology, our system was very antiquated and not worthy to consider reviving. Post 154 is requesting the City of Tybee Island their financial assistance securing a new, 21st century, audio video system to continue providing this veterans organization and the Tybee community a facility with an intelligible audio system and video system of clarity.

Tybee Island's American Legion typically does not ask for financial assistance. This however, is an exception. Since 1946, the Legion has provided their facility at substantially reduced rates in comparison to local venues or, in some cases, has not charged for community events. Our old AV system was limited to the technology of yesterday. Today, audio-video systems are multi media driven and an integral piece in promoting or memorializing events. Perspective users of the hall from outside nonprofit organizations to private "celebrations of life," to City events and functions will have the necessary professional grade AV equipment to support, enhance and express their message. The new equipment will seamlessly integrate and facilitate all current AV technology and expansion for future devices.

With the upgraded AV system it will increase the opportunity for our organization to add more community events for families and adult gatherings – perhaps a movie night or live music events for instance – regardless, all of our Legion family members and our Tybee Island community are dedicated to promoting our veterans and their families. We cannot underscore Tybee's valued support. The investment of such would also be beneficial to the Post's private hall rental. By featuring the multi media AV system, would certainly be a positive point in renting Post 154's hall. Overall, the Post will be included as the newest upscale venue offered

on Tybee Island. Attracting out of town guests to Tybee Island and our facility obviously increases the overall income for the island; local businesses, restaurants, hotels, B&B's resulting in increased tax revenues for our island! We believe this will benefit us all.

What percentage of these funds will be matched by your organization?

Tybee Island American Legion Post 154 recognizes the demands of our building and her aging bones. Over the course of the years our members have collectively organized different fundraisers specifically for the maintenance and operation of the building. From the outside to the interior, our upgrades and improvements have been continuous over the years. The building's projects we have addressed include plumbing, mechanical, drainage issues, and energy saving elements as insulation and windows installed. All improvements come at an expense that we have been proud to carry out in maintaining the historical value of "Building 102" and to continue its legacy for generations to come.

Currently, we have been frugal with our working funds saving for the replacement of our aging HVAC system. This is a large reason we have reached out for your assistance. The proper AV system is just as necessary as any other piece of equipment or fixture in our building to continue our revenue making efforts aiding in veterans causes, their families, and private citizens in the community that may need a helping hand.

As we reach out to you, the City of Tybee Island, we realize the value of your financial assistance for our Legion family and our building. We are extremely grateful for your assistance with the electrical system upgrade that continues to progress. We point out that Post 154 extends our projection of future fundraising efforts through our monthly dinners, raffles, cook off events, etc. As a professional courtesy to all City employees, once the grant is approved, we will offer a reduced hall rental fee of \$250.00. This reduced rate, however, does not include bartenders or cleaning service fees.

Tybee Island American Legion Post 154 thanks you for your consideration in awarding a grant to fund the needed audio video system enabling us to continue providing our veterans and our community a venue that promotes and supports a village – Tybee Island. Thank you.

Dear Commander Walker:

In reply to your recent request, The National Organization of The American Legion was granted its exempt status by the Internal Revenue Service in 1934. In February of 1946, we submitted to the central office of the Internal Revenue Service a complete listing of all Departments and Posts extant in the Legion up to and including December 31, 1945. With our submission we requested a group ruling which would extend exemption from the payment of federal income tax for those Departments and Posts designated in our listing.

Each year since 1946 supplemental listings have been transmitted to the Internal Revenue Service for an over-all group ruling covering those Departments and Posts chartered during the previous year. Group rulings have been issued yearly by the Internal Revenue Service covering those Departments and Posts. Since Tybee Island Post No. 154 was chartered on October 24, 1940, it was included in our original listing. Enclosed is a copy of the original ruling.

Section 101(8) referred to in the exemption letter corresponds to Section 501 (c) (4) of the 1954 Code. The American Legion, its component Departments and Posts, were exempt from the payment of federal income tax under this Section up to and including the year 1972. By virtue of the passage of Public Law 92-418 on August 29, 1972, veterans' organizations were given a separate classification under the Code, Section 501(c)(19). A copy of that ruling is also enclosed.

Also enclosed please find a copy of a letter we received from the Internal Revenue Service dated February 17, 1976, wherein the National Organization, Departments and Posts were instructed to use the number 0925 as their Group Exemption Number (GEN) when filing their Form 990.

In addition, the status of The American Legion and its Departments and Posts may allow acceptance of charitable gifts and bequests. The following might be of assistance to you.

Deductability of Contributions to The American Legion is governed by 26 U.S.C. 170 (c) (3) Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended.

Deductibility for bequests is established by 26 U.S.C. Section 2055 (a) (4).

