The regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Marshall was held January 12, 2020, at the Minnesota Emergency Response and Industrial Training (MERIT) Center, 1001 West Erie Road. The meeting was called to order at 5:30 P.M. by Mayor Robert Byrnes. Consider the request of Monte Buntjer for a Variance Adjustment Permit at 516A Main Street East.

The owner desires to use a shipping container as a permanent storage next to his building at the address listed above. The Ordinance prohibits using shipping containers as accessory buildings (Sec. 86-163 (10)) or permanent storages (Sec. 86-248 (f)).

To grant a variance, City Ordinance and State Statutes require the presence of practical difficulties. The term "practical difficulties," as used in connection with granting a variance, means that the property owner proposes to use the property in a reasonable manner not permitted by the zoning ordinance, the plight of the landowner is due to circumstances unique (usually something related to physical characteristics of the property not allowing to comply with the Ordinance) to the property not created by the landowner, and the variance, if granted, will not alter the essential character of the locality. The State Statutes essentially forbid granting variances if those conditions are not met. The Findings of Fact, based on the League of Minnesota Cities template, is attached to this memo, and explains each item listed above in detail.

Shipping containers do not meet building codes and do not fit into typical city environment, which may lead to reduction in surrounding properties' values. Based on the above information, staff does not believe that there are any practical difficulties in this case and therefore recommends that the variance be denied. It is the opinion of City Staff that allowing this variance will set a precedent for the entire city.

The variance regulations and procedures are found in Section 86-29.

At the Planning Commission meeting on January 20, 2021, a public hearing was held, and a motion was made by Knieff, second by Lee to recommend approval to the City Council of the request by Monte Buntjer for a Variance Adjustment Permit for a shipping pod as permanent storage at 516A East Main Street. All voted in favor of the motion.

Motion made by Councilmember DeCramer, Seconded by Councilmember Schafer to table until the February 9 council meeting. Consider the adoption of an Ordinance amending Chapter 2, Article 6, Division 6; Human Rights Commission.

Beginning this fall, staff, council members and community members have been regularly meeting to begin work on establishing a City commission to address diversity, equity, and inclusion within the city of Marshall. The Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Commission, although in its infancy, has established its vision and mission statements, guiding principles and has begun working on its first set of actions steps as well as proposed this amendment to the city code to official become a City Commission.

The groundwork for the DEI commission is key and crucial. The Commission is dedicated to learning, creating innovative ideas, and adapting to the ever-changing environment. The DEI Commission is taking purposeful action to advance this commitment through the guiding principles of equity, inclusion, collaboration, and transparency.

At the January 12, 2021 regular meeting the City Council Introduced the Ordinance. The DEI group continues to meet establishing its framework to ensure a solid foundation.

Establishment of Comprehensive Plan Proposal Review Committee.

The City is currently advertising a request for proposals (RFP) for an update to the City Comprehensive Plan. The "Comp Plan" is a planning guide that the City primarily uses to provide a consistent set of goals and policies that guide decisions regarding land use. The Comp Plan update process will be very public, and the City and its selected consultant will plan to do a lot of outreach and we will plan to solicit a lot of input.

Before we get to that step, the City will need to receive proposals and select our desired consultant. To do this, we are planning to establish a Proposal Review Committee that will meet a few times to grade, interview, and select the consultant.

We are proposing a committee consisting of:

- 2-City Council members: Don Edblom (liaison to the Planning Commission) and Dr. Meister or John DeCramer (liaisons to the EDA)
- 1-Planning Commission member: Amanda Schroeder
- 1-EDA Board member: Dan Herrmann
- 2-City Staff (likely Ilya Gutman and Lauren Deutz)
- 1-Chamber member

Proposals are due by Wednesday, February 3, 2021. Staff would expect that the Proposal Review Committee would meet a few times in February and early March to rate proposals and select a number of consultants to interview. Following the interview and final grading, the committee would select their preferred consultant for recommendation to the City Council.

No fiscal impact at this time. Cost estimate for our Comprehensive Plan update was presented as \$50,000-\$60,000 at the November 24, 2020 Council meeting. Current belief is that the update may cost \$60,000-\$80,000, depending on level of consultant involvement in the public participation portion of the plan

Motion made by Councilmember Schafer, Seconded by Councilmember Lozinski that the Council authorize the establishment of the Comprehensive Plan Proposal Review Committee for the purpose of completing a thorough review of Comprehensive Plan RFP's and seeking consensus on the preferred consultant to be recommended to the City Council. <u>Project Z83: James Avenue/Camden Drive Reconstruction Project - Consider Resolution Approving Plans and Specifications and Ordering Advertisement for Bids.</u>

This project consists of the following: reconstruction and utility replacement on James Avenue between Camden Drive and South 4th Street and Camden Drive between James Avenue and South 4th Street. All utilities will be replaced, including watermain, sanitary sewer, and storm sewer on James Avenue and Camden Drive. Other items of work included in this project are pavement removal, aggregate base, bituminous surfacing, sidewalks, curb and gutter and other minor work.

