REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

October 4, 2021

The Dougherty County Commission met in Room 100 of the Albany-Dougherty Government Center on October 4, 2021. Chairman Christopher Cohilas presided and called the meeting to order at 10 a.m. Commissioners present were Victor Edwards, Gloria Gaines, Russell Gray, Clinton Johnson and Anthony Jones. Commissioner Ed Newsome participated via the audio-conferencing feature. Also present were County Administrator Michael McCoy, Assistant County Administrator Scott Addison, County Attorney Spencer Lee, County Clerk Jawahn Ware, and other staff. The public and representatives of the media participated in person and via live streaming of the meeting on the County's Facebook page and the government public access channel.

After the invocation and Pledge of Allegiance, the Chairman called for approval of August 16th Regular Meeting, August 30th Special Called Meeting and September 13th Regular Meeting.

Commissioner Gray moved for approval. Upon a second by Commissioner Johnson, the minutes were unanimously approved.

The Chairman recognized David Hodges, Chief Ranger, to provide the Georgia Forestry Commission Annual Report. Mr. Hodges presented his report from July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021. He stated that he was responsible for 130,792 forested acres in Dougherty County and shared that a burn permit for the yard is no longer required and the restrictions were reviewed upon question by Commissioner Jones. Other statistics and updates were provided.

The Chairman recognized Fredando Jackson with Flint River Fresh to give a year one recap of the Dougherty Fresh initiative. Dougherty Fresh is a partnership with Flint River Fresh, UGA Extension Office and Dougherty County. Mr. Jackson recapped the organization's mission and shared that their goals stemmed from a survey that was distributed in the community. He also discussed successful weekly mobile markets and nutritional support initiatives. Information referencing the Commissioner's desire for the Food Policy Council was shared. In year one, the following took place:

- over 2,680 fresh produce packages and/ or deliveries were done;
- 190 at-home garden kits were provided;
- 16 engagement events were conducted; and
- 8 new fresh healthy food access points were established.

Due to the pandemic, a virtual community garden seminar was held and questions and comments from the Board were answered.

The Chairman recognized William Wright, dba Afram-Tech, Inc. to continue the presentation on subsequent analysis of intervening issues with nine metro-counties in the State of Georgia as compatible to Dougherty County and provide an update on the SBA Supplemental Targeted Advance and Targeted EIDL Advance.

The Chairman called for consideration of the recommendation to accept the annual resolution authorizing the Southwest Georgia Regional Commission to execute and file the renewal of the annual application on behalf of Dougherty County with the Georgia Department of Transportation and the United States Department of Transportation for a grant for public transportation assistance under Section 5311 Regional Transit Program.

Commissioner Gray moved for approval. Upon a second by Commissioner Johnson, the motion for approval passed unanimously. Resolution 21-053 is entitled:

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION WITH THE GEORGIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR A GRANT FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION ASSISTANT UNDER TITLE 49 U.S.C., SECTION 5311.

The Chairman called for consideration of the nomination of the County Voting Delegate at the ACCG ReConnect Conference Business Session on November 13, 2021, in Savannah, GA. Chairman Cohilas addressed.

Upon the nomination by Commissioner Johnson, Commissioner Anthony Jones was unanimously appointed as the County Voting Delegate.

The Chairman called for the consideration of the recommendation from the Emergency Medical Services Department to apply for a State of Georgia FY2020 Naloxone Statewide Initiative Grant in the amount of \$16,692 to purchase a year's supply of naloxone. This is a 100% grant with no local match required. EMS Director Sam Allen addressed. Mr. Allen shared that naloxone is narcan and helps to treat a narcotic overdose in emergency situations.

Commissioner Jones moved for approval. Upon a second by Commissioner Edwards, the motion for approval passed unanimously.

Mr. McCoy provided an update on the proposed tennis center. He said that a recommendation will be provided within 30 days and added that there are preliminary plans in place but we are currently addressing some concerns with the location. He also said that an expansion of another park is also being reviewed and two potential design changes will be presented.

Chairman Christopher Cohilas provided an update on the Albany Area Chamber of Commerce's 2021 Washington, DC, Fly In. Chairman Cohilas provided the historical change on the base and concerns regarding the impact of the previous storm financially on the Marine Corps Logistics Base. He also discussed the advocacy needs specifically for broadband and showed some pictures from the recent event.