September 8, 2010 Page #2

Section 170(c)(3) reads as follows:

"Section 170. Charitable, etc., contributions and gifts

- (a) Allowance of deduction
 - (1) General Rule. There shall be allowed as a deduction any charitable contribution (as defined in sub-section (c) payment of which is made within the taxable year. A charitable contribution shall be allowable as a deduction only if verified under regulations prescribed by the Secretary or his delegate.
 - (c) Charitable contribution defined. For purposes of this section the term 'charitable contribution' means a contribution or gift to or for the use of -
 - (3) A post or organization of war veterans, or an auxiliary unit or society of, or trust or foundation for, any such post or organization -
 - (A) organized in the United States or any of its possessions, and
 - (B) no part of the net earnings of which inures to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual."

According to the records at The American Legion National Headquarters, your Post EIN is 58-6068030.

Note 1. Nature of Activities

Fresh Air Home, Inc. was incorporated in the state of Georgia on May 27, 1987. The purpose of the Organization is to improve the health of children, to build character, and to help them grow into better men and women – both physically and morally. Each summer the Organization hosts a summer camp on Tybee Island free of charge for children ages 4-11 from Chatham, Bryan and Effingham Counties.

Major sources of revenue and support include grants, donations and investment income. The main source of the investment income is provided by investments made possible by a generous gift received in 1978 from the estate of Cecil Day.

Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting - The Organization prepares its financial statements on the accrual basis of accounting. Consistent with this basis, revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recognized when incurred.

<u>Basis of Presentation</u> - The Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets; unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

<u>Cash Equivalents</u> - The Organization considers all highly liquid investments with a maturity of three months or less at date of acquisition as "cash equivalents" for financial statement disclosure.

<u>Estimates</u> - The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

<u>Contributions</u> - Contributions received that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions expire in the fiscal year in which the contributions are received. All other donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets.

FRESH AIR HOME, INC. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2016

Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

<u>Donated Materials, Property and Equipment</u> - Non-cash donations and donations of property and equipment are recorded as contributions at their fair market value at the date of the donation.

<u>Donated Services</u> - Donated services are record in the financial statements to the extent that those services create or enhance a nonfinancial asset or meet the following criteria: a) the service requires specialized skills, b) the service is provided by individuals who possess those skills, and c) the services would typically need to be purchased if not donated. Services meeting the criteria for recognition in the current year totaled \$3,925.

<u>Investments</u> - Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between participants at the measurement date. Investment income or loss (including realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments, interest and dividends) is included as a component of unrestricted activity unless the income or loss is restricted by donor or law.

<u>Property and Equipment</u> - Purchased property and equipment are stated at cost; donated assets are valued at their estimated fair value on the date donated. Depreciation is computed on the straight-line method based on cost of the depreciable assets and their related estimated useful lives. Estimated useful lives are as follows:

Income Tax - Fresh Air Home, Inc. is exempt from income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code and has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service not to be a private foundation under Section 509(a) of the Code.

As of December 31, 2016, the tax years that remain subject to examination by taxing authorities begin with 2013. Management believes that all positions taken in those years would be sustained should those years be examined.

<u>Subsequent Events</u> - Management has evaluated subsequent events through March 15, 2017, the date the financial statement were available to be issued. Management was not aware of any subsequent events through this date that would have a material effect on these financial statements.

Note 3. Fair Value Measurements

FASB ASC 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, establishes a three-level fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs used to measure fair value. This hierarchy requires entities to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of inputs used to measure fair value are as follows:

Level 1 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.

Level 2 - Observable inputs other than quoted prices included in Level 1, such as quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable markets.

Level 3 - Unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets and liabilities. This includes certain pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies and similar techniques that use significant unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2016.

Corporate bonds and U.S government securities - valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Mutual funds - valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Organization at year-end.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, the Organization believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other organizations, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the date of reporting.

Continuing our work with DPW, TBA plans to further our goal of making Tybee a little more sensitive to current positions on the management of public land. As a follow-up to the pollinator workshop at MAREX that was attended by TBA & DPW in October 2018, we will share information through an open session discussion about planting lands to enhance habitat for pollinators, as well as a discussion of pollinators, their life cycles and what we can do to benefit them. TBA will provide educational materials at the events and to City Hall for individuals unable to attend. We also request the event be recorded and rebroadcast as a City PSA. 1. Executive Summary

1.1 Commission of Project

The 1858 Cockspur Island Lighthouse, located within Fort Pulaski National Monument, has been subject to various natural and human degradation issues, along with numerous repair campaigns. In 2008, the Lighthouse was listed on the Georgia Trust for Historic Preservation's 2008 Places in Peril due to limited available funding to maintenance, remote location, and natural degradation issues. In 2016, in conjunction the with centennial celebration of the founding of the National Park Service and the 50th anniversary of the passing of the National Historic Preservation Act, Fort Pulaski National Monument applied for and received funding for repairs to the lighthouse under the Centennial Challenge funding program. It was determined by Park Service staff that the most appropriate use of these funds was to update the existing Historic Structures (HSR) Report, last completed in 1994, and to conduct training workshops for Park Service staff within the region. Professor Paul Kapp of the University of Illinois Champaign-Urbana, and Stephen Hartley, PhD candidate at the University of York, were selected to update the existing HSR and conduct the specified training workshops.

