

REGULAR ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION AND / OR APPROVAL

1. Discuss windstorm and other related insurance policies and take any action deemed necessary. Scotty Jones, Finance Director

Scotty Jones, Finance Director, opened the discussions stating that the options presented excluded CDC property. Ashley Rivera, Accounting Specialist, presented Council with renewal options for Windstorm Insurance and costs. Shawna Burkhart, City Manager, stated that the Gallager option was the best coverage and second best is option 1 to prepare to go self funded in 19 years. Ms. Burkhart added that she was concerned about the State limiting certificate of obligations and the impact it will have on the city. Councilman Westmoreland stated that the renewal is coming soon. Councilwoman Sitz advised to let this year be our first risk year. Councilman Westmoreland added that if we take out a bond to build or repair something then that structure will have to have windstorm. There were additional discussions regarding current legislation in regard to bonds and bond limits. Mayor Nelson stated that if we were to take out a bond to build a new Police Department then we would not be able to bond more because we've met our debt limit, then even if we self-insure, we can't bond any more money.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

BACKGROUND:

The City carries windstorm coverage on most properties, however during Hurricane Harvey and Hurricane Nicholas—very little has been paid out on claims due to the exclusion of "wind driven rain". The City experienced a 42% increase in 2020, a 9% increase in 2021, and a 20% increase in 2022. In 2022, the Staff requested this to be bid in two ways:

- 1) All properties
- 2) Essential Properties (only critical service buildings)

On April 26, 2022, City Council action was to cover all properties one more year until further discussion on windstorm options could be made.

In October 2022, a windstorm committee was formed. It was concluded at the October 25 meeting to only bid out a select set of essential buildings to the market and obtain a quote from TWIA for the 2023 renewal.

On April 25, 2023, the City Council tabled action to bind windstorm until the following meeting so that all Council members could be present. At that time- Council and Staff were provided assurance by Broker that an extension on a quote would not be a problem if we bind before any storms named or unnamed.

On April 26, 2023, our broker stated that after reaching out to Amrisc—the company stated they were unable to extend the quote but then re-bid as "new business" and more than likely due to the age of the buildings would not offer terms.

Spoke to Ashely this morning, and she informed me that windstorm coverage is going to be tabled until next week's meeting. Please note that as of mid-night tonight, the city will not have any wind/hail coverage.

The AmRisc quote expires today, so I asked for an extension on the quote. Unfortunately, AmRisc is unable to extend the quote to 5/15 while city goes bare.

We will have to re-submit the schedule of locations as new business. We will then be working with another underwriter who does new business. It is likely that AmRisc will not offer terms because coverage is wind/hail only and due to age of the buildings

Quite possible that we will have to utilize another insurance company, which will most probably be higher than the current AmRisc renewal pricing.

AmRisc is renewing older buildings, but is hardly accepting new business with older construction.

Best thing is to make a decision today if city has any interest in purchasing AmRisc.

We can wait if it's TWIA, but there will still be a lapse in coverage.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 66 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BAY CITY, TEXAS BY AMENDING ARTICLE III (TOBACCO PRODUCTS), DIVISION 1 "GENERALLY", DIVISION 2 "DISTRIBUTION TO MINORS; PROVIDING SEVERABILTY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BAY CITY, TEXAS:

Section 1. That Chapter 66, Article III, of the Code of Ordinance shall be amended as follows:

DIVISION 1. – GENERALLY

Sec.66-89. – Definitions

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

"Tobacco product" means:

- (a) a cigar;
- (b) smoking tobacco, including granulated, plug-cut, crimp-cut, readyrubbed, and any form of tobacco suitable for smoking in a pipe or as a cigarette;
 - (c) chewing tobacco, including Cavendish, Twist, plug, scrap, and any kind of tobacco suitable for chewing;
- (d) snuff or other preparations of pulverized tobacco; or
- (e) an article or product that is made of tobacco or a tobacco substitute and that is not a cigarette or an e-cigarette as defined by Section 161.081, Health and Safety Code.

"Cigarette" has the meaning assigned by Section 154.001, Tax Code.

- (a) "E-cigarette" means:
 - (i) an electronic cigarette or any other device that simulates smoking by using a mechanical heating element, battery, or electronic circuit to deliver nicotine or other substances to the individual inhaling from the device; or

- (ii) a consumable liquid solution or other material aerosolized or vaporized during the use of an electronic cigarette or other device described by this subdivision.
- (b) The term "e-cigarette" does not include a prescription medical device unrelated to the cessation of smoking.
- (c) The term "e-cigarette" includes:
 - (i) a device described by this subdivision regardless of whether the device is manufactured, distributed, or sold as an ecigarette, e-cigar, or e-pipe or under another product name or description; and
 - (ii) a component, part, or accessory for the device, regardless of whether the component, part, or accessory is sold separately from the device.

Sec. 66-89 90. – Vaping, Ssmoking and use of tobacco products in city-owned buildings prohibited; exceptions.

- (a) *Prohibition*. Smoking and the use of any tobacco product, including but not limited to cigarettes, cigars, pipes, chewing tobacco and/or snuff, in any city-owned building or enclosed structure is declared to be a health hazard, and is hereby prohibited except as limited by subsection (c) of this section.
- (b) *Penalty*. Violation of subsection (a) of this section by any person shall constitute a Class C misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.
- (c) Exceptions. This section shall not apply to the following city-owned buildings and/or enclosed structures:
 - (1) The residential house located at 2001 Fifth Street, Bay City, Texas 77414.
 - (2) The old fire station located at 2001 Sixth Street, Bay City, Texas 77414.

Sec. 66-90 91. - Penalty and culpability.

- (a) Each violation of this article is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$200.00 \$500.00.
- (b) There shall be no requirement of a culpable mental state for a violation of this article.

DIVISION 2. - DISTRIBUTION TO MINORS

Sec. 66-109. - Definitions.

Sec. 66-110. - Minimum age to sell tobacco products.

It shall be unlawful for any person or entity to engage, employ or permit any person under 18 21 years of age to sell tobacco products.

Sec. 66-111. - Purchase by minors prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 48 21 years to purchase tobacco products, or to misrepresent their identity or age, or to use any false or altered identification for the purpose of purchasing tobacco products.

Sec. 66-112. - Possession by minors prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 18 21 years to possess any tobacco products, provided that the possession by a person under the age of 18 years under the direct supervision of the parent or guardian of such person shall not be prohibited

Section 2. Repealing Clause.

That all Ordinances, Resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 3. Severability Clause.

If for any reason any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, shall be held invalid, it shall not effect any valid provisions of this or any other ordinance of the City of Bay City, Texas.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall become effective on the 25th day of April, 2023.
