

Background – What is Sustainability?

- There is no universally agreed definition of sustainability
- Municipal practitioners have defined sustainability as improving the quality of human life while balancing the need for environmental protection, societal progress and economic growth

Making Sustainability a Core Value

- Create a Sustainability Commission or Task Force
- Create a Sustainability Plan
- Hire staff to be a liaison to the Commission/Task Force and manage the Sustainability Program






Sustainability Commission or Task Force

- Sustainability Task Force
 - Council can request the City Manager to create a Task Force
 - Members appointed by City Manager
 - $_{\circ}$ $\,$ Purpose and formulation of the functions of the task force established by City Manager $\,$
 - $_{\circ}$ $\,$ Staff would follow-up with council regarding a recommendation from the task force
 - $_{\circ}$ $\,$ The task force could have a sunset date
- Sustainability Commission
 - Establish an ordinance to create a new chapter in the municipal code (2.51)
 - Membership appointed by council (5 to 9 citizens of Greeley)
 - Purpose of the Commission would be established by council
 - Functions/Powers of the Commission established by council
 - The more detailed procedures can be taken care of in the commission's by-laws that they would create/adopt



Sustainability Plan

- A strategic plan that outlines goals and objectives with action items on how the organization plans on addressing sustainability initiatives that pertain to the Community and the Organization
 - Most organizations hire a consultant to work w/ city staff and the Commission/Task Force to develop a Sustainability Plan (Estimated Cost: \$35K)





Sustainability Staff

- Chief Sustainability Officer
 - Are responsible for an organization's objectives and initiatives relating to sustainability
 - Analyze and predicts the organizations' future outlook, present stability, and environmental impact
 - Work with the Commission/Taskforce to implement strategies to improve the organizations and community sustainability efforts





Staff Recommendation

- Request the City Manager to form a Task Force of community members and city staff that will evaluate and make recommendations as it pertains to sustainability initiatives for the City of Greeley
 - **.** Keeps components of the evaluation/assessment:
 - What does sustainability mean to the City of Greeley
 - Sustainability Strategic Plan/Program/Initiatives
 - Sustainability Staff
- Hire a consultant to work w/ city staff and the Task Force to develop Greeley's Sustainability Program/Plan

Consideration of an Executive Session to instruct negotiators and to confer with the City Attorney for the purpose of receiving legal advice related to the City's pending litigation against the manufacturers, distributors and wholesalers of opioid medications, as authorized by C.R.S. §§ 24-6-402(4)(b) and 24-6-402 (e)(I) and Greeley Municipal Code 2-151 §§ (a)(2) and 2-151(a)(5).

Background:

On October 1, 2019, City Council passed a resolution authorizing the City Attorney to institute litigation against opioid manufacturers and wholesalers related to the misuse and over-prescription of opioid painkillers. On October 9, 2019, the City filed a lawsuit in the United States District Court for the District of Colorado against several opioid manufacturers and wholesalers. On October 31, 2019, the United States Judicial Panel on Multi-District Litigation transferred the City's case (along with more than 1,800 other cases) to the Northern District of Ohio. Settlement negotiations are ongoing and direction from City Council regarding the City's position in these negotiations is needed. The City Attorney and Deputy City Attorney will provide legal advice to City Council relative to the negotiations.
