The Mayor and Council of the City of Abbeville met in emergency special session on December 30, 2021 at 5:00 P.M., at the regular meeting place, the Council Meeting Room located at 101 North State Street, Abbeville, Louisiana, with the Honorable Mark Piazza, Mayor, presiding.

Mayor Piazza stated that we are here to declare a state of emergency because of the vandalism of Felicity Electrical Substation. This will allow him to do all acts necessary to replace the transformer as expeditiously as possible. He will not go through all the details about the acts of vandalism and the efforts that were made to restore electricity as quickly as possible. Each Council member was there and saw exactly what happened and what we had to do to restore the power. It took longer than we were hoping for but those were things that could not be avoided. This is no different than a hurricane event. We are now operating on our backup transformer. We need to act as soon as possible with the advice of Harvey Dubois and Stewart Head. Stewart and the electrical crew did a fantastic job. He will wait for Harvey's evaluation of the existing transformer before acting. This emergency declaration will allow him to purchase some things that may be necessary. Councilman Touchet stated that the Mayor will have the ability to do what he needs to do and to put us in a good position. He is not comfortable because we don't have a spare transformer. Stewart and his crew did an outstanding job. They worked non-stop. Chris Gautreaux did an excellent job. He provided updates to him. He was on top of it and he did what he needed to do. He led our guys, did what needed to be done and he was a leader to the crews. He thanked Chris for what he did. Councilman Broussard stated that this Council works so well together and we are being proactive 5 hours after this crisis ended. This will authorize the Mayor to find the transformer in a crisis, nationwide, supply chain issue. This will not be as easy, as fast or as affordable as it once was. Mayor Piazza stated that Kathy has already reached out to our insurance company and it appears that we will have some coverage for this. Councilwoman White asked Mayor Piazza if the City would cover the perishables and other losses of constituents. She had been receiving a lot of calls about that. What is the City liable for? Mayor Piazza stated that Ike is not here and he is not an attorney but he thinks that Ike would say that even in a state of emergency, such as this, you can't contribute, donate or give to the public City funds under any situation. Unless this would be something distributed through the National Guard or FEMA or something along those lines. He does not believe that the City can hand out money to people to help them pay for food because of an act of vandalism or an act of God. It has never been done in the past. Councilwoman White distributed the research that she had done on the property adjacent to the substation. The lot was sold in September 2021 for a very low amount. When you are looking at your action plan, please think about this property because we do need a little

more room to maneuver and this property is vacant. We should be able to acquire the property for a relatively low amount. Councilman Touchet stated that we need to have the trees cut and get them out of there. Mayor Piazza stated that we will have to take the trees out because we need to be able to go in there with a crane when the new transformer comes in. Councilwoman Broussard thanked the Mayor and the City Council members for being out there and for Chris and all he did during this crisis. Mayor Piazza added that we also need to thank Shirley for answering all the phone calls.

Mayor Piazza stated we have two agenda items on this special meeting at the request of Councilman Touchet and Councilman Broussard. One is to approve a quote from Bayou Fencing and the other is to approve a quote from LisCo. Both are relative to the Comeaux Park Renovation that is currently taking place. The problem we are having is the ability to get materials. We need to get all this ordered now in order for it to be in and installed by February 2022. Materials are very hard to get so that is why we are having this special meeting.

Councilman Plaisance asked where the invoices will be paid from. Mayor Piazza stated that the fencing project will be paid from the hurricane funds because some of the fences were damaged as a result of the hurricanes. The other invoice will be paid from the borrowed funds. Councilwoman White stated the balance left in the borrowed money is \$214,133.79. The portable restrooms are being paid from the ARPA funds. Councilman Plaisance asked the question because he is concerned if we were to have another emergency and would need those funds. Mayor Piazza stated that he is still optimistic about receiving the remaining money from FEMA. He has a meeting with GOHSEP on January 12, 2022 to discuss this issue.

-01 introduced by Mr. Francis Touchet, Jr. and seconded by Mr. Brady Broussard, Jr. to approve the quote from Bayou Fencing in the amount of \$58,860.21 for fence repairs/replacement at Parker, Shelby-Chester, Vorhoff, Luquette and Delcambre fields and to pay those invoices from hurricane funds. The motion carried unanimously.

-02 introduced by Mr. Francis Touchet, Jr. and seconded by Mr. Brady Broussard, Jr. to approve the quote from LisCo in the amount of \$215,251.00 for canopies and concrete at various ballfields at A. A. Comeaux Park. The motion carried unanimously.

LisCo stated that he will begin work on January 10, 2022. This will be paid from the borrowed funds.

Mayor Piazza stated we are here for this special City Council meeting to discuss a couple of agenda items. Councilman Broussard asked that the we deviate from the agenda to add one item to the agenda for Comeaux Park. Councilman Broussard stated that the sports engineer made his final inspection today on Sellers and Theriot Fields. We need to give the Mayor authorization to accept those two fields as substantially complete with a punch list so that we can take possession of those fields so the high schools can begin using these two fields.