During the course of investigation, several issues were discovered within the structure. These include incompatible previous repairs, natural degradation of original and replacement materials, human degradation through visitors use, and overarching concerns about the future of the site due to its location within Lazaretto Creek and the increased pressures facing coastal historic site from global warming and rising sea levels.

The site was found to be in good condition, albeit with areas of concern within the structure. Given the remote location of the site, issues with material storage, lack of utilities on site, and hostile working conditions, a structured restoration plan must be formulated which takes into account the issues facing the site as well as the long term concerns of future viability of the structure from rising sea level threats.

1.2 Timeline of Project

This project was initiated 1 September, 2015. It was begun with site visits by the assessment team, supported by Park Service staff. Throughout the fall, multiple visits were performed on-site, along with desk assessments of previous reports pertaining to the structure accessed through Park Service archives. 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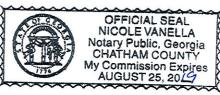

The lighthouse is Tybee's most important and historic building and is representative of Tybee's historic roots. The lighthouse is present on most media produced to advertise the island, and is an important state icon as well, so it is imperative to keep it looking its best. The Tybee Island Historical Society has many purposes under its mission, but maintaining the lighthouse and light station is one of its primary purposes. 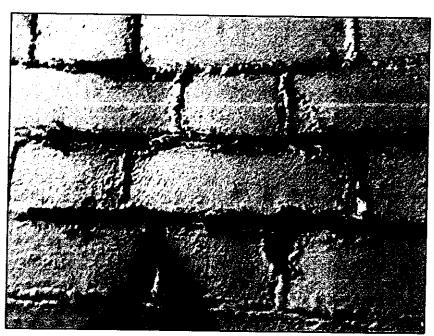
Dear Ms. Jones:

Thank you for all courtesies shown to our Mr. Dick Youtz P.E. and the writer during our recent inspection. We have reviewed the current conditions of the interior of the lighthouse and offer the following observation and recommendations.

Removal of existing coatings:

It is often mentioned that is important for masonry to be able to breathe. What this actually means is that the clay brick is porous in nature and takes in and expels moisture cyclically. If masonry has coating applied to one or both sides this restricts its ability to expel moisture thereby leading to the premature breakdown of the mortar and the clay brick.

In northern climates this is even more detrimental to the fabric as freeze thaw cycle will cause ice jacking which spalls the masonry.



Removal of existing white paint/coatings:

We propose to remove much of the existing white paint wherever present, specifically at the mortar joints. Our goal will not be total removal however. There will be coatings present on the faces of the brick much like in the picture below. Leaving the mortar joints free to expel water vapor freely is the aim.

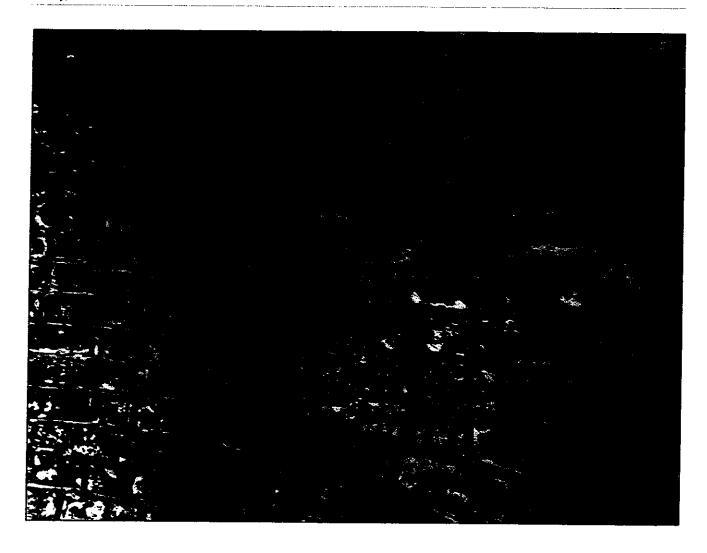
Removal of soft mortar: It was brought to our attention that the soft / beige mortar is constantly eroding and dusting the stair treads.

