RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE USE AND GRANT OF PUBLIC FUNDS AND THINGS OF VALUE IN AID TO VARIOUS PRIVATE ENTITIES AS PART OF THE CITY'S ANNUAL BUDGET PROCESS, PURSUANT TO AMENDMENT 772 OF THE ALABAMA CONSTITUTION.

WHEREAS, the City has caused to be published a notice satisfying the requirements stated in Section 94.01 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901 (also known as the Amendment 772 to the Alabama Constitution of 1901), as amended (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment 772"), to the extent Amendment 772 applies, to approve and authorize the lending of the City's credit and the use and grant of public funds and things of value in aid of various nonprofit programs and entities identified herein; and

WHEREAS, the entities identified herein have undertaken and been instrumental in the development of important civic, benevolent, and youth programs within the corporate limits of the City of Leeds, Alabama (the "City"); and

WHEREAS, these programs and purposes include, to name only a few, the providing of educational and civic programs directly benefiting the citizens and more specifically the children of Leeds; and

WHEREAS, these identified programs have requested grant funds from the City to aid in the continuation and growth of their respective programs and community benefits; and

WHEREAS, a Grant/Appropriation Agreement will be created with the entity listed and the City in order to formalize all of the understandings, covenants, duties and commitments of each Party to the Agreement (the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held to allow comment from those who wish to be heard on this subject; and

WHEREAS, having duly deliberated and considered the matter at hand, the City desires to authorize and approve the execution, delivery, and performance of the Agreement and documents necessary to provide the requested grants and any other documents necessary to affect the purposes of this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEEDS, ALABAMA, as follows:

- 1. The Recitals set forth above are hereby found and declared to be true and correct.
- 2. The City has caused public notice of this meeting to be published in accordance with Amendment 772 to the Alabama Constitution of 1901, as amended.
- 3. It is hereby found and declared that the use and grant of public funds and things of value and the lending of the City's credit in connection the City's execution of the Agreement as the time of the subject grant to each of the identified entities; to wit:

\$2,500.00

will serve a valid and sufficient public purpose under Amendment 772 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, notwithstanding any incidental benefit accruing to any private entity (including any benefit to individual City citizens, or the affiliates, agents & assigns of as this Grant is expected to create a real impact on the lives of citizens and their general wellbeing as

they participate and utilize the services of the identified and approved entities listed herein.

- 4. Subject to the full execution of a Grant/Appropriation Agreement, with the entity listed herein, the execution, and any other actions necessary to affect the purposes of this Resolution are hereby approved and authorized.
- 5. The Mayor, City Clerk, and other representatives or agents of the City are hereby severally authorized and empowered to take any and all such further actions necessary, required, or convenient to effectuate the intent of this Resolution, and any such actions taken by them are hereby ratified and confirmed.

GRANT/APPROPRIATION AGREEMENT

THIS GRANT / APPROPRIATION AGREEMENT is effective as of this 22nd day of November 2019, by and between Ann's New Life Center (herein called the "Recipient" or "Grantee") and the City of Leeds Alabama, an Alabama municipal corporation (herein called "City").

WHEREAS, pursuant to Amendment 772 of the Alabama Constitution (i.e. Section 94.01), the City has approved the funding of certain expenditures to private entities to promote the general economic benefit and the enhancement of the overall wellbeing of the citizens in the City, which includes certain appropriations to the Grantee herein.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and other good and valuable consideration the receipt and adequacy of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>PURPOSE.</u> The purpose of this Grant Agreement is for the overall development of, and assistance for, important civic, economic development, education, benevolent, and/or health-related programs within the corporate limits of the City of Leeds, Alabama to include, without limitation, the operation and ownership of the Recipient's business and general civic outreach and support to the underserved citizens of the City.
- 2. <u>FUNDING & COMPENSATION.</u> This Project, for which the Grant/Appropriation Agreement is made, is financed with City funds not to exceed the sum of Two thousand five hundred Dollars and Zero Cents (\$2500.00) (the "Grant Amount") which is expected to be paid in <u>one</u> installment during the current fiscal year, under the terms of this Agreement, and shall not constitute a debt of the City or the approval of work accomplished or proper accounting for expenditures of the subject Grant funds.
- 3. <u>CONTINGENCY CLAUSE</u>. Although it is the overt intentions for the City to timely and fully fund this approved Grant, it is expressly understood and agreed that any City commitment of funds herein shall be contingent upon the availability of said funds following the execution of this Agreement.
- 4. <u>REPORTING.</u> The Grantee shall immediately provide a final written report listing Grant accomplishments and expenditures upon full expenditure of the Grant funds.

