Thursday, May 23, 2024 at 12:00 PM

I. Call to Order

Mayor Doud called the meeting to order at 12:00

II. Roll Call

IV. Additions to / Adoption of Agenda

- Darrow Brothers Excavating Vehicle Permits for Forest Drive and Lakeview Blvd.

V. Correspondence

As Councilman St. Onge was unable to attend the meeting, he submitted emailed correspondence

- Councilman St. Onge is in opposition of any gravel work in the Annex
- Suggested obtaining bids from Belonga Excavating or Darrow Brothers Excavating to compare costs and to prepare for a fall project
- Does not believe the shoulders on Grand Avenue need to be brought up as they are no worse than the shoulders on the roads recently paved by the State Park
- Disagrees with the 3/8th minus material being proposed as he does not believe it will hold up to the thin wheels of the private carriages, the cost is also much more than the regular 22A
 - The 3/8th minus product has been used in the Sunset Forest Association area and is typically repaired annually and creates potholes
- Project will most likely not start until after Memorial Day, which is outside of the vehicle cut off dates

VI. New Business

Councilwoman Myers presented a breakdown of the Road Improvement Funds

- After the payment to Bacco for the paying work done (\$367,000.00) there is \$159,000.00 left in the Road Improvement Fund
- Dennis Dombroski noted that the original number from Bacco reflected 22A gravel
 - o Bacco was under the impression that the roads were going to be paved, so Belonga was going to supply the 22A which is preferred to go under asphalt
 - Was concerned about using 22A for just graveling the roads as we have had issues with that type of gravel in that area in the past
 - 8 to 10 years ago when the City re-graveled the Annex roads with 22A, there was an incident where someone flipped over their mobility cart
 - o Changed to the 3/8th minus product that Sunset Forest Association (SFA) is using
 - Councilwoman Myers pointed out that Councilman St. Onge's email stated that the 3/8th minus material being used in SFA could easily be chewed up by the horses
 - Councilman Sehoyan commented that he has been riding the SFA roads and they have been really nice
 - Chad Belonga commented that the horses will eventually chew anything up
- Mayor Doud questioned how long the project will take?
 - Mario Calcaterra of Bacco stated that they would want one week due to the logistics of being on the island
 - If the materials are here it could be placed in a few days, then rolling and shaping would take another day should take about (5) days
 - Have to take weather in to account as well as ordinances and restrictions for trucking
- Councilwoman Myers inquired what portion of Lakeview Blvd. was quoted
 - Dennis Dombroski noted that it would be going from Lorna Straus's house to where it intersects with Park Avenue
 - O Worst part seems to be the corner right after Haan's
 - Bacco has estimated enough gravel to get the road above the grass which will help the road stay dry and avoid pot holes
 - o Park Ave measures about 900 feet and is not in as bad of shape as Lakeview Blvd.
 - Dennis wanted to just freshen up the road but Mario identified the fact that the road needs to be built up to avoid pot holes and such

- O Councilman Chambers inquired if the 3/8th minus was ok to pave over?
 - Mario noted that the cleaner the material is at the time of paving, the better, but it should be ok to pave over that material
- Councilwoman Myers inquired the Council's thoughts on filling in the shoulders of Grand Avenue
 - Councilman Moskwa felt that they did not look too bad. Suggested having the City crew place some gravel where it is needed along the shoulder
 - Councilman Chambers agreed that this would be sufficient
 - At least need feathering out near Valley Road and wherever there are entrances to houses or barns
 - City Foreman Mike Ruddle stated that he did have some gravel, and it should be enough to take care of this
 - Councilwoman Myers noted that the State Park does have plans to feather in their roads as well. A lot of people take Grand Avenue at night and it is not well lit
 - Councilman Moskwa noted that Mike and his crew taking care of this work would take \$14,000.00 off the quote
- O Councilman Moskwa noted that there are many other roads throughout the island that need to be maintained and that this should be the last time gravel is placed
- O Councilwoman Myers inquired if Bacco will be coming back in the fall
 - Mario believes so, but no guarantees depends on how much work develops.
 Do not have contracts at this time
- O Councilman Chambers inquired if we move forward now does it make sense to do it now with the vehicle cut off dates, or do we put the project off until fall when there is less traffic and the road has more time to settle
 - Councilman Sehoyan questioned if the work can?
 - Dennis noted that, on a normal year, the City has paved into the middle of June. Blessed with early lift of frost laws
- O Councilwoman Myers noted that Lakeview Blvd. is a problem and needs to be done.
 - Could do that now and wait to see how that works and do Park in the fall with the same material
 - Councilman Corrigan inquired if material costs are going up?
 - Mario noted that he is not sure, it is not a common material. Also need to think about fuel prices.
- Councilman Moskwa inquired what other paving projects the City has going forward
 - Dennis noted that Church Street should be next on the list. Bogan Lane & Truscott could use some attention. All of these are getting close to gravel
 - Market Street, Main Street, and Cadotte Ave. are all roughly paved with 3 inches all other roads done in the future should be brought up to the same standards
 - Councilman Moskwa also noted that the roads in the Mission area are not very wide (especially Truscott) maybe going forward we should look at widening the roads
 - Anneke Mike doing work should take us down to about \$131,000.00

