The Mayor and Council of the City of Abbeville met for a committee meeting on June 7, 2022 at 5:15 P.M., at the regular meeting place, the Council Meeting Room located at 101 North State Street, Abbeville, Louisiana, with the Honorable Mark Piazza, Mayor, presiding.

Mayor Piazza stated we are here for an Ordinance Committee meeting chaired by Councilwoman Terry Broussard. He turned the floor over to Councilwoman Terry Broussard. Councilwoman Broussard stated that we only have one agenda item and that is to consider an ordinance annexing the Hollier Property, owned by the City, into the corporate limits.

Mr. Funderburk stated that we negotiated with the Hollier family to acquire property that is adjacent to the Abbeville RV Park. We have successfully closed the sale and the City is now the owner of $6\frac{3}{4}$ acres of property that fronts on Coulee Kinney. We need to annex the property so that it is in our corporate limits.

Mayor Piazza stated we are here to interview two candidates for the position of Firefighter with the Abbeville Fire Department. At the beginning of the meeting, there was no quorum but Mayor Piazza stated that we could still interview the two applicants. Councilman Plaisance, Councilwoman Broussard and Councilman Broussard were not in attendance at the beginning of the meeting. The applicants were Leslie "Les" Hollister and Lucas Meaux. Mayor Piazza and the Council members who were in attendance at the time, began the interviews individually with each candidate. Prior to the adjournment of the meeting, Councilman Plaisance and Councilwoman Broussard arrived at the meeting.

Mayor Piazza asked Chief Jude Mire to lead the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Piazza led those assembled in prayer.

-01 introduced by Mr. Francis Plaisance and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to accept the resignation of Trevor Eaton from the Abbeville Fire Department effective June 21, 2022. The motion carried unanimously.

-02 introduced by Mr. Francis Plaisance and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to authorize the creation of the classification of Utility Collection Specialist II and to change the Utility Collection Specialist classification to Utility Collection Specialist I. Both positions are in the Central Office. The motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Piazza stated that the position would have to be created and the job description would have to be written and then approved by both the Civil Service Board and the City Council before the position can be filled.

Chief Jude Mire and Mayor Piazza recognized Captain Keith Huntsberry and Assistant Chief Jason Harmon for their recent retirement. Captain Huntsberry retired after 33 years of service and Assistant Chief Harmon served 25 years. Both retirees were presented with a certification of appreciation from the City.

-03 introduced by Francis Plaisance and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to approve the minutes from the Committee meeting held on May 3, 2022, the regular City Council meetings held on May

3, 2022 and May 17, 2022 and the special City Council meeting held on May 17, 2022. The motion carried unanimously.

-04 introduced by Ms. Terry Broussard and seconded by Mr. Francis Plaisance to ratify bills paid in the month of May 2022. The motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Piazza asked if there were any comments from the public on any agenda item prior to action. There were none.

Mr. Steven Menard was at the meeting to request a special event permit for the Vermilion NAACP to hold a motorcade for the Juneteenth Celebration. It would be held on June 17, 2022. The motorcade will be made up of the queens. He has already visited with the police department about the motorcade. We will begin at the old Hibernia bank building, then proceed down Charity Street, then turn on Hospital Lane and end up at the Red Barn on Rodeo Road. We will gather at 5:30 PM, then we will have a prayer at 7:30 PM and then proceed with the motorcade. Mr. Funderburk stated that he has not yet received the appropriate documentation that is required for the permit.

-05 introduced by Ms. Terry Broussard and seconded by Mr. Francis Plaisance to grant the special event permit for the motorcade as discussed contingent upon the receipt of all necessary documentation and the meeting of all the requirements of the permit. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Steve Moosa discussed a graph presentation of the audit for the fiscal year ended 12/31/2021. It depicted revenues and expenses in various funds. There were no findings on the audit. The Louisiana Legislative Auditor has reimplemented the Agreed Upon Procedures (AUP) after relaxing the requirements during COVID. He also discussed the AUPs. It is a recommendation on best practices and not a finding. The requirements were put in place as of January 2022. We will assist with updating policy and procedures and segregation of duties as needed.

-07 introduced by Mr. Francis Plaisance and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to approve the renewal from UMR for employee health insurance, Tokio Marine HCC for stoploss coverage and the group Medicare Advantage Program for retirees for the policy year from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023. The motion carried unanimously.

-08 introduced by Mr. Brady Broussard, Jr. and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to table the approval of the quote from Bayou Fencing for fencing around the tennis courts at Comeaux Park because Councilman Touchet was not at the meeting and it was unknown where the invoice would be paid from. Mayor Piazza recognized Ms. Charlene Beckett for a very successful Daylily Festival and he asked her to provide a report about it.

Charlene Beckett, Main Street Manager

- They had 34 vendors for the Daylily Festival. We had vendors from Mississippi, Lake Charles, Forest Hill, Franklinton and locally too. We had educational displays from the Bonsai Society and the Abbeville Garden Club. We had two educational speakers in the Cultural Center and the 4-H Garden Club winners were also announced. There were over 160 people that walked in and out of the Cultural Center. We had less vendors than we normally do but we had more people that came this year. We had good weather. She thanked the Police Department, Chris and the City workers and Tommy.
- We received the trash can grant from Keep Louisiana Beautiful for LaFitte Park and we also received another grant to purchase garbage grabbers, gloves and other supplies.