5. AUDITS.

- a. The Grantee hereby agrees and assents to the City policy (i.e. Res 2010-10-01 attached) that all City Grants or appropriations to private entities are subject to City audit.
- b. The Grantee's obligations herein shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

- c. Payment of funds awarded under this Grant Agreement may be suspended, withdrawn, or recaptured in the event that there is an illegal use of funds or an outstanding audit exception identified by any City audit.
- d. The City shall have access to any pertinent book, paper, or record of the Grantee for the purposes of the audit conducted, if any.
- 6. <u>TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT.</u> The City or the Grantee may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving written notice. Notwithstanding this provision, however, any commitments of the City shall terminate upon the full payment of the Grant Amount.
- 7. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS & CONFLICTS OF INTEREST. The expenditure of Grant funds shall be subject to all applicable state and local laws. The Grantee further certifies that to the best of its knowledge and belief, no conflicts of interest exist that may affect the subject Grant award.
- 8. <u>RECORD RETENTION</u>. All documents pertinent to the expenditure of Grant funds must be retained for five (5) years from the date of the final expenditure of the Grant funds.
- 9. MISCELLANEOUS. The designated representative of the Grantee certifies that:
 - a. He/She has legal authority to apply for and accept the Grant on behalf of the Grantee.
 - b. The Grantee will provide all managerial resources to ensure that the projects expenditures are completed in accordance with this Agreement.
 - c. Funds awarded should be expended only for the purposes and activities identified herein.
 - d. If the Grantee fails to properly utilize the funds provided, then the Grantee will reimburse the full amounts made pursuant to this Agreement.
 - e. The Grantee will establish and maintain a proper accounting system to record expenditure of the funds in accordance with generally accepted accounting standards.
 - **f.** The Grantee agrees that the City may elect to, withdraw all or part of this funding from the Grantee for noncompliance with any portion of the terms stated in this Agreement.

This Agreement is made by and between The City of Leeds, Alabama ("Client"), doing business at 1400 9th Street, Leeds, Alabama 35094 and, **Skipper Consulting, Inc**. ("Consultant"), doing business at 3644 Vann Road, Suite 100, Birmingham, Alabama 35235.

Who agree as follows: Client requires professional traffic engineering services to perform traffic signal design for the U.S. Highway 78 at Interstate 20 Eastbound Exit Ramp intersection in *Leeds, Alabama*. The Consultant shall be authorized to start work on the services outlined in this agreement upon execution of this Agreement. The Client and Consultant agree this agreement, together with Exhibit A referred to herein; constitute the entire agreement between them relating to this assignment.

1. PROFESSIONAL SERVICES: The Consultant agrees to perform the following Services under this agreement:

2. The Consultant agrees to furnish consulting services only, as may be required for any and all of Client's work. Consultant shall be responsible for coordination of his work with that of Client.

This agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties and any prior understanding or representation of any kind preceding the date of this agreement shall not be binding upon either party except to the extent incorporated in this agreement.

Any modification of this agreement or additional obligation assumed by either party in connection with this agreement shall be binding only if placed in writing and signed by each party or an authorized representative of each party.

It is agreed that this agreement shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Alabama.

