Southern California Logistics Airport Fire Department/Mission Aviation and Fire Rescue ADMINISTRATION DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES – Division Chief

As the Division Fire Chief for the Southern California Logistics Fire Department my responsibilities are managing day to day operations under the direction of the Fire Chief. I manage the fire departments budget as well perform purchases under the City of Victorville Procurement Policies and Procedures. I oversee the fire department building inspections that the fire personnel perform throughout the year. I manage and oversee the training curriculum and program that assures compliance for FAA Federal Aviation Administration and the Office of the California State Fire Marshal's Office. Additional Responsibilities are to develop working relationships with local cooperators and outside responding agencies.

Through the Chain of Command, I manage personnel issues that range from policy violations, medical leave, as well as holiday and vacation leave.

Attend Aviation Commission meetings when presenting request to the commission. Prepare agendas for each request made.

As the Division Fire Chief, I'm also responsible for all Deployment Teams that respond to military deployments, California CAL Fire wildland fire response and U.S. Forestry Department.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS – Southern California Logistics Airport Fire Department/Mission Aviation and Fire Rescue

- July 2019, developed and implemented a new training matrix for the SCLA FD that meets and exceeds FAA requirements for Aircraft Rescue Firefighting.
- August 2019 Developed Standard Operating Procedures for the SCLA FD.
- September 2019 Established Memorandum Of Understanding/Letter of Agreement with FAA Tower Operations for response to incidents that may happen on the runways and taxiways involving aircraft.
- September 2019 Developed Fire Inspection Program for all buildings to be inspected for Life Safety.
- September 2019 Placed Thermal Imaging Cameras on all apparatus as well as gas detection meters.
- November 2019 Started rewriting the Airport Emergency Plan which dictates how the airport will operate during emergency situations. As well assisted airport administration with updating the (ACM).
- December 2019 Developed a Mas Casualty Incident Response Vehicle that will support medium to large scale incidents for the airport and the city of Victorville, California.
- July 2020 Developed and put into service a Mass Casualty Incident response apparatus. This apparatus provides
 multiple capabilities such as SCBA replenishment, Scene Lighting and large MCI capabilities.

As the Assistant Chief and second in command of the Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department my responsibilities are managing day to day operations under the direction of the fire chief. I manage the fire departments budget as well perform purchases under the Augusta Richmond County Procurement Policies and Procedures. I oversee the fire department building inspections that the fire personnel perform throughout the year. I manage and oversee the training curriculum and program that assures compliance for FAA Federal Aviation Administration and GFSTC Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council. I manage Incidents from small scale to large scale incidents.

- Oversees all training for all ARFF personnel by managing the training division and teaching specialized classes that meet National Fire Protection Association, National Pro Board, Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Compliance, and FAA.
- Manages, maintains, and oversees the training records of all ARFF personnel for Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council and the FAA FAR Part 139 compliance.
- Supervises new recruits and staff personnel, during training operations, and coordinates all personnel training needs.
- Responds to incidents and assists Incident Command at major incidents.
- Assist with the development of general guidelines, standard operating procedures, rules and regulations, budge preparation for the department, and the purchasing of equipment.
- Assist the Airport Fire Chief with daily operations for the department and acts as Airport Fire Chief in his/her absence.
- Supervises staff personnel, during training operations, and coordinates personnel training needs.
- Performs other duties of a similar nature or level as required.
- Additional I assist the Fire Chief with managing the daily operations for the department for all major incidents.
- Through the Chain of Command, I manage personnel issues that range from policy violations, medical leave, as well as holiday and vacation leave.
- Attend Aviation Commission meetings when presenting request to the commission. Prepare agendas for each request made.
- Prepare the department's fiscal budget for approval from the Fire Chief, Airport Director, and final approval from the Aviation Commission.

Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department ADMINISTRATION DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES - Captain

As the Captain over the Training Division my position is responsible for but not limited to the following duties: administrative work in planning, organizing, coordinating and directing the fire training activities of the Fire Department in accordance with FAA, NFPA, and the State of Georgia standards. Utilizing excellent customer service skills establishes and maintains effective working relationships with other employees, tenants, and the general public. Operates various motor vehicles to assist in carrying out the business of the department and the City. Develops, delivers and evaluates basic and advanced fire training courses for members of the Department. Acts as an alternate for ARFF Lieutenants as needed.

Conduct all training for all ARFF personnel to meet FAA, NFPA and Georgia standard.

Develope training program and send to Chief for approval

Manage the training records of all personnel.

Conducts ARFF personnel skill evaluations.

