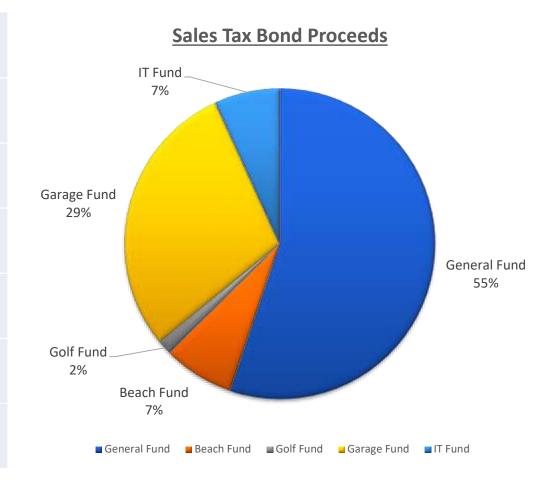

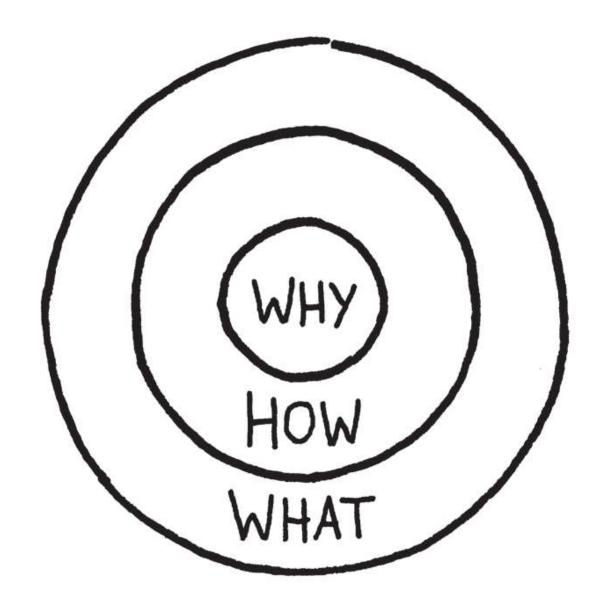

Commission adopted the City of Lake Worth Beach's Strategic Plan 2020-2025.



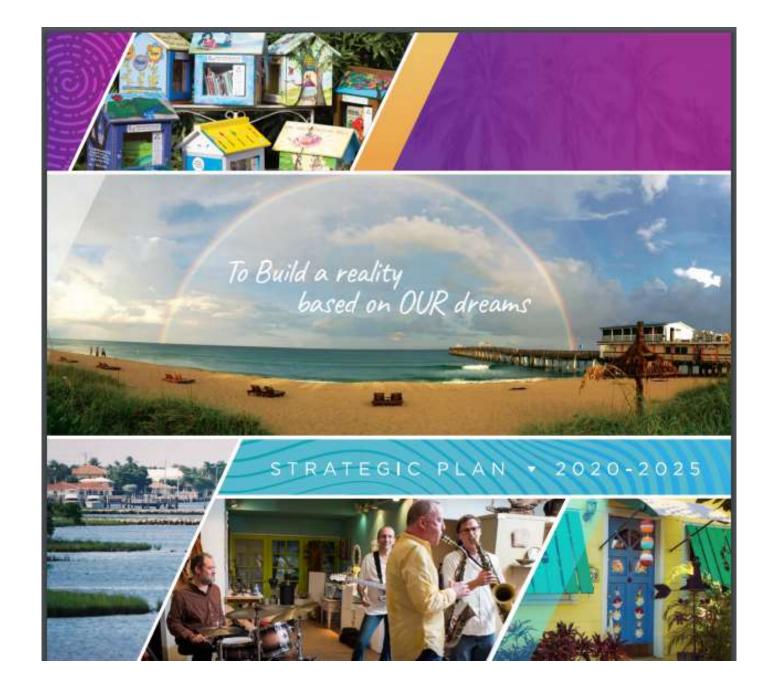
A Strategic Plan provides a framework for making critical policy and budgetary decisions about investing resources TODAY in order to maximize performance in the FUTURE.
