#### **MINUTES**

PRESENT Chairwoman Jorja Clemson Council Member Junior Ezeonu Council Member Jacquin Headen

#### **CALL TO ORDER**

Meeting was called to order by Chairwoman Clemson at 3:01p.m.

#### STAFF PRESENTATIONS

Citizens may speak for five minutes on any item on the agenda by completing and submitting a speaker card.

#### 1. 2022 Clean Prairie Annual Report

Cindy Mendez, Public Health and Environmental Quality Director discussed the Clean Prairie Outreach, Fall Sweep, Clean Prairie Recognition, and statistics. Ms. Mendez announced the Clean Prairie Winners (Lockheed Martin and IKEA) and the Friends of the Environment winners (IKEA and Cummins) at the Industrial Awards Banquet. Councilmember Clemson stated her appreciation for the Clean Prairie program and would like council to get invitations to future events. Councilmember Headen asked about IKEA's involvement in Clean Prairie. Patricia Redfearn, Director of Solid Water/Landfill reviewed the assistance received from IKEA to Solid Waste during Covid and educational events for Grand Prairie students.

#### 2. Aquatic Safety Presentation

Duane Strawn, Park, Arts, and Recreation Director and Jeremy Thomas, Supervisor of Programs at the Epic Recreation Center gave an update on Aquatic Safety measures at the facilities. Mr. Thomas presented the industry standards for pool testing, cleaning, and disinfecting protocols. Parks will begin utilizing an app for chemical readings and allows staff to check on them throughout the day. Deputy City Manager Cheryl De Leon thanked the staff for their expertise. Councilmember Headen asked about the UV (ultraviolet) system. Mr. Thomas stated it is part of the main filtration pump line. Most outdoor pools do not use a UV system however, our Splash Factory does have one.

#### 3. 29th Quarterly Judicial Report

Judge Bryan Arnold presented the quarterly report and court docket statistics. Councilmember Headen asked about community service locations. Judge Arnold stated some locations are

Prairie Paws, Mission Arlington, as well as working toward a GED. Councilmember Headen asked if we are directing people to the COPE program through the Police department if there are mental health issues. Judge Arnold stated most of these cases involve county charges and are handled through them.

#### **AGENDA ITEMS**

4. Minutes from March 6, 2023 Public Safety, Health, and Environment Committee meeting

Councilmember Ezeonu motioned to approve; seconded by Councilmember Headen; 3-0

5. Approve Current and Future Opioid Settlements Which are to be Distributed in Accordance with the Texas Term Sheet Adopted by Resolution 5244-2021, Including Agreements with Walmart, Walgreens, CVS, and Allergan, and Authorize the Execution of Documents Relative to the Acceptance of Said Settlements

Megan Mahan, City Attorney and Tiffany Bull, Assistant City Attorney presented the amounts and sources of funds for the Opioid Settlement. The Police could use the funds from the settlement for drug treatment and prevention. This would allow them to hire a Crisis Support position for five to eight years. Monies would also be used to purchase Narcan for the treatment of fentanyl overdoses and community drug disposal.

Councilmember Headen motioned to approve item to be sent to council; seconded by Councilmember Ezeonu; 3-0

6. Annual Contract to Ensolum for asbestos and mold consulting for an amount not to exceed \$100,000 for one year with the option to renew for four (4) additional one-year periods totaling \$500,000 if all extensions are exercised

Cindy Mendez, Public Health and Environmental Quality Directed stated this contract is for evaluating for asbestos and mold. She stated the contract with our current company is ending and was sent out for bid. Councilmember Headen asked if these evaluations are done on a case-by-case basis. Ms. Mendez stated they are done on a case-by-case basis and may not exceed the amount approved.

Councilmember Ezeonu motioned to approve; seconded by Councilmember Headen; 3-0

7. Resolution authorizing the City Manager to apply for a grant from the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS), Tobacco Prevention and Control Branch Tobacco Enforcement Program (TEP), through an Interlocal Agreement with Texas State University up to the amount of \$12,500 for the purpose of compliance-related activities of tobacco retailers. Authorize the City Manager to accept, reject, alter, or terminate the grant, if awarded

Ryan Simpson, Assistant Director of Operations and Support Bureau stated this grant is for a continuation of the tobacco enforcement program.

Councilmember Headen motioned to approve; seconded by Councilmember Ezeonu; 3-0

8. Resolution ratifying a FY 2024 Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) application to the Office of the Governor, Public Safety Office, Criminal Justice Division for the purpose of funding a Crisis Support Specialist position's annual salary and fringe benefits in the amount of \$60,000 and authorizing the City Manager to accept, reject, alter, or terminate the grant, if awarded

Ryan Simpson, Assistant Director of Operations and Support Bureau stated this grant is requested to continue funding the Crisis Support Specialist position.

