SUBJECT: Capital Improvements Program (CIP) Continued Discussion

1. I am referring the Capital Improvements Program (CIP) back to the FBO Committee for continued deliberation.

- 2. On December 19th, this committee voted to recommend that the CIP be sent forward to City Council for consideration. The CIP was then voted down by the City Council at its January 3rd meeting, on a 3-to-4 vote.
- 3. The committee materials for this meeting are the same as for the January 3 meeting. For the sake of not reprinting those materials, your original printed packets may be used. The packet is available online at https://bit.ly/CF2023-01-03-MeetingPacket as Item #2.
- 4. I am seeking from the FBO Committee a recommendation for approval of the CIP, based on amendments and compromises needed to attain the votes necessary for approval of the plan.

FY 23-28 CIP Review January 17, 2023



Introduction

- Based on feedback from Council members, purpose of this presentation is to review some proposed changes to the CIP
- Motions (or amendments to motions) on the proposed changes
- May not be an exact order on CIP since some projects tie together
- Public Hearing is tonight that would allow Council to approve the CIP plus any approved changes.



- 1. Change #35 Downtown Parking Ramp Study
 - Motion Move the \$100,000 funding from FY23 (since not spent yet) to FY24.
 - Funded by Downtown TIF
 - Feasibility study will be performed in FY24 that takes into account location, design, possibility of a private partnership, etc.
 - A consultant contract would come back to Council for approval



- 2. Change #36 Downtown Parking Structure
 - Motion Move the funding for this project back to FY25 and FY26 so a study can be performed first.
 - Funded by Downtown TIF
 - Once a study is performed, may have more accurate information about type of structure and possible costs
 - If after study is performed, the Council may choose next year during the CIP process to move up the timing of the structure.



- 3. Change #53 UNI Dome Renovation
 - Motion Reduce the Economic Development Funding (EDF) by \$500,000.
 - Total contribution to UNI would reduce to \$2.5 million
 - Move the \$500,000 of EDF to #70 (HS Pool)
 - A 28E agreement with UNI would come forward to City
 Council before the contribution is made to UNI that would
 outline possible access to UNI facilities (pool, track, etc)



- 4. Change #70 High School Pool
 - Motion Take the \$500,000 EDF funding from UNI Dome and reduce the GO amount by \$500,000 on the pool project.
 - Total contribution to the Pool would still be \$8 million
 - GO funding now only \$200,000 for the pool
 - A 28E agreement with the Cedar Falls Schools would come forward to City Council before a contribution would be made outlining use of the pool, future maintenance commitments, revenue, etc.



- 5. Change #57 Cedar Valley Placemaking
 - Motion Remove the GO funding in the amount of \$191,510.
 - Bridge lighting is not an allowable expense for the project under the grant.
 - Still keep some Hotel/Motel funding for some possible small projects related to the grant if the grant is awarded and Cedar Falls is still part of the grant.



- 6. Change #59 Comp Plan & Zoning Code Updates
 - Motion Lower the funding to \$75,000 each year for FY24 and FY25. Lower the funding to \$25,000 each year thereafter.
 - Total line item for this project would reduce from \$725,000 in General Revenue (GR) to a total of \$225,000
 - Each year would include \$25,000 to review zoning code updates or amendments, but not new zoning initiatives.
 - Additional \$50,000 in FY24 & FY25 to update City's Comp plan
 - Description on detail sheet would be updated to reflect the purpose of the funds

- 7. Change #64 Resilience Initiatives
 - Motion Change name to Energy Efficiency Projects.
 Funding to remain at \$25,000/year (except FY24).
 - Checked with Brian Heath & Matt Buck and feel they use the \$25,000/year – mainly lighting upgrades. They also work with CFU to try and get rebates for qualifying projects.
 - Description on detail sheet would be updated and include listing of the potential projects.

- 8. Change #204 SCBA Replacement
 - Motion Move this item to FY27 using GO2026 bonds vs GO2024 bonds.
 - Staff noted that the 15-year cycle for their SCBA equipment comes due in Fall of 2026.



Clarifications

- #56 The River project does include possible funding for an engineering observation contract
- #119 Aldrich School Connections include all discussed connections
- #121 Annual Street Repair These amounts are the streets listed annually in the pavement management program and additional revenues received in the Local Option Sale Tax (LST) are directed to larger projects listed on CIP (Current - Main St, Past - Cedar Heights, Univ Ave, etc)
- #135 Union Road was delayed until FY29 due to the overage on Main St., however, the sewer and storm water improvements are still on the CIP as funded.



Summary of Proposed Changes

- Direct impact to property taxes by reducing GO funding by approximately \$700,000 and GR funding by \$225,000
- Reminder that the CIP is a planning document and as more items are finalized changes can be made next year.
- Also GO funding for 2024, 2026, and 2028 can also be more refined next year before the 2024 bond sale occurs.



Final Motion

 Motion to recommend approval at City Council meeting for CIP as presented or as amended.
