Hello Shawn and to whom else this may concern,

I would like to address the council concerning the growing homeless issue occurring in downtown Clovis. I work at the House Of Juju and over the past years have noticed the rise of homeless individuals in the area. I want to document several instances in which these individuals have threatened mine, coworkers and other community members safety and have disrupted business and are creating an atmosphere of unease and dirtiness.

- 1. While walking with a coworker to Old Town Cafe for breakfast around 930am, we came upon a homeless man yelling at all the patrons of Twin Cities Coffee Shop enjoying their morning outside and those of us crossing 4<sup>th</sup> street at Pollasky. He was obviously agitated and aggressively yelling at us to "Stay off our cell phones and stop tattle tailing". He was not backing down. He continued this behavior for blocks! I was grateful the elementary school children waiting for a tour of the museum had not quite caught up to the area.
- 2. The same day I contacted the non-emergency police number while at work because another individual was sitting outside our entrance shirtless, slapping himself and talking nonsense.
- 3. Another individual wondered into our restaurant during a busy dinner rush playing a guitar and yelling "F you"...."F you"....
- 4. 2 individuals came into House of Juju, male and female, the male was insisting that we take the female home and provide her with care and protection.
- 5. While sitting at Boba Fresh across the street from House Of Juju, A male was walking around swing something, hitting objects and causing a fuss, again obviously agitated and disruptive.
- 6. A 19-year-old coworker was in her car at the light at Bullard and Fowler. A homeless man walked up to her passenger door and tried to open it. Luckly, she had the doors locked. He then proceeded to tap on the window and attempt to get in the vehicle until the light changed green and she drove off.
- 7. We have had repeated time periods where males have been instructed to walk females to their vehicles after night shifts due to homeless activity in and amongst the dumpsters.

These are just a handful of MANY instances. I grew up in Clovis and this was not an issue during my childhood. I have worked for 7 years over the past 10 years in Downtown Clovis and have seen this issue grow. IT NEEDS TO BE ADDRESSED! Please....Do Something! Thank you Kristin Walters 5595933367

Dear Members of the Clovis City Council,

We, the undersigned, are residents of the Quail Run community and members of the Quail Run 18 Association (the "Association"), a community of homeowners deeply invested in the well-being and future of our neighborhood.

As the City Council is well aware, the Association expressed numerous concerns with respect to Wilson Homes' proposed Shepherd North development on Shepherd and Sunnyside (the "Project").

During an April 17th community meeting, Wilson Homes presented a revised tract map and presented other changes with respect to the Project.

Since that meeting, the Association has been in discussions with Wilson Homes regarding our concerns about the Project.

The Association and Wilson Homes are in general agreement with respect to a potential resolution of the matter but have not had sufficient time to finalize such terms in a binding agreement.

In light of the changes presented at the April 17th community meeting, and in light of an impending binding agreement that addresses the Association's concerns, the Association is prepared to offer their conditional support of the Project, subject to and conditional upon the April 17th changes and the finalization of a binding agreement between Wilson and the Association..