-01 introduced by Mr. Brady Broussard, Jr. and seconded by Mr. Francis Plaisance to deviate from the agenda to add the acceptance of Sellers and Theriot fields with punch list items. The motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Broussard stated that the sports engineer saw nothing out of the ordinary in his final inspection of Sellers and Theriot fields. He has a punch list for both fields. Mayor Piazza stated that once the engineer states that the high schools can play on those fields, he will give them the go ahead because we will not have another meeting between now and the start of their season. Our next meeting falls on Mardi Gras, 3/1/22, so we will not have a meeting that day. The high schools want to start next week. He has met with all three of the schools that play there now, Abbeville High, Harvestime and Vermilion Catholic, to sign the third-party usage field agreements. Those are all in place. This will allow the Mayor to allow them to play since we have the agreements in place and we have the substantial completion of those two fields. That will give them ability to go on the field and the contractor would not be able to come back on us and say the schools messed it up before the end of the contract. Councilman Plaisance asked if the outfields are ready too. Councilman Broussard stated that Don Simpson, the sports engineer, was not saying that. A majority of the outfields were not touched as part of this project. We can't argue with Mother Nature and if they will be wet, then they will be wet. That is not part of what GeoSurfaces did. This would be only for the part that GeoSurfaces did.

-02 introduced by Mr. Brady Broussard, Jr. and seconded by Mr. Francis Plaisance to accept Sellers and Theriot Fields as substantially complete with a punch list so that the high school teams may begin utilizing the fields. The motion carried unanimously.

-03 introduced by Mr. Brady Broussard, Jr. and seconded by Mr. Francis Plaisance to accept option number 2 in the amount of \$222,897.18 for the renewal of property, inland marine/equipment, commercial auto physical, airport liability and boiler machinery coverage effective March 1, 2022 with Thompson, Smith and Leach. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Rivera stated that there may a buy down option to reduce the boiler and machinery coverage deductible from \$250,000 to \$50,000 for an additional premium of \$900 for electrical apparatuses. If that happens, he will come back with an endorsement later. He will follow up on that and let the Insurance Committee know.

Mayor Piazza asked Mr. Joey Boneski to lead the assembly in prayer. Mayor Piazza asked Chief Bill Spearman to lead the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

-01 introduced by Mr. Francis Plaisance and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to approve the minutes from the Council personnel interview meeting held on December 7, 2021, the Committee meeting held on December 7, 2021 and the regular City Council meetings held on December 7, 2021 and December 21, 2021. Mayor Piazza asked if there were any comments from the public on any agenda item prior to action. There were none.

-02 introduced by Mr. Francis Touchet, Jr. and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to ratify the purchase of radios from Premier Wireless in the amount of \$13,374.40 for the Abbeville Police Department. The radios are under state contract. The motion carried unanimously.

-03 introduced by Mr. Brady Broussard, Jr. and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to approve the quote from Techline in the amount of \$8,934.81 for poles for stock. The motion carried unanimously.

-04 introduced by Ms. Terry Broussard and seconded by Mr. Francis Plaisance to approve payment of estimate for partial payment number 1 in the amount of \$54,413.41 payable to Patriot Construction for the LaFitte Park Walking Trail project. The motion carried unanimously.

- -05 introduced by Mr. Francis Plaisance and seconded by Mr. Francis Touchet, Jr. to approve change order number 1 relative to the LaFitte Park Walking Trail project. The change order does not change the contract price. The motion carried unanimously.
- -06 introduced by Ms. Terry Broussard and seconded by Ms. Roslyn White to approve payment of estimate for partial payment #3 (final) payable to Glenn Lege Construction in the amount of \$12,582.34 for the North and South Hollingsworth Drive and Cypress Street milling and overlay. The motion carried unanimously.
- -07 introduced by Ms. Roslyn White and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to approve change order #2 relative to the North and South Hollingsworth Drive and Cypress Street milling and overlay project. The change order reduces the contract price in the amount of \$75.00. The motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Piazza stated this is a project estimated to cost \$1.5 million. The grant is \$1,000,000 and we will utilize \$500,000 from the ARPA funds. The project will aid the west side of the City and will increase the sewer capacity.

