You have the right to dispute inaccurate information by contacting the consumer reporting agency directly. Once you have directly notified the consumer reporting agency of your dispute, the agency must, within a reasonable period of time reinvestigate and record the current status of the disputed information. If after reinvestigation, such information is found to be inaccurate or unverifiable, such information must be promptly deleted from your records. If the reinvestigation does not resolve the dispute, you may file a brief statement setting forth the nature of the dispute with the consumer reporting agency. Your filed statement will then be included or summarized in any subsequent consumer report containing the information in question.

- LC 04 94 02 20 Religious Organization Directors and Officers Liability Coverage
- LC 28 09 02 20 Health Occupation Training Student Professional Liability
- LC 28 10 02 20 Pastoral Professional Liability
- A. Sexual Misconduct Liability Coverage, LC 04 91 02 20 Sexual Misconduct Liability Coverage (Claims-Made), LC 04 92 02 20

If your expiring policy provided Sexual Misconduct or Molestation Liability Coverage, it was provided as a separate, self-contained Coverage Part (**LC 00 11 or LC 00 21**). Your new Sexual Misconduct Liability Coverage is provided as an endorsement to the Commercial General Liability Coverage Part (CGL).

All changes described below apply to your new endorsement LC 04 91 or LC 04 92, unless noted otherwise.

Broadenings Of Coverage

- 1. The Insuring Agreement in your new endorsement is broader because it expresses that it will pay sums that you become legally obligated to pay as damages because of sexual misconduct. Your expiring policy would only pay for loss arising out of these specific circumstances:
 - A wrongful act, but only to the extent of the insured's vicarious liability; or
 - The insured's negligent employment; investigation; supervision; retention; training; reporting to proper authorities, or failure to report to proper authorities, of a person who committed a wrongful act; or negligent act, or failure to act, upon receipt of a complaint arising out of a wrongful act.
- 2. The Supplementary Payment Section of your new endorsement contains the following revisions:
 - Loss of Earnings now provides up to \$500 per day because of time off from work at our request to assist us in the investigation or defense of a claim or suit.

- Prejudgment interest has been added as a Supplementary Payment in your new endorsement. This
 means that with respect to any claim we investigate or settle, or any suit against an insured we defend
 we will pay prejudgment interest awarded against the insured on that part of the judgment we pay. In
 your expiring policy, prejudgment interest was not included as a Supplementary Payment. Any
 payments made for such prejudgment interest under your expiring policy were considered a covered
 loss and as a result reduced your available limits of insurance.
- 3. The following summarizes several changes pertaining to Innocent Party Defense Expense Coverage:
 - If your expiring policy included the LC 99 46 Innocent Party Defense Coverage Endorsement, it
 provided an Aggregate Defense Expense Amount of \$100,000 or \$300,000. Your new endorsement
 provides an Innocent Party Defense Expense Coverage Limit that is equal to the lesser of your new
 endorsement's Aggregate Sexual Misconduct Limit or \$1,000,000. This broadens the defense expense
 coverage limit if your new endorsement's Aggregate Sexual Misconduct Limit is greater than \$300,000.
 - The loss of earnings expense has been increased to up to \$500 per day. This broadens coverage if your expiring policy included the LC 99 46 Innocent Party Defense Coverage Endorsement.
 - If your expiring policy did not include the LC 99 46 Innocent Party Defense Coverage Endorsement, coverage is broadened because it includes Innocent Party Defense Expense Coverage automatically at no additional premium charge.
- 4. The Who Is An Insured Section of your new endorsement contains the following revisions:
 - A limited liability company will qualify as an insured under your CGL and new endorsement. Your CGL indicates that if you are a limited liability company, your members are also insureds with respect to the conduct of your business. Your managers are insureds, but only with respect to their duties.
 - Your expiring policy included your board members or commissioners as insureds, if you were a public
 board or commission, but only with respect to their duties as such. Your new endorsement broadens
 coverage because it now includes any of your past, present or future lawfully elected or appointed
 officials, members, commissioners, trustees, directors or executive officers of your boards, committees
 or commissions, with respect to their duties as such.
 - Student interns are included as insureds under your new endorsement.

