- Commissioner Collard ESD No. 6
 - NG911 looking for rollout Fall 2021 and has been in the planning stages for the last five (5) years. Few counties are ready for GIS integration.
 - o Fire & EMS set call records again − 4th month.
 - o McGregor training facility is progression.
 - ESD is working with LCRA on planning the installation of a new multibank tower and looking at possible relocation of existing towers and possible locations for HAM repeaters.
 - New station is about a month behind due to supply chain problems and parts shortages. "Opening" is still scheduled for June 26th 10:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m. and hiring will take place in the fall.
 - o Converting old station to training, logistics and supply maintenance.
- Commissioner Polk Fire Inspection
 - o Planned apartments by IHOP across from Belterra instead of hotel.
 - o Headwaters Commercial adding 3 new pad sites.
 - o Rob Shelton hotel experiencing construction and supply delays.
- Commissioner Hood Precinct 4

3. Emergency Management Coordinator Report

Roman Baligad, Emergency Management Coordinator

- 4 COVID positive cases at City Hall, resumed remote work and stepped up protocols
- Expect pandemic response for City Hall by next meeting for commission review
- Emergency fuel cloud system back on order, cost \$5500 which is within budget
 - o Option for unique vehicle pins or agency pins
 - Requesting feedback on policies to be implemented regarding fuel tracking and management
 - Submitted agreement to ESD 6 and 1, and expect approval at December meetings

4. Operations Committee Report

ESD No. 6

- Attorney approved fuel agreement with city, needs to go to board in December
- Unexplained call volume decrease in October, first time all year after setting records monthly
- 290 and Martin Road closure starts 11/30/2021
- Experiencing hiring challenges trying to hire 12 firefighters and looking at creative options

- Acquired fuel tank truck in conjunction with ESD No. 1, working on interlocal agreement to share back with the City and other responders
- Working on remodel planning for station
- Looking for more property for future stations
- Close to finish out for station at McGregor where there is barn and water storage
- Brief report on new buildings

ESD No. 1

- After 11 months breaking records, October calls are down
- Closed on new property and working on facility plans to open in 2023

Hays County

- Radio tower improvements plan came in at \$6 million, planning to use COVID recovery funds for county
- Working on COVID vaccination reimbursements for agencies involved will also fall under recovery funds
- State recovery funds exhausted but county still has funds and is working on allocations
- Exercise Monday focused primarily on communication
- CERT awards event 12/6 in San Marcos
- Working on county development guide to assist entities wanting to build and establish presence in county
- Challenges hiring new fire marshal, county on low end of pay scale related to counties with similar workload

5. Planning Committee Report

Commissioner DeWitte

- RFQ for AM antenna pad in process
- Raspberry pie unit assembled and configured and ready to deploy
- Working on software issue revisions for raspberry pie unit
- Thinking City Maintenance staff can erect the tower once the pad is complete and looking further into that
- Proposing monthly HAM test once installation complete similar to hospital system routine test
- Hays EOC still having challenges with their HAM installation

6. Logistics Committee Report

- a) Generator Subcommittee Vice Chair Little presented the report.
 - Working with Texas Gas about protecting a local gas fixture that ahs been a concern of this group
 - Generator:
 - PEI has cables to assemble and install to complete DSRP generator installation
 - o PEI completed load test on City Hall and DSRP

- o PEI submitted bid for City Hall generator installation, will review and approve specs so it can go out for more bids
- Vice Chair Little will review and get more detail on mooring generator trailer bid, which can go out for further bids. Intend to use recovery funds for this item
