## 2. Budget ~ Discuss, consider, and/or approve allocating funds for building repairs of the Whitson street facility leased by Economic Action Committee.

Shawna Burkhart, City Manager, stated that as presented it was presented at last meeting, there are costs associated with repairs and restrooms. Ms. Burkhart asked Council to commit \$44,000 now to benefit seniors and get the restrooms fixed so they can get the building open. Councilwoman Brown asked why the lessee has not kept up wear and tear. Councilwoman Sitz made motion to approve the funds to repair restrooms. Anne Marie Odefey, City Attorney, recommend that we give them list of what they need to do. There were discussions on issues of selling the property to EAC. Mayor Nelson stated we needed to make the repairs and discuss later the future terms. Anne Marie Odefey stated that a rewrite could include maintenance if wanted. Councilwoman Brown requests clarity on all repairs and ensure not messing up and not to exceed \$40,000.

Motion made by Councilwoman Sitz approved allocating funds for building repairs, Seconded by Councilman Folse. Voting Yea: Mayor Nelson, Mayor Pro Tem Childers, Councilwoman Brown, Councilman Folse, Councilwoman Sitz. Motion carried.

## 3. Report ~ Discuss, consider, and/or approve the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the Fiscal Year ending September 30, 2020.

Scotty Jones, Finance Director, presented the CAFR, 3 sections: 1st intro, 2nd financial, 3rd statistical. Shawna Burkhart, City Manager, thanked Scotty Jones and her staff for their work and putting together the CAFR book.

Motion made by Councilwoman Brown to approve the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the Fiscal Year ending September 30, 2020, Seconded by Councilwoman Sitz. Voting Yea: Mayor Nelson, Mayor Pro Tem Childers, Councilwoman Brown, Councilman Folse, Councilwoman Sitz. Motion carried.

# 4. Finance ~ Discuss, consider, and/or approve the use of Capital Funds designated for Fiscal Year 2022 for use of reconstruction of Elliot Addition roadway.

Shawna Burkhart, City Manager, stated that we have a 5 year plan that includes Elliot, Highland, and Moore Addition roads in 2022 and 2023. Most complaints are coming from Elliot and Moore additions. Elliot really needs full reconstruction. Ms. Burkhart discussed monies spent and remaining balances from other road projects, one being the anticipated monies underbudget from Nile Valley road to be reclassified. Elliot Addition full reconstruction on roads estimated at \$1.79 million.

Mayor Nelson stated that he has spoken with BASF and TxDOT, and there are collaborations to make repairs or reconstruct. He also pointed out tracks on Nichols.

### **DECLARATION OF LOCAL STATE OF DISASTER**

WHERAS, THE CITY OF BAY CITY on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of May 2021, has suffered widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property (or there is imminent threat of same) resulting from

Catastrophic rainfall that began on May 16, 2021

WHERAS, THE MAYOR of BAY CITY has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE MAYOR OF BAY CITY:

1. That a local state of disaster, effective on May 24, 2021, is herby declared for CITY OF BAY CITY pursuant to §418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code.

2. Pursuant of §418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code, the state of disaster shall continue for a period of not more than seven (7) days from the date of this declaration unless continued or renewed by the CITY COUNCIL of BAY CITY:

3. Pursuant of §418.108(c) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with CITY SECRETARY.

4. Pursuant of §418.108(d) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster activates the CITY emergency management plan.

5. That this proclamation shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.


## **Vision 2040- Comprehensive Master Plan Summary**



### PETITION FOR THE CREATION OF A PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF BAY CITY, TEXAS,

### TO: THE HONORABLE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF BAY CITY, TEXAS

This petition (the "<u>Petition</u>") is submitted and filed with the City Secretary of the City of Bay City, Texas (the "<u>City</u>"), by \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ (collectively, the "<u>Owners</u>"), acting under the provisions of Chapter 372, Texas Local Government Code, as amended (the "<u>Act</u>"), requesting that the City create a public improvement district (the "<u>District</u>") to include property owned by the Owners and located within the corporate limits of the City (the "<u>Property</u>"), more particularly described in <u>Exhibit A</u> and depicted in <u>Exhibit B</u>. In support of this Petition, the Owners present the following:

Section 1. General Nature of the Authorized Improvements. The purposes of the District include the design, acquisition, and construction of public improvement projects authorized by §372.003(b) of the Act that are necessary for development of the Property, such public improvements (collectively, the "Authorized Improvements"), will include: (i) design, construction and other allowed costs related to street and roadway improvements, including related sidewalks, drainage, utility relocation, signalization, landscaping, lighting, signage, off-street parking and right-of-way; (ii) design, construction and other allowed costs related to storm drainage improvements; (iii) design, construction and other allowed costs related to water, wastewater and drainage (including detention) improvements and facilities, (iv) design, construction and other allowed costs related to parks, open space, and recreational improvements, including trails and landscaping related thereto; and, (v) design, construction and other allowed costs related to projects similar to those listed in subsections (i) - (iv) above authorized by the Act, including similar off-site projects that provide a benefit to the property within the District (vi) payment of expenses incurred in the establishment, administration and operation of the District; and, (vii) payment of expenses associated with financing such public improvement projects, which may include but are not limited to, costs associated with issuance and sale of revenue bonds secured by assessments levied against the Property. These Authorized Improvements shall promote the interests of the City and confer a special benefit on the Property.

<u>Section 2. Estimated Cost of the Authorized Improvements</u>. As set forth in the Development Agreement, the estimated total cost of the Authorized Improvements is \$9,000,000.

Section 3. Boundaries of the Proposed District. The District is proposed to include the Property as set forth in *Exhibits A and B*.

Section 4. Proposed Method of Assessment., The City shall levy an assessment on each lot within the District to pay the cost of the Authorized Improvements in a manner that results in imposing equal shares of the cost on property similarly benefited. Once levied, each assessment may be paid in full at any time (including accrued and unpaid interest) or may be paid in annual installments (including interest and debt). The annual installments must be paid in amounts necessary to meet annual costs for the Authorized Improvements and must continue for a period necessary to retire the indebtedness on the Authorized Improvements.

Section 5. Proposed Apportionment of Cost between the District and the City. The City shall not be obligated to provide any funds to finance the Authorized Improvements. The cost of the Authorized Improvements will be paid from the assessments and from other sources of funds, if any, available to the developer of the Property, which may include revenues from a tax increment financing district established by the City.

<u>Section 6. Management of the District</u>. The Owners propose that the District be managed by the City, with the assistance of a consultant, who shall, from time to time, advise the City regarding certain operations of the District.

<u>Section 7. Owners Request Establishment of the District</u>. The persons signing this Petition request the establishment of the District.

<u>Section 8. Advisory Board</u>. The Owners propose that the District be established and managed without the creation of an advisory body.

This Petition has been signed by (1) the owners of taxable real property representing more than 50 percent of the appraised value of taxable real property liable for assessment under the proposal, as determined by the current roll of the appraisal district in which the property is located; and (2) the record owners of real property liable for assessment under the proposal who: (A) constitute more than 50 percent of all record owners of property that is liable for assessment under the proposal; or (B) own taxable real property that constitutes more than 50 percent of the area of all taxable real property that is liable for assessment under the proposal.

This Petition may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and constitute one and the same instrument.