The failure of either party to this agreement to insist upon the performance of any of the terms and conditions of this agreement, or the waiver of any breach of any of the terms and conditions of this

agreement, shall not be construed as thereafter waiving any such terms and conditions but the same shall continue and remain in full force and effect as if no such forbearance or waiver had occurred.

The invalidity of any portion of this agreement will not and shall not be deemed to affect the validity of any other provision. In the event that any provision of this agreement is held to be invalid, the parties agree that the remaining provisions shall be deemed to be in full force and effect.

Neither party to this agreement shall be liable to the other for any loss, cost, or damages, arising out from or resulting from, any failure to perform in accordance with the terms of this agreement where the causes of such failure shall include, but not limited to, acts of God, strikes, lockouts, or other industrial disturbances, wars, whether declared or undeclared, blockades, insurrections, riots, governmental action, explosions, fire, floods, or any other cause not within the reasonable control of either party.

Consultant shall secure and maintain such insurance as will protect him from claims under the workers' compensation acts and form claims for bodily injury, death, or property damage that may arise from the performance of his services under and pursuant to this agreement. Certificates of such coverage will be provided to Client upon request.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Client and Consultant agree that, except for claims of indemnification, the time period for claims under this agreement shall expire one year following completion of the project.

Client shall provide Consultant access to the project site necessary for the Consultant to provide the services outlined.

Reuse of any documents or other deliverables pertaining to the project by the Client other than for the project for which documents or deliverables were prepared without written verification by the Consultant shall be at the Client's risk.

Exhibit "A" SCOPE OF WORK U.S. Highway 78 at I-20 EASTBOUND EXIT RAMP Leeds, Alabama

Skipper Consulting, Inc. proposes to provide professional traffic engineering services related to signal design for the U.S. Highway 78 at I-20 Eastbound Exit Ramp intersection in Leeds, Alabama. It is the Consultant's understanding, based upon conversations with the City of Leeds, the Consultant's knowledge of the project location, and our understanding of the City/ALDOT requirements, that we are to undertake a traffic signal warrant study, traffic signal design, signal permitting and signal coordination timings development and installation following signal construction. The scope of work that follows represents the Consultant's understanding of this assignment.

Task 1 - Traffic Signal Warrant

The Consultant would undertake a Traffic Signal Warrant Study for the U.S. Highway 78 at I-20 Eastbound Exit Ramp. This effort would be initiated by conducting approach traffic counts for the study intersection for a 24-hour weekday period. A traffic signal warrant evaluation would be conducted for this location by projecting development traffic onto existing conditions at the intersection using trip generation estimates for the proposed development and possible other development within the vicinity. Trip estimates would be added to existing traffic volumes to result in projected (post-development) traffic volumes by hour of the day for a twelve (12) hour period. Projected (post-development) traffic volumes would be compared with the traffic signal warrant criteria outlined in the Federal Highway Administration's Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), latest edition. These comparisons would indicate if projected (post-development) traffic volumes would be sufficient to meet signal warrant criteria.

Following completion of the signal warrant evaluations, a summary of the findings would be submitted to the Client for review. Following review and approval by the Client, a report document would be prepared outlining the data collected, evaluations undertaken, and study findings. The report would be provided to the Client in draft format for review (PDF). Upon receipt of any comments, the signal warrant study would be finalized for submittal to the ALDOT, as required. The final report would be provided as a PDF and up to six (6) bound copies for the Client's use. The Consultant would submit or assist the Client in submittal of traffic signal warrant study to ALDOT, as needed, for review and comment.

Task 2 - Traffic Signal Design Services

Traffic signal construction plan development would be undertaken by Skipper Consulting, Inc. for the project intersection and follow the procedures as required by the City of Leeds and ALDOT. A preliminary design would be developed using base map information provided by the Client (intersection survey) or their representative. Data provided on the base map should include, but not be limited to pavement edges and/or curb lines; roadway markings; highway signs; utility poles; overhead utilities; street lighting; underground utilities; right of way; drainage structures; etc. This preliminary design would be submitted to the City for concurrence prior to initiating final plan preparations.