Miscellaneous Changes

- 1. The Insuring Agreement Section of your new endorsement contains the following revisions:
 - Your new endorsement clarifies that sexual misconduct involving multiple, continuous, sporadic or related acts of misconduct, committed by one person or two or more persons acting together will be deemed to have been first committed when the first such act was committed.
 - If your renewal policy includes LC 04 92, your new endorsement indicates that a claim seeking
 damages will be deemed to have been made at the earlier of when notice of such claim is received and
 recorded by any insured or by us, whichever comes first; or when we make settlement.
- 2. Your new endorsement contains the following Exclusion revisions:
 - Your new endorsement includes an Intentional Acts exclusion. This provision excludes coverage for sexual misconduct that was expected or intended from the standpoint of the insured or committed with the knowledge, consent, direction or participation of the insured. Your expiring policy's Insuring Agreement prevented coverage for wrongful acts committed with the knowledge, consent, direction or participation of the insured. Wrongful acts expected or intended from the standpoint of the insured were not expressly excluded under your expiring policy.

- An Injunctive or Other Non-Monetary Relief exclusion is included in your new endorsement. Your
 expiring policy didn't include a specific exclusion for injunctive or non-monetary relief, but these types
 of claims would not have been covered because they were removed from the definition of loss
 contained in your expiring policy. This results in a clarification of coverage intent.
- Your new endorsement's Punitive or Exemplary Damages exclusion clarifies that if a suit is brought
 against you arising out of a claim which alleges both compensatory and punitive or exemplary damages,
 we will defend the entire suit with the understanding that we'll pay only the compensatory damages. In
 addition, a definition of punitive or exemplary damages is included in your new endorsement.
- 3. The Supplementary Payments Section in your new endorsement reinforces that coverage is provided for court costs taxed against you, but does not provide coverage for plaintiff's attorneys' expenses taxed against you. While this is considered to be a reinforcement of coverage intent, it may result in a reduction in coverage in some jurisdictions.
- 4. The Who Is An Insured Section of your new endorsement contains the following revisions:
 - Your new endorsement clarifies that clergy and your other leaders or honorifics, including but not limited to elders, deacons or wardens are included as insureds.
 - Your new endorsement clarifies that no person is an insured for any claim or suit arising out of sexual
 misconduct that is committed with such person's knowledge, consent, direction or participation.
- 5. The Limits of Insurance Section of your new endorsement contains the following revisions:
 - Your new endorsement clarifies that the limits of insurance are the most we will pay regardless of the number of organizations making claims or bringing suits.
 - The new Each Sexual Misconduct Limit clarifies that it is the most we will pay under the endorsement's
 coverage for the sum of all damages arising out of any one sexual misconduct regardless of the number
 of persons making claims or bringing suits. The provision also clarifies that one sexual misconduct
 includes a single act of misconduct or multiple, continuous, sporadic or related acts of misconduct,
 committed by one person or two or more persons acting together toward another person or persons.
 - Your new endorsement clarifies that the Each Sexual Misconduct Limit and the Aggregate Sexual Misconduct Limit are not subject to the CGL's separate Each Occurrence Limit or General Aggregate Limit. This means that any payment we make for damages arising from sexual misconduct will only be subject to the Each Sexual Misconduct Limit and Aggregate Sexual Misconduct Limit. Such payments will not be subject to or reduce the CGL's Each Occurrence or General Aggregate Limits, respectively.
- 6. If your expiring policy was subject to a deductible, your renewal policy has been issued without a separate LC 03 51 Sexual Misconduct and Molestation Liability Deductible endorsement because your new endorsement automatically includes deductible policy provisions. The new deductible provision clarifies that one sexual misconduct includes a single act of misconduct or multiple, continuous, sporadic or related acts of misconduct, committed by one person or two or more persons acting together toward another person or persons.
- 7. Your expiring policy included a number of Sexual Misconduct and Molestation Liability conditions and definitions. Your new endorsement does not contain many of those conditions and definitions, because they are contained within the CGL policy to which your new endorsement is attached.
- 8. Your new endorsement contains an important new definition of sexual misconduct that is used in constructing your policy's coverages, exclusions and other policy provisions. This definition is intended to clarify the meaning of the term by adding examples of the types of misconduct that can be considered to be sexual misconduct.