Attorney Spencer Lee provided a review of the Board of Commissioners of Dougherty Attorney Lee provided a high-level overview for the County form of government. Commissioners to review the Code of Ordinance referencing the need for the adherence Section 2-2-21 of the County's Code of Ordinances. The Chairman commented on the dilation of powers and Commissioner Edwards requested that an orientation be conducted for newly elected Commissioners. Commissioner Edwards also suggested that any concerns by employees against a Commissioner should go to the Government Affairs Committee as opposed to the County Administrator; and he requested a structural policy be created because he said a County Administrator cannot reprimand a Commissioner. Chairman Cohilas addressed how some of the concerns countered the whistleblower laws and the State's form of government. Chairman Cohilas restated that this ordinance is for the protection of Commissioners and employees. After a lengthy discussion, Attorney Lee suggested that the best way to address this concern is for the Chairman, County Administrator and the Attorney to meet to further discuss. Commissioner Jones suggested that the Board participate in sensitivity training. Attorney Lee asked that the Chairman revise the agenda so that the Executive Session will be listed as potential and pending litigation and personnel.

Commissioner Edwards asked Mr. McCoy to provide an update on the speed bumps on Astoria Drive. Mr. McCoy shared that the decision made to deny was not made by the County Administrator but by the County's Traffic Calming Policy. Mr. McCoy added that any revisions made would be a policy change made by the Board. Attorney Lee said that the Board would need to adhere to its policy but can revise it if desired. Commissioner Edwards wanted alternatives for the concern and Chairman Cohilas requested that an open discussion be held at the next work session. The Chairman clarified that the County Administrator does not create policies but the Board does. Commissioner Jones shared concerns about the several rezoning requests. He added that once the requests are approved, the requestors are changing their type of business. He asked that the Planning and Code Enforcement come and address the Commission and the Chairman noted this as a compliance issue. Commissioner Johnson mentioned the closing of Coats and Clark and announced an upcoming job fair. He asked the Chairman to allow Paul Forgey to review and the Board possibly adopt the State's tiny home ordinance. Attorney Lee said the zoning regulation would need to be reviewed. Chairman Cohilas revised the request and asked for an update on the State's ordinance first. Lastly, Commissioner Johnson welcomed the Albany State University alumni to the city for homecoming week.

The Chairman called for consideration of the recommendation from the County Attorney to enter into Executive Session for the purpose of discussing potential and pending litigation and personnel and then to adjourn.

Commissioner Johnson moved for approval.	Upon a second by Commissioner Jones, the
motion for approval passed unanimously.

WORK SESSION MEETING MINUTES

October 11, 2021

The Dougherty County Commission met in Room 100 of the Albany-Dougherty Government Center on October 11, 2021. Chairman Christopher Cohilas presided and called the meeting to order at 10:00 am. Commissioners present were Victor Edwards, Gloria Gaines, Russell Gray, Clinton Johnson, Anthony Jones, and Ed Newsome. Also present were County Administrator Michael McCoy, Assistant County Administrator Scott Addison, County Attorney Spencer Lee, County Clerk Jawahn Ware, and other staff. The public and representatives of the media participated in person, via live streaming of the meeting on the County's Facebook page and the government public access channel.

The Chairman recognized Thomas Brazzle, Ariel Fristoe, and Marcel Foster with Out of Hand Theater, Atlanta, GA to request Board support in pursuit of a CDC grant. The Chairman asked that paperwork be sent to the County Administrator for additional consideration.

The Chairman recognized Public Works Director Chuck Mathis and Engineer Manager Jeremy Brown to provide an update and response to the request to consider the installation of exercise pad fans at Robert Cross and Overlook Parks. Mr. Brown shared that a consultant was contacted regarding this request and provided current constraints in reference to expense, liability, security and building structure. Commissioner Edwards shared that he appreciated the staff for bringing the cost to the Commission. Concerns of the Board were addressed.

The Chairman recognized Public Works Director Chuck Mathis and Engineer Manager Jeremy Brown to provide an update on the Speed Study conducted in the Southgate community and proposed solutions for Astoria Drive. Mr. Mathis shared that he had a discussion with Mr. Dawson. When the initial traffic study was conducted it did not capture all of the data in the area where speeding was occurring. Mr. Mathis said that it is now staff's recommendation that the speed study is redone. Citizen Mr. Willie Dawson spoke and shared that if the new study is not favorable, then he is requesting for a 4 way stop sign to be installed. Pastor Frank Williamson spoke about his concern about the article in the paper regarding this issue and the time it took for a response. Concerns of the Board were addressed. After a lengthy discussion, the Chairman reminded the Board that we need to adhere to the policy that adheres to the best engineering practices.

The Chairman called for a discussion of the zoning consideration of Lanier Engineering, Inc. (21-056) request to rezone 1.45 acres from C-5 (Office-Institutional-Residential District) to C-3 (Commercial District). The property is located at 2507 Fleming Road. The property owner is Base Side Storage, LLC; the applicant is Lanier Engineering, Inc. (District 6). The Planning Commission recommended approval. Paul Forgey, Planning & Development Director, addressed. The Public Hearing and Action are scheduled for October 18, 2021.

