Council Member Whitaker said he had served on the Fire Department with Winthy Hatcher for many years and considered him a friend as well as family. He will be missed.

Council Member Keeton commented that she had many great memories with Winthy Hatcher. They lived on the same street and went to the same church. She said Mr. Hatcher was her son's godfather. She went on to say that he will be missed and was a great guy. There is no one like him.

Town Manager's Oral Report

Town Manager Forbes started his report by thanking everyone that came to the meeting. He reported that that the B Street project is moving along nicely, with over 50% of the second home completely rebuilt. He said that the town is working on getting the clock moved to the new Town Office. A new platform has to be built and he is hopeful the clock will work. Before the clock was moved it was not working properly. Forbes said the Hutchinson Street sewer repair project took three weeks longer than expect and was more costly than anticipated but it is now complete. The Town Manger said he is hopeful that the runway paving will begin April

or May. He finished by saying it was a very nice send off for Winthy Hatcher. He was a pillar of the community and will be missed.

Public Works Monthly Update

The month rolled on by in a hurry. Not short of things for the guys to do either. Everyone has pitched in where and when needed. The grass and water issues have kept both crews on their toes. Charlie Small was brought in to build a new pedestal for the clock and the reworking of the wall in the rear of the building. We are gearing up for Spring Clean Up week. We expect to see a lot of spring cleaning from our residents.

Street Department

The Street Crew guys have been stretched to the limit trying to keep up with the grass. Rainy days keep them from cutting, warm days makes it jump. With some persistence, they have done a good job. They have also been busy with brush and debris removal. Gravel delivery can be added to the list as well. The crew finds time to pick up at the Cemetery and keep it looking nice too.

Maintenance

Chris has been at the Town Office cleaning and repainting the windows. His most recent job there was installing wires/lines for the reinstall of the clock on its new pedestal at the front of the building. He has also maintained the airport, pavilion and the Library. The shop has dealt with maintenance and some repair work on several of the Police vehicles. Loader tires were ordered and installed by G&E Tire of South Hill.

Water Department

The Water Crew was able o get the last of the new water lines replaced on Hutcheson Ave. to complete the install process. During the month, we have had a few small leaks to deal with; Several sewer lines to unclog. They made a new water tap, rerouted an old water line and are currently prepping an area behind the old PD for a sewer line replacement for the Fire Department.

Other Updates

The guys at the Waste Water Plant are keeping things going pretty good. They had an issue with one of the pumps at the WWTP and Thynedale Pump Station but with a little elbow grease, the problems were solved quickly.

Residential Anti-Displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan Certification

Town of Chase City

The Town of Chase City will replace all occupied and vacant occupiable low/moderateincome dwelling units demolished or converted to a use other than as low/moderateincome dwelling units as a direct result of activities assisted with funds provided under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended. All replacement housing will be provided within three (3) years of the commencement of the demolition or rehabilitation relating to conversion.

Before obligating or expending funds that will directly result in such demolition or conversion, the Town of Chase City will make public and advise the state that it is undertaking such activity and will submit to the state, in writing, information that identifies:

- 1. A description of the proposed assisted activity;
- 2. The general location on a map and approximate number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be demolished or converted to a use other than as low/moderate-income dwelling units as a direct result of the assisted activity;
- 3. A time schedule for the commencement and completion of the demolition or conversion;
- 4. The general location on a map and approximate number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be provided as replacement dwelling units;
- 5. The source of funding and a time schedule for the provision of replacement dwelling units;
- 6. The basis for concluding that each replacement dwelling unit will remain a low/moderate-income dwelling unit for at least 10 years from the date of initial occupancy; and
- 7. Information demonstrating that any proposed replacement of dwelling units with smaller dwelling units is consistent with the housing needs of low- and moderate-income households in the jurisdiction.

Residential Anti-Displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan Certificat

The Town of Chase City will provide relocation assistance to each low/moderate-income household displaced by the demolition of housing or by the direct result of assisted activities. Such assistance shall be provided under Section 104 (d) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, or the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, as amended.

The Town of Chase City's B Street Project, Phase 2 includes housing rehabilitation, substantial reconstruction, demolition of vacant, dilapidated units, water and sewer improvements as outlined in the Community Development Grant application submitted in June 2023.

The activities as planned will not cause any displacement from or conversion of occupiable structures. As planned, the project calls for the use of the existing right-of-way or easements to be purchased or the acquisition of tracts of land that do not contain housing. The Town of Chase City will work with the grant management staff, engineers, project area residents, and the Department of Housing and Community Development to ensure that any changes in project activities do not cause any displacement from or conversion of occupiable structures.

