- I. <u>Call to Order</u> The meeting was called to order by Pat Shull at 6:49pm with a quorum present.
- II. Review Minutes May 10, 2021 The last public health meeting was held May 10, 2021. Dr. Ralph Wiegman accepted the minutes and Keith Fletcher seconded them. All were in favor.
- III. <u>Review of Quarterly Reports</u> The 2nd Quarter Report was reviewed by the committee and staff.
- IV. <u>COVID 19 Update</u> According to the Texas Department of State Health Services, 99.5% of the Covid-related deaths occurring between February July were among unvaccinated people. Texas has 64.76% vaccinated population (at least one dose) to date this includes individuals from 12 years of age and older. More specifically in Dallas County the percentage is 52.18% of those who have had at least one vaccination dose. The City of Grand Prairie's lowest vaccinated zip code is 75051 which is 33.84% this is below any average of Dallas County. As of August 12, 2021 the FDA has approved the 3rd dose for immunocompromised which has the effectiveness of 59% 72%. Some of the efforts we have made in Grand Prairie to promote vaccination are 1) Covid-19 dashboard on our www.gptx.org website that includes testing sites in GP, vaccine facts, etc. 2) Organized block walks to promote upcoming vaccination sites in local neighborhoods 3) Mailouts with Covid-19 facts and vaccination site information. Abraham C. suggested a church organized vaccine

site for their own members and locals in the neighborhood. Cindy M. advised GP works with Dallas County / Parkland regarding giving more vaccines. Dr. Ralph advised of all that is needed to store and give the vaccinations and that this causes several barriers for GP – also that our city does not have a hospital and is not staffed for this.

- V. Smoking Ordinance Revisions Smoking is the 2nd highest risk factor for death in the world. Annual health care costs directly caused by smoking is approximately \$22.6 billion in the United States alone. In 1986 the City of Grand Prairie created their first Smoking Ordinance. In early 2013, a new Smoking Ordinance was proposed with public input August September 2013 and a public meeting in October followed by a PSH&E review in November. This revised Smoking Ordinance was approved in January in the City Council meeting. The Texas Municipal population protected by 100% smoke-free ordinances must include the 5 following settings: 1) Municipal worksites 2) Private worksites 3) Restaurants 4) Bars in restaurants 5) Bars not in restaurants. Grand Prairie currently does not meet all 5 settings due to a select few private worksites and bars (not in restaurants). Dr. Ralph asked if PHAC is wanting recommendations or if they are just being informed. Cindy M. advised that we do want recommendations and will be taking this to City Council in September. Grand Prairie's goal is to become a smoke-free city.
- VI. <u>Summary of Community Events:</u> Cindy M. shared that we had the following events: Back the Blue – National Night Out, Fishing Day, Summer Safety Kits and upcoming events include a mobile mammogram in October and a Prenatal Pampering and Education event for expecting mother's and mothers with young children.
- VII. Guest Comments There were no guest comments.

<u>Adjournment</u> – With no other questions or comments, Dr. Ralph motioned to adjourn and Keith F. 2nd the motion. The motion was passed with all present voting yes. The meeting was adjourned at 8:12pm.










Texas WNV Distribution

WNV-Positive Traps per Location 2021



Air Quality Issues at Crematory

Site History

- 2731 S. Great Southwest Major Cremation and Funeral Center
 - Began operation in 2006
- 2735 S. Great Southwest North Texas Funerals and Cremations
 - Began operation in 2009
- Crematory requirements were inadvertently removed from UDC, so no SUP was required.
- Currently, requirements for SUP have been added back into the UDC.



Air Quality

- TCEQ regulates air quality in the state
- Crematories must comply with Air Permit by Rule 30 TAC §106.94.
 - Opacity of emissions from the incinerator shall not exceed 5.0% averaged over a six-minute period
 - Manufacturer's recommended operating instructions shall be posted at the unit
 - Log of operation must be kept


Summary of Issue

January 10, 2018

- A building inspection employee brings a video taken on 1/9 of black smoke emanating from what looks like 2731 on S. Great Southwest
- Investigation revealed that FD had been called multiple times to location because of black smoke being observed by citizens



THE CREMATION PROCESS



Actions taken

- Both facilities inspected in 2018.
 - Unit at 2731 is older and lacks some features that can help ensure black smoke is no emitted
 - Employee at 2731 stated that black smoke is common during startup and when there are large bodies
- Facilities are now

Actions Taken

- Jan. 10, 2018 TCEQ contacted
- Jan. 19, 2018 NOV sent. Owner notified that complaint had been submitted to TCEQ.
- Jan. 24, 2018 Audit conducted by TCEQ on Jan. 24
 - Violations issued for
 - failure to post operating instructions
 - failure to maintain records
 - failure to limit hours of operation to one hour after sunrise and one hour before sunset

NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Dear Mr. Williams:

The City of Grand Prairie's Environmental Services Department has received a complaint concerning the generation of excessive black smoke from your facility's cremation operation. Additionally, we have received information from the city's Fire Department that indicates that this may be a reoccurring problem. Please be advised that such activities are a violation of city ordinance and the state's at pollution regulations. A formal complaint has been forwarded to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. This situation is especially egregious given the proximity of your facility to a residential area. Your prompt action to alleviate the situation is required.

Please be advised that any future instances may require our office to implement additional enforcement action. If you have any questions or would like to meet concerning this matter, please contact me at 972/237-8058.

Further Complaints at 2731 S Great Southwest

- 9/28/20
 - Resident behind crematories registers complaint w/ City regarding black smoke and smell at 2735 S. Great Southwest (North Texas Funerals and Cremations)
 - Resident advised to keep a log of when smoke/smell is observed and to lodge a complaint with TCEQ
- 6/23/21
 - Complaint registered with TCEQ
 - Complainant alleged odor/smoke from the regulated entity is causing a nuisance. The complainant alleged the odor smells like burning corpse.

Air Pollution Control Ordinance

Last updated in 1992

- ♦ References Outdated
- ♦ Significant changes since 1992
 - ♦ Natural Gas Wells
 - GHG reduction measures and energy conservation efforts
 - ♦ State and federal rule changes
 - ♦ Increased vehicular traffic

Corrective Actions

- Operating Manual must be posted at unit
- Submit documentation of the most recent available records of hours of operation.
- Submit documentation of the most recent available records of quantity of waste burned.

Actions Taken by PHEQ

- Conduct yearly inspections.
- Contracted with Modern Geoscience to determine what actions were available to City.
- Revised the ordinance.

Texas Clean Air Act

Authority of Local Governments

♦ Local Governments have the same power and is subject to the same restrictions as the commission under Section 382.015 to inspect the air and enter public or private property to determine compliance.

Authority of Municipalities

A municipality has the powers and rights to abate a nuisance and enforce an ordinance for the control and abatement of air pollution not inconsistent with the commissions rules.
