Agenda Items:

- 1. Consider Minutes from November 16, 2023, and December 14, 2023. Motion passed, none opposed.
- 2. Discuss proposal from Reconstruction Experts in the amount of \$4,994.03 to repair the perimeter wall along S Great SW Parkway north of Fairmont Drive behind 4406-4410 Lorraine.
 - a. Discussed the status of this claim.
 - b. This was due to an accident. A driver going northbound on S. Great SW Pkwy drove off the road and into the parkway. A police report was obtained. An insurance claim was made to repair damages. The work is scheduled to be completed.
- 3. Consider the proposal from Lerch Bates. Lerch Bates, Engineer, was selected at the last meeting. Proposal Services include on site evaluation and report on the wall on Magna Carta in the amount of \$7,625.00.
- 4. Consider proposal from Associa Oncall (AOC) for removing the wall along Magna Carta to ensure safety of pedestrians in an amount not to exceed \$80,674.90.
 - a. Board discussed and agreed to table this, pending information from the engineer.
- 5. Discuss proposal from Identitec in the amount of \$6,292 for the repair of four 12-ft pole/streets/stop signage assemblies located at Spinner at Magna Carta, Chanute at Magna Carta, Presto at Endicott, and Devon (SWC) at Hallmark.
 - a. The quote was approved 11/16/23. Work to be completed once the materials have been received. It is expected to be completed in the February/March timeframe.

Call to Order 6:32 p.m. by President, Mary Garza. Present were board members Mary Garza, Curtis Buchanan, Barbra Thomas, James VanCamp, Julia Perez, Tam Nguyen and others: Lee Harriss, City of Grand Prairie, and Ferronica Briggs, Associa. Absent was board member Raul Leal.

Call to Order – 6:32 pm Invocation – Mary Garza Citizens' Forum – None

Agenda Items:

- 1. Consider proposal from SPSD in the amount of \$118,059.91 for 2024 landscape maintenance on Great Southwest, Claremont, and Magna Carta.
 - a. This proposal is for a calendar year. The board's budget is a fiscal period from Oct-Sep.
 - b. The proposal added a mulch change two times per year, which was requested by the board. This was the main reason for the increase. The last change in mulch was February 2023 and it has faded so the board requested the mulch.
 - c. Mulch is to be added in March and it will be a red color. Depending upon the appearance and feedback from the community, the September mulch color is to be determined.
 - d. The board discussed the color changes. There are three scheduled (March, June, and November). The board wants to stay with native landscaping which can tolerate the elements. We requested that Associa find out more information regarding this expense with SPSD.
 - e. The board also discussed the prickly pear cactus that didn't survive during the recent winter freeze. Associa is going to look into this as well with SPSD.
 - f. We requested the irrigation reports that are completed by SPSD be provided to the board. Associa to follow up with SPSD.
 - g. Motion passed, none opposed.
- 2. Discussion of Budget to Actual Financial Report for January 31, 2024 presented by Lee Harriss.
 - a. Lease Payments for the Flock Cameras are on the report; however, we do not yet have a contract. It expired. The last payment was in May of 2022. The City says the attorneys are working on the contract.
 - b. The decorations line item amount. Comment made how residents liked the decorations. There were some electrical issues causing some areas not to work properly. We've asked Associa to help resolve this issue prior to the next installation.
- 3. Consider amending OHSV PID bylaws to reduce number of board members from seven to five.
 - a. Bylaws do not need to be amended because they have a range of three to nine. No specific number is required in the bylaws. Therefore, no vote is required. Although there is no urgency, the board will plan on reducing board member count to five thru attrition.
 - b. Julia Perez announced her resignation. We are grateful for her contributions, and she will be missed, but we understand why she is stepping away.

- Warranty for transplanted and non-irrigated plant material is excluded.

- Work to be performed during regular business hours. Overtime rates may apply for worked performed outside of normal business hours.