Funding

- Councilwoman Myers noted that money could be moved from what is collected from the Post Office rent
- Mike Ruddle commented that the City needs to look at the longevity of pacing projects
 - o May have less than (5) years before Market Street has to be redone again, which is around a \$300,000 plus project
 - o Councilman Sehoyan suggested looked at a (5) year plan and start to plan and save some money for paving
- Dennis noted that the City could easily spend upwards of \$250,000.00 maintaining roads each year
 - Forest Way Townhomes was an important project, but the City needs to begin thinking about allotting \$250,000.00 each year for roads and not allowing that money to be moved for other projects (Mahoney Ave. was on the "wish list" for almost 10 years before it got repaved).

- Councilwoman Myers noted that, with the City crew doing the shoulders of Grand Avenue, \$14,000.00 can be cut, bringing the quote down to \$131,000.00
 - o All Council members were in agreeance with this
 - Mario stated that he was ok with cutting the shoulder work, but also noted that he is not in charge of making that decision
- Mario inquired how the trucking was being addressed for this project
 - Councilwoman Myers noted that vehicle and trailer permits need to be submitted to the Clerk's office, but that the permit fees will be waived
 - Looking to have the work completed the week of June 3rd to avoid the Detroit Chamber conference next week
 - Mario believed that that timeline should be agreeable
 - o Councilwoman Myers inquired how much trucking will be needed for this project
 - Mario stated that material will be stockpiled at British Landing and will be trucked to the site
 - Maybe 10 truckloads over two to two and a half days
 - Belonga will be using (2) to three (3) trucks to haul materials
 - Foreman Mike Ruddle noted that they will begin to encounter traffic on Annex and Stonecliffe roads as early as 7:00 am
 - Councilwoman Myers suggested that Bacco and / or Belonga appoint some traffic control personnel while the trucking is happening
 - City Clerk reminded everyone of the following school restriction times
 - 7:45 am to 8:30 am
 - 12:00 pm to 12:30 pm
 - 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm
 - School ends June 7th, but that is too far to push the project back if it can be completed sooner
 - Lilac Festival also beings on June 7th and runs through June 16th
 - Chad Belonga inquired about an escort for the project
 - Councilwoman Myers suggested Dennis Bradley
 - Foreman Mike Ruddle noted that he could release Dennis from his work at the City to perform the escorts
 - Councilwoman Myers also asked if Mayor Doud could contact Myron Johnson with the State Park to see if they would be willing to waive the docking fees to help with the overall cost.

Motion made by Moskwa, Seconded by Corrigan, to authorize Bacco Construction Company to complete the graveling of Lakeview Blvd. and Park Avenue in the Annex, to strike the Grand Avenue shoulder work as listed on the quote – bringing the total to \$131,000.00 – with the work to be performed the week of June 3rd through June 7th, to waive all City permit fees, and for all trucks to follow the school restriction times.

Vehicle Permits were submitted by Darrow Brothers Excavating to deliver aggregate to 3979 Forest Drive and 8332 Lakeview Blvd. on May 30th or sooner.

Motion by Myers, seconded by Chambers, to deny the vehicle permit applications per the City's Ordinance, as the applicant has not presented any evidence or extenuating circumstances as to why the vehicles are needed after the vehicle cut-off date.

Councilwoman Myers noted that, when applying for permits, applicants should make sure to put down a detailed explanation or attend the meeting to explain the need of their permit(s).

- Councilman Moskwa congratulated Mayor Doud on winning her 49th election for Mayor.