Chris Gautreaux, Public Works Director

- The fountain at Magdalen Square is back on and working.
- The Water Department fixed 25 water leaks, replaced two fire hydrants and have completed the drinking water tap relocations.
- The Sewer Department resolved 12 major blockages and made a few other minor repairs.
- The cement has been poured at the tennis court.
- We are still working to get all the hydrants changed. It is a slow process.

Tommy Picard, Park and Recreation Director, QSA

- The pickle ball court has been set up in the recreation center. We will need to get cushions for the poles.
- Tournament season is winding down. We don't have one this week.
- The American Legion State tournament will be played here in July.

This was the last meeting of Mayor Mark Piazza after serving as Mayor for 20 years. This was also the last meeting of Councilman Plaisance after serving as Councilman-at-Large for 16 years.

Mayor Piazza asked Pastor Steve Delino to lead those assembled in prayer. Mayor Piazza asked Councilman Plaisance to lead the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

-01 introduced by Mr. Francis Plaisance and seconded by Ms. Roslyn White to appoint Leslie "Les" Hollister and Lucas Meaux to the position of Firefighter with the Abbeville Fire Department, pending successful completion of all post-hire procedures. The motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Touchet had a special recognition of Mayor Piazza and Councilman Plaisance. He stated that tonight will end for two men who have been very important to the City of Abbeville. This is their last meeting. They have brought so much over the years. Mayor has served 32 years (12 as Councilman and 20 as Mayor) and Councilman Plaisance served 16 years. It is important to take some time out of our meeting to honor these two individuals. Both of them have done so much for the citizens of Abbeville and we should always be grateful and we should show our appreciation. He knows that, in this retirement part where they are moving towards, they will enjoy their families and spend time with their grandkids. He began by reading a proclamation aloud for Councilman Plaisance and also presented him a plaque. He then followed by reading a proclamation aloud for Mayor Piazza and also presented him a plaque. He congratulated both of them on their retirement. They have both done great work for the City of Abbeville.

-02 introduced by Mr. Francis Plaisance and seconded by Ms. Roslyn White to deviate from the agenda to approve a quote from DeHart Shipyard in the amount of \$7,387.00 to repair the water/slurry (sludge) tank truck. The motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Piazza asked if there were any public comments on any agenda item prior to action. There were none.

-03 introduced by Ms. Terry Broussard and seconded by Mr. Francis Plaisance to receive public comments regarding the adoption of an ordinance to annex the Hollier property which is owned by the City of Abbeville, into the corporate limits of the City of Abbeville. The property is located adjacent to the Abbeville RV Park and fronts Coulee Kinney. The motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Piazza announced that we are in a public hearing and asked if there were any comments from the public on the proposed ordinance. There were none.

-04 introduced by Mr. Francis Touchet, Jr. and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to close the public hearing and reconvene the regular meeting. The motion carried unanimously.

Plaisance/T. Broussard Ordinance 22-02

An ordinance to annex the Hollier property, which is owned by the City of Abbeville, into the corporate limits of the City.

The motion was put to a vote and the vote thereupon was as follows:

-05 introduced by Mr. Francis Plaisance and seconded by Ms. Roslyn White to approve change order number 1 relative to the Lime Sludge Thickener Unit Rehabilitation project at the Water Treatment Facility. The change order increases the contract amount of \$7,700.00. The motion carried unanimously.

-06 introduced by Mr. Francis Touchet, Jr. and seconded by Ms. Roslyn White to approve estimate for partial payment number 2 (final) in the amount of \$44,442.00 payable to Southern Constructors, LLC for the Lime Sludge Thickener Unit Rehabilitation at the Water Treatment Plant. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Gene Sellers stated that bids were received for the Abbeville Downtown Streetscape Phase 2 project recently. The low bidder was Southern Constructors, LLC however it was \$100,000 over the budget. The state has approved paying for their share of the amount overbudget. That would be an additional amount of \$80,000. After speaking with Mayor Piazza and Mayor-Elect White it was decided that we should accept the extra grant money. Councilwoman White stated that total out of pocket costs for this project will be around \$151,000.00. It will add handicapped accessibility near the City Hall and the Court House. We have about \$72,000 in the budget for street overlay this year. The CPA recommended that we use those funds. The project won't start until later in the year and we can allocate the additional funds needed in next year's budget. Mr.

Gene stated that the state has approved the overlay from Main Street to State Street. That will be a state project and the state will pay for that. It will happen once the sidewalk project is complete.

-07 introduced by Mr. Francis Touchet, Jr. and seconded by Mr. Francis Plaisance to award the contract for the Abbeville Downtown Streetscape Project, Phase 2 to the low bidder, Southern Constructors, LLC and to accept the additional grant funds from the state since the bid is overbudget. The motion carried unanimously.

