Committee Chairman Hervochon stated the agenda needed amending to include a discussion item; The historic pay of Council relative to the articles by the Island Packet related to the cost of living increase and stipends.

DISCUSSION ITEM

The historic pay of Council relative to the articles by the Island Packet related to the cost of living increase and stipends

Discussion: Committee Chairman Hervochon stated that staff is looking into this issue and researching the stipend and will be providing the analysis. Regarding the cost of living increase, Council approved Administration compensation, which included a cost of living increase. The Council did not vote for a separate COLA and wants to make that clear for the public. There is an Ordinance, which is required by state law, that approves a COLA increase for Council. Committee Chairman Hervochon listed a series of questions to address on how this happened and how to correct it.

Council Member Passiment discussed the report from the Island Packet regarding the Council's salary increase doubling. Clarifying that the amounts proposed, in the newspaper, came from researched salaries from other Counties. Beaufort County is not accurately comparable to those Counties.

Council Member Flewelling requested that any discussion of overpayment should be sent to the individual personally and to be handled individually before releasing to the public or having Council handle.

Council Member McElynn stated that the 2019 COLA overpayment was corrected by payroll by deducting pay.

Council Member Rodman stated that every year there is an Ordinance for the budget. That budget includes a line item for Council's compensation. Therefore, it was approved each year.

Council Member Howard has requested a reconciliation because the numbers produced by the paper do not match what she has recorded.

Council Member Flewelling stated at the time, about six years ago, the Council changed the meetings allowed to 144. There shouldn't be any problems before the change.

County Administrator Ashley Jacobs mentioned that payroll has already made adjustments regarding the cost of living increase.