# Chris Gautreaux, Public Works Director

He and Stewart had a debriefing regarding how they could have been more efficient and what could have been done different, regarding the emergency at Felicity Substation. We will need to cut the trees to install the new transformer when it comes in. They filled out the sabotage report together. Stewart is in the process of pricing a transformer. That may take five to twelve months to get a replacement. They will be meeting with the insurance adjuster tomorrow. Mayor Piazza stated that the transformer is not readily available so in the meantime we are getting prices from an electrical contractor to run a connection line to Gertrude. That will happen pretty quickly. We will need a price and we also need to know who can get here the fastest. Stewart stated once they begin work it will take about 2 days to run the line. Chris asked if we still need three quotes since an emergency declaration has been issued. Mayor Piazza stated that we will have to talk to Harvey Dubois about that regarding a price for a turn key job to replace the transformer. That way it is a public works contract and we would not need to go out for bids. Councilman Touchet stated that we need to talk about how we will protect our infrastructure in the future. We will need a master plan for that. Mayor Piazza stated that he has already reached out to Mike Marcotte. He has a few suggestions and Harvey

- works with a lot of big providers and we are researching all avenues. He thanked Stewart and his crew for their hard work and efforts on this.
- Since 12/1/2021, the water department has repaired 33 water leaks in the City. They have two pending. They are keeping a log. Those guys get out there and they hustle to get them done.
- He is working with Councilwoman White on Graceland. We have a problem with about 160 feet of line there. We are working in conjunction with the Police Jury to replace the line and getting them to overlay that intersection. It is a 2-inch galvanized line. It is not on the map and we are not sure if it feeds anyone. Mr. Gene will assist us to put a tracer on it to see if it does feed anybody. If it doesn't then we can cap it on both ends and eliminate that problem. There have been about 8 repairs in that one section. It is time we do something. Councilwoman White stated that we will dig up the line and either abandon it if we can and if not, we will cut it out and put a good piece of pipe so we don't have to break the road again. Juror Wayne Touchet and Juror Paul Bourgeois both will assist in the overlay of the street once the repair is complete. We need to make sure whatever is going on, sub-surface, is taken care of first.
- Bihm Construction put in the by-pass at the wastewater treatment plant. They are there now to complete the cleaning of the main lift station. There are a lot of debris like bricks, gravel, 2X4's and other stuff. That money will be well spent. We are paying for this from the ARPA funds.
- The last couple of weeks the sewer crew have been working on locating a strong sewer smell on Lorraine and Odea. They found grease plugs in both areas and remove those to alleviate the smell.
- They no longer need it so they haven't picked that up in years. We are at a point now that we can't hardly turn trucks around there. He has eliminated a lot of trash from going in there since he started. We are now hauling tires to the solid waste plant. During the day, people just drive by and throw trash. If the gates are locked, they throw it at the door. It is becoming a big problem and we need that placed cleaned up. He has plans to keep it clean. He has exhausted all of the avenues of people coming to get it for free. He has received quotes and they range from \$65,000 to \$35,000. The Police Jury will not accept it. It is hard to get rid of concrete and blacktop. The solid waste plant will not take it. We need to make the yard more presentable and he will need help from the City Council. - He has also consulted with Mr. Gene regarding some water drainage issues at Comeaux Park. With all the concrete being poured, we need to see where all the water will go. There is an issue on the back side of the property. That is where all the water goes. We will be proactive with that and see if we can work on those issues.
- They will start boring in the park to place the underground utilities on Thursday.
- Thank you for approving the quote to clean up the City Yard. Once it is clean, we will go to the next steps. We will fix the fence and seal the fence on the outside. City forces will do that. After that we will put containers to put the different debris in.
- Councilman Touchet asked Chris is LISCO has started their work at Comeaux Park yet. Chris stated that they have not started.

- Chris stated that the goals are almost hung at McKinley Scott Park. He poured some extra concrete there too. Councilwoman Broussard thanked Chris for the work being done in her district. Ms. Stacey Neal, the Director of Community Competitiveness with LED was at the meeting tonight to discuss the strategic plan for economic development for the City of Abbeville as part of the Louisiana Development Ready Communities program. Ms. Neal stated that 48 communities have gone through this process. Abbeville it the 49<sup>th</sup>. LDRC started in 2009. It is to come up with a strategic plan for community development. The things that we focus on in this are the things that industry is looking at when they are looking at your community. It makes the community take a hard look at what you have and what you need. We want to set realistic goals on those things we can realistically accomplish. We do not want to set expectations that are not really there. A

