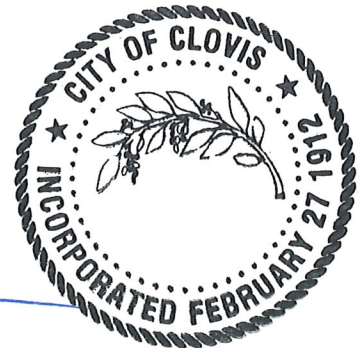

Comment: At last week's Council meeting, Mayor Flores interrupted City Manager Serpa's COVID-19 report to assert that "everyone forgets" to mention that people who have been infected with COVID but survived have "even better" immunity than those who are vaccinated, but "no one mentions that."

By this logic, if only everyone would just avoid vaccination and risk getting sick, they would emerge healthier, as long as they didn't die in the process. "No one mentions it" because it isn't true.

A simple check of the CDC website shows how mistaken he is:

"If you have had COVID-19 before, please still get vaccinated," said CDC Director Dr. Rochelle Walensky. "This study shows you are twice as likely to get infected again if you are unvaccinated. Getting the vaccine is the best way to protect yourself and others around you, especially as the more contagious Delta variant spreads around the country." <https://www.cdc.gov/media/releases/2021/s0806-vaccination-protection.html>

Mayor Flores, who has no medical expertise, is jeopardizing the health of the community by making such reckless and irresponsible statements. He should encourage Clovis residents to get vaccinated and publicly retract his dangerously mistaken assertion.
