Summary/Background: A budgetary approval of restriping the DSRP Event Center parking lot was approved as an expenditure in the FY2021 budget for \$20,000. The FY2021 budget cycle ended on September 30, 2021. The project has yet to be completed. In 2021 it was estimated that the plan would cost approximately \$20,000. That estimate did not take into consideration the assessment of event center business needs and carrying capacity in addition to the escalated costs associated with construction that have been and continue to be extremely impacted by the onset of the 2020 Covid-19 pandemic.

Parking Lot Striping Plan.

Summary/Background: A budgetary approval of restriping the DSRP Event Center parking lot was in its 2nd fiscal cycle as of Fiscal Year 2021 which ended on September 30, 2021. The project has yet to be completed. While the notion and need had been approved, the concept of reconfiguring and aligning the parking to best meet the event center's needs instead of just restriping "as is" had not been previously considered. City staff partnered with the city engineer to analyze and discuss whether the current parking configuration served DSRP events and public safety to the best and most applicable standard. Together they assessed current layout and applied operations into consideration.

> With staff input and National Park RV parking standards in mind, the City Engineer developed four possible parking lot striping layouts for consideration and mapped out a plan for one-way vehicular traffic flow around the event center and parking lot to promote a higher standard of event and park user safety.

> The proposed various design concepts are supported by the fact that the parking lot striping paint at the DSRP Event Center has completely faded away. Parking at events is very complicated because attendees cannot see striping to appropriately place and navigate their vehicles to safely park or circumnavigate the event center. RVs and trailers are parked incoherently because operators cannot see their boundaries. By applying National Park models, the city engineer developed conceptual plans that support large event needs with heavy RV/Trailer presence but can simultaneously accommodate heavy car parking as well. He has provided four parking lot striping scenarios for the Board to consider and select their choice from.

Summary/Background: Empty Bowls is an event that helps supply Helping Hands which serves people in our

community. Helping Hands rents the Vendor Hall, Main Event Room, Concession Kitchen, and Concession Plaza. By using all those spaces, DSRP is unable to rent out the facility for weekend events. DSRP had to pay the custodial fees for the event because we had to turn the facility overnight for an incoming event. Rental Fees and Custodial Fees for those spaces is over \$4325.00. That does not include the labor needed to set up and break down

the space (i.e. tables, chairs, panels).

Staff Recommendations: Staff recommends offering the small event room and concession stand to Empty Bowls

with only rental rates waived. Empty Bowls would be responsible for custodial fees. This will allow us to book a prime fall weekend to rentals. September-November are prime months. We already host two free events in October (Buda Buckle Bash) and November

(Fall Classic).

Dear Dripping Springs Ranch Park Board,

Thank you for reviewing our request to waive the rental fees of DSRP for the 25th Annual Empty Bowls Project on Sunday, November 6, 2022. We respectively make this request to reduce the expenses of the largest fundraiser for Dripping Springs Helping Hands.

Dripping Springs Helping Hands provides more than 240,000 pounds of food to our neighbors in need each year. Temporary financial aid is given to individuals and families who are struggling to meet basic needs such as housing, transportation, utilities, medical, and other social services. In 2020, financial aid totaled more than \$70,000. In addition, Helping Hands purchased \$42,000 in food from Central Texas Food Bank. Helping Hands serves more than two hundred families each week. Without Helping Hands, the needs of our less fortunate in our community could not be met. Helping Hands conducts a school supply program, a summer supplement program, and a Holiday Elf program. Helping Hands operates solely on volunteers. There are no paid employees. This nonprofit organization has served our community for 36 years.

In 2021, the city and the DSRP board waived the rental fees of DSRP for the 24th Annual Empty Bowls Project in the amount of \$3,625. This amount represents 8% of the money spent to buy food from Central Texas Food Bank in 2020.

The City of Dripping Springs has waived the rental fee for the past three years and we remain grateful. The city has also been a co-sponsor of the Empty Bowls for the past five or six years. We appreciate the city's support of Helping Hands by joining us to help met the needs of our community. We are proud to include the city's logo on all our marketing materials and to call the city a friend of Helping Hands.

Our event is successful and runs smoothly because DSRP has all the facilities needed to hold this event for 1,000 people during the hours of 11: AM until 3:00PM . Our committee and volunteers set-up and take dow

Co-Sponsorship

Policy & Application

I. Purpose

The purpose of this Co-Sponsorship policy is to set forth guidelines and criteria governing the granting of City of Dripping Springs funds or in-kind services for the purpose of supporting local festivals, special events, community projects or programs. The City recognizes that Co-Sponsorships play an important role in supporting our community, as well as to promote the tourism and economic development efforts of the City. This co-sponsorship agreement is separate from a request for a grant of Local Hotel Occupancy Tax funds.

II. Goals and Objectives

Co-Sponsorship of funds or in-kind services will be considered for special events, community projects or programs designed to accomplish one or more of the following goals and objectives:

- Promote the City of Dripping Springs as a desirable place to live, visit and do business.
- Promote the City of Dripping Springs as a visitor destination and/or bring tourism- associated revenue to the City.
- Enhance the quality of life and wellbeing of some or all residents of the community.
- Advance the City's commitment to and pride in being a multicultural community.
- Promote the historic districts.
- Promote cultural and artistic awareness among the citizenry.

The granting of City funds or in-kind support is evaluated according to the effectiveness and impact the particular special event, community project or program has on the community-at-large. Special attention is paid to Co-Sponsorships that promote the attractiveness of the City as a place to visit and/or live, celebrate the heritage of the City and its environs, and/or enrich the character and quality of life of its citizens.

