- Showcase new businesses

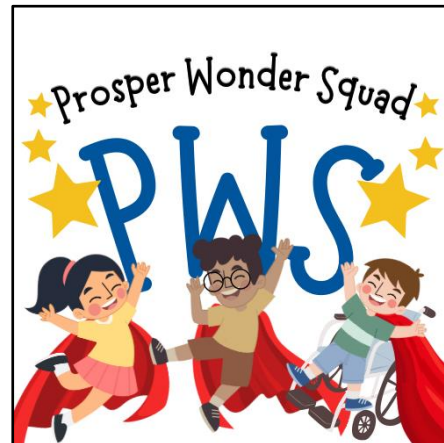
Multicultural Component

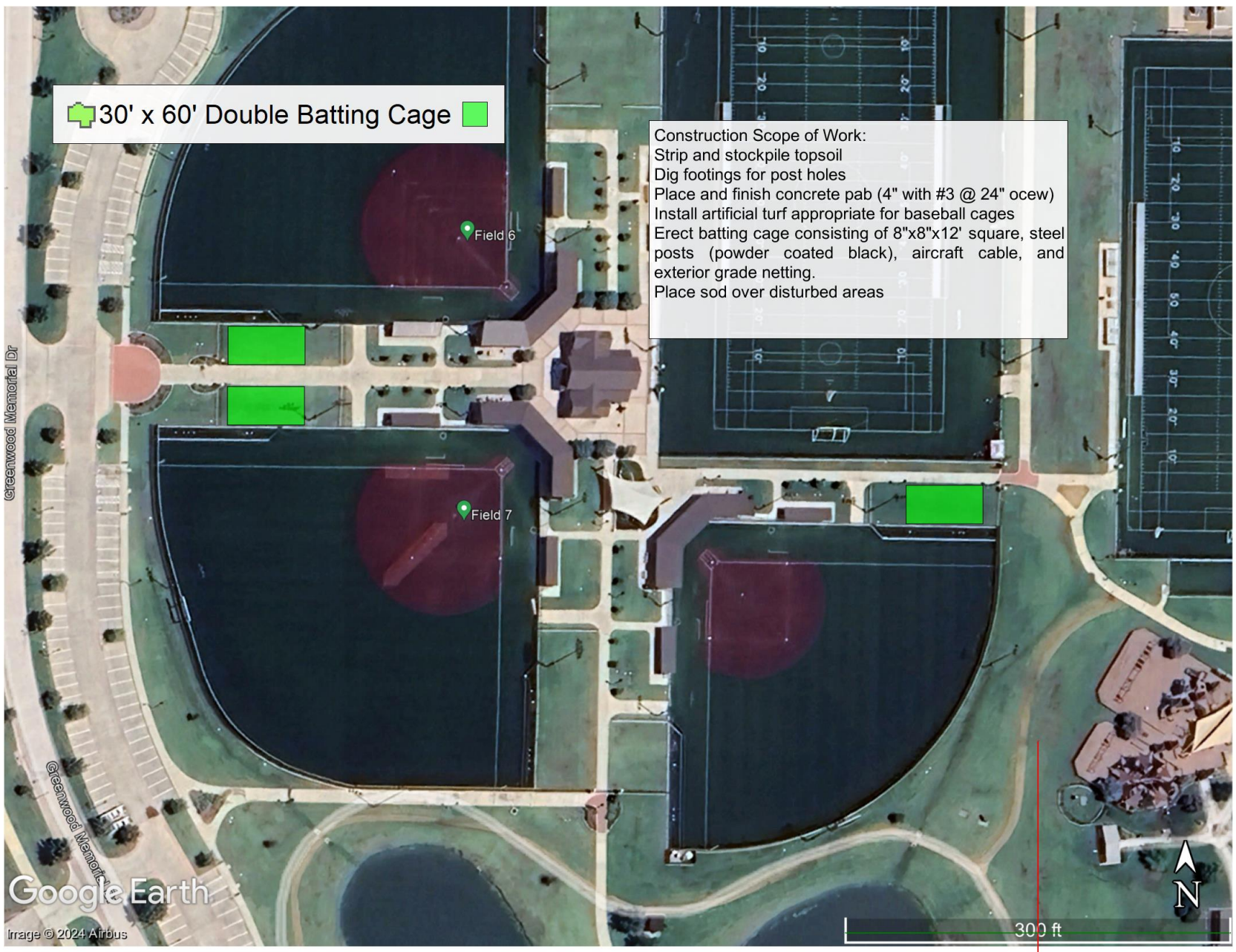
Baseball Facilities Addition to Frontier Park

- Practice Infield and Batting Cages
- Fully funded through PBSA
- Through ILA:
 - Facilities would be Town of Prosper property
 - Town of Prosper would be responsible for maintenance
- Installation during this summer



30' x 60' Double Batting Cage

Construction Scope of Work:
Strip and stockpile topsoil
Dig footings for post holes
Place and finish concrete slab (4" with #3 @ 24" o.c.)
Install artificial turf appropriate for baseball cages
Erect batting cage consisting of 8"x8"x12' square, steel posts (powder coated black), aircraft cable, and exterior grade netting.
Place sod over disturbed areas

Park Development:

Lakewood Park Development

- Fencing installation around the sports courts is underway.
- Trail work continues as weather allows.
- Irrigation system trenching is underway.
- Project completion is anticipated before the end of 2024.

Park Development:

Raymond Community Park

- GMP No. 2 package has been fully executed.
- Grading of fields continues.
- Storm drainpipe and water line installation still underway.
- Excavation for the detention ponds will begin soon, as conditions dry.

PARKS OPERATIONS:

- **Pecan Grove Park** – A powerful storm felled trees and scattered debris all around the park.
- **Hays Park** - Parks Operations visited Hays Park to clean up the trees and debris left by the storm, turning the trees into wood chips.
- **Town Hall** – Newly spread mulch throughout Town Hall flower beds.





PARKS OPERATIONS:

- ❖ Upgrades were completed at Town Hall, with new plants added throughout the flower beds and planters.

Raymond Community Park Update

- GMP #2 approved May 28
- CIP Subcommittee asked staff to identify funding outside of project funds for Well System (\$1.2M)
- Potential to use \$1.9M from 2020 Bond Program
 - Bond funding allocated for future trail construction
 - All current trail projects have identified funding or are being considered for grant funding.
 - Remaining funds could be used with remaining contingency funds to purchase bid alternate items.
 - Will request additional funding for trails in next Bond Program