The mortar may be the specified mix utilized in the 1998 restoration (a historic mix that was 6 parts hydrated lime, 1 part white Portland cement and 12 parts sand). This mix seems to be <u>much</u> softer than the original. Typically preservation architects specify weaker mortars to make sure that the new mortar is sacrificial. This particular mortar may have been weak to start and/or over time it has lost its strength through the migration of moisture.

We see that the darker / harder mortar appears to be original. In most areas the joints are within ¼" of the surface of the brick which is sufficient. We recommend removing most of the softer mortar and preserving the original mortar in place as well as re-pointing joints that are void at a depth of more than 5/8".







The general condition of the interior masonry liner is in need of partial re-pointing. Three separate mortar conditions are present in the photo above:

- The Soft white/yellow mortar is possibly from the 1998 restoration. (to be removed as it is falling out
 on its own and creates labor intensive cleaning work)
- The Dark / harder mortar is potentially the original mortar. (to be preserved)
- There are joints void of mortar (to be re-pointed to match original mortar in color, texture and strength)
- The Cracks (to be infilled with matching mortar)





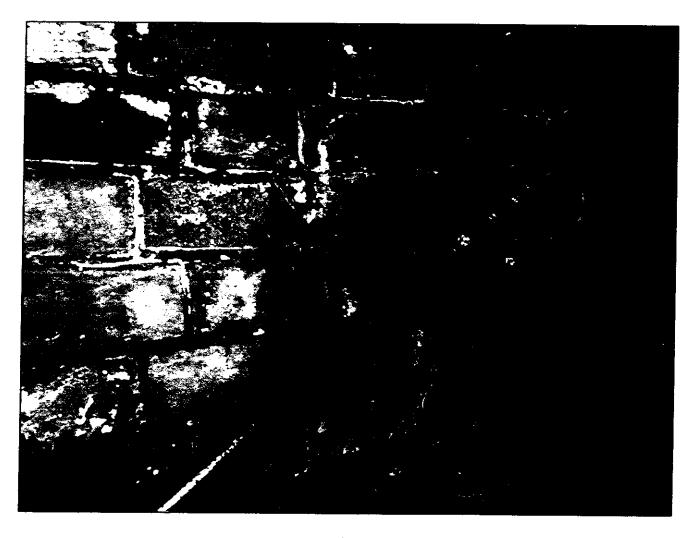
Eroded mortar joints shown above are in need of re-pointing with historically appropriate mortar. We propose the use of GSA approved *historic pointing mortar* which consists of 1 part Portland cement, 3 parts hydrated lime and 6-9 parts sand. Samples will be made and tested for appropriate color and composition prior to application. The goal will be to repoint any joints greater than a depth of 5/8" deep. Our aim is preservation first, not complete restoration.



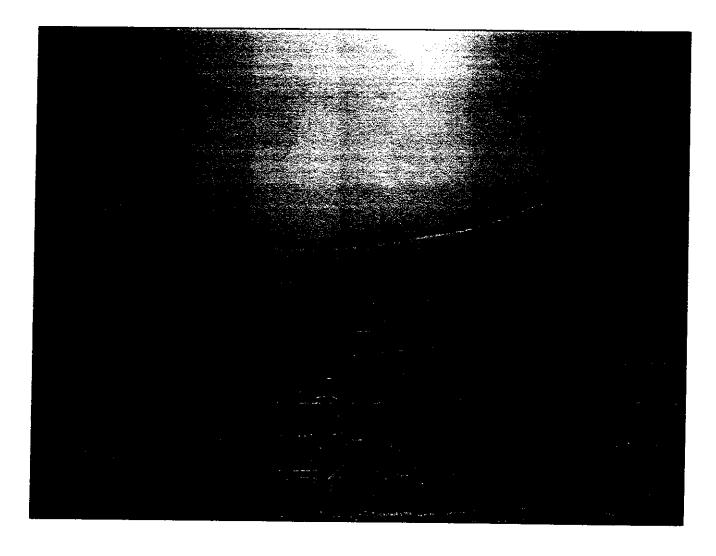
Damaged masonry:

Rust staining and iron loss through exfoliation:

Besides the natural deterioration of mortar in the brick liner there are areas of particular concern that need attention. Shown in the photo below is the condition commonly known as *rust jacking*. Moisture is ever-present in the air and more specifically within the wall at the iron anchorage plate. This moisture initiates corrosion of the embedded cast iron. When iron corrodes it expands and exfoliates causing displacement of the surrounding fabric; in this case the clay brick and mortar. Lighthouses being constructed in coastal environments rich with chlorides present in the air are at an even greater disadvantage to withstand this constant chemical reaction.







Once rust jacking commences initiating pressure, spalling of brick and stone is common in historic masonry / iron structures. In the photo above spalled brick at the corbel landing support is due to this.