As reflected in your new endorsement, sexual misconduct means any actual, alleged or threatened act of misconduct that is of a sexual nature and is committed by one person or two or more persons acting together towards another person or persons. Sexual Misconduct includes but is not limited to:

- Molestation, abuse, assault, physical touching, contact;
- Harassment, advances, victimization, exploitation, requests for favors;
- Coercion to engage in sexual activities, exhibitionism, voveurism;
- Verbal or non-verbal communication; or
- Showing, sharing or creating of text, pictures, drawings, audio, video or digital recording.
- 9. If your expiring policy included the **LC 00 11** coverage form, it contained a Late Notification of An Incident exclusion which excluded coverage when you failed to give us written notice within 90 days of your being notified of an incident which could reasonably be expected to result in a claim. Your new endorsement does not contain a similar exclusion. However, you are still required to comply with the endorsement's Duties In The Event of Sexual Misconduct, Claim or Suit Condition which requires you to notify us as soon as practicable of sexual misconduct which may result in a claim.

Restrictions In Coverage

- 1. If your policy includes the new endorsement LC 04 91, the Insuring Agreement in your new endorsement indicates that insurance applies only if the sexual misconduct is first committed during the policy period. This is intended to restrict the coverage that is provided so that only the policy in effect when the sexual misconduct was first committed will apply. Your expiring policy did not restrict coverage to the policy period in which the wrongful act was first committed.
- 2. A Claims-Made Inception Date (CMID) is included within the LC 04 92 endorsement. CMID means the CMID shown in the Schedule of the LC 04 92. If a CMID is not shown in the Schedule, then the CMID will mean the effective date of the first Sexual Misconduct Liability coverage issued and continuously provided by us or any of our affiliates, parent companies or subsidiaries.

The CMID provision reduces coverage because it says that insurance will only apply if on or before the CMID:

- Notice was not given to any prior insurer of sexual misconduct or any fact, circumstance, situation, event, transaction or cause reasonably likely to give rise to a claim; and
- Any insured who was designated by you to give or receive notice of sexual misconduct had no knowledge of such sexual misconduct or any fact, circumstance, situation, event, transaction or cause reasonably likely to give rise to a claim.

Your expiring policy contained a similar provision, but it did not contain a specific CMID, nor did it apply to any fact, circumstance, situation, event, transaction or cause reasonably likely to give rise to a claim

3. A Sexual Misconduct or Abuse Exclusion now applies within your new endorsement. This exclusion specifically applies to the CGL Coverages A and B. A similar exclusion was not contained in your expiring Sexual Misconduct or Molestation Liability Coverage Form. However, if your expiring policy had a companion CGL policy, the LC 21 109 Sexual Misconduct and Molestation Liability Exclusion may have been attached to the CGL.

The following restrictions in coverage apply, some depending on whether or not your expiring companion CGL included the **LC 21 109**:

- If your expiring companion CGL policy did not include the LC 21 109, coverage provided by your new endorsement is reduced because it now contains the sexual misconduct or abuse exclusion.
- The new endorsement excludes coverage for abuse. The LC 21 109 did not exclude abuse.
- The new endorsement's exclusion is potentially broader in that it applies to any liability, damages, loss, injury, demand, claim or suit. LC 21 109 applied only to bodily injury, property damage or personal and advertising injury.
- Negligent supervision of any person who was subjected to sexual misconduct or abuse of any kind, including physical or mental abuse is excluded.

- The exclusion now applies if the claim against any insured alleges other wrongdoing.
- **4.** Your new endorsement contains an Employment Related Practices exclusion that excludes coverage for situations like wrongful termination, demotion, harassment, discipline or defamation.
- 5. If your expiring policy included the LC 00 11 coverage form without modification, it contained an Other Insurance Condition that made it primary over any other valid and collectible insurance that also applied to a loss. Your new endorsement's Other Insurance Condition is similar. However, when you have been added as an additional insured to any other primary insurance that also applies to a loss, your new endorsement will apply on an excess basis.
- B. Sexual Misconduct or Abuse Exclusion, LC 21 141 02 20

If LC 21 109 02 14 Sexual Misconduct and Molestation Liability Exclusion applied to your expiring policy, your renewal policy may have been issued with the LC 21 141 02 20 Sexual Misconduct or Abuse Exclusion.