-08 introduced by Mr. Francis Touchet, Jr. and seconded by Ms. Roslyn White to appoint the Abbeville Meridional as the official journal for the City of Abbeville from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023. The motion carried unanimously.

-09 introduced by Ms. Roslyn White and seconded by Mr. Francis Touchet, Jr. to table payment of application number 6 (final) in the amount of \$119,000.00 payable go GeoSurfaces, Inc. for the Comeaux Park Turf and Lighting project because the lighting and turf still have some issues that have not yet been resolved. The motion carried unanimously.

White/T. Broussard Resolution R22-15

A resolution authorizing the Mayor to execute a termination of easement agreement originally dated 12/20/2000 by the Ollie Trahan Trust et al.

The motion carried unanimously.

-10 introduced by Ms. Roslyn White and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to approve a variance to move a 1999 mobile home from 412 Chevis to 611 N. Lamar. The variance is needed due to the age of the mobile home. The motion carried unanimously.

-11 introduced by Ms. Roslyn White and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to approve a variance to move a new mobile home to 308 Loraine Street. The variance is needed because this is a no mobile home corridor. The motion carried unanimously.

Councilwoman White stated that she is granting the variance to move the mobile home from Chevis to N. Lamar because the mobile home is in excellent shape and it is only being move a few blocks. It will not result in an increase in mobile homes in District A. The new mobile home being placed at 308 Loraine Street replaces a very dilapidated mobile home that was on that property. They have demolished the old mobile home and they are ready to move forward with a brandnew mobile home.

-12 introduced by Ms. Roslyn White and seconded by Ms. Terry Broussard to appoint Nikki Vidos to the Vermilion Economic Development Alliance Board to serve on behalf of the City of Abbeville. This is to replace Mayor-Elect Roslyn White whose term recently expired. The motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Mark Piazza

Since 1990, for the past 32 years, I've had the distinct privilege of serving the City of Abbeville and have a seat at this table. I've served alongside 5 different Chiefs of Police and 13 different City Council Members. I served as the Abbeville City Councilman for District A under Mayor Brady Broussard for 12 of those year. Alongside Mayor Brady and the City Council, many great things happened. The Magdalen Square Gazebo was built, the Abbeville Christmas lights and the Christmas Stroll were started, the Airport Helipad was built, the Louisiana Military Hall of Fame Museum began and the Fruit of the Loom Company was brought to Abbeville, along with several Baseball World Series, Regional and State-wide tournaments, just to name a few. I was then elected in 2002 to the Office of the Mayor, where I served for the past 20 years. The new administration got off to an extremely difficult start by being annihilated by Hurricane Lili after being in office for only 3 months. We were out of electricity for 14 days. Since then, we've been involved in one way or another in 17 major hurricanes, 22 tropical storms and the flood of 2016, the worst in 76 years. But many great things have happened in those years including the building of a new police station, a new fire station, and a state-of-the-art airport terminal, which won us the LMA State Community Achievement Award for Economic Development. Other notable ventures are 3 new City parks, 2 new electrical substations, a flood prevention pond, 2 museums and a downtown Welcome Center with outdoor public restrooms and new handicapped sidewalks, a skateboard park and splash pad, a new Event Center, a walking trail, a fishing pond and dog park, new tennis courts and the elevation of McKinley Scott Park pavilion. We have new turf baseball fields as well as a neighborhood community garden. Our water and wastewater systems have been improved and upgraded numerous times through millions of dollars in CDBG Grant Funds and generators have been installed at every public building. We upgraded the water plant, sewer plant and numerous sewer lift stations. Along with these infrastructure improvements, we've added events to entertain our citizens and promote tourism. We started the Daylily Festival, the Sicilian Celebration, the Blacksmith Shop Museum, Sounds on the Square, the Cake and Ice Cream Festival, the Farmers' Market and Christmas festivities, to name a few. The Abbeville Film and Visitors Commission was created along with the Abbeville Planning and Zoning Board, Parks and Recreation Board, Aviation Board, and my personal favorite, the KAB organization. Thanks to KAB, our Mainstreet Director and the Abbeville Garden Club, we have 8 District Cleanest City contest titles, 3 state titles and we were honored by the State KLB for our beautification efforts. Along, with these efforts, we've also added 2 new entrance signs and a historic downtown clock. But, the additions and improvements to our community have not always been limited to material items. He is proud to have been a part of these accomplishments. Our City employees have received raises 19 out of the 20 years for their hard work and efforts and it has been a pleasure to have worked with all 13 City Council members and to have served the citizens of our great City. He thanked each and every one and wished the best of luck for the incoming administration. He knows they will do a fantastic job. He is not going anywhere if they need any assistance. He thanked everyone for their support over the years and the citizens of Abbeville for giving him the honor of serving our community.

- It has been a pleasure working with Mayor Piazza. It was her first term. Thank you for answering her calls. Thank you for helping. She wished best wishes to Councilman Plaisance and his family. Best wishes for your future endeavors. Get out there and travel.

You have supported this Council as we have done our difficult jobs.

There being no further business to discuss, Mayor Piazza declared his final meeting adjourned.