Maintaining a proper coating on the iron can slow this process but not eliminate the problem. We propose to remove and replace the spalled units of brick at the corbel and prep the underside of the cast iron to receive a coating of moisture cure urethane. (We will aim to locate matching brick units, perhaps the museum can assistance in locating historically appropriate local brick).

Tybee Island Marine Science Center: Program Overview

Our mission is to cultivate responsible stewardship of coastal Georgia's natural resources through education, conservation, and research. We offer year-round programming for island visitors, school and scout groups—on the beach, in the marsh, on the water, in the classroom, and the Coastal Georgia Gallery.

1. Island Visitor Programs:

- Coastal Georgia Gallery The gallery is open daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. to the general public. Throughout the day, educators are stationed in the gallery to interpret exhibits and deliver cart-programs.
- Our **Walks, Talks & Treks** program offers Beach Walks, Turtle Talks, Whale Tales, Shark Jaws, Marsh Treks, and Jelly Jive scheduled throughout the week during season (the public may request a program outside of a regularly scheduled time-slot and we will comply based on educator availability) and by request off-season.
- Sea Camp: Coastal Kids Ocean Adventure during the summer, we offer eight sessions of week-long children's sea camps based on age groupings.

Note 1. Nature of Activities

Tybee Island Marine Science Foundation, Inc. (a non-profit organization) was incorporated in the state of Georgia on November 20, 1990. The purpose of the Foundation is to promote appreciation, conservation, and understanding of the marine ecosystem of coastal Georgia through programming, services and exhibits. Sources of revenue and support include grants, admissions, program fees and gift shop sales.

Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting - The Foundation prepares its financial statements on the accrual basis of accounting. Consistent with this basis, revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recognized when incurred.

<u>Basis of Presentation</u> - The Foundation is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets; unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

<u>Cash Equivalents</u> - The Foundation considers all highly liquid investments with a maturity of three months or less at date of acquisition as "cash equivalents" for financial statement disclosure.

<u>Estimates</u> - The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

<u>Contributions</u> - Contributions received that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions expire in the fiscal year in which the contributions are received. All other donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets.

<u>Deferred Revenue</u> - Deferred revenue consists of program booking fees received for programs to be provided in the subsequent year.

<u>Inventory</u> – The Foundation's inventory consists of merchandise available for sale in the gift shop located on premises. The inventory is stated at cost. Cost is determined by the first-in, first-out method.

Advertising Costs - Advertising costs are expensed as incurred.

Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

<u>Donated Materials, Property and Equipment</u> - Non-cash donations and donations of property and equipment are recorded as contributions at their fair market value at the date of the donation.

<u>Donated Services</u> – Donated services are record in the financial statements to the extent that those services create or enhance a nonfinancial asset or meet the following criteria: a) the service requires specialized skills, b) the service is provided by individuals who possess those skills, and c) the services would typically need to be purchased if not donated. Services meeting the criteria for recognition in the current year totaled \$0.

<u>Property and Equipment</u> – Purchased property and equipment are stated at cost; donated assets are valued at their estimated fair value on the date donated. Acquisitions of property and equipment in excess of \$500 are capitalized at cost. Depreciation is computed on the straight-line method based on cost of the depreciable assets and their related estimated useful lives.

<u>Website Development Costs</u> - Website development costs are stated at cost. Amortization is computed on the straight-line method based on the cost of the assets and their related estimated useful lives.

Income Tax - Tybee Island Marine Science Foundation, Inc. is exempt from income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code and has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service not to be a private foundation under Section 509(a) of the Code.

As of December 31, 2017, the tax years that remain subject to examination by taxing authorities begin with 2014. Management believes that all positions taken in those years would be sustained should those years be examined.

Subsequent Events - Management has evaluated subsequent events through May 29, 2018, the date the financial statement were available to be issued. Management was not aware of any subsequent events through this date that would have a material effect on these financial statements.

Note 3. Concentration of Credit Risk

The Foundation occasionally maintains deposits in excess of federally insured limits. Accounting standards identify these items as a concentration of credit risk requiring disclosure, regardless of the degree of risk. The risk is managed by maintaining all deposits in high quality financial institutions. As of December 31, 2017 the organization's uninsured cash balances totaled \$10,554.

These funds are required to be accounted for in a separate fund and not commingled with other funds.

In a prior year the City of Tybee Island allocated \$600,000 of SPLOST funds to the Foundation to be used to build a new facility. The City is holding the funds and making distributions as qualifying expenditures are made. During the current year \$13,956 was distributed leaving an available balance of \$434,876.