lot of time, when we come into communities, what we find is that we have to start at the base level. We have to identify funding before we can move into the next level of a plan. Anne Falgout contacted her last spring or early summer and asked her to do a zoom with the Mayor as an introduction to LDRC. Abbeville applied for the program. We started this in July of last year. We met with the committee. The Council approved a resolution to move forward with this process last June. We came in July and had a kickoff meeting. At that point in time, there was an assessment done of the community. The committee researched the quality-of-life things that industry would be interested in to help them be successful. We did a community survey and over 200 surveys came back. That is an astronomically number for a community this size. The committee did a great job with that. There were a lot of the same things said over and over again. That is good because it shows that everybody has that same focus of what needs to be done. Between the community assessment and the survey, we did a SWOT analysis and then we came up with some draft goals. LED's role in this is facilitation and they match up the City with resources. The committee and this community did these things. LED just facilitated and kept it on the rails. From there we did a public meeting of what came out of those goals. Drainage got added at that meeting and other things. We were here for a whole day and had a very good turnout. We finally did our second goal meeting in December to try to get everything cleaned up. Here we are today. The plan will be announced by LED On February 16, 2022. The Council has been given a copy of the plan. Benefits that you get by being an LDRC are that everyone knows where you are heading and this will help your community. Our private managers match up projects to communities that are on that map. They know that they will come in here and have a leadership that will work with them. They know that you will have all the things needed for a project to be successful here. We also have tuition assistance and will prepare testimonial videos of the good things happening in Abbeville. It takes locals to make this successful. Without our local economic development folks, we don't know what is going on here every day. If you have some good stuff going on, LED wants to know. We need to know what is going on so we can sell you. On the 16<sup>th</sup> you will be recognized as a certified City. You will be put on all of LED's mapping stuff and we will start working for you. Then this community will have to implement this plan. Mayor Piazza stated there will be a luncheon at the old Riverfront and we will invite the chamber of commerce and some of the business community leaders. It is open to the community and we will ask for a head count. Ms. Neal stated that Secretary Pierson will go over the entire plan at the luncheon. The plan will be available for the public at that time. This is a living, breathing document and things can be changed as needed. These are not set in stone. As we check things off then we can add new things to it. They will help you do that. Councilwoman White stated that the committee is a living committee and continues to work on the checklist. We currently have one person working on economic development, Anne Falgout, but now we have expanded that times 90 because we have the State team working for us. This is at no cost to the City of Abbeville. It was done completely with volunteer labor and under the umbrella of LED. We will post the plan on the website after February 16<sup>th</sup>. Mayor Piazza stated that he has never been a big fan of these types of plans because there was usually no funding available to implement the plan. Now with all the federal grants coming from the infrastructure bill there may be money available to do this. There are finances out there that we need to go after.

- Yesterday was the deadline to report for the 2021 Community Challenge AARP grant. The fit trail at LaFitte Park is complete. Easiest grant we have ever had.

The Garden Club planted the pansies in Harmony Park and the materials have been purchased to build the garden beds.

### Chris Gautreaux, Public Works Director

- We had our annual audit at the Water Plant. He has not yet seen the final results but Roger said we did really well. One thing is that we will have to change our water sample taps.
- The water crew had 30 water leaks in the month of January. 25 have been fixed and the other 5 are pending Louisiana One Calls before they can be fixed.
- The electrical crew is busy doing service calls and working at Comeaux Park.
- We finished the basketball court at McKinley Scott Park. Paul Tomino painted the court and got the goals up. The kids love it.
- The trash still has not yet been cleaned up at the City yard. He is still waiting for Larry with HIDCO. He said he is coming and the weather is holding him back right now.
- The street crew is busy working in Comeaux Park and in several districts and doing what they can around the weather.
- A salesman stopped by the office and discussed an interesting machine for road cut patches. They make a trailer that you put cold mix in and it heats the cold mix so you can work with it. It also has a sprayer on it where you can spray down the whole once you clean it. It also has a packer on the trailer that allows you to pack it down good. Then you spray it to seal the patch. That doesn't allow water to get in it. He and the Mayor have been discussing this equipment. A 4-ton machine is about \$60,000.00 and he is awaiting a price on a 2-ton machine. Mayor Piazza stated that the last time we hired a contract crew it was \$36,000.00. Before that it was \$32,000.00 and before that it was \$50,000.00. It is getting more and more expensive. He and Chris have been discussing this for quite a while. Sometimes we have to wait months to get a road patch fixed. We keep having to put limestone over and over. Councilman Touchet asked if ARPA funds could be used. Mayor Piazza answered that maybe we could. Chris stated that he is doing concrete when he can because concrete is quicker. Mayor Piazza stated that he prefers us to use concrete on a concrete road and use asphalt on an asphalt road. Chris has been working with the Police Jury for the very large road cuts or those that are severely deteriorated.
- Chris stated that we have the large patch on Graceland that we will work with the Police Jury. Larry will order the water pipe for the side of the shoulder. Councilwoman White stated that she spoke to Gary today and he said to go ahead with our crew and do the work and as soon as it warms up, he will put us on the front of the list to overlay that portion. Chris stated they still not have been able to see who the water line feeds. Mayor Piazza stated that Larry said he would try to do it on the shoulder so that he would not have to cut the road anymore. There are also two bad road cuts on Maude that he is working on. They go all the way across the road.
- Mayor Piazza asked Chris about the rotor repair. Mr. Gene Sellers stated the contractor had another setback so it has been pushed back to April.