Councilmember Ezeonu motioned to approve this item; seconded by Councilmember Headen; 3-0

9. A Resolution ratifying a FY 2024 First Responder Mental Health Program grant application to the Office of the Governor, Public Safety Office, Criminal Justice Division for the purpose of providing first responder mental health resources not to exceed \$66,000 and authorizing the City Manager to accept, reject, alter, or terminate the grant, if awarded

Ryan Simpson, Assistant Director of Operations and Support Bureau stated this grant is for the continuation of the mental health program used for counseling and training for Police officers and their families.

Councilmember Ezeonu motioned to approve this item; seconded by Councilmember Headen; 3-0

10. Authorize the Grand Prairie Police Department to Participate in the North Texas Internet Crimes Against Children ("ICAC") Task Force and Authorize the City Manager to Execute an Interlocal Agreement Relative to the Participation with the City of Dallas, Effective October 1, 2022, and any Future Renewal of the Interlocal Agreement Under Substantially Similar Terms

Ryan Simpson, Assistant Director of Operations and Support Bureau stated this is a continuation of a grant with City of Dallas to investigate online child solicitation abuse.

Councilmember Headen motioned to approve this item; seconded by Councilmember Ezeonu; 3-0

11. Ordinance Amending Chapter 5 "Animal Services," by deleting and replacing Section 5-65 – "Prohibited Sale of Animals," Providing a penalty clause and a severability clause and providing an effective date after publication

Lily Yap, Animal Shelter Manager stated this ordinance adjustment is for humane pet store ownership and a requirement for microchipping. Ms. Yap is seeking feedback on having a grandfather clause for this ordinance. If no grandfather clause, some cities have given up to a year to comply with the ordinance. After discussion, the committee would like to reevaluate the grandfather clause in six months to a year.

Councilmember Headen moved to approve the item with the reevaluation provision; seconded by Councilmember Ezeonu; 3-0

12. Resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute an amendment to the existing Memorandum of Understanding / Interlocal Agreement (MOU/ILA) with Dallas County's Office of Information Technology for Law Enforcement data sharing and participation in Urban Counties' Techshare Juvenile program

Ryan Simpson, Assistant Director of Operations and Support Bureau stated this item is for an agreement with Dallas County for data sharing.

Councilmember Ezeonu motioned to approve this item; seconded by Councilmember Headen; 3-0

13. A Resolution ratifying a FY 2024 Victim Assistance Program continuation grant application to the Office of the Governor, Public Safety Office, Criminal Justice Division for the purpose of funding two Victim Assistance Coordinator and one Intern positions' annual salary, fringe benefits, and training, in the amount of \$182,067 and authorizing the City Manager to accept, reject, alter, or terminate the grant, if awarded

Ryan Simpson, Assistant Director of Operations and Support Bureau stated this grant is for the continuation of the Victim Assistance Coordinator position. Councilmember Headen asked is monetary resources are provided. Mr. Simpson stated they are only directing them to resources.

Councilmember Headen motioned to approve this item; seconded by Councilmember Ezeonu; 3-0

14. Resolution of Support for a Municipal Setting Designation at 2801 E. Park Row, Arlington, Texas

Cindy Mendez, Public Health and Environmental Quality Director presented a resolution in support of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality requesting a Municipal Setting Designation at this location. Ms. Mendez stated they have been approved by the City of Arlington and explained the environmental issues at this location.

Councilmember Ezeonu motioned to approve this item; seconded by Councilmember Headen; 3-0

#### **PURPOSE OF REQUEST:**

In September 2019, City Council approved a Municipal Maintenance Agreement between the City of Grand Prairie and TXDOT, whereby the City would perform all mowing and litter collection along TXDOT rights-of-way within the city limits, in both Dallas and Tarrant Counties. In April 2022, City Council awarded a bid for mowing services to Lawn Patrol Service, Inc. Upon renewal of that agreement for another term, Lawn Patrol Service, Inc. notified staff that they did not wish to continue the agreement.

Notice of bid #23102 was advertised in the Fort Worth Star Telegram and Public Purchase. The bid was also emailed to 47 vendors. Two bids were received, as shown on attachment A.

Staff is recommending Good Earth, Inc. as vendor to perform the required mowing of these rights-of-way, to maintain a clean and presentable appearance. The proposed agreement will provide for nine scheduled mowing cycles, with up to six additional mowing cycles, on an as-needed basis. Further, Good Earth Inc., is the vendor currently utilized for litter collection along these rights-of-way. Having a single vendor for both services will result in efficient and coordinated services, ensuring that litter is consistently collected prior to a mowing cycle.

The award was based on best value criteria established in the specification, including cost, qualifications (available equipment and experience with similar contracts), past relationship with the city and other municipalities, local presence, and other relevant criteria as listed in the specification.

Good Earth, Inc. meets specifications and is recommended for award.

#### **PURPOSE OF REQUEST:**

The City and T-Mobile West LLC desire to enter into a lease agreement under which T-Mobile West will be permitted to install antennas and equipment on the City's water tower located at 6720 TX 360 in Mansfield, as well as an equipment shelter and associated equipment on the premises below to facilitate cellular communications.

