WHAT IS THE COMMISSION

- Commission was formed in 1974 to address federal environmental regulations
- Purpose is to over see the establishment of a Sanitary Disposal Project Landfill
- Members consist of Black Hawk County and all communities located within it
- Overseen by 5 Commission Commissioners
 - Two representatives from the City of Waterloo
 - One representative from City of Cedar Falls
 - Black Hawk County Supervisor
 - One representative from all other communities
- Solid Waste and Resource Recovery Administrator

LANDFILL MANAGEMENT AND OPERATIONS

- Commission owns over 500 acres
 - 136 acres closed cells
 - 25 acres open Cells, with an additional 17 acres in November
- Receives 180,000 tons of waste a year
 - Capacity to continue managing waste for 25 plus years
- Commission responsible for landfill development, waste screening, monitoring and closing
- Contracted daily operations to private contractor, Waste Tech Inc.

PROVIDE COMMUNITY GRANTS

- Commission is fully self supported
 - No tax support provided
 - Operations and development supported solely from fees it collects
- Provides \$500,000 in grants to member communities
 - Cedar Falls received \$139,000
 - University of Northern Iowa received \$19,000
- Funds Solid Waste education and other waste collection programs

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

- Waste Trac Education Team
 - Educating Black Hawk county on the impact of solid waste management decisions
 - Established in 1996 with partnership with Black Hawk County Conservation Board
- Provides education support to schools with programing to meet teaching standards
 - Partnership with Green Iowa AmeriCorps Sustainable Schools
- Organizes community events with solid waste reduction efforts
- Assists residents and businesses with solid waste options
 - Partnership with Iowa Waste Exchange for Businesses
- Program redevelopment underway