The following changes apply when LC 21 141 is attached to your renewal policy:

- LC 21 141 applies to any liability, damages, loss, injury, demand, claim or suit arising out of sexual misconduct or abuse as defined in the endorsement. Your expiring policy's exclusion specifically applied only to bodily injury, property damage or personal and advertising injury arising out of sexual misconduct or molestation. While the overall purpose of this change is to clarify the exclusion's intent, the broader terms of LC 21 141 may result in a reduction in coverage in some circumstances.
- LC 21 141 applies to sexual misconduct or abuse. If your expiring policy contained LC 21 109, the
 exclusion applied to sexual misconduct or sexual molestation, but not to abuse. The inclusion of abuse
 in your new exclusion reduces coverage. This change does not apply in Vermont.
- Your renewal policy's exclusion now applies to the actual, alleged or threatened sexual misconduct or abuse of any kind, including physical or mental abuse, of any person. The LC 21 109 exclusion applied to actual or alleged sexual misconduct or sexual molestation. The addition of threatened sexual misconduct or abuse to the exclusion results in a reduction in coverage.
- **LC 21 141** contains a new exclusion that applies to the negligent supervision of any person who was subjected to sexual misconduct or abuse of any kind, including physical or mental abuse.
- The LC 21 141 exclusion applies if the claim against any insured alleges other wrongdoing.
- LC 21 141 contains a definition of sexual misconduct for clarification purposes.

If your expiring policy did not contain the **LC 21 109**, but your renewal policy now includes **LC 21 141**, your coverage has been reduced by the exclusions contained in this new endorsement.

C. Religious Organization Directors and Officers Liability Coverage, LC 04 94 02 20

If your expiring policy provided coverage for Religious Organization Directors and Officers Liability Coverage it was provided as a separate, self-contained Coverage Part (**LC 00 15**). Your new **LC 04 94 02 20** Religious Organization Directors and Officers Liability Coverage is provided as an endorsement to the Commercial General Liability Coverage Part (CGL).

All changes described below apply to **LC 04 94** unless noted otherwise.

Broadenings Of Coverage

- 1. The Supplementary Payment Loss of Earnings now provides up to \$500 per day because of time off from work at our request to assist us in the investigation or defense of a claim or suit.
- 2. The Who Is An Insured Section of your new endorsement contains the following revisions:

- Any person elected or appointed in the past, present or future as a director, officer, trustee, committee member or member of your board of governors or directors and officers or trustees is now an insured.
- Organizations over which the named insured maintains a majority ownership or interest are insureds with respect to their official duties for the organization.
- Newly acquired or formed organizations will now qualify as insureds.

Miscellaneous Changes

- 1. Your new endorsement's Insuring Agreement provides Religious Organization Directors and Officers Liability Coverage on a claims-made basis. This claims-made insurance requires that wrongful acts do not take place before the Retroactive Date or after the end of the policy period. Claims must be first made during the policy period, or any Extended Reporting Period that we provide.
- 2. Your new endorsement contains the following Exclusion clarifications:
 - Your new endorsement relies on the CGL's definition of personal and advertising injury within the
 context of its' Bodily Injury, Property Damage and Personal and Advertising Injury exclusion. As used
 in the exclusion, the definition clarifies that oral or written publication, in any manner, is excluded. The
 reference to in any manner intends to emphasis the many types of media that could be used to publish.
 - The Civil Rights Law or Ordinance Exclusion clarifies that coverage is excluded for damages arising
 out of the violation of any civil rights statute or ordinance, including those barring discrimination based
 on race, color, creed, sex, religion, age, national origin, gender identity, gender expression or sexual
 orientation.
- 3. The Supplementary Payments Section in your new endorsement:
 - Now expresses that we will also pay with respect to any claim we investigate. Your expiring policy
 indicated we would pay with respect to any claim we settle or any suit we defend.
 - Reinforces that coverage is provided for court costs taxed against you, but does not provide coverage
 for plaintiff's attorneys' fees or attorneys' expenses taxed against you. While this is considered to be a
 reinforcement of coverage intent, it may result in a decrease in coverage in jurisdictions where courts
 have ruled that plaintiff's attorneys' fees or attorneys' expenses taxed against the insured can be levied
 as a supplementary payment.
- 4. The Limits of Insurance Section of your new endorsement contains the following revisions:
 - Your new endorsement clarifies that the Limits of Insurance are the most we will pay regardless of the number of wrongful acts.
 - The Each Wrongful Act Limit now expresses that a single wrongful act or a series of wrongful acts that
 have common or related facts, circumstances, situations, events, transactions or causes will be
 considered one wrongful act. This may represent a reduction in coverage, depending on the
 circumstances of a claim.
 - Your new endorsement clarifies that the Each Wrongful Act Limit and the Aggregate Limit are not subject to the CGL's separate Each Occurrence Limit or General Aggregate Limit. This means that any payment we make for damages arising from a wrongful act will only be subject to the Each Wrongful Act Limit and Aggregate Limit. Such payments will not be subject to or reduce the CGL's Each Occurrence or General Aggregate Limits, respectively.
- 5. Your expiring policy included a number of conditions. Your new endorsement does not contain many of those conditions because they are contained within the CGL policy to which your new endorsement is attached. As a result, similar conditions continue to apply.
- 6. The Definitions Section of your new endorsement contains the following revisions:

- Your expiring policy included a number of definitions. Your new endorsement does not contain many of those definitions because they are contained within the CGL policy to which your new endorsement is attached. As a result, similar definitions continue to apply. In addition, new definitions of pastoral counseling, punitive or exemplary damages and sexual misconduct are added to clarify coverage intent throughout the endorsement.
- The definition of wrongful act is revised to reflect that it means actual or alleged acts, errors or omissions, misrepresentations, negligence or breach of duty committed by one or more directors and officers, committee members or board of governors while acting in their capacity as such.
- 7. A new Extended Reporting Period applies to your new endorsement as follows:
 - Your new endorsement will provide an Extended Reporting Period when we renew or replace your coverage with insurance that does not apply to damages that arise out of wrongful acts on a claimsmade basis.
 - A Basic Extended Reporting Period is automatically provided without additional charge. This period starts at the end of the policy period and lasts for 60 days.
 - The Supplemental Extended Reporting Period is available for an additional premium charge. This
 period starts at the end of the Basic Extended Reporting Period and lasts for three years. You must
 give us a written request for a Supplemental Extended Reporting Period within 60 days after the end
 of the original policy period.
 - If you purchase a Supplemental Extended Reporting Period, a separate Supplemental Extended Reporting Period Aggregate Limit of Insurance will apply during that reporting period.
- **8.** The Duties In The Event Of A Wrongful Act, Claim Or Suit Condition is revised to clarify that notice of a wrongful act is not notice of a claim.

Restrictions In Coverage

- 1. If your new endorsement's Retroactive Date is equal to your renewal policy's effective date, there is potential for a restriction in coverage. This potential restriction in coverage results in a circumstance where a wrongful act was committed during one of your expiring coverage forms prior policy periods but a claim was not reported to us within one year after the termination or expiration of your most recent expiring policy.
- 2. A Claims-Made Inception Date (CMID) is added to your new endorsement. The CMID means the CMID shown in the Schedule of the endorsement. If a CMID is not shown in the Schedule, then the CMID will mean the effective date of the first Religious Organization Directors and Officers Liability coverage issued and continuously provided by us or any of our affiliates, parent companies or subsidiaries.

The CMID provision reduces coverage because it says that insurance will only apply if on or before the CMID:

- Notice was not given to any prior insurer of such wrongful act or any fact, circumstance, situation, event, transaction or cause reasonably likely to give rise to a claim; and
- Any insured who was designated by you to give or receive notice of a wrongful act had no knowledge
 of such wrongful act or any fact, circumstance, situation, event, transaction or cause reasonably likely
 to give rise to a claim.
- 3. Your expiring policy contained an Other Insurance Condition that made it primary over any other valid and collectible insurance that also applied to a loss. Your new endorsement's Other Insurance Condition is similar. However, your new endorsement is excess over any other insurance that is in effect prior to the beginning of the policy period and applies to wrongful acts on other than a claims-made basis, if:
 - · No Retroactive Date applies; or