# Tommy Picard, Park Director QSA

- You need to go see Sellers Field. When it is finished, it will be the nicest high school field in the state of Louisiana. Councilwoman White asked Tommy to share the video with Allie so she can post it on the City page. Tommy stated that they will go to Theriot Field next.
- The covers are on Parker and only have Vorhoff left. Councilman Touchet stated that he is concerned about Abbeville High School and Vermilion Catholic. Baseball season is coming up so he asked Chris and the Mayor to work with Tommy. He asked Tommy to go through Chris to schedule the work. Chris will get the answers from the Mayor. Those schools are relying on us to get this done. We need to get a punch list on each of these

- fields and knock that out. Take advantage of the weather we have. Tommy stated that we are waiting for the mounds. They should be in pretty soon. We should not rush it. We rushed it with this sod thing at Sellers Field and that was a mistake.
- They have a tournament on March 18<sup>th</sup>. It is an adult softball tournament. There will be 120 teams. They come play all night long. They will play on Sellers and Theriot. They will finish Sunday night.

#### Councilman Francis Plaisance

- The Louisiana Cattle Festival is coming back October the  $7^{th}$ ,  $8^{th}$ , and  $9^{th}$ . The pageant will be held March  $5^{th}$ .
- On March 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, The Zerbini Family Circus will be at the Red Barn. They will have 2 performances each day.

# Councilman Brady Broussard, Jr.

- We have a need for jail space. The police department is picking up (panhandlers) and booking them and there is no place to put them so they are going back on our street and are repeating the crime. It is a revolving door and it is because they cannot place them in a jail cell. We are responsible for finding jail space when there is none. The City of Abbeville had a jail and for whatever reason we don't have it now. He has been getting complaints about the panhandlers who make a living on our corners. The police department pick them up and book them 6,7,8 times and then let them go and they are right back in the same place. We better start thinking outside of the box about how we will take these people off of our streets.

### Councilman Francis Touchet, Jr.

Asked Ike if we are prosecuting these panhandlers. Ike answer yes and we have been doing it the entire time that he has been a prosecutor for the City. We have hot spots. We used to have problems at Robies. Now we have problems on Charity Street and the By-Pass. Two weeks ago, in his packet of cases, he had the same guy on three different panhandling type charges. We can't put them in Iberia Parish Jail where we have beds that we pay for. Mayor Piazza stated we can't put them there because those offenses are misdemeanor offenses. They will not take them in any of the jails for a misdemeanor. Councilman Touchet asked if the officers are seeing about this problem. Chief Spearman answered yes. If they are in the road or if they are violating an ordinance, his officers are taking care of it. Ike stated that generally we get the complaint from the business. Mayor Piazza stated if the property owner allows them to be there, we cannot do anything. Ike stated we can deal with those that are on the right-of-way. If the property owner calls to report a panhandler on their property, then the police respond to that. Chief Spearman stated they can prosecute those on the right-of-way. They are issued a citation. Councilman Broussard stated that if there is an arrest then the police cannot put them in jail because of the jail space issue. Councilman Touchet stated that we need to continue to do what we have to do so that these people understand that they can't do that here. Mayor Piazza stated that Councilman Broussard is incorrect. Chief Spearman cannot put a person in jail for a misdemeanor. All he can do is issue him a citation. The judge at City Court is the only one that can put a person in jail for a misdemeanor. Ike stated the judge can order someone to go to jail if they fail to pay their bond. Mayor Piazza stated however the parish jail does not have to take them because it is for a misdemeanor. Ike stated that we do not have our own jail facility. When we did, we could use that as our leverage in order to get people to pay their bond. Grandma would come in and pay Junior's fine so Junior wouldn't have to go to the Abbeville City Jail.

He thanked the constituents of District B for him having no opposition again. He will be here at this table for another four years. In the twenty years he has been on this Council, something happened during qualifying time that he is very disappointed in. He will take an active role with whoever will be on this Council because he really believes that there are certain people that did certain things that tried to get people to run against him that were not even in his district. You have to be kidding me. You were disrespectful to the citizens of District B and himself. We have people that come to this Council that don't even belong in our parish that come over here and talk about this, that or whatever that get on the phone and say things like we still have time to get somebody against him. These people need to grow up. Mayor Piazza has done an excellent job and you will be ending your term. We will have a new Council and a new Mayor and we will have a new Chief. Elections have consequences. If the citizens of Abbeville don't understand that, then we will have the same old, same old take place. That is what it comes down to. We have to make sure that we put people in office that will stick to their word and do the things that they have to do. He pledges to this Council, to the future Council and to the community that we will work on safety. He doesn't feel safe. His kids don't feel safe in this community. We need to work on economic development. We have 50+ buildings that are not occupied. We need to work on cleaning our City. Those three things will make all the difference of what we will do as far as moving this City forward. He is not from here. He has been here; he is not leaving and his family is here. Elections have consequences. People need to go and do the things they have to do or else it will be the same old, same old. Mayor Piazza congratulated Councilman Touchet for him running unopposed. He wanted to follow up on something that he said. Many economic development people will tell you that cleanliness of your City is the number one thing you need to concentrate on to attract people to your City. If you can't pick up your own litter then you will never attract a major company into your City to open up business and to hire people. We suffered a huge loss, because of some of the actions at the Police Jury, that made Sheriff Couvilion have to discontinue his litter abatement program. That was a huge loss to this parish. That was the main topic at the Keep Abbeville Beautiful meeting held last week. We need to keep the entrances to this City clean and losing that litter abatement program with the Sheriff, that was not his fault but because of actions of the Police Jury, has really hurt us with the ability to pick up litter in this parish.

