Fiscal Years 2020 and 2021 – Status and Overview

#### **Background:**

Since mid-March of this year, the City of Greeley has been experiencing impacts from COVID-19. These impacts have affected many important components of the City organization including revenues, service levels and operations. While most services have remained accessible since that time, a number of services and programs have been impacted by governmental orders and revenue shortfalls. The City staff has been and continues to monitor the fluid conditions and impacts in an effort to assess the demand, revenue impacts, and plan service delivery accordingly.

As a part of that process, the Finance Department will provide a presentation to the City Council outlining the assumptions for and modifications to the current Fiscal Year 2020 budget. In addition, as the Finance Department prepares for the Fiscal Year 2021 budget development, the presentation will also include a review of the assumptions, service levels and strategic levers planned for use in developing and balancing the Fiscal Year 2021 City Manager's Recommended Budget.

As the City prepares to implement and close out the Fiscal Year 2020 budget and develop the Fiscal Year 2021 City Manager's Recommended Budget, the unstable economic environment will pose challenges. This discussion with Council will assist in ensuring alignment on assumptions and approaches moving forward.

- Reduced/Modified Services Mandated Limitations & Desired Subsidy
  - Culture/Parks/Recreation up to \$10 million in reductions
- Possible Deferment of Activities Reduction up to \$2 Million
- Investment in Strategic Improvements Increases up to \$2 Million




# Service Levels – Strategic Levers Examples of Challenges – Subsidy/Reserves

- Opening of Pools, UCCC Events, Recreation Center, Ice Haus, etc.
  - Limited Number of Participants
  - Significant Reduction in Direct Revenues While Operating Costs Remain High
  - Need to Identify Desired/Sustainable Level of Investment/Subsidy in Services
- City Savings Available to Cover Short-Term Shortfalls Not the Long-Term
  - Need to Balance Additional Costs to Operate with Sustainable Resources
  - Should Not be Used for Ongoing Increases:
    - Pay Increases, Inflationary Costs, or Service Level Increases