The plans and specifications have been prepared by City staff for the above-referenced project. If the City Council decides to proceed with this project, a resolution has been prepared approving the plans and specifications and ordering advertisement for bids.

The engineer's estimate for the construction portion of the project is \$952,200. The total estimated project cost, including 10% allowance for contingencies and 16% for engineering and administrative costs is \$1,214,700. All improvements will be assessed according to the current Special Assessment Policy, including but not limited to participation from Marshall Municipal Utilities, Wastewater Department, Surface Water Management Utility Fund and Ad Valorem. Final approval of the project must include determination of funding sources.

Motion made by Councilmember DeCramer, Seconded by Councilmember Lozinski that the Council adopt Resolution Number 21-010 the "Resolution Approving Plans and Specifications and Ordering Advertisement for Bids" for Project Z83: James Avenue/Camden Drive Reconstruction Project. Voting Yea: Mayor Byrnes, Councilmember Schafer, Councilmember Meister, Councilmember Edblom, Councilmember DeCramer, Councilmember Lozinski. Voting Nay: Councilmember Labat. The motion **Passed. 6-1**

Lyon Street Lane Reconfiguration (TH 23 to Adobe Road).

In 2022, the City will be completing an enhanced pedestrian crossing on Lyon Street adjacent to Adobe Road to provide a safer pedestrian crossing between Independence Park and Parkside Elementary School. The project will incorporate the use of new school zone signed, radar speed zone signage, a rectangular rapid flashing beacon (RRFB), and a pedestrian refuge island. See attached drawings.

To accommodate the pedestrian refuge island and better accommodate area travel patterns, City engineering staff would like to propose a Two-Way Left Turn Lane (TWLTL) striping configuration on Lyon Street from Adobe Road to TH 23. The TWLTL fits well in this area and the existing road width can accommodate this striping pattern and the on-street bike lanes if parking is removed from both sides of Lyon Street through this area. Most land uses adjacent to Lyon Street through this area do not currently utilize on-street parking. There are two residential homes west of Adobe Road that would lose parking directly in front of their homes as a result of the restriping.

City staff would propose to complete this restriping in 2021.

At the Public Improvement/Transportation Committee meeting on January 8, 2021, LABAT MADE A MOTION to recommend approval to the City Council of the Lyon Street Lane Reconfiguration (TH 23 to Adobe Road) as presented, SECONDED BY LOZINSKI. ALL VOTED IN FAVOR. MOTION PASSED 3:0.

Motion made by Councilmember Meister, Seconded by Councilmember Lozinski to table the agenda item until the February 9 council meeting. Voting Yea: Mayor Byrnes, Councilmember Schafer, Councilmember Meister, Councilmember Edblom, Councilmember DeCramer, Councilmember Labat, Councilmember Lozinski. The motion **Carried. 7-0**

US Army Corps of Engineers Betterments Project Update.

In spring-summer 2019, City staff brought forward six different locations where some level of slope failure was occurring along our US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) flood control project. High water events in summer 2018 and spring 2019 resulted in some areas of significant damage to our flood control project. After reviewing the locations with USACE St.

Paul District staff, it was determined that four of the six locations may be eligible for federal assistance in rehabilitation under Public Law 84-99 (PL 84-99).

At the September 24, 2019 meeting, the City Council entered into an agreement with the USACE for city participation in "betterments" associated with the flood control project repairs. At the time, city staff was informed that the federal government would pay for costs associated with repairing the flood control project to its pre-existing/pre-flood damage condition, and the city would be responsible for all costs associated with improving the project to make the system more resistant to similar damage in the future. In the agreement, the City's estimated cost participation for these "betterments" is \$148,311.

Recently, USACE staff completed project plans and are nearly ready to prepare the project for bid with a 2021 construction schedule. Along with completed plans, the USACE sent over an updated cost proposal. The updated cost proposal reflected a city cost participation of \$440,919, which was significantly greater than the \$148,311 cost participation that the City Council had previously agreed to. City staff-initiated conversation with USACE staff and held multiple meetings to discuss the discrepancy and the lack of communication to get to this point.

