DECLARATION OF A QUORUM AND CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Steve Fortenberry called the Regular Meeting to order at 7:00 PM and announced all members present except Council Member Potter and Council Member Price. Mayor Fortenberry noted that Council Member Price would be arriving shortly.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Fortenberry invited the Midway Little League Champions to lead the pledge.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION(S) AND RECOGNITION(S)

1. **SPECIAL PRESENTATION OF PROCLAMATION IN RECOGNITION OF MIDWAY LITTLE LEAGUE 2022 ALL-STAR SOFTBALL TEAM - WORLD SERIES (12U) CHAMPIONS.** Mayor Fortenberry presented the proclamation declaring September 19, 2022, as Midway Little League World Series Championship Day.

He expressed appreciation to the city for allowing short-term rentals in the city, and he stated he had some questions about a letter received requiring registration and payment of hotel occupancy tax.

- 2. PUBLIC HEARING AND ACTION ON ORDINANCE NO. 2022-12(A) APPROVING A REQUEST FOR A VARIANCE TO THE SIGN ORDINANCE FOR A PYLON SIGN LOCATED AT 325 ENTERPRISE BLVD. AS PRESCRIBED IN CHAPTER 58 SIGN REGULATIONS, SECTION 58-7 (P) SIGN REQUIREMENTS FOR NON-RESIDENTIAL USES, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HEWITT. THE REQUEST IS TO ALLOW FOR THE INSTALLATION OF A 40-FOOT-TALL PYLON SIGN WITH APPROXIMATELY 80 SQUARE FEET OF FACING PER SIDE.**