The Chairman called for a discussion of the zoning consideration of Lanier Engineering, Inc. (21-057) request for Special Approval to allow the special use of self-storage (Mini Warehouses) in a C-3 (Commercial District). The property is located at 2507 Fleming Road. The property owner is Base Side Storage, LLC; the applicant is Lanier Engineering, Inc. (District 6). The Planning Commission recommended approval. Paul Forgey, Planning & Development Director, addressed. The Public Hearing and Action are scheduled for October 18, 2021. Mr. Forgey confirmed that rezoning is required prior to a special approval.

The Chairman called for a discussion of the recommendation to accept the proposed resolution providing for the assessment and collection of an annual ad valorem tax to provide funds for the payment of the principal and interest on a Dougherty County School District General Obligation Sales Tax Series 2021 Bond in the amount of \$28,565,000. Dougherty County School System Attorney Tommy Coleman addressed. He shared that this is a standard request and noted the significant improvements made throughout the school system. Attorney Coleman confirmed that Dougherty County's role is a required administrative duty of the County Commission.

The Chairman called for a discussion of the recommendation to approve the alcohol application from Moree's Grocery & Liquor, Inc, Bettye J. Amburn licensee, dba County Line Liquor, at 4030 Moultrie Road for Package- Liquor, Beer and Wine. The Albany-Dougherty Marshal's Office recommended approval. Marshal Nathaniel Norman, Business and License Support Department, addressed. He said that this is an application to transfer ownership to a relative due to the death of the initial applicant.

The Chairman called for a discussion of the recommendation to accept the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) Project 4297-0008-R Albany-Dougherty County Acquisition Project - Phase I Award in the amount of \$3,327,308.48. County Administrator Michael McCoy and Director of Disaster Recovery & Grant Programs Georgia Collier-Bolling addressed. Mr. McCoy shared details of the Phase I project and stated that it consists of 18 homes from the 2017 storms. The County has been responsible for about \$499,000 that will come out of the Special Services Fund. Ms. Collier-Bolling shared that additional properties are being evaluated for consideration and the County will need to maintain the lots after the homes are demolished. Mr. McCoy said that it will be an economic impact because properties are coming off of the tax digest. Upon Commissioner Johnson's question, Mr. McCoy shared that the properties are vetted at the federal level. Ms. Collier-Bolling reconfirmed that the application is between the applicant and FEMA and Dougherty County does not have a "say" in this mitigation process. She also added that the matching funds will be paid by the homeowners.

The Chairman called for a discussion of the recommendation to accept the federal procurement guidance under the Uniform Administrative Requirements at 2 CFR 200.318 through 2 CFR 200.327, General Procurement Standards, and the federal GSA scheduled rates for travel, retroactive to January 1, 2017. Director of Disaster Recovery & Grant Programs, Georgia Collier-Bolling addressed. Ms. Collier-Bolling shared that this request will make the County's threshold similar to the Federal threshold (for disaster recovery requests).

The Chairman called for a discussion of the review of the State of Georgia's Tiny Home Zoning Regulation for consideration of adoption. Paul Forgey, Director, Planning & Development Services addressed.

The Chairman called for a discussion of the recommendation to declare the listed vehicles and equipment as surplus and authorizing the disposal of or sale of same via an online auction. County Administrator Michael McCoy addressed.

Mr. McCoy asked for direction on the Tiny Homes and Commissioner Johnson asked for a sample ordinance. Chairman Cohilas shared that we can review this issue on a future Work Session after consensus was received from the Board. Commissioner Edwards wanted the Marshall to address the codes on dumpsters at apartment complexes and enforcement and/or citation that can be provided to the private property owners. Commissioner Gray announced condolences to the family of the former Dougherty County School System Superintendent Butch Mosley. Chairman Cohilas read a letter from the City of Americus that was received that thanked the Board for their assistance with a recent clean-up after the storms.

There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting adjourned at 11:44 a.m.




CONCEPT FLOOR PLAN

Recommend contracting with **Management Advisory Group of Spartanburg, SC** to provide a comprehensive classification & compensation study for the Dougherty County Human Resources Department for a total expenditure of **\$39,700.00**.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Bid Ref. #22-015 was advertised in the local paper, on the local access channel, and on the Georgia Procurement Registry. The bid opening was September 20, 2021. Eleven (11) firms were directly solicited with four (4) firms submitted proposals.

The Proposal Analysis Group consisted of Dominique Hall, County HR Director, Erica Potts, Asst. County HR Director, Wendy Vogel, Asst. County Finance Director, Tatesha Irving, Asst. County Chief of Police, Chris Smith, County Solid Waste Director, and Sam Allen, EMS Director. The proposals were evaluated based on the criteria of Qualifications & Experience, Project Methodology, Timeline, Pricing & Fees, M/WBE Participation, References, and Local Participation.

The Proposal Analysis Group has selected Management Advisory Group as the lowest responsive and responsible proposer. Three references were checked from the City of Savannah, City of Americus and Durham County, North Carolina. All the references providing positive feedback on their working relationship with Management Advisory Group.
