



- Both Cell Phone and Landline: 29%



#### Title

Commons Park Plan Update

#### **Background**

Director Maher met with the Fridley Youth Sports Association chair last week. They developed a plan for relocation of fields impacted by the redevelopment of Commons Park, with the following elements:

- 1. One baseball field fully redeveloped on the northern end of Commons Park. This field would have safety and outfield fencing, covered dugouts, bleachers, moveable baselines and pitching mound to allow for use by different age groups ranging from base lines at 60 ft, 75 ft or 90 ft. Cost of lighting to be evaluated.
- 2. A field suitable for softball or baseball practice developed east of the existing football field on the commons park property. No outfield fencing would be included but a home plate backstop and safety fencing along the first and third baselines can be included along with benches for players.
- 3. Modifications to improve Community Park for FYSA baseball and soccer. Softball fields 5 and 6 would be converted to turf to allow for expansion of capacity for soccer fields. One softball field converted to a baseball field with moveable bases and pitching mound.
- 4. Commons Park work would be scheduled in a manner that would allow for use of existing fields until July 4th of 2025.

Engineering staff has prepared concept plans pursuant to the elements identified above. These will be presented for discussion with the City Council.

#### **Financial Impact**

There are costs associated with preserving additional fields not included in the current Master Plan. Staff will endeavor to have this information available to the City Council.

#### **Vision Statement**