- The other insurance has a policy period which continues after the Retroactive Date of this endorsement.
- The Exclusions Section of your new endorsement contains the following revisions:
 - Your new endorsement contains a number of newly expressed exclusions. Depending on the circumstances surrounding each individual claim, some of these exposures may have been precluded from coverage under your expiring policy. However, because these exclusions are now specifically expressed we are categorizing them as restrictions in coverage out of caution. Refer to your endorsement for more information on the following exclusions:
 - Access or Disclosure of Confidential or Personal Information and Data Related Liability: 0
 - Contractual Liability;
 - Cyber, Data and Network Security;
 - Employee Benefit Plans: 0
 - **Employment Related Practices**;
 - Pastoral Counseling:
 - Punitive Damages Or Exemplary Damages; 0
 - Real Property; 0
 - Recording and Distribution of Material in Violation of Law:
 - Workers' Compensation and Similar Laws;
 - The Sexual Misconduct exclusion contained in your new endorsement is broader because it doesn't limit its' application to acts committed by any insured, employee of the insured or any other person performing services for or on behalf of any insured. In addition, the new endorsement's exclusion also applies to negligent training of a person who committed sexual misconduct.
 - The School Board Liability exclusion now applies to duties that are within the scope of ownership, administration, maintenance or operation of a preschool.
- D. Pastoral Professional Liability, LC 28 10 02 20
 - 1. LC 28 10 is revised throughout for clarification of coverage intent.
 - 2. 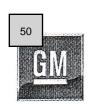

MOBILE COMMUNICATIONS AMERICA INC. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

DEFINITIONS: __*MCA" & "Company" shall mean Mobile Communications
America, Inc. "Customer" & "Buyer" shall mean the customer named herein &
"Products" shall collectively mean the equipment, parts, services & software
referred to in the agreement.

CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE OF ORDER: Mobile Communications America, Inc.'s acceptance of this order is expressly conditioned upon buyer's consent to the terms and conditions of sale as contained herein. This Agreement contains all of the terms and conditions of this purchase and sale. If these terms and conditions are not acceptable to buyer, buyer must so notify MCA prior to order placement by specific written objection. Buyer's consent to these terms and conditions will be inferred upon buyer's acceptance of a quote from MCA unless written objections are received prior to order placement. No waiver, alteration or modification of this Agreement shall be binding on MCA unless in writing and signed by an Executive officer of MCA.

CANCELLATION: In case of cancellation prior to delivery, customer will be charged and agrees to pay 20% of the total order, and in addition, pre-site and/or engineering charges as quoted, or at prevailing rates, will be invoiced to Customer. The order is not cancelable after delivery. Cancellations must be provided in writing. Special order items may not be cancelable depending on third party vendor terms and conditions. Programmed equipment is not returnable according to some Manufacturer's guidelines & therefore a cancellation or return may not be accepted by MCA in these instances.

DELIVERY: Unless otherwise specifically provided, delivery of all items shall be FOB seller's shipping facility or at seller's option, FOB point of manufacture. Ground shipment charges will be prepaid and added to invoice. Title and risk of loss or damage shall pass to buyer upon seller's delivery of the goods to a common carrier or other delivery agency for shipment to buyer. Standard commercial packing for domestic ground shipment is included in the FOB price. Insurance is not included in the price unless requested by buyer at the time of order placement. It shall be the responsibility of the buyer to file claims with the carrier for loss or damage to goods while in transit. Absent specific instructions, we will select the carrier for shipment, but by doing so. will not thereby assume any liability in connection with shipment nor shall the carrier in any way be construed to be our agent. MCA shall not be liable for any damages or penalty for delay caused solely by transportation or failure to give notice of such delay. The seller shall not be responsible for any failure to perform due to causes beyond its reasonable control, such as, but not limited to, acts of God, acts of the buyer, acts of civil or military authority, judicial action, default of subcontractors or vendors, priorities, labor disputes, accident, failure or delays on transportation, and inability to obtain necessary labor or materials. In the event of any delay due to such causes, or other difficulties, (whether or not similar in nature to any of those specified) the date of delivery shall be extended for a period equal to the time lost.