Note 7. Building Lease

The Foundation has a 15 year lease dated October 23, 2003 allowing them to occupy their current building for an annual rental fee consisting of the services provided by the Foundation to the citizens of the City of Tybee Island in the nature of educational and recreational programs.

Note 8. Land Lease

On May 8, 2014 the Foundation entered into a new lease agreement commencing February 27, 2014 and expiring December 31, 2028, with the right to extend the agreement for three additional periods of five years. The base rent is \$10 per year. The lease authorizes the Foundation to construct a new marine science center facility on the property. The City of Tybee Island will hold title to the facility. Upon expiration or early termination of the lease all of the Foundation's rights and interests in the facility with automatically vest in the City.

Note 9. Commitments

On December 17, 2013 the Foundation entered into an agreement with Sottile & Sottile to provide design services for the new facility. The total contract amount is \$244,500. As of December 31, 2017, \$55,449 of the total contract had been completed, leaving an outstanding balance of \$189,051.

On October 3, 2012 the Foundation entered into an agreement with Kern-Coleman & Co., LLC to provide civil engineering services for the new facility. The agreement includes 10 phases. The total contract amount is \$30,900. As of December 31, 2017, \$22,350 of the total contract had been completed. The remaining contract activities of \$8,000 were rolled into the Sottile & Sottile contract, leaving an outstanding balance of \$1,650.

Note 10. Prior Period Adjustment

Beginning net assets have been restated to account for a change in SPLOST expenditures. In 2017, it was determined that work completed on the new facility during 2016 would be paid by the City of Tybee instead of with SPLOST funds. The effect of this adjustment was to decrease property and equipment by \$7,900, and decrease unrestricted net assets by \$7,900.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JUNE 30, 2018

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF SCHOOL AND REPORTING ENTITY

Tybee Island Charter School, Inc. (the "School"), doing business as Tybee Island Maritime Academy, was organized in 2012. The State of Georgia and the Savannah-Chatham County Public School System have approved the School to operate as a public charter school for students in kindergarten through fifth grade living in Chatham County, Georgia.

During the current year, management determined the School would be more accurately reported as a governmental entity, and would therefore follow generally accepted accounting principles promulgated by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB). This change in financial reporting had no effect on beginning net position of the School though the format of the financial statements and disclosures were changed significantly to be in accordance with applicable GASB standards.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF PRESENTATION

The School's basic financial statements are collectively comprised of the government-wide financial statements, fund financial statements and notes to the basic financial statements of Tybee Island Charter School, Inc.

Government-wide Statements

The Statement of Net Position and the Statement of Activities display information about the financial activities of the overall School. Governmental activities generally are financed through intergovernmental revenues and other nonexchange transactions.

The Statement of Activities presents a comparison between direct expenses and program revenues for each function of the School's governmental activities.

- Direct expenses are those that are specifically associated with a program or function and, therefore, are clearly identifiable to a particular function. Indirect expenses (expenses of the School related to the administration and support of the School's programs, such as office and maintenance personnel and accounting) are not allocated to programs.
- Program revenues include (a) charges paid by the recipients of goods or services offered by the
 programs and (b) grants and contributions that are restricted to meeting the operational or capital
 requirements of a particular program. Revenues that are not classified as program revenues are
 presented as general revenues.

In the Statement of Net Position, equity is reported as net position and consists of net investment in capital assets (if any), amounts restricted by outside parties for specific purposes (if any) and unrestricted amounts. The net investment in capital assets (if any) is calculated by taking the capital assets, net of accumulated depreciation, less any related long-term financing arrangements, and adding back any unspent bond or contract proceeds.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

BASIS OF PRESENTATION (CONTINUED)

Fund Financial Statements

The fund financial statements provide information about the School's funds. The emphasis of fund financial statements is on major governmental funds, each displayed in a separate column.

The School reports only one major governmental fund:

The General Fund is the School's primary operating fund. It accounts for all financial resources
of the School.

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING/MEASUREMENT FOCUS

The basis of accounting determines when transactions are reported on the financial statements. The government-wide financial statements are reported using the economic resources measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are recorded when earned and expenses are recorded at the time liabilities are incurred, regardless of when the related cash flows take place. On an accrual basis, revenues are recognized in the fiscal year in which they are earned. Revenue from grants and donations is recognized in the fiscal year in which all eligibility requirements have been satisfied.

The School uses funds to report on its financial position and the results of its operations. Fund accounting is designed to demonstrate legal compliance and to aid financial management by segregating transactions related to certain governmental functions or activities. A fund is a separate accounting entity with a self-balancing set of accounts.