VIII. Committee Reports

Mayor's Assistant Trist France submitted a grant application to the Mackinac Island Community Foundation for assistance with Forest Way Townhomes Phase III and was awarded \$76,928.00 towards the construction costs.

- The grant will be reveiwed again during the fall grant cycle and it is possible more money may be granted towards the project.

It was noted that the Public Safety Committee recently received and reviewed the resignation letter from Douglas Topolski, resigning from his position as Chief of Police.

Motion by Myers, seconded by Chambers, to accept the resignation letter from Chief of Police Douglas Topolski

- Councilman St. Onge inquired if the job vacancy was advertised within the department on an interim basis or as full time?
- Mayor Doud responded that the job was posted within the department as full time
- Councilman St. Onge suggested making the position interim to being with and then "at the pleasure" of council to make the hire permanent if everything is working out
- Mayor Doud stated she has spoken with the officers and they are comfortable with it being accepted as a full-time position from the beginning
- Police Officers also changed the inter-department deadline to this Friday at 12:00 noon, and have one officer who is interested in applying
- Councilman Moskwa also questioned if this should be done on a trial basis

IX. Correspondence

- a. An email was received by the Mayor's Office from a Bayview Yacht Club member request to bring back the finish line cannon at Windermere Point for this year's 100th Bayview to Mackinac race.
 - Councilwoman Myers questioned if this request was just from a member or if it was from the actual Yacht Club.
 - Mayor Doud noted that the request should come directly from the yacht club, and suggested tabling the request for two (2) week.

- Mayor's Assistant Trista France will reach out to the yacht club and inquire
- Councilwoman Myers noted that the Council may consider only for this year since it is the 100th race

Motion by Myers, second to the motion by Sehoyan, to place the email on file and for the Mayor's Assistant to inquire with the yacht club about this request.

X. Old Business

Councilman Moskwa inquired if there had been any response to the letter sent to Mackinac Island Ferry Company from the City's Attorney regarding their Bike Transportation Policy

- Mayor Doud noted that Attorney Evashevski is on maternity leave so the issue has been tabled at this time
 - o City Clerk Leach noted that Attorney Evashevski had sent an email to Attorney Murray and Mr. Fetty on May 9th, but that there had not been a response as of this meeting
- Councilwoman Myers asked that the Clerk reach out to Attorney Jim Murray & Jerry Fetty to request that they attend the May 29th Council meeting

XI. New Business

- a. Amendment to the Historic District Commission Ordinance to change the number of commission members from five (5) to seven (7).
 - Motion made by Moskwa, Seconded by Myers, to adopt the ordinance amendment with the change from five (5) to seven (7) members.
 - Voting Yea: Chambers, Corrigan, Moskwa, Myers, Sehoyan, St. Onge
- b. Quote for ballistic armor and exterior carriers for the Police Department / Request for Officers Miedzianowski & Davis
 - Department is due for new bullet proof vests & Officer Miedzianowski has been looking in to grants to cover these
 - Looking to acquire eight (8) new vests cost of \$11,709.00
 - Patrick Leahy Bulletproof Vest Partnership Program (BPV)
 - Grant would allow 50% of the needed funding to be covered
 - Dickey Foundation Grant
 - Could cover remaining costs after the BPV program
 - Would submit for \$4,759.00
 - Grant does not require a City match
 - Between both grants, if awarded, the Department should be able to cover the full amount needed for the eight (8) new bulletproof vests
 - Walmart Foundation
 - Exploring this grant for funds toward any match needed for the vest project and / or any needed medical equipment such as AEDs of other medical supplies.
 - Grant does not require a City match
 - MCOLES Grant
 - To hire future full time and potentially seasonal officer position vacancies through the utilization of the MCOLES Grant
 - Covers academy costs
 - Covers expenses via a reimbursement payment up to \$24,000.00
 - Once the candidate completes the academy, the would be hired by the City for a fill time officer position, or a seasonal officer position – whichever is available at the time
 - Councilman Corrigan noted that there was a student at Mackinac Island Public School who was interested in this program, and that he attempted to put the student in contact with Chief Topolski
 - Chief Topolski, attending the meeting via Zoom, noted that he had spoken with the student and they are interested. The student is also interested in attending Ferris State University after graduation.
 - City would have to pay the money up front, but would be reimbursed by the MCOLES program / grant

Motion by Myers, second to the motion by Corrigan, to authorize the Police Department to apply for the Leahy BVP Grant, The Dickey Foundation Grant, and the Walmart Foundation Grant for vest and / or medical equipment and supplies as needed as long as any matching funds come from existing allocated funding in the Police Department budget.