SHORTAGES AND DEFECTS: Buyer will be deemed to have accepted the Products upon shipment unless MCA is notified in writing of the rejection of any unit of the product. Any claim of shortages or defects must be made within 3 days of delivery. Claims must be provided to seller in writing & must inform MCA of the specific reason for rejection. Buyer shall afford seller prompt and reasonable opportunity to inspect all materials against which any claim is made. Buyer shall not return any equipment to seller without prior authorization. After MCA has reviewed the rejection notice & authorized the return, buyer will return the unit to MCA in the same condition as when it was received. All returns must be in the original container & packing along with all accessories & instructions included must be shipped freight prepaid.

TERMS AND METHODS OF PAYMENT: Each shipment shall be considered a separate and independent transaction and payment therefore shall be made accordingly. If installation or shipments are delayed by the buyer, payments shall be made due on the date when the company is prepared to make shipment or to install products. Products held for the buyer shall be at the risk and expense of the buyer. Products shipped as exchanges will be invoiced for full value until the product exchange is complete and product has been returned to MCA in good and working condition, only then will full value credit be given to buyer. If, in the judgment of the seller, the financial condition of the buyer at any time does not justify continuance of

performance or shipment on the terms of payment specified, the seller may require full or partial payment in advance. In the event of bankruptcy or insolvency of the buyer, or in the event any proceedings are brought by or against the buyer under the bankruptcy or insolvency laws, the seller shall be entitled to cancel any order then outstanding and shall receive reimbursement for its cancellation charges.

Customer grants to MCA a purchase money security interest in the goods or supplies, including any software provided hereunder, and to the proceeds thereof until the full price and all other liabilities due to MCA are satisfied. Upon payment in full to MCA, title to the goods and supplies shall pass to Customer and MCA's security interest shall be terminated. Any invoiced amount which is not paid in accordance with the terms & conditions of this Agreement shall be considered overdue. MCA shall be entitled, without prejudice to any other rights or remedies, to charge buyer with interest at the rate of 18 APR%. Buyer shall not deduct from any invoice any amounts, except such amounts as are set forth in any written credit memorandum issued by MCA to buyer prior to the due date of the outstanding invoice. Upon any default or breach by Customer hereunder, MCA shall have all of the rights and remedies of a secured party under the Uniform Commercial Code or other applicable law, which rights shall be cumulative. MCA shall have the right to enter Customer's premises and repossess and remove any equipment goods or supplies, including any software, sold hereunder if full payment has not been received by MCA. Any controversy or claims arising under this Agreement or under any contract or order to which the terms and conditions of the Agreement apply, which is not settled by agreement of the parties, shall be exclusively subject to the Laws of the State of Delaware and jurisdiction to which buyer consents shall be exclusively in the courts of the State of Delaware. In the event that MCA brings an action for collection of any overdue amount payable under this contract, buyer shall pay the cost of collection including reasonable attorney's fees.

STANDARD TERMS: If Customer has not established preliminary credit with MCA, prepayment of full amount is required.

40% down at order entry 50% at shipment 10% within 30 days of invoice or completion of installation, if applicable.

NON-STANDARD CREDIT TERMS: Negotiable prior to order acceptance.

NON-STANDARD PAYMENT TERMS: Subject to convenience fees.

LATE FEES:

If payment is outstanding after a 7 day grace period, interest at 18 APR% will be added to the balance.

All quotations reflect U.S. Dollars.
All payments must be made in U.S. funds.

TAXES: The prices stated in this order may not include any provision for sales, use, excise, or similar taxes. The amount of any and all such present or future taxes or other government charges applicable to the goods sold will be added by seller to the sales price and shall be paid by the buyer, unless buyer provides seller with a tax-exemption certificate acceptable to the taxing authority. If MCA is required to pay or bear the burden of any excluded tax, the prices set forth herein shall be increased by the amount of such tax and any interest or penalty assessed, and Customer shall pay to MCA the full payment of any such increase no later than 10 days after receipt of invoiced charges.

