He reported that the junior lifeguard tournament was won by Manasquan this year with 275 participants in the program.

Public Safety Committee – Council Member Lee sent is condolences to Council President Mangan on the death of his grandmother. He reported that the police have purchased 12 new pedestrian safety signs that will be placed around town by next week. He reported that the chief has created a task force within the police department to community safety tips and take a more aggressive approach to educating the bikers. He went over the violations that have been issued by the police department in the past 2 weeks.

Public Works & Construction Committee - Council Member Bryant sent condolences to Council President Mangan's family. He thanked everyone that was involved in putting together the Fireman's fair including the public works.

Mayor Donovan also sent his condolences to Council President Mangan and thanked Fire Company #2 for all they did to get the fair up and going in such a short time.

#### **Audience Participation**

Council Member Bryant made a motion to open the public portion, seconded by Council Member Lee. Motion carried unanimously.

Jen Brown, 121 Curtis Avenue stated that she is also speaking on behalf of her neighbors. She voiced her concerns with the parking on Curtis and Mount Lane including Squan Taxi parking. She also voiced her concerns on the pickup of participants of Coast Cheer as well as multi tenants in the back of 105 Curtis Avenue.

Mayor Donovan stated that this is an ongoing issue and Squan Taxi was given a certain amount of parking spots. He stated that this will be referred to the code enforcement officer to follow up on.

Tom Huth, 220 Broad Street stated that he has a family home at 554 Salmon Avenue and voiced his concerns on the entrance to the dog beach that was created for the dredging project as well as the proposed new parking lot.

Mayor Donovan stated that the back of the Pompano lot will be returned to its natural state and a new parking lot will be installed to the south of the current paved parking lot with a road in the back to get to the new lot. He stated that this is a Monmouth County Project as the land is owned by them.

Mr. Flarity stated that the entrance that is there now is just a temporary entrance which is being used for the dredging project and that the entrance to the proposed new parking lot will be in back of the current lot. He stated that there will only be one entrance off Third Avenue with access to the new lot towards the back of the current paved lot.