# Councilwoman Roslyn White

- Congratulated Councilman Touchet on him running unopposed for the District B seat.
- On the last cleanup day, she picked up herself with Nikki, walking from Highway 14 to St. Francis Woods subdivision, 7 bags of trash. It is a problem and people will see it and absolutely no company will come and invest in Abbeville if we have piles of trash, litter and roadside debris littering our roads. It is problem that we need to work on and it is a problem that we need to work with the Police Jury to try to solve. They are in charge of waste pickup and waste management. It is something we have to focus on.
- Thanks to KAB for allowing us the volunteer them to help out with the economic development plan.
- November 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> will be the Omelette Festival this year.

There being no further business to discuss, Mayor Piazza declared this meeting adjourned.

Mayor Piazza asked Mr. Richard Dubois to lead the assembly in prayer. Mayor Piazza asked Mr. Gerald Gaspard to lead the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

-01 introduced by Mr. Francis Plaisance and seconded by Mr. Brady Broussard, Jr. to appoint Blake Miller, Terry Grice, Erin LaPoint and Brittany Hebert Kent to the position of Police Officer with the Abbeville Police Department, pending successful completion of all post-hire assessments. The motion carried unanimously.

-02 introduced by Mr. Francis Plaisance and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to ratify bills paid in the month of January 2022. The motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Piazza asked if there were any comments from the public on any agenda item prior to action. There were none.

-03 introduced by Ms. Terry Broussard and seconded by Mr. Brady Broussard, Jr. to enter into a public hearing to discuss ,with the property owner, the demolition of a dilapidated camper and abatement of all trash/rubbish off the property located at 511 S. Young Street. The motion carried unanimously.

## **Public Hearing**

The owner of the property stated that she needed more time to have the camper demolished. Her husband had a stroke. Councilwoman Broussard stated that she realizes he is not well. She has been receiving complaints from the neighbors. The property owner requested 30 days.

-04 introduced by Mr. Brady Broussard, Jr. and seconded by Ms. Roslyn White to reconvene the regular meeting from the public hearing. The motion carried unanimously.

-05 introduced by Ms. Terry Broussard and seconded by Mr. Francis Plaisance to grant the property owner of 511 S. Young Street 30 days to get the camper demolished or removed off the property. The motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Piazza stated that he had received a letter from Representative Clay Higgins about grant opportunities. He distributed the letter to the Council. He has also received other documentation from LMA which he distributed too. He also received some correspondence from Anne Falgout about this topic too. He wanted to make the Council is aware that there are a lot of grants and funding opportunities out there. The letter he received from Representative Higgins has 25 different competitive infrastructure funding opportunities for local governments in the form of grants. There may be more out there because the terms and conditions of the infrastructure bill is just being rolled out now. What types of grants, how to apply for them, and how much money is allotted in each grant are all different. There are some great opportunities out there. We have talked about transportation grants before and there are things for buses and bus facilities which could include bus stops. There are infrastructure grants for roads, streets and bridges. There is a very big variety of grants. There are things that would include crosswalks and other things. They also have things about reconnecting communities for parks and other infrastructure to address legacy impacts. Another one is the Brownfield remediation which would include asbestos remediation. That would affect our blighted properties. Asbestos remediation is a big expense when it comes to blighted properties. There are some in there for flood mitigation. We can always use grant money for drainage issues. In the past we have used Richard Minvielle for the majority of our grants. He is talking about retirement. He still does want to do some grant work but he no longer wants to do federal grant work. Federal grant work is very competitive and there is a lot of paperwork involved. It is very confusing and requires matching dollars. We may need to either look for another grant writer or look to Mr. Gene's office or Mr. Primeaux's office in the future. We have used your firms for mostly water, sewer, drainage and road projects. These grants go beyond that. If there is some interest from either one of you, we would like to know that. If the Council wants to seek a grant writer, that is something that you need to discuss. There is so much money out there and it will take a lot of tedious work to apply for these grants and keep up with them. Councilwoman White stated that she spoke with Mr. Gene and called Mr. Primeaux and also spoke with Todd. Richard gave her a list of other people who do the CDBG programs and gave us some recommendations on that if we should choose to go that route. Todd Vincent assured her that he has two grant writers that will be keeping up with all of these federal grants that are available and he will make those people available to us for any grants we want to go after. It is an option to go through Sellers & Associates for the federal grant money. He also said he would be hiring some additional administrative assistants to make sure they can handle the paperwork. That is one option. You have to first start with the projects before you can write the grant. We need to figure out which projects we want to go after then match the money pots with them. Mayor Piazza stated that normally it starts with an idea then you develop a plan or there is some type of grant that you want to pursue then you have the grant writer reach out, look online or call that department and see exactly if what you want will fit into that grant opportunity. It takes some leg work. He advises the Council, if they choose to reach out to a grant

writer, that they have them do that research. LMA has a grant writer that can advise the Council on some potential grants. Most of that would be through the State. The State has some matching grants for water and wastewater infrastructure so there will be an opportunity there. Some of these grants have deadlines that are not that far off. It needs some attention if the Council wants to pursue these grants that the federal government is dishing out so you will need to act now. You need to decide who you want to use as a grant writer and reach out to that individual or that company. He advised the Police Chief and the Fire Chief to do the same thing. These grants are very competitive. There is a lot of grant money available out there. Recently, only 28 of the applicants received funding out of 300 for the Water Sector Program grant.