Co-Sponsorship benefits may include:

- Up to 10% fee discount
- Banner on the Triangle or other city-owned property for specified number of days
- Required use of City Logo on marketing
- In kind donations from current city resources

Any Co-Sponsorship requesting benefits in excess of this amount must request a Donation Agreement with the City through the City Administrator.

III. General Requirements, Eligibility Criteria and Conditions

The applicant for Co-Sponsorship of funds or in-kind services for special events, community projects or programs must meet all of the following requirements, eligibility criteria, and conditions:

- 1. The applicant must be a registered nonprofit corporation or 501(c)3 organization with tax-exempt status. Co-application with a nonprofit corporation will make an applicant eligible to apply for co-sponsorship.
- 2. The special event, community project, or program supports the aforementioned goals and objectives.
- 3. Event and promotion must take place within the City of Dripping Springs limits or extraterritorial jurisdiction. Some limited exceptions will be made. Reason(s) for not holding the proposed event or promotion in the City of Dripping Springs must be stated on the application. Exemption from this requirement will be provided on a case-by-case basis and will favor activity promoting the City of Dripping Springs as a desirable place to live, visit and do business in.
- 4. The recipient of Co-Sponsorship funds or in-kind services shall provide the City recognition as a sponsor in exchange for the funds or in-kind services in a method consistent with other sponsors. In no event shall the recognition for the City's funds or in-kind services be less than that provided to other sponsors who have contributed the same total financial or in-kind support.
- 5. The nonprofit corporation must be ready, willing, and able to enter a contractual agreement for Co-Sponsorship with the City and provide a certificate of liability insurance.
- 6. The nonprofit corporation must comply with all City ordinances if applicable, wherein standards and procedures for the issuance of special event permits or other requirements are set forth.
- 7. The nonprofit corporation will not discriminate on the grounds of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, age, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition or any condition related thereto.
- 8. All co-sponsorship applications will be reviewed by City Administrator once the application is complete unless the application is for a co-sponsorship for the Dripping Springs Ranch Park and Event Center (DSRP). For the DSRP co-sponsorship applications, the DSRP Board shall review all co-sponsorship applications submitted for events at DSRP. The DSRP Board shall forward recommendations for co-sponsorship applications to the City Council. For non-DSRP co-sponsorship applications, the City Administrator's decision is final. The City will inform the applicant in writing whether an application has been approved or denied.

- 9. All packets must be submitted at least ninety (90) days prior to the event and shall include:
 - a completed sponsorship application;
 - a cover letter describing how the event will benefit the City, its residents, and its visitors; and
 - a budget sheet that includes the expenses for which the sponsorship is requested. Filing of an application is not a guarantee that it will be approved.

10. Items that will be considered include:

- Benefit to the community.
- Success of past events that included community involvement.
- How the event complements or conflicts with current City programming and policies.
- How the event aligns with the City's goals and objectives.

If your organization's sources of support, or its character, method of operations, or purposes have changed, please let us know so we can consider the effect of the change on the exempt status and foundation status of your organization.

Your organization is required to file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, only if its gross receipts each year are normally more than \$25,000. If a return is required, it must be filed by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of the organization's annual accounting period. This Policy is in addition to the Dripping Springs Sponsorship Policy-Resolution 2020-R31.

Adopted August 11, 2020

A. Purpose

This Policy is enacted to provide guidelines and standards for the City of Dripping Springs ("City") to allow use of the Dripping Springs Ranch Park Event Center and other park amenities ("DSRP") by certain qualified entities at a reduced rate. This policy is designed to supplement the City's Co-Sponsorship Policy.

B. Types & Time of Use

- (1) Depending on the needs of the User, and the needs of the City, the City may agree to allow use of DSRP at a reduced rate:
 - (a) by a single User once;
 - (b) by a single User on a recurring basis for a set amount of time; or
 - (c) by a specific group of multiple Users for one time.
- (2) The City may agree to allow use of any of the rentable facilities at DSRP at a reduced rate.

C. Standards for Selecting User

The City will allow an Entity to use DSRP if that Entity satisfies three or more of the following criteria. Priority will be given to those Entities that satisfy multiple criteria.

- (1) The Entity has an office or branch located in the City.
- (2) The Entity is classified as a non-profit under the United States Internal Revenue Code or has a co-applicant who is a nonprofit corporation.
- (3) The Entity has a history of providing financial support to the City.
- (4) The Entity has a history of supporting City events by advertising for such City events, volunteering at such City events, or co-sponsoring City events.
- (5) The Entity has a good-faith and demonstrated need for financial assistance.
- (6) The use of DSRP by the Entity furthers a project that has been approved by the City Council.
- (7) The Entity has no adequate alternative space to use.
- (8) The Entity's use of DSRP is to serve as a place for multiple civic groups, charitable organizations and/or political subdivisions to meet together.
- (9) The Entity's use of the DSRP will not pose a realistic threat to the public health, safety or welfare, or create an unreasonable source of legal liability for the City.
- (10) The Entity's use of the DSRP will not create an undue, continuing financial burden on the City, a result of which is to create a public obligation that outweighs the public benefits.

D. Application

Any Entity interested in becoming a User must fill out a Sponsorship Application on file with the City.

E. Use Agreement

All Users must sign a Sponsorship Agreement created by the City.

F. Approval