Governmental funds are reported using the current financial resources measurement focus and the modified accrual basis of accounting. Under this method, revenues are recognized when measurable and available. The School considers all revenues reported in the governmental funds to be available if they are collected within 60 days after fiscal year-end. Expenditures are recorded when the related fund liability is incurred, except for principal and interest on general long-term debt, which are recognized as expenditures to the extent they have matured. Capital asset acquisitions are reported as expenditures in governmental funds. Proceeds from general long-term liabilities and acquisitions under capital leases are reported as other financing sources.

The School funds certain programs by a combination of specific cost-reimbursement grants, categorical grants and general revenues. Thus, when program costs are incurred, there is both restricted and unrestricted net position available to finance the program. It is the School's policy to first apply grant resources to such programs, followed by cost-reimbursement grants, then general revenues.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments with original maturities of three months or less from the date of acquisition.

RECEIVABLES

Receivables, which include amounts due from other governments, consist of amounts due from the various entities disclosed from information available. Receivables are recorded when either the asset or revenue recognition criteria has been met. Receivables recorded in the basic financial statements do not include any amounts which would necessitate the need for an allowance for uncollectible receivables.

CAPITAL ASSETS

Capital assets purchased, including capital outlay costs, are recorded as expenditures in the fund financial statements at the time of purchase (including ancillary charges). The cost of normal maintenance and repairs that does not add to the value of assets or materially extend the useful lives of the assets is not capitalized. The School does not capitalize book collections or works of art. Depreciation is used to allocate the actual or estimated historical cost of all capital assets over their estimated useful lives.

The capitalization threshold for all classes of assets is \$1,000. The estimated useful lives of capital assets reported in the government-wide statements are as follows:

FUND EQUITY

Fund equity at the governmental fund financial reporting level is classified as "fund balance." Fund equity for all other reporting is classified as "net position."

Fund Balance – Fund balance is a measurement of available financial resources defined as the difference between total assets/deferred outflows and total liabilities/deferred inflows in each fund.

GASB Statement No. 54 distinguishes fund balance classifications based on the relative strength of the constraints that control the purposes for which specific amounts can be spent. Beginning with the most binding constraints, fund balance amounts will be reported in the following classifications:

Nonspendable – Fund balance reported as "nonspendable" represents amounts not in a spendable form (e.g., inventory) or are legally or contractually required to be maintained intact (e.g., permanent fund principal).

Restricted – Fund balance reported as "restricted" represents amounts that can be spent only on the specific purposes stipulated by external parties, either constitutionally or through enabling legislation (e.g., grants and donations).

Committed – Fund balance reported as "committed" includes amounts that can be used only for the specific purposes determined by a formal action of the Board. Commitments may be changed or lifted only by referring to the formal action that imposed the constraint originally. Actions to constrain resources should occur prior to the end of the School's fiscal year, though the exact amount may be determined subsequently.

Assigned – Fund balance reported as "assigned" represents amounts intended to be used for specific purposes, but not meeting the criteria to be reported as committed or restricted fund balance. The intent is expressed either by the Board or by a designee to whom the Board delegates the authority. If these funds should have a deficit fund balance, those deficits are required to be reported as unassigned fund balance.

Unassigned – Fund balance reported as "unassigned" represents the residual classification of fund balance and includes all spendable amounts not contained within the other classifications. Unassigned amounts are available for any legal purpose.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED) FUND EQUITY (CONTINUED)

Fund Balance (Continued)

The responsibility for designating funds to specific classifications shall be as follows:

Committed Fund Balance – The Governing Board is the School's highest level of decision making authority, and the formal action that is required to be taken to establish, modify or rescind a fund balance commitment is a resolution approved by the Board.

Assigned Fund Balance – The Governing Board has authorized the Principal or his/her designee as officials authorized to assign fund balance to a specific purpose as approved by this fund balance policy.

Spending Policy – When multiple categories of fund balance are available for expenditure (e.g., a project is being funded partly by a grant, funds set aside by the Board and unassigned fund balance), the School will start with the most restricted category and spend those funds first before moving down to the next category with available funds.

NOTE 3. STEWARDSHIP, COMPLIANCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY

The School adopts an annual budget for its General Fund. After the School has tentatively adopted the budget, such budget is advertised at least one time in a local newspaper of general circulation. At the next regular meeting of the Board after advertisement, the budget is revised as necessary and adopted as the final budget.

The following General Fund functions had an excess of actual expenditures over appropriations in the amount shown for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018:

These excesses were funded by higher than anticipated revenues from local sources.

NOTE 4. DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS

COLLATERALIZATION OF DEPOSITS

Official Code of Georgia Annotated (OCGA) Section 45-8-12, provides that there shall not be on deposit at any time in any depository for a time longer than ten days a sum of money which has not been secured by surety bond, by guarantee of insurance or by collateral. The aggregate of the face value of such surety bond and the market value of securities pledged shall be equal to not less than 110% of the public funds being secured after the deduction of the amount of deposit insurance. If a depository elects the pooled method (OCGA 45-8-13.1), the aggregate of the market value of the securities pledged to secure a pool of public funds shall be not less than 110% of the daily pool balance.

