MINUTES:

1. The October 27, 2020 Work Session Minutes and the October 27, 2020 Board Meeting Minutes were available for review.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Positively Paulding: Recognizing Aundrea Biles as the November Employee of the Month aired for the Commissioners and the audience.

Frank Baker, County Administrator, and Felicia Womack with Paulding County Rides for Wishes Team presented a check to Jaylee Stratton with the Make a Wish Foundation.

INVITED GUESTS:

Paulding Northwest Atlanta Airport Director Terry Tibbitts gave an annual update on the Northwest Atlanta Airport. Mr. Tibbitts presented a presentation with the events from 2020. He stated that the Airport conducts business every day, with large company flying in, he showed photos of the pilots lounge, the new hanger and the Museum of Flight. Mr. Tibbitts also addressed future potential rental opportunities and discussed what will be their next Capital Outlay projects. He also announced a Public Hearing that will be held on November 17, 2020 at 7:00 pm at the Main Terminal of the Airport for the purpose of letting the public participate in the proposed Airport 10-year Development Plan.

NEW BUSINESS:

11. Discussed action to adopt Resolution 20-41 authorizing the filing of an application with the Georgia Department of Transportation and the United States Department of Transportation, for a Grant for public transportation assistance under Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Laws under Chapter 53 of Title 49 of the United States Code:

Tabitha Pollard, Finance Director stated this is a routine item. The County applies for this grant every year to receive funds for the Paulding Transit operation. The only difference this year is the GDOT asked us to apply for all of the operations.

12. Discussed action to adopt Ordinance 20-12 amending Chapter 6 of the official Paulding County Code to provide for the issuance of Alcohol Manufacturing License for Breweries for the Production and Sale of Malt Beverages:

Chief Marshal Trevor Hess stated a lot of time has been put into getting this together. Jayson Phillips, County Attorney stated in the State of Georgia there is a three-tier system with Alcohol regulations. You have companies that make it, wholesale distributers, or retail purposes. The state does not allow you to blend these three. However there are exceptions, where you can combine making and having on premises to purchase but limited to a certain amount.

13. Discuss action to adopt Ordinance 20-13 amending the Tall Grass Ordinances to lower the maximum vegetation height limit and for other purposes:

Chief Marshal Trevor Hess stated the purpose of this amendment was to lower the maximum height to 18 inches. He further stated that his office has a large number of calls for this type of violation and when they are on location they find they are actually not in violation. This uses County time and resources, by lowering the height requirement the Marshal's Bureau does not have to be dispatched multiple times to the same location, when most of the time the calls are for grass at or above the 18 inch mark. He further stated his office has received many request from citizens asking for this change.

14. Discuss action to approve the Development Agreement with PR Land Investments, LLC for construction of a Water Main along a portion of Seven Hills Connector. Post IV:

Laurie Ashmore, Water System Director stated this developer has a 33 acre track that was zoned R-55 in 2019. With that type of zoning he is required to install an 8-inch water main to serve his project but long term forecasts call for a 16-inch water main. In this Development Agreement the developer agrees to the placement and cost sharing of a 2,525 linear feet of 16-inch water main within the right of way of Seven Hills Connector along the property frontage. Ms. Ashmore further stated that under this contract the County is responsible for providing the materials and PR Land Investments is responsible for the construction. The terms of the Development Agreement stated the agreement will terminate at the completion of the project or in 24-months.

Commissioner Stover reminded everyone that the Annual Dallas Christmas Parade will be on December 5, 2020 and the deadline to register to participate is November 15, 2020.