 - Councilman Moskwa commented that it would be nice to hear from the contractor why
 this needs to be done now and why it was not done prior to May 1st
 - Myron Johnson of the State Park noted that the State Park begins to reduce vehicle use by May 15th. Will keep in contact with Mayor Doud regarding this permit

XII. Miscellaneous / General Council Discussion / Additional Agenda Items

Councilman St. Onge:

 This council has a high transparency, very above board, but do think a policy that needs to be revisited is that all job vacancies need to be posted (whether hired job or commissions / boards). Going forward, any and all positions should be posted on the City's website.

Motion by St. Onge that any and all available positions within the City of Mackinac Island be posted.

- Motion died due to lack of support
- Councilwoman Myers & Councilman Moskwa would like to see this topic go to Committee for further discussion
 - o Councilman Moskwa commented that this is not a bad concept
- Councilman St. Onge commented that he is not necessarily concerned about commissions and boards, but paid positions such as the Building Inspector position should be posted
 - Mayor Doud stated that those type of positions have been advertised upon availability

Councilwoman Myers:

- Would like to discuss the Hoffman Landscaping trailer that was parked at the Stonecliffe gates, rather than on site at Stonecliffe
- Not sure if the Council is aware of how the trailer is being used. Under the impression that
 the trailer was being used to move things around site, but recently have seen it being used
 to bring materials from the State Dock materials that could be hauled by dray.
- Ben Horn noted that when the permit application was submitted, it was submitted to haul heavy materials. Trailer was parked outside the gates because Belonga was laying new gravel and the trailer was in the way of that
- Councilwoman Myers noted that the materials seen on the trailer were small and could have been hauled by a dray. Approval of permit does not give cart blanch to haul any and all materials
- Councilman St. Onge noted that he saw the trailer moving cedar trees earlier today
- Councilwoman Myers asked Mr. Horn to have the contractor send an explanation of what is being hauled to the Clerk

Councilman Moskwa inquired if Forest Drive has it been fixed

- Tom Sullivan of Sunset Forest Association (SFA) noted that the lights are back on, Manor V looks close to being done, roads were being fixed by Belonga yesterday & today, the road out to Woods restaurant was done today, and that he is looking forward to the Streets Committee meeting where road maintenance for Forest Drive can be discussed
- Updates on WWTP project
 - o Ken Peterson noted that the goal is to be done with vehicle use during the day soon and will begin, per contract, to run between 10:00 pm and 6:00 am
 - Biggest material that will be hauled is supplies for concrete (aggregate and sand)
 which has been stock piled at British Landing
 - Would like to do one night a week to haul from British Landing to site
 - o Progress is going well have about 2/3rd of the excavation done, 4 buildings going up, end of July / august to start excavating for new buildings. Within the next month they should be able to start doing some backfilling
 - O Councilwoman Myers stated that it is not acceptable to run throughout the night
 - Mr. Peterson commented that it would most likely 10:00 pm and midnight
 - Councilwoman Myers again stated that this is not acceptable
 - Mr. Peterson responded that this would need to be negotiated
 - Councilwoman Myers inquired if this is an agreement the DPW arranged
 - Department of Public Works Director Allen Burt noted that delays in the project adds more time to the overall project and adds to the overall cost
 - Councilwoman Myers suggested running between 4:00 am to 6:00 am like the other trucks
 - Mr. Peterson noted that they have discussed stockpiling more materials at British Landing and moving them in one shot to the work site. There may be a period where things need to be hauled late – this would be for a shorter time period, not talking all night all summer.
 - Mayor Doud inquired how many days a week they would like to haul at night?
 - Mr. Peterson replied that they are trying to limit hauling concrete products to (1) night per week, but will haul as deemed necessary to complete the project in the proposed timeline
 - Would like to stay away from hauling on the weekends
 - Goal is to run Monday through Wednesday, but there is a lot of material that needs to be brought to the site, and at some point, that will need to be moved at night.
 - o Mr. Peterson noted that he understands that this will be uncomfortable and that there needs to be a lot of communication while this is happening
 - Councilwoman Myers requested a notice to residents and businesses in the area, as well as to be provided with a schedule of when and how often the trucks will be running at night
 - Mr. Peterson responded that he will work on schedule and present it to the council
 - Councilwoman Myers also suggested working with the State Park to grade State Road since the heavy use by the DPW has caused pot holes, which causes more noise.
 - O Councilman St. Onge also noted taking in to account drivers not showing up or boats running late.
 - Seeing a lot of trucks going directly up British Landing Road and not using the roundabout with State Road
 - The City needs more notice for residents and businesses in the area.
 - Don't want to see this project run late, but also agree with Councilwoman Myers that we need to take these things in to consideration.
 - Councilwoman Myers noted that is was discussed with the DPW that there would be a lot of trucking and that some would be at night, but not to this extent
 - DPW Director Allen Burt commented that he understand and agreed that this was not what was originally expected.
 - Councilwoman Myers suggested that the trucks could probably run until 7:00 am there is not much traffic at that time and it is a reasonable cut off time, 1:00 / 2:00 am is not acceptable.
 - O Councilman Moskwa suggested looking in to some top dressing or filling on State Road to help reduce the noise from the trucks
 - O Councilwoman Myers stated that this is an issue that needs to be discussed further