Design efforts for the project will be undertaken using procedures and specifications as established by the City and ALDOT. The traffic signal construction plan assembly shall include:

Professional Services Agreement Traffic Impact Study

- Signal phasing and timing.
- Coordination requirements.
- Research applicable City and ALDOT specifications.
- Determine appropriate traffic signal notes.
- Determine equipment and installation details.
- Traffic signal construction control plans.

The plan assembly would include applicable traffic signal notes, signal plan, applicable detail sheets, interconnect methods and details for striping modifications for the signalized intersection.

Task 3 - Traffic Signal Permitting

Working with the City and ALDOT, the Consultant would prepare agreements/permits and support documentation for submission to appropriate permitting agencies. During the review process, the Consultant will maintain contact with appropriate personnel involved in the review and permitting process and coordinate responses to any comments.

Task 4 - Traffic Signal Coordination Development/Implementation

The intersection of U.S. Highway 78 and I-20 Eastbound Exit Ramp will require interconnection with adjacent traffic signals on U.S. Highway 78. It is anticipated the adjacent traffic signals would be interconnected and the intersection of the I-20 Eastbound Exit Ramp will require inclusion into any traffic signal system.

Traffic signal coordination/implementation would include the following work tasks by the Consultant:

- Development of local intersection timings;
- Development of traffic systems timings for the new signalized location for coordination with the adjacent traffic signals on U.S. Highway 78; and
- Installation of traffic signal systems timing at the two existing and one proposed intersection. This
 work effort will be coordinated with ALDOT and the local agencies following construction efforts.

Additional Services

Should during the course of the project additional services be required, the Consultant would notify the Client of such tasks for authorization. Such tasks would be undertaken only upon authorization by the Client. Should additional tasks be required and authorized by the Client, such tasks could be undertaken as an amendment to this agreement or under a separate agreement.

Exclusions

This scope of work is limited to the tasks outlined above. Work tasks which are specifically excluded include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Surveying
- Geotechnical investigation
- Pole design
- Pole foundation design
- Services related to property rezoning
- Presentations before Planning Commissions, City Councils or County Commissions

This new Dodge Ram would become our primary rescue truck putting our current Dodge Ram in reserve. By doing this we would be making a more capable and efficient rescue than our current reserve rescue/brush truck.

2020 SUV 4x4

By acquiring this vehicle, we would roll back our oldest administration vehicle to a position where it would not respond to daily calls, that itself would replace an old police car. The vehicle it is replacing is a 2011 Ford F150 with approximately 125,000 miles that would be used as a towing/special needs vehicle(transportation to classes and recruit school)

2020 4500 4x4 Brush Truck

This truck would be more versatile and equipped job specific truck over the old one that was made to be a back up rescue truck and a brush truck. The current apparatus just can't hold up to wear and tear of responding to medical calls when used as a reserve rescue apparatus.

Brush Fire Unit for Polaris UTV-

Would allow our Polaris UTV to be used on brush fires where a piece of apparatus could not make it due to terrain or would damage equipment. It is a slide in unit with a pump hose and a tank for water.

Fire Hose

Our current attack hose is nearing ten years old and is reaching the end of its usable life span. We would like to replace with newer more efficient hose allowing our personnel to flow more water than our current hose will flow. Also, when purchasing we will be color coordinating to each specific piece of apparatus putting in an added level of safety and accountability on fire scenes.

Tools and Equipment -

Replacing outdated equipment on apparatus with more efficient, functional, and safer tools to perform tasks. Ex. Nozzles, thermal imaging cameras, hand tools

Lucas Device

A Lucas device is a chest compression device that delivers high quality AHA guideline compliant chest compressions for extended amounts of time. With this device we will be giving our citizens a substantially increased survival rate of sudden onset cardiac arrest. It gives better chest compressions than your average 2-4 personnel crew can perform. It also frees up personnel by performing a task which is usually given to 2-3 personnel on cardiac arrest calls.