Fill in on shift when the Lieutenant is off.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS - Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department

- In 2012 I created and developed a 3-year Strategic Plan for the fire department and the projected date for the Strategic Plan will be accomplished by the first of 2015.
- Restructured the entire training program for the Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department.
- Developed a career matrix for all personnel and positions within the Fire Department. I Created new job descriptions for each position which matches the career matrix for each position.
- With FAA approval the FAR 139 training required for ARFF firefighters was changed to a more elaborative specific topic that confirms that assures specific training is covered within the required training subjects.
- I instructed many classes that fire personnel needed to meet their new job requirements. All classes were approved by the Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council and by the National Pro Board Qualification which meets national standards for the fire service.
- Registered the Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department with the State of Georgia DPH Department Public Health to be recognized by the State EMS office as a licensed Emergency Medical Service provider. The inspection and procedure took about 4 months to complete.
- After achieving our Georgia Emergency Medical Service provider license, I established an MOU with the 911 EMS service provider Gold Cross EMS and Doctor Jimmy Peebles to establish the Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department and Gold Cross as partners. This was approved and signed by the Aviation Commission. The Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department and Gold Cross EMS use the State mandated protocols for treating patients and administration of medicine. The department's approval is granted under Doctor Jimmy Peebles who is our Mec Control Director for the Airport Fire Department and Gold Cross EMS.
- The Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department has received a 100% pass on the last 5 FAA Inspections. The training program that I created has been branched out to other airports within the southern region due to the complexity of the curriculum and tracking of training. several times to assist other departments with establishing a proactive training program such as the one our department uses to assure compliance.

- In 2013 I was nominated by the ARFF Working Group as the Georgia State Representative for the Section 3 group which covers the Southern Region Airports. Nominations came from Atlanta Airport Fire Department, Orlando International Fire Department Airport as well as other airports.
- In 2014 I achieved my A.M.F. Airport Master Firefighter certification through AAAE. The process took about 3 months of studying before actually testing out for the certification.
- In 2014 I became a GFSTC Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council Proctor/ Monitor which allows me to administer test for GFSTC and the National Pro Board System.
- In March of 2014 I completed the following procedures through GFSTC Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council to have the Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department recognized as an online testing facility There are only 3 in our region Columbia County Fire Rescue, McDuffie County Fire Rescue and Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department for this portion of the State of Georgia.
- Throughout the year 2013 I was able to establish Mutual Aid Agreements with surrounding counties: McDuffic County, Burke County and the Georgia Forestry Division and Columbia County.
- In the year 2014 when tragedy struck in San Francisco with the Asiana crash I saw the need to establish an Inciden Safety Officer program that would fit for our mission here at the Augusta Regional Airport. The class itself was already in production throughout the fire service but there was no specific training for such an event that took place in San Francisco so I created the scenario and instructed the class to fit a large aircraft incident. After completing the class, I contacted GFSTC Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council and completed the necessary paperwork to have the class excepted by the National Pro Board Qualification System. The Augusta Regiona Airport Fire Department was the first fire department in the state of Georgia to achieve this certification. Al personnel that work for the Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department successfully passed the NPQS exam. Ir attendance with our department personnel from Augusta Fire Department and Columbia County Fire Rescue attended and received the National certification.
- In the year 2014 Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department received permission from the Aviation Commission to purchase a brand new 1500-gallon Rescue Pumper. I assisted E-One with design and specifications that we as a department requested.
- In the year 2014 the Augusta Regional Airport Director along with the Fire Chief gave me his blessings to develop and construct a firefighter training facility which is located at the air cargo building. The personnel at the fire department constructed many training props that range from ARFF to structural firefighting as well as confine space and rescue training. With this facility our department has increased its capabilities of performing more physical and demanding training which is required for a real-world event.
- In the year 2014 I worked closely with the Department of Health and local EMS Providers to write protocols for Ebola Response Procedures for the Augusta Regional Airport as well for the (CSRA) Central Savannah River Area
- For the years 2012, 2013, 2014 the Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department has received 100% for FAA inspection. These inspections are critical to the airport certification for commercial air travel.
- In 2016 I had the opportunity to take a leading role in establishing a cutting-edge course provided by the Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department and (MCG) Medical College of Georgia Emergency Medicine. The TECC (Tactical Emergency Casualty Care) course is the industry's response to Foreign and Domestic Terrorism, along with the active shooter scenario. The TECC course brought together several of the area's leading professionals and departments to take a two-part learning approach to mitigate a growing epidemic. A mixed style of Page 11 no

hands-on scenarios provided all students the information, tools, and tactics they need to be successful in ar unfortunate situation.