# Gene Sellers, Engineer

- We received a letter from DOTD. They had a few comments for the Sidewalk project. We are responding to them at this time and they expect to have that project let by the end on June 2022.
- Abbeville's application for the Water Sector program was missed only by 3 points. They will have a second round but there are a lot of people who didn't do it the first time so you will be back in the mix.

# Richard Primeaux, Engineer

 His office does do federal grants and other grants. He did look at some of the funding opportunities and there are some that may apply. His office is currently researching the opportunities.

### Mayor Mark Piazza

We should be complete with both Sellers Field and Theriot Field by the end of the week. They turf is laid down and the sand has been applied at Sellers and they are in the process of doing that at Theriot. Stewart should be almost finished at Sellers and moving on to Luquette. He has already completed Theriot. The street crew has been assisting with a

- lot of dress work. A lot of the concrete has been laid and most of the roofs and structures are finished. The bleachers should be in any day. Things are progressing very rapidly and very well. We ran into a few problems with drainage but nothing that we didn't expect.
- He met with Councilwoman White, Anne Falgout and Charlene Beckett regarding Tiffany Plaza. Tiffany Plaza has been purchased. They met with the new owner. He is from Houston. He seems to have a great deal of financial backing and he is open to remodeling the Tiffany Plaza commercial complex. We made suggestions about the parking lot and some of the buildings and he was very open to those. He is open to working with businesses and individuals and wants to change some of the makeup of some of the buildings. It was very exciting news. He has made a substantial financial investment in this property and intends to continue to make a substantial financial investment into the property. He wants to renovate it so he can start getting tenants there. We threw out many suggestions that would benefit Abbeville like different types of businesses, activities, and things for the kids and he was open to all suggestions. He was very thankful. He will be working very closely with Anne Falgout and he will seek out any grant opportunities that may help him. Councilwoman White added that he will also be here in our community actively participating. He will have an active role here.
- He also had a meeting with Don Benoit. He owns D & T Crawfish by Maximart. He has a very huge wholesale and commercial crawfish operation. He has purchased the old Fruit of the Loom building. He has big plans for that building. He is negotiating with one major corporation. He is encouraged and he believes they are very close to making a deal. Anne Falgout has been working very closely with him. He will do something with that building. That is encouraging news too.
- There is an interested party in the old Stine Lumber building. He is not at liberty to say who or what at this time but it was very encouraging. If that deal goes through, people will be very surprised and excited to see what will happen with that building.

# Bill Spearman, Police Chief

- In the last two weeks they have handled 320 calls.
- We had 68 complaints and we removed 53 subjects. That are all our loiters near McDonald's and Burger King and Circle K. 95% of those were panhandlers. The jail did refuse to keep them however. We bring them back here and write a citation. We keep them as long on the bench and book them in as long as we can. That is all we can do.

# Jude Mire, Fire Chief

- Discussed calls responded to and personnel. All stations are ok. The truck on the west side had to go to the shop because it had a leaking water tank but it was under warranty so they fixed it. The truck on the By-pass is out right now. It is in the shop being repaired. They had 211 calls since January 1, 2022. There have been a lot of grass fires lately. There is currently a burn ban. Mayor Piazza asked if the sugarcane farmers are exempt from the burn ban. Chief Jude stated only if they have been to the class and they were taught the proper way to burn. They need to have the certificate from the State. They can also ask for permission from the Fire Chief to burn. Right now, he is not giving permission to anyone.
- We have placed 30 of the smoke detectors and still have about 90 left.
- He received a call last Monday that we will be getting our reimbursement for Hurricane Laura. Mayor Piazza has allowed the fire department to go help lowa after the hurricane.
- Chief Kelly is going to the Rotary meeting tomorrow. Last year they donated a boat to us and this time they may be giving us a rescue tool. That is a \$10,000 piece of equipment. It is the "jaws of life".

- He applied for AFG grant for a brand-new aerial truck. Theirs is 20 years old. The grant is for \$950,000 and a new aerial will cost about \$1,200,000.