- 1. That the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized to execute the permit (Exhibit A) with the Alabama Department of Transportation to permit the following:

- 2. The equipment and/or associated hardware shall be installed in accordance with the applicable portions of the:
 - A. Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways (MUTCD), current ALDOT approved edition.

 - C. National Electrical Code, current edition.

In the event the MAINTAINING AGENCY furnishes the equipment and/or associated hardware to be utilized in the accomplishment of the work identified by (A) and/or (B) above, the MAINTAINING AGENCY shall ascertain that the type and quality of the equipment and/or associated hardware is in accordance with the STATE's Materials, Sources, and Devices with Special Acceptance Requirements (APL) as maintained by the STATE's Bureau of Materials and Tests.
- 4. Title to any and all equipment and/or associated hardware furnished by the STATE shall remain in the STATE and the STATE is deemed to be the sole owner of such equipment and/or hardware.
- The equipment and/or associated hardware shall be operated and maintained at the sole expense of the MAINTAINING AGENCY. The MAINTAINING AGENCY agrees to provide electrical energy on a continuing basis as required, beginning at the time of the initial electrical service connection during the construction of the system. The MAINTAINING AGENCY agrees further to maintain the equipment and/or associated hardware in a good state of repair at all times, as required in accordance with the applicable documents: Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways and the Alabama Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Highway Construction and applicable special provisions. Any traffic control signal equipment and/or associated hardware must also be maintained in accordance with any traffic signal operating plan of the STATE which is in effect at the applicable time of the maintenance. If a malfunction of the equipment and/or associated hardware should ever occur, the MAINTAINING AGENCY shall make or cause to be made any repairs immediately. If a malfunction presents a potential hazard to the motoring public and the MAINTAINING AGENCY is unable to repair the equipment and/or associated hardware in a timely manner as determined by the STATE, the MAINTAINING AGENCY agrees that the STATE reserves the right to and may repair the equipment and/or associated hardware, and invoice the MAINTAINING AGENCY for all costs incurred. The MAINTAINING AGENCY agrees to pay the STATE all such costs incurred by the STATE promptly upon receipt of the invoice from the STATE.

- 5a. In instances where ALDOT maintains a fiber-optic trunk line that is used in conjunction with a closed-loop signal system, the MAINTAINING AGENCY shall maintain the fiber-optic cable from the splice point in the trunk line out to the traffic control equipment.

The X CITY (Incorporated Municipality)

Subject to the limitations on damages applicable to municipal corporations under Alabama Code § 11-47-190(1975), the CITY shall indemnify and hold harmless the State of Alabama, the Alabama Department of Transportation, its officers, officials, agents, servants, and employees from and against (1) claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including but not limited to attorney's fees arising out of, connected with, resulting from, or related to the work performed by the CITY, or its officers, employees, contracts, agents or assigns (2) the provision of any services or expenditure of funds required, authorized, or undertaken by the CITY pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, or (3) any damage, loss, expense, bodily injury, or death, or injury or destruction or tangible property (other than the work itself), including loss of use therefrom, and including but not limited to attorney's fees, caused by the negligent, careless, or unskillful acts of the CITY, its agents, servants, representatives, or employees, or the misuse, misappropriation, misapplication, or misexpenditure of any source of funding, compensation, or reimbursement by the CITY, its agents, servants, representatives, or employees, or anyone for whose acts the CITY may be liable.

The COUNTY (County Government or Agency)

The COUNTY shall be responsible at all times for all of the work performed under this agreement and, as provided in Alabama Code § 11-93-2(1975), the COUNTY shall indemnify and hold harmless the State of Alabama, the Alabama Department of Transportation, its officers, officials, agents, servants, and employees.

