WHEREAS, the Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:9-27 et seq. has elected through its Mosquito Control Division to perform all acts necessary for the elimination of mosquito breeding areas and/or to exterminate mosquitos within the county; and

WHEREAS, the County has instituted an Integrated Pest Management Program consisting of surveillance, water management, biological control, and chemical control to exterminate the mosquito population within the county of Monmouth; and

WHEREAS, prior to conducting aerial dispensing operations over a designated “congested area,” the County is required, pursuant to Federal Aviation Administration Regulations (FAR Part 137.51), to secure prior written approval from the governing body of the political subdivision over which the aircraft is to be operated; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Manasquan is designated as a “congested area” by the Federal Aviation Administration and the County has requested that this governing body consent to its proposed aerial dispensing operations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

1. The Governing Body hereby authorizes the County of Monmouth Mosquito Control Division or its agent to apply pesticides by aircraft for mosquito control in certain areas of the municipality designated by the County as being either larval mosquito habitat, or areas harboring high populations of mosquitoes constituting either a nuisance, a hazard, or both with the understanding that:

- a) The County shall utilize pesticides, application equipment and aircraft that are approved for aerial applications by the applicable Federal (USEPA) and State (NJDEP) agencies, and
- b) Such operations will be performed in compliance with applicable Federal and State regulations, and
- c) The County will notify the Manasquan Police Department when aerial pesticides operations are planned prior to commencement of such operations.

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 16 (FEES) SECTION 16-1 FEE SCHEDULE ESTABLISHED (CHAPTER 12 BEACHES AND BEACHFRONT) SECTION 12-2, SECTION 12-10 AND SECTION 12-11 OF THE BOROUGH OF MANASQUAN CODE IN THE BOROUGH OF MANASQUAN, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY.

ORDINANCE AMENDING APPENDIX B (BOARD OF HEALTH), SECTION BH:4 (RETAIL FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS) SUBSECTION BH:4-6 (LICENSE FEES) AND SECTION BH:5 (MISCELLANEOUS FEES) SUBSECTION BH:5-1 (BIRTH, MARRIAGE, CIVIL UNION, DOMESTIC PARTNERSHIP OR DEATH CERTIFICATE) IN THE BOROUGH OF MANASQUAN, MONMOUTH COUNTY, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Manasquan, in the County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Appendix B (Board of Health), Section BH:4 (Retail Food Establishments), Subsection BH:4-6 (License Fees) is amended as follows:

Prior to the issuance of any license under Sections BH:4-1 through BH:4-9, the applicant shall be required to pay an annual license fee of one hundred fifty (\$150.00) dollars to cover costs incurred by the Board of Health in the issuance of the license and inspections incidental thereto. No fee shall be charged to a nonprofit organization which shall make an application for a license under Sections BH:4-1 through BH:4-9, provided that an appropriate person or officer of the organization shall file with the Secretary of the Board of Health a statement, signed under oath, indicating that the organization applying for the license is, in fact, a duly qualified nonprofit organization under the laws of the State of New Jersey.

SECTION 2. Appendix B (Board of Health), Section BH:5 (Miscellaneous Fees), Subsection BH:5-1 (Birth, Marriage, Civil Union, Domestic Partnership or Death Certificate) is amended as follows:

The fee for issuing a certification or certified copy of a birth certificate, marriage certificate, civil union certificate, domestic partnership certificate, death certificate or other vital statistics record shall be \$25 for the first copy and \$2 for each additional copy.