In all cases, an occupiable structure will be defined as a dwelling that meets local building codes or a dwelling that can be rehabilitated to meet the code for \$25,000 or less.

Section 504 Grievance Procedure

The **Town of Chase City** has adopted an internal grievance procedure providing for prompt and equitable resolution of complaints alleging any action prohibited by the Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) (24 CFR 8.53(b) implementing Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 USC 794). Section 504 states, in part, that "no otherwise qualified handicapped individual . . . shall solely by reason of his handicap, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance. . . ."

Complaints should be addressed to Charles Forbes, Town Manager, Town of Chase City, 525 N. Main Street, Chase City, VA 23924, who has been designated to coordinate Section 504 compliance efforts.

- 1. A complaint should be filed in writing or verbally contain the name and address of the person filing it, and briefly describe the alleged violation of the regulations.
- 2. A complaint should be filed within thirty days after the complainant becomes aware of the alleged violation. (Processing of allegations of discrimination occurring before this grievance procedure was in place will be considered on a case-by-case basis.)
- 3. An investigation, as may be appropriate, shall follow the filing of a complaint. The investigation will be conducted by Charles Forbes, Town Manager. These rules contemplate informal but thorough investigations, affording all interested persons and their representatives, if any, an opportunity to submit evidence relevant to a complaint. Under 24 CFR 8.53(b), the Town of Chase City needs not to process complaints from applicants for employment or applicants for admission to housing.

- 4. A written determination as to the validity of the complaint and description of the resolution, if any, shall be issued by Charles Forbes and a copy forwarded to the complainant no later than thirty days after its filing.
- 5. The Section 504 coordinator shall maintain the files and records of the Town of Chase City relating to the complaints filed.
- 6. The complainant can request a reconsideration of the case in instances where he or she is dissatisfied with the resolution. The request for reconsideration should be made within thirty days to Alden Fahringer, Mayor.
- 7. The right of a person to a prompt and equitable resolution of the complaint filed hereunder shall not be impaired by the person's pursuit of other remedies such as the filing of a Section 504 complaint with the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Utilization of this grievance procedure is not a prerequisite to the pursuit of other remedies.
- 8. These rules shall be construed to protect the substantive rights of interested persons, to meet appropriate due process standards, and to assure that the Town of Chase City complies with Section 504 and the HUD regulations.

Section 3 Business and Employment Plan Town of Chase City

- 1. The Town of Chase City designates as its Section 3 Business and Employment Project Area Mecklenburg County.
- 2. The Town of Chase City, its contractors, and designated third parties shall utilize Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to utilize businesses and lower-income residents of the County in carrying out all activities, to the greatest extent feasible.
- 3. In awarding contracts for construction, non-construction, materials, and supplies, the Town of Chase City, its contractors, and designated third parties shall take the following steps to utilize businesses that are located in or owned in substantial part by persons residing in the County:
 - (a) The Town of Chase City shall identify the contracts required to conduct CDBG activities.
 - (b) The Town of Chase City shall identify through various and appropriate sources including the News Progress and the Mecklenburg Sun the business concerns within the County that are likely to provide construction contracts, non-construction contracts, materials, and services that will be utilized in the activities funded through the CDBG.
 - (c) The identified contractors and suppliers shall be included on bid lists used to obtain bids, quotes, or proposals for work or procurement contracts that utilize CDBG funds.
 - (d) To the greatest extent feasible the identified business and any other project area business concerns shall be utilized in activities that are funded with CDBG funds.

- 4. The Town of Chase City and its contractors and subcontractors shall take the following steps to encourage the hiring of lower-income persons residing in the County:
 - (a) The Town of Chase City in consultation with its contractors (including design professionals) shall ascertain the types and number of positions for both trainees and employees that are likely to be used to conduct CDBG activities.
 - (b) The Town of Chase City shall advertise through the following sources: News Progress and the Mecklenburg Sun the availability of such positions with the information on how to apply.
 - (c) The Town of Chase City, its contractors, and subcontractors shall be required to maintain a record of inquiries and applications by project area residents who respond to advertisements and shall maintain a record of the status of such inquiries and applications.
 - (d) To the greatest extent feasible, the Town of Chase City, its contractors, and subcontractors shall hire lower-income project area residents to fill training and employment positions necessary for implementing activities funded by the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG).
- 5. To document compliance with the above affirmative actions and Section 3 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, the Town of Chase City shall keep, and obtain from its contractors and subcontractors, Registers of Contractors, Subcontractors, and Suppliers and Registers of Assigned Employees for all activities funded by the CDBG. Such listings shall be completed and shall be verified by site visits and employee interviews, crosschecking of payroll reports and invoices, and audits if necessary.
