

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order by Keith Fletcher at 6:34 pm with a quorum present.

- I. Review Minutes – The last public health meeting was held February 13, 2023. Ms. Rodriguez motioned to approve minutes, seconded by Mr. Coleman, all were in favor.
- II. Review of Quarterly Reports – The 2nd and 3rd quarterly reports were reviewed by the committee and staff. A question was raised regarding the amount of STDs in November and December of 2022. Mr. Coleman motioned to approve the reports, seconded by Ms. Linicomm, all were in favor.
- III. Get Fit GP 2023 – Get Fit GP is in its 10th year. Reviewed the 2023 events of February through July and discussed upcoming events. Ms. Mendez requested that board members attend at least one event during the year.
- IV. Community Health Assessment – Dr. Teresita Oaks, Director of Community Health Programs at Parkland discussed the 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment and how data was collected and utilized. The report was handed out to members and was told that the report is also available on-line. Dr. Oaks said that the report is required every three years under the Affordable Care Act and defines the community, identifies the disparities, solicits community input, and identifies health needs. Some conclusions were that African Americans and Hispanics have the highest poverty rates, there is low access to food and primary care, and high mortgage forbearance in some areas of the county. Grand Prairie has a higher insured rate than Texas. There is a 20 year mortality age difference between the highest and lowest health indicators and that these two areas are less than 5 miles apart. Most common causes of death are heart disease, cancer, and cerebrovascular diseases. In

2020, the number one cause of death among Hispanics was COVID. Community Health concerns include chronic diseases, mental health, and preventative health.

V. Municipal Setting Designation – This item was tabled until the November 2023 meeting.

Adjournment – With no other questions or comments, Mr. Fletcher motioned to adjourn and Mr. Coleman seconded. The motion was passed with all present voting yes. The meeting was adjourned at 8:01 pm.



RECOMMENDED ACTION: Recommend Approval

ANALYSIS: 1205 E. Avenue H, formerly Solvay Polymers, in conjunction with the 2 other neighboring properties referenced above, has requested an ordinance from the Grand Prairie City Council to restrict potable, shallow groundwater use under the designated properties that have been contaminated with low levels of trichloroethene and petroleum hydrocarbons from off site sources. This application will be considered by City Council.



GROUNDWATER PLUMES IN GP



WHAT IS A MSD?


- In 2003, the Texas Legislature passed a Municipal Setting Designation (MSD) statute which created a new alternative for persons addressing the groundwater contamination they were responsible for causing, as well as for persons who “volunteer” to address groundwater contamination.
- An MSD is an official state designation given to property within a municipality or its extraterritorial jurisdiction which certifies that designated groundwater at the property is not used as potable water.

KEY TERMS



Groundwater

Water located beneath the surface of the ground




Aquifer

Contains groundwater that can yield a useable quantity of water using a water well



Potable Water

Water used for drinking, cooking, bathing or showering, and for irrigating crops intended for human consumption




Trinity Sands Aquifer – City Wells

A MSD ONLY ADDRESSES POTABLE WATER SOURCES

Other environmental issues:

- ❑ The owner/developer must still address environmental impacts to groundwater that are not related to potable water use:
 - ❑ Dermal contact
 - ❑ Vapor Intrusion
 - ❑ Impact to ecological receptors (such as a river)
 - ❑ Soil contamination

WHY SELECT A MSD?

Benefit to City

- ✓ Protects public health by disallowing the use of the water.
- ✓ In some cases, the responsible party for the contamination can not be defined and the property can not be sold or put back into use without a MSD.

Benefit to Applicant

- ✓ A municipal setting designation may significantly reduce the cost, time and uncertainty in satisfying the state's environmental remediation requirements.

CITY'S ROLE

Item 4.

Before the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality certifies a municipal setting designation, the city where it is located must prohibit use of “designated groundwater” for potable purposes.

If the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality approves a municipal setting designation, the owner of the site may complete remediation activities without meeting the protective concentration level for ingestion of groundwater.