For all claims not subject to Alabama Code § 11-93-2(1975), the COUNTY shall indemnify and hold harmless the State of Alabama, the Alabama Department of Transportation, its officers, officials, agents, servants, and employees from and against any and all damages, claims, loss, liabilities, attorney's fees or expense whatsoever, or any amount paid in compromise thereof arising out of, connected with, or related to (1) work performed under this Agreement, (2) the provision of any services or expenditure of funds required, authorized, or undertaken by the COUNTY pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, or (3) misuse, misappropriation, misapplication, or misexpenditure of any source of funding, compensation or reimbursement by the COUNTY, its officers, officials, agents, servants, and employees.

The term "hold harmless" includes the obligation of the MAINTAINING AGENCY to pay damages on behalf of the State of Alabama, the Alabama Department of Transportation, and its agents, servants, and/or employees.

- 7. Complete removal of the equipment and/or associated hardware, hereinabove identified by (C), will be at the sole expense of the STATE MAINTAINING AGENCY.
- 8. The STATE reserves the right to demand the removal of the equipment and/or associated hardware should the STATE determine that the signal is no longer required or deem its condition or operation hazardous. Further, the STATE shall have the right to remove the equipment and/or associated hardware should the MAINTAINING AGENCY fail to do so upon demand by the STATE. The MAINTAINING AGENCY agrees to reimburse the STATE for its costs associated with the removal. Any equipment and/or associated hardware which is deemed by the STATE to be non-uniform or obsolete will be removed and disposed of by the MAINTAINING AGENCY. None of the non-uniform or obsolete equipment and/or associated hardware which has been removed shall be reused on the STATE highway system.
- 9. If future traffic conditions require changes and/or adjustments to said equipment and/or associated hardware (other than ordinary timing), the MAINTAINING AGENCY shall obtain the approval of the STATE before such changes are implemented and the STATE shall make a determination on whether a new Agreement is required to be submitted for the UPGRADING, OPERATION, and MAINTENANCE of the new equipment and/or associated hardware. All such changes shall be at the sole cost and expense of the MAINTAINING AGENCY.
- 10. In the event Federal funds are utilized in the accomplishment of the work hereinbefore described, "Exhibit M" is attached to and made a part of this Agreement.

11. FUNDS SHALL NOT BE CONSTITUTED AS A DEBT

It is agreed that the terms and commitments contained herein shall not be construed as a debt of the State of Alabama in violation of Article 11, Section 213 of the <u>Constitution of Alabama</u>, 1901, as amended by Amendment Number 26. It is further agreed that if any provision of this Agreement shall contravene any statute or Constitutional Provision or Amendment, then the conflicting provision in this Agreement shall be deemed null and void.

For any and all disputes arising under the terms of this Agreement, the parties hereto agree, in compliance with the recommendations of the Governor and Attorney General, when considering settlement of such disputes, to utilize appropriate forms of non-binding alternative dispute resolution including, but not limited to, mediation by and through the Attorney General's Office of Administrative Hearings or where appropriate, private mediators.

In the event the work to be accomplished is identified by (A), (B), and/or (C) and [1] in part or wholly constitutes an interconnected, coordinated, fixed time relationship, signal control operation between two or more intersections (herein referred to as a SYSTEM and hereinabove indicated by the SYSTEM check-box for YES marked in the controller box above), [2] is located within the limits of a SYSTEM, or [3] is within close proximity as to adjoin a SYSTEM, the STATE MAINTAINING AGENCY shall substantiate the work identified by (A), (B), and/or (C) to be SYSTEM compatible.
- 14. By entering into this agreement, the MAINTAINING AGENCY is not an agent of the State, its officers, employees, agents or assigns. The MAINTAINING AGENCY is an independent entity from the State and nothing in this agreement creates an agency relationship between the parties.