## Allie Horton, Digital Media Assistant

- She has worked with the Nehemiah Project on the Black History Month Campaign. She interviewed some former graduates of Herod on Friday to get personal stories on their education. She highlighted black owned businesses last week.
- She is starting to promote Sounds on the Square and the Black History Month exhibit at the Cultural Center.
- She is starting to plan content for the month of March because that is when her baby is due. That will be Women's History Month so she is planning those posts so they will automatically post. Councilwoman White stated that she could take over the posts for the month of March.
- She is working with Mrs. Ann Hardy on the Municipal Civil Service Board page on the website and job postings. She also got with Kathy at the Meridional and she will send a proof of the job posting.
- We are having a lot of French tourists that are coming visiting the Tourist Center and groups are coming in to view the voting rights exhibit.

## Councilwoman Roslyn White

- Tomorrow we will have the LDRC certification luncheon at the old Riverfront. We were not able to make it open to the public because it is not big enough so we will have limited seating. We sent out invitations to all the parties listed that we will need cooperation in order to execute the plan. Once that is done, she and Allie will post the plan on the City's website and share it on Facebook so that everyone will have access to it. It will be an exciting day because we will have our final plan and will be able to start executing it. We have a good list and 48 people have RSVP'd and they are any where's from the State to Lafayette planning and all the local agencies here. It should be a very good luncheon.

## Councilman Brady Broussard, Jr.

- When you are traveling eastbound into Downtown, on Highway 14, and you get to the Main Street light, and turn south on Main, there is not a turning lane there. Our citizens are complaining because if you are parked at the light with your blinker on to turn right, cars are passing on the side of you to turn right (south on) on the shoulder. That is not a turning lane and he would like Chris to talk to Randy with DOTD to see if they can do anything with this. He asked Lieutenant Jonathan Touchet to explain this issue to the Police Chief. It is not a turning lane and people are doing that and collisions and near collisions are occurring. Citizens are asking for a solution for that.

# Councilwoman Terry Broussard

- Williams Scholar Academy will have its first Spring Gala, Saturday, March 19, 2022 at Magdalen Place. It will begin at 7:00 PM. It includes a dinner, drinks, auctions and entertainment. It is semi-formal. If anyone is interested, please contact Nicole Desormeaux. She has her phone number.

# Councilman Francis Plaisance

- Discussed the dilapidated properties across from Popeye's. We have sent letters to these people but he does not what else we can do. It is terrible and an awful sight. These people do have a right to have a place to live but we need to try to do something.

**BE IT KNOWN AND REMEMBERED**, that pursuant to a public notice, a regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council of the City of Abbeville was held on the 15th day of March, 2022, commencing at 5:30 o'clock p.m. at City Hall, 101 North State Street, Abbeville, Louisiana, where the following resolution was moved, duly seconded, passed and adopted, to-wit:

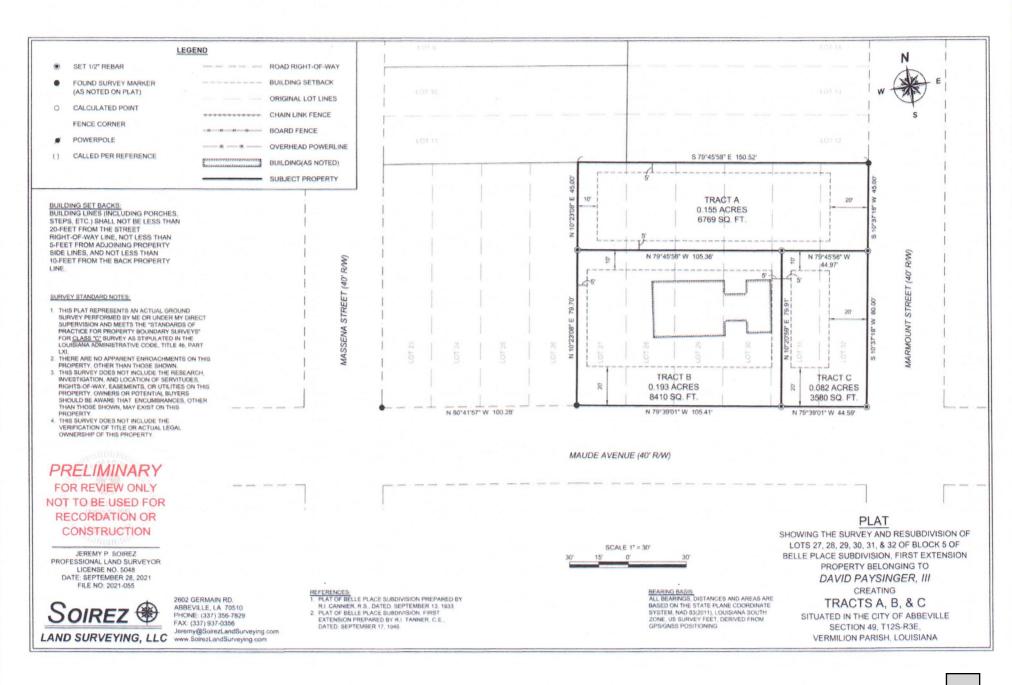