The initial term of the lease will be five years, and T-Mobile has the option to renew the lease for four additional five-year periods. If all renewal options are exercised, the lease will be for 25 years. The initial lease rental is \$30,000 per year, payable in advance, and ratchets up by 15% upon each five-year renewal.

T-Mobile West has provided an acceptable site plan identifying the antennas and equipment to be installed on the water tower and the premises below. T-Mobile is required to notify the City of any modification, update, maintenance, repair or replacement of equipment on the premises, and must obtain advance approval when replacement facilities are greater in number, size, or capacity than the existing facilities.

This introductory letter explains the 3 proposals presented within this packet. The key to my service is that when I perform a Grading Summary and provide the community a List of Suggested Improvements (Phase I), a great deal of the information required to fill out the Pre-Survey Packet will be assimilated at that time. Therefore, when I fill out the Pre-Survey Packet (Phase II) it is obviously less time consuming than if I had not performed the Grading Summary and corresponding List of Suggested Improvements. The same holds true for assisting the community when the I.S.O. Field Representative visits and performs his field survey (Phase III). If I have filled out his Pre-Survey Packet then I am familiar with the infrastructure of the community as it pertains to the I.S.O. rating. This makes it less time consuming when transferring the information to the field representative. It is for this reason that each phase is contingent upon the one which preceded it.

The total cost to the City of Grand Prairie to complete *only* the Grading Summary with the corresponding List of Suggested Improvements for areas afforded fire hydrant protection will not exceed \$32,000, and will require 1 site visit. The total cost to the City of Grand Prairie to complete all 3 projects, for the areas afforded fire hydrant protection, will not exceed \$65,000 (this total being contingent upon completing all 3 phases). The total for all 3 projects does not include additional site visits such as City Council presentations or workshops. 3 site visits will be required and only 3 site visits are within the scope of this proposal. Each improvement will show, again to 2 decimal places, how much that improvement will add to the overall grading point total which develops the ISO PPC for the City of Grand Prairie.

After your staff analyzes these improvements and implements the ones that are economically feasible within the budget constraints of the City of Grand Prairie, we will request an I.S.O. survey. At that time, I.S.O. will assign a field representative. At present we have already been assigned an excellent ISO Field Representative; Mr. Mike McCormack.

Once the field representative is assigned, he will send you his Pre-Survey Packet. At that time I will return to the City of Grand Prairie and together we will complete this packet. We also will assimilate the support data required to document the answers to this packet.

After the packet is complete we will set a date and time for the field representative to visit the City of Grand Prairie. I will be with the City of Grand Prairie during the entire survey process to guarantee the seamless transfer of information.

Please note that I am a Registered Professional Civil Engineer in the State of Texas - License # 45719. It requires a Civil Engineer to analyze the Water Supply (38% of the entire rating) and prepare the water supply section's support data for an ISO survey (especially the hydraulic modeling of the flow tests and then the mapping of the flow tests versus the fire demand). My firm is also registered in the State of Texas: License # F-13781. All communities hire me without a RFP or RFQ thru a professional services contract. Hiring a licensed professional does not require the bidding process regardless of the cost.

#### **PURPOSE OF REQUEST:**

The fire department has specific firefighter gear (bunker gear) tested by an internal committee and designed specifically for our department. The criteria are breathability, thermal protection, moisture protection, and comfort/flexibility. The gear selected and has been very successful for GPFD is called Globe. Casco, a Grand Prairie company, is a regional Globe dealer and a dealer for our helmets, tools, and certain safety equipment. Being a local company, our staff can go directly to Casco for fitting/outfitting which saves a tremendous amount of staff time and shipping costs. Being a Globe Gear sole source dealer, they are the regional authorized vendor for the DFW area.

All fire gear has a 10-year life under Texas administrative code. GPFD issues two gear sets for every firefighter to help minimize cancer exposure. Within the next three years, we have 115 sets of bunker gear set to expire and we will need to purchase two sets of gear for the fire station 11 new hire class. Due to the expiration of gear and the new personnel, we expect a larger purchase of gear through 2027.

#### **PURPOSE OF REQUEST:**

Front Line Mobile Health has been the vendor for the fire department for the past two years performing the NFPA 1582 annual health assessments for the uniformed fire staff. Under the state administrative code, every fire department is required to provide medical physicals for their employees. GPFD has been a leader in the State of Texas for the past five years as we do much more than medical assessments but now include full cardiovascular assessments, cancer screenings to include x-rays and ultrasounds, and a complete mental health assessment. Local vendors are minimal and can perform this process and none can do a one-stop process like Front Line. The other vendors we have used are Concentra, Care Now, and Huguley Health. Front Line is the only medical provider that can meet the needs of our firefighters.

For the past few years, we contracted with Front Line using an Interlocal Agreement with Plano or Fort Worth and now these cities are doing a direct professional services contract, as this is one of the allowable exemptions related to Medical/Physicians.

In addition to our incumbent firefighters, we will begin using Front Line as our new employee medical screening process as well. This gives Front Line and the firefighter a career of data to monitor their health and wellness.