RESOLUTION NO. 2019-11-08

EXPRESSION OF OPPOSITION TO AND REJECTION OF THE TIER 3 PENSION (ACT 2019-132)

WHEREAS the Alabama Legislature has given local employers that participate in the Employees' Retirement System of Alabama (RSA) the option of granting Tier 1 pension benefits to its Tier 2 employees upon the Legislature's adoption of Act 2019-132; and

WHEREAS RSA participating employers have until May 8, 2021, to pass a resolution to irrevocably adopt the provisions of Act 2019-132; and

WHEREAS participating employers who have not previously implemented the provisions of Act 2011-676 and who elect to implement the Tier 3 pension must I) increase Tier 2 employee contributions by 1.5% and 2) adopt a plan to increase its Tier 1 employees by 2.5% such employees receiving no benefit from the Tier 3 pension change; and

WHEREAS, based on experience, the City Council is deeply concerned that the current 2-tiered pension plan is unstainable and that replacing the Tier 2 plan with a Tier 3 plan that provides benefits 35% greater than the Tier 2 plan can only worsen the pension plan's financial position;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEEDS, ALABAMA, as follows:

1. The City hereby voices is objection to the provisions of Act 2019-132 and rejects the implementation of the provisions thereof due to the adverse effects on both the funded status of the City's RSA pension plan as well as the untenable required contribution currently in excess of 20% of covered payroll.

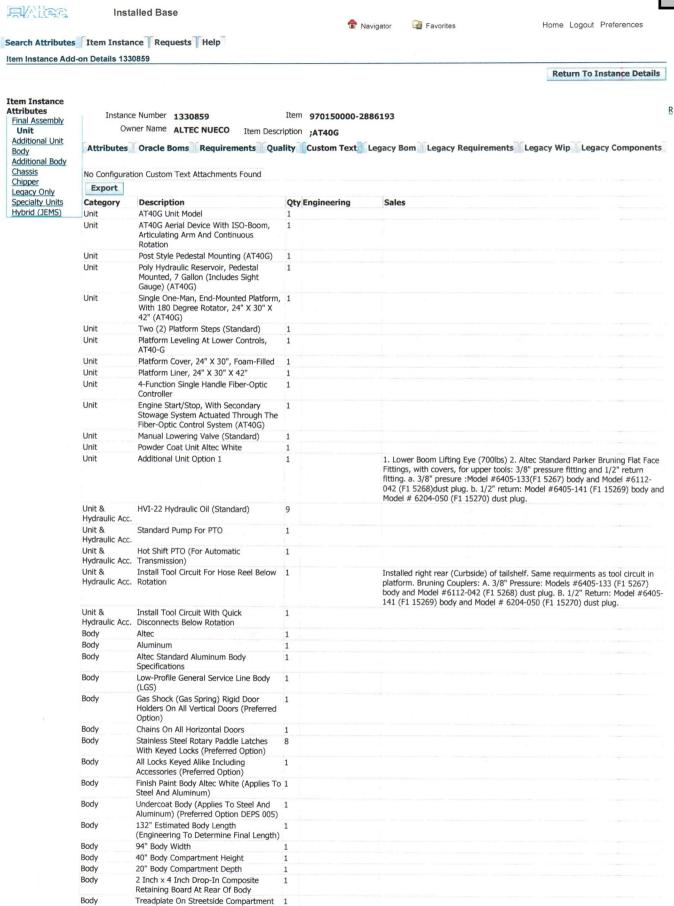

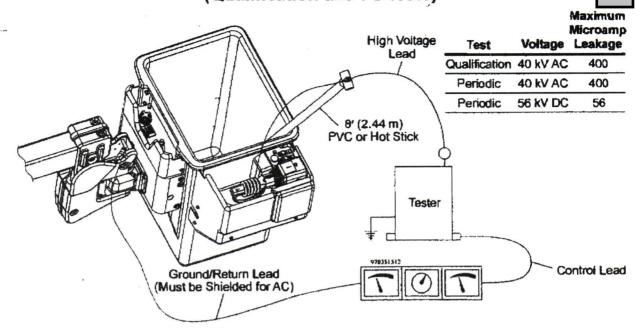

Confirmation Test of Fiber Optic Upper Control Components With High Electrical Resistance (Qualification and Periodic)

The purpose of this test is to verify the high electrical resistance components at the upper control station. In some cases the high voltage test lead may short circuit to other nearby conductive components. First, verify that provided covers in the control area are intact. Then, insulating material, such as a piece of insulating blanket or liner, may also be placed under and to the sides of the spring which wraps the high voltage test connections, as needed during the test, to prevent this from happening. For AC testing it is recommended that the high voltage test lead be elevated on an 8' (2.44 m) PVC pole or hot stick to reduce the capacitive leakage that is unrelated to the focus of the test. Also for AC tests, use only a shielded return lead to further reduce capacitive leakage.