Mayor Doud informed the Council that Councilwoman Myers, Dennis Dombroski, and herself met with a potential replacement for Mr. Dombroski

- This was the fourth person interviewed for the position, which has been advertised.
- Latest is the husband of current school superintendent (Dave)
 - o Seems very interested but needs to get his license renewed
 - o Plan to meeting with him again.
- Mayor Doud recently had to testify in front of the House of Representatives for a bike speed limit.
 - o If all goes well, by the end of this week or first of next week the speed limit will be implemented in to state law
 - 10 mph in town and 15 mph around the island
 - o Councilwoman Myers noted that the speed limit will need to be posted
 - Mayor noted that she has spoken with State about this and will keep everyone posted.
 - o Mayor Doud also reminded everyone that this is for all bikes, not just electric bikes.

Recreation Director Dr. Mary Patay announced that the Recreation Department had received the following grants from the Mackinac Island Community Foundation

- Annual sports camps \$4,019.00
- (2) bounce houses for 4th of July \$2,043.00
 - These will be purchased by the City and will be available for community events
- Funds to install an AED at Turtle Park \$2,480.00

Vicki Riel thanked the City for paving Grand Ave. in the Annex

- Hoping that the City plans to put caps on the sides of road as she believes it is dangerous as is.
 - o It was noted that the road just got paved and Mr. Dombroski had not had a chance to review work.
- Mrs. Riel also informed that Council that the State Park will no longer be allowing helicopter tours on the island.
 - O Councilman St. Onge questioned if that meant that helicopters cannot run from the airport, but can still fly over the island?
 - o Mrs. Riel responded that helicopters can still fly over the island, but there are requirements on how far out and how far above they need to be.
 - It was also noted that this was specifically for tours and did not include medical helicopters



- Coloring Mural, 15 feet wide by 5 feel tall
- 4 bounce houses
- Michigan Cornhole Tournament

Coloring Mural: Thursday, June 6 - Monday, June 17

The 15-foot coloring mural features Mackinac Island Landmarks and is erasable to be reused throughout the Festival. It will be put up the evening of Thursday, June 6th and taken down the morning of Monday, June 17th. The stand is made from light-weight, aluminum tubing and is fixed to the Doghouse posts and railing. The mural is moderately wind resistant and will be checked by a Tourism Bureau staff member daily. This is the same coloring mural we have previously used and Monster Mural is the vendor.

Bounce Houses: Friday, Saturday, Sunday, June 7-9 & Friday, Saturday June 14-15

We are partnering again with Bouncers & More to bring back 4 bounce house units at Windermere Point. The bounce houses are placed as close to the water edge as the ground will safely allow and the air blowers are pointed in the direction of Lake Huron, so that noise blends in with the waves, and it is not pushed out into the streets. These two strategies proved to work well over the past six years.

Additional safety precautions include using 24" to 48" stakes. The wind will be assessed and the bounce house units will be temporarily shut down when gusts reach 20 mph. Each bounce house will be staffed with trained employee from Bouncer's and More.

With your permission, the bounce houses will be set up each morning and deflated each night and operating from 10:00 am - 5:00 pm.

Michigan Cornhole Tournament

Michigan Cornhole will be hosting their Mackinac Island Cornhole tournament Saturday, June 8 at Windermere Point. Registration begins at 10:00 am and bags fly at 11:00 am.