GENERAL: The buyer shall not assign this order or any interest therein or any rights hereunder without the written consent of the seller, and any such

assignment shall be void. In no event shall any claim for special or consequential damages be made by either party. The seller will comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws. Any provisions or conditions of the buyer's order which are in any way inconsistent with or in addition to these standard conditions of sales (except additional provisions specifying quantity, character of the product ordered and shipping instructions) shall not be binding on the seller and shall not be considered applicable to this sale. No additions to or modifications of any of these provisions shall be binding unless made in writing and signed by an executive officer of the seller. All such requests must be made within 10 days after Seller's receipt of the order to receive consideration. The validity hereunder shall be governed by the laws of the State of Delaware. The terms of sale shall be as outlined on this document, any terms or conditions not authorized by MCA will be void. They may also not be used on product containers, component parts, business forms, sales, advertising and promotional materials or any other business supplies or materials whether in writing, orally or otherwise.

FCC AND OTHER GOVERNMENT MATTERS: Aithough MCA may assist in the preparation of FCC License Applications, Customer is solely responsible for obtaining any licenses dictated under the FCC's rules and regulations or required by any other Federal, State or Local government agency. Neither MCA nor any of its employees is an agent of Customer in FCC or other governmental matters.

UMITATIONS:

A. <u>LIMITATIONS OF MCA LIABILITY:</u> Except for personal injury and except as provided for in the section "PATENT, COPYRIGHT AND TRADEMARKS", MCA's total liability arising out of or related to this Agreement whether for breach of contract, warranty, MCA's negligence, strict liability in tort,

- or otherwise, is limited to the price of the particular products sold hereunder with respect to which losses or damages are claimed. Customer's sole remedy is to request in writing that MCA at its option either refund the purchase price or repair or replace products that are not as warranted. In no event whether for breach of contract, warranty, MCA's negligence, strict fiability in tort or otherwise, will MCA be liable for incidental, special or consequential damages. This includes, but is not limited to, frustration of economic or business expectations, loss of profits, loss of data, cost of capital, cost of substitute products, facilities, or services, downtime cost, or any claim against Customer by any other party.
- B. <u>INSURANCE</u>: It is further understood that MCA is not an insurer and that Customer shall obtain all Insurance, if any, that is desired and that MCA does not represent or warranty that MCA products will event or prevent occurrences, or the consequences therefrom, which are monitored, detected, or controlled with the use of the products sold herein.
- C. NO REPRESENTATIONS: MCA's representatives are only authorized to fill in the blanks on this sales order or quote form with the information requested. Any and all representations, promises or statements by MCA representatives that differ in any way from the Terms and Conditions of this sales order, and any applicable warranties and licenses incorporated herein shall be given no force or effect. The issuance of information, advice, approvals, instructions or cost projections by MCA sales or service personnel or other representatives shall be deemed expressions of personal opinion only and shall not affect MCA and Customer's rights and obligations hereunder, unless that same is in writing and signed by an officer of MCA with the explicit statement that it constitutes an amendment to this Agreement.
 - WARRANTY AND DISCLAIMED WARRANTIES: As part of the Agreement MCA has provided Customer with the equipment Manufacturer's warranty and if applicable, it's Software License and Software Warranty which, to the extent applicable, are incorporated into and made a part of this Agreement. These warranties are given in lieu of all other warranties expressed or implied, which are specifically excluded. including, without limitation, implied warranties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose & noninfringement. Customer hereby acknowledges receipt of such warranties and license. Warranties are extended to the original End User of the Products and are not assignable or transferrable to any later purchases. MCA does not warrant that the operation of the products will be uninterrupted or error-free, or that defects in the products will be corrected. No oral or written representations made by MCA or an agent thereof shall create a warranty or in any way increase the scope of this warranty. MCA does not warrant any products that have been operated in excess of specifications, damaged, misused, neglected or improperly installed by another vendor. All labor warranties in relation to installation or repairs made by MCA will be in effect for 30 days after such work is completed. All claims against MCA's labor warranty must be made in writing prior to the end of the 30 day warranty period & must identify specific labor defects. MCA will require a reasonable period to assess and correct the installation or repair warranted. All terms of limitations of MCA's liability under section "Limitations, A" apply to labor as well as product warranties. In addition, labor and travel charges incurred by MCA may not be covered under the Manufacturer's warranty. In such cases, buyer will be responsible for any related charges not covered by the Manufacturer or their warranty. Manufacturer Warranties on equipment, parts and/or software may not cover removal of defective products or reinstallation of repaired/replaced products. Customer shall be responsible for delivering defective products to MCA for warranty service. Customer shall be responsible for reinstallation of repaired/replaced products.
