Council Member Read made a motion to open the hearing to the public, seconded by Council Member Olivera. Motion carried unanimously.

Dick Meincke, 36 N. McClellan Avenue inquired about the wording of the ordinance and suggested changing the wording to be clear as to the fee charged to be on the beach in section h and i.

Mr. Kitrick explained the purpose of section h and i which is specific to badges being sold on the beach front and not at a gate or over the counter. He stated that this ordinance is accurate for notification purposes.

Mr. Meincke voiced his concern on how people will interpret the beach fees for Manasquan.

Carol Budisak, 76 First Avenue inquired about Sea Watch parking and how will the borough proceed with the lottery to make spaces available to New Jersey residents as required by Green Acres.

Municipal Clerk, Barbara Ilaria explained the current lottery process for the Sea Watch parking spaces.

Ms. Budisak stated that she has been in correspondence with New Jersey and she has been advised that the lottery should be open to everyone not just people who had them last year.

There was discussion on the Sea Watch parking spaces and Green Acres regulations.

Mayor Donovan stated that the Borough will check with Green Acres and make sure that it is done the right way.

Council Member Walsh made a motion to close the public portion, second by Council Member Lee. Motion carried unanimously.

Council Member Olivera made a motion to pass and publish ordinance 2307-20 according to law, seconded by Council Member Walsh. Motion carried by the following vote: "yes" Council Members Bryant, Lee, Olivera, Read, and Walsh. "No" none.

Mr. Kitrick stated that ordinance 2308-20 and 2309-20 will need to be carried in order to comply with the notice requirements.

Committee Reports

Public Works Committee – Council Member Walsh welcomed Council Member Olivera back. He advised that this is a new committee for him and that they will be meeting twice a month because there is a lot on the docket. He reported on the water main break on Mount Lane and the full extent of the damage should be known shortly.

Mayor Donovan stated that this was a forced main which is owned and operated by South Monmouth Regional Sewerage Authority (SMRSA) that broke and their line went underneath the Borough's stormwater conveyance conduit that runs from behind St. Denis and across Mount Lane and into the stream that runs into the Glimmer Glass. SMRSA is taking care of all of their issues and will fix the portion of the Borough's pipe that broke as a result of their repairs. He advised that there are some engineering issues with the borough's pipe which are being investigated.

Administration Committee – Council Member Read reported that boat slip renewals have been sent out and need to be returned by March 2, after which there will be a lottery for any slips not renewed. He stated that lottery applications are due by March 5 with the lottery being held for residents on March 10 and March 12 for non-residents. He advised that the lottery application will be posted on the website starting February 10.

Finance Department – Council Member Olivera reported that budget season is coming up with meetings starting on Saturdays at 9 am with meetings scheduled for February 22, March 7, March 14, and March 21. He stated that the ratification of the 19th Amendment for Women's right to vote in New Jersey is Sunday and suggested celebrating that by wearing a yellow rose.

Public Safety Committee – Council Member Lee acknowledged the retirement of Officer Tischio and thanked him for his service. He stated that the Chief is moving forward with his replacement and future sergeant promotion. He reported on the police activities for January which have been higher compared to the past. He advised that OEM Coordinator Chris Tucker will be bringing forward a shared service with Monmouth County for a DCA grant for the Borough's community rating system (CRS) which is the management software that provides residents with a reduction in flood insurance rates.

Code & Zoning Committee – Council Member Bryant reported on the code/construction/zoning activity for the month of January. He provided information on the ratification of the 19th Amendment in New Jersey.

Audience Participation

Council Member Bryant made a motion to open the meeting to the public, seconded by Council Member Lee. Motion carried unanimously.

Bob Eirich, 76 N. Main Street inquired about noise complaint against the school and advised that the municipal judge would not hear the complaint. He is asking the borough attorney to look into this to see if the school district is exempt from local noise ordinances.

Mayor Donovan stated that this will be looked into.

Dick Meincke, 36 N. McClellan Avenue inquired about the status of the parking meters.

Council Member Lee stated that it is still in the investigation stage and it would be for the municipal lots. He advised that there would be pay stations not meters for every space.

Council Member Olivera made a motion to close the public portion, seconded by Council Member Read. Motion carried unanimously.