Procedure

Test device number

- 1. Read and understand the dielectric test information in the Maintenance Manual and ANSI requirements.
- 2. Insulate the vehicle from ground by placing polyethylene pads beneath each tire and outrigger leg.
- 3. Upper control components must be clean and dry prior to testing. Use isopropyl alcohol to clean.
- 4. Wrap a 0.375" to 1.000" diameter spring around the control handle as shown. Conductive aluminum foil may be used in lieu of a spring. Keep the tail of the spring away from conductive components.
- 5. Attach the high voltage lead (insulated from ground) to the spring on the control handle as shown.
- Attach the ground/return lead to the lanyard attachment pin or platform leveling bracket. This lead must contact a bare metal surface.
- It is not necessary to raise or extend the upper boom. The platform may be tested near the tailshelf for easier access.
- 8. Do not use cancel (null) circuit if the tester is so equipped.

To test the control, gradually increase the voltage (refer to the chart). Hold at the appropriate voltage for three minutes continuously. If flashover occurs or the leakage rate exceeds the appropriate microamps from the chart, the control has failed the test. Record leakage reading.

- Read and understand the dielectric test information in the Maintenance Manual, ANSI requirements, and the manual
 for the test device being used.
- This procedure is for a DC test device with output current metering only. Do not use this procedure when using a DC test device that measures the return current instead of the output current. If equipped with a selector switch, set the switch to Ground Return.
- 3. The test area should be dry and appropriately roped off to prevent bystanders from entering the test area.
- 4. Ground chassis, test device or control box, and discharge stick as shown.
- 5. No isolation pads are required under the vehicle tires or outriggers.
- 6. Set up booms to maintain at least 2' of clearance between conductive components as shown.
- Electrically bond all metal at the boom tip to ensure all possible current paths are considered. Include all conductive brackets, air plunger switches, hydraulic valves, controls, cylinders, jib brackets, etc.
- 8. Extend upper boom to minimum extension length for dielectric test (not applicable to AL32).
- 9. Attach the high voltage test lead and bonding jumpers as shown for the upper and lower boom test.
- 10. It is not necessary to use the meter receptacle on the upper boom of Category A and B machines for the upper boom test. However, whether the meter receptacle is used or not, all internal connections to this receptacle must be checked to verify that all current paths through the boom are properly connected to ensure proper function.
- 11. Voltage and maximum allowable leakage for the upper boom test are as follows.
 - a. Category C-46 kV and below-56 microamps at 56 kV after 3 minutes
 - b. Category A/B 46 kV and below 28 microamps at 56 kV after 3 minutes
 - c. Category A/B 69 kV 42 microamps at 84 kV after 3 minutes
 - d. Category A/B 138 kV 84 microamps at 168 kV after 3 minutes
- Voltage and maximum allowable leakage for the lower boom test is 100 microamps at 50 kV.
- 13. To test the upper boom, gradually increase the voltage to the proper level. Hold for 3 minutes. If flashover occurs or the leakage rate exceeds the maximum value, the unit has failed the test. Record leakage reading.

Periodic laboratory analysis is the most accurate method of determining the condition of the hydraulic oil and when it should be changed. If laboratory analysis is used, take baseline sample. Compare future lab tests on subsequent samples to the original to establish a trend. Initially measure turntable tilt as a baseline. Check rotation bearing wear every 2 years until it measures 0.050" increased wear from initial measurements. After reaching 0.050" increased wear, measure every 6 months. Refer to the Maintenance Manual for the proper procedure.