Custodial Credit Risk. Custodial credit risk for deposits is the risk that, in the event of the failure of a depository financial institution, the School will not be able to recover deposits or will not be able to recover collateral securities that are in the possession of an outside party. State statutes require all deposits and investments (other than Federal or State government instruments) to be collateralized by depository insurance, obligations of the U.S. government, or bonds of public authorities, counties, or municipalities. As of June 30, 2018, all of the School's cash and cash equivalent accounts were not properly collateralized as required by State statutes.

Acceptable security for deposits consists of any one of or any combination of the following:

- Surety bond signed by a surety company duly qualified and authorized to transact business within the State of Georgia,
- (2) Insurance on accounts provided by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation,
- (3) Bonds, bills, notes, certificates of indebtedness or other direct obligations of the United States or of the State of Georgia,
- (4) Bonds, bills, notes, certificates of indebtedness or other obligations of the counties or municipalities of the State of Georgia,
- (5) Bonds of any public authority created by the laws of the State of Georgia, providing that the statute that created the authority authorized the use of the bonds for this purpose,
- (6) Industrial revenue bonds and bonds of development authorities created by the laws of the State of Georgia, and

(7) Bonds, bills, notes, certificates of indebtedness or other obligations of a subsidiary corporation of the United States government, which are fully guaranteed by the United States government both as to principal and interest or debt obligations issued by the Federal Land Bank, the Federal Home Loan Bank, the Federal Intermediate Credit Bank, the Central Bank for Cooperatives, the Farm Credit Banks, the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Association and the Federal National Mortgage Association.

NOTE 5. RISK MANAGEMENT

The School is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts; theft of, damage to and destruction of assets; errors or omissions; job related illness or injuries to employees; and acts of God.

The School has obtained commercial insurance for risks of loss associated with torts, assets, errors or omissions, job related illness or injuries to employees and acts of God. The School has neither significantly reduced coverage for these risks nor incurred losses (settlements) which exceeded the School's insurance coverage in either of the past three fiscal years.

NOTE 7. LEASE COMMITMENTS

The School provides all program services from leased facilities. The School accounts for leases of the facilities and office equipment as operating leases. Total rental expense amounted to approximately \$101,800 in fiscal year 2018. The office equipment lease is set to expire in March 2019, while the leases for facilities are set to expire in June 2023. Total minimum lease payments under these leases are as follows:

We have audited, in accordance with the auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, the financial statements of the governmental activities and major fund of Tybee Island Charter School, Inc. (the "School"), as of and for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the School's basic financial statements, and have issued our report thereon dated October 26, 2018.

Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered the School's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) to determine the audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the School's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the School's internal control.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. A significant deficiency, is a deficiency or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the School's financial statements are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit and, accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that is required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*. The results of our tests disclosed an instance of noncompliance or other matters that is required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards* and is described as item 2018-001, in the accompanying schedule of findings and responses.

Tybee Island Charter School's Response to the Finding

Tybee Island Charter School's response to the finding identified in our audit is described in the accompanying schedule of findings and responses. The School's response was not subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and, accordingly, we express no opinion on it.

Purpose of this Report

The purpose of this report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control or on compliance. This report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the entity's internal control and compliance. Section II - Financial Statement Findings

2018-001. Undercollateralization of School Deposits

Criteria: The Official Code of Georgia (OCGA) Section 45-8-12 (c) requires all depositories of public funds to pledge securities of not less than 110% of the uninsured deposited public funds.

Condition: For the year ended June 30, 2018, the School's deposits held were not properly collateralized.

Context: The financial institution holding the deposits of the School was not pledging collateral for the School's deposits in the School's tax identification number.

Effect: The School's total deposits in excess of depository insurance were not properly collateralized, allowing for the possibility of loss of assets if the financial institution were to become insolvent.

Cause: See above context.

Recommendation: We recommend the School periodically review a listing of all accounts opened under the School's tax identification number to determine that all are properly coded as public deposits. Additionally, the School should request from the financial institutions holding School deposits, a monthly pledging report to determine that each financial institution has pledged securities of not less than 110% of the uninsured deposited funds as required by Georgia law, in the School's tax identification number.

Views of Responsible Officials and Planned Corrective Action: We concur. This collateralization issue will be resolved for FY 2019. We will begin monitoring the pledging of collateral on a regular basis.

Section III - Federal Award Findings and Questioned Costs

There was not an audit of major federal award programs as of June 30, 2018, due to the total amount of federal funds expended being less than \$750,000.