In reviewing the cost estimate city staff learned that the USACE was proposing to cover the costs of site #2 in its entirety, with the city covering the costs of all other project sites (Sites #1, #3, and #6) in their entirety. The thought process from the USACE was that the failure at site #2 was directly compromising the flood protection project and the other three sites were not immediately hazardous to the integrity of the flood control project. City staff disagreed with this proposal and presented our argument to the USACE staff. City staff shared some historical aerial imagery as well as some local river and project knowledge and following further discussion, USACE staff have now proposed to cover all project costs for Sites #1 and #2, with the city being entirely responsible for Sites #3 and #6.

The cost estimates for Sites #3 and #6 are \$82,342.63 and \$128,323.55, respectively. Staff is proposing to the USACE to seek bids with Sites #1 and #2 as the base bid, and Sites #3 and #6 being listed as add-alternates. This will allow the City the flexibility to determine if we'd like to participate in the project by completing the work at Sites #3 and #6 after we review the costs from the low bidder.

If the City does not view the costs as favorable, we may choose to not cost participate and not complete work at Sites #3 and #6. By choosing this route, the City will very likely need to expend funds at these two locations in the future to protect and manage the flood control project. These locations will very likely be continually flagged on our inspection reports which will require the City to utilize our funds to maintain the project. The benefit of waiting is that there may be another high-water event that clearly causes significant damage to the project and these sites may be eligible for federal cost participation at that time.

If the costs for completing the work at Sites #3 and #6 are favorable, the City may choose to have these alternate sites awarded and included with the project. By doing so, the City will be required to pay for all costs associated with the "betterments" at these two locations. The improvements will become part of the flood control project, and future damage repairs may be eligible for federal cost participation.

The City has already prepaid \$148,311 from the Surface Water Management Utility to cover our original estimated portion of project costs. No further payment is required at this time. If the City elects to complete work at Sites #3 and #6 and costs are greater than \$148,311, the City will be expected to contribute more funds. If the City elects to not participate in a project at Sites #3 and #6, the City will be reimbursed our \$148,311. The City is only required to pay for actual costs associated with Sites #3 and #6 if we elect to complete work at these locations.

Motion made by Councilmember DeCramer, Seconded by Councilmember Lozinski that the Council authorize City staff to advise USACE officials to bid Sites #3 and #6 as alternates for City consideration upon receipt and tabulation of bids. Voting Yea: Mayor Byrnes, Councilmember Schafer, Councilmember Meister, Councilmember Edblom, Councilmember DeCramer, Councilmember Labat, Councilmember Lozinski. The motion **Carried. 7-0**

<u>Consider Approval to Request Proposals for Marshall Aquatic Center Design, Architecture, Engineering Services.</u>

The Marshall Aquatic Center has served the residents of Marshall and surrounding communities for more than 50 years—a long time for a community recreation facility. The current facility is showing its age and has numerous deficiencies in code compliance, operations, customer experience and maintenance costs.

The existing Marshall Aquatic Center includes three (3) vessels: a diving pool with 1-meter and 3-meter diving boards, a lap/ general use pool with a waterslide, and a wading pool. It also includes a bathhouse and concessions building. The original facility was constructed in 1960's.

For many years, the City has been studying and reviewing next steps with the 50-year old Aquatics Center. A study was completed in 2019 that provided recommendations on next steps (see attached Study).

In order to move the project to a decision stage staff is recommending we hire a firm to bring us from the conceptual stage to bidding documents in order to bring to the public for their consent.

Motion made by Councilmember Meister, Seconded by Councilmember Lozinski to approve Request for Proposal Process. Voting Yea: Mayor Byrnes, Councilmember Schafer, Councilmember Meister, Councilmember Edblom, Councilmember DeCramer, Councilmember Lozinski. Voting Nay: Councilmember Labat. Background Information:	This project consists of: reconstruction and utility replacement on North 1 st Street from East Main Street to West Marshall Street, on West Redwood Street from East College Drive to North 1 st Street, and on West Marshall Street from East College Drive to North 1 st Street; sanitary sewer, watermain, and storm sewer will be replaced. This project will also include new curb & gutter, new 5-ft. sidewalk on both sides of the streets, driveway aprons, water services, and sewer services to the right-of-way.
	On February 5, 2021, bids were received for the above-referenced project. Three bids were received as shown on the attached Resolution Accepting Bid. The low bid was from D&G Excavating, Inc. of Marshall, Minnesota, in the amount of \$1,051,247.90. The engineer's estimate was approximately \$1,170,646.
Fiscal Impact:	The above-referenced project, or a portion thereof, may be financed by the sale of bonds with repayment coming from assessments and Debt Service Fund Levy. It is required that action be authorized by City Council via Resolution Declaring Official Intent Regarding the Reimbursement of Expenditures with the Proceeds of Tax-Exempt Bonds.

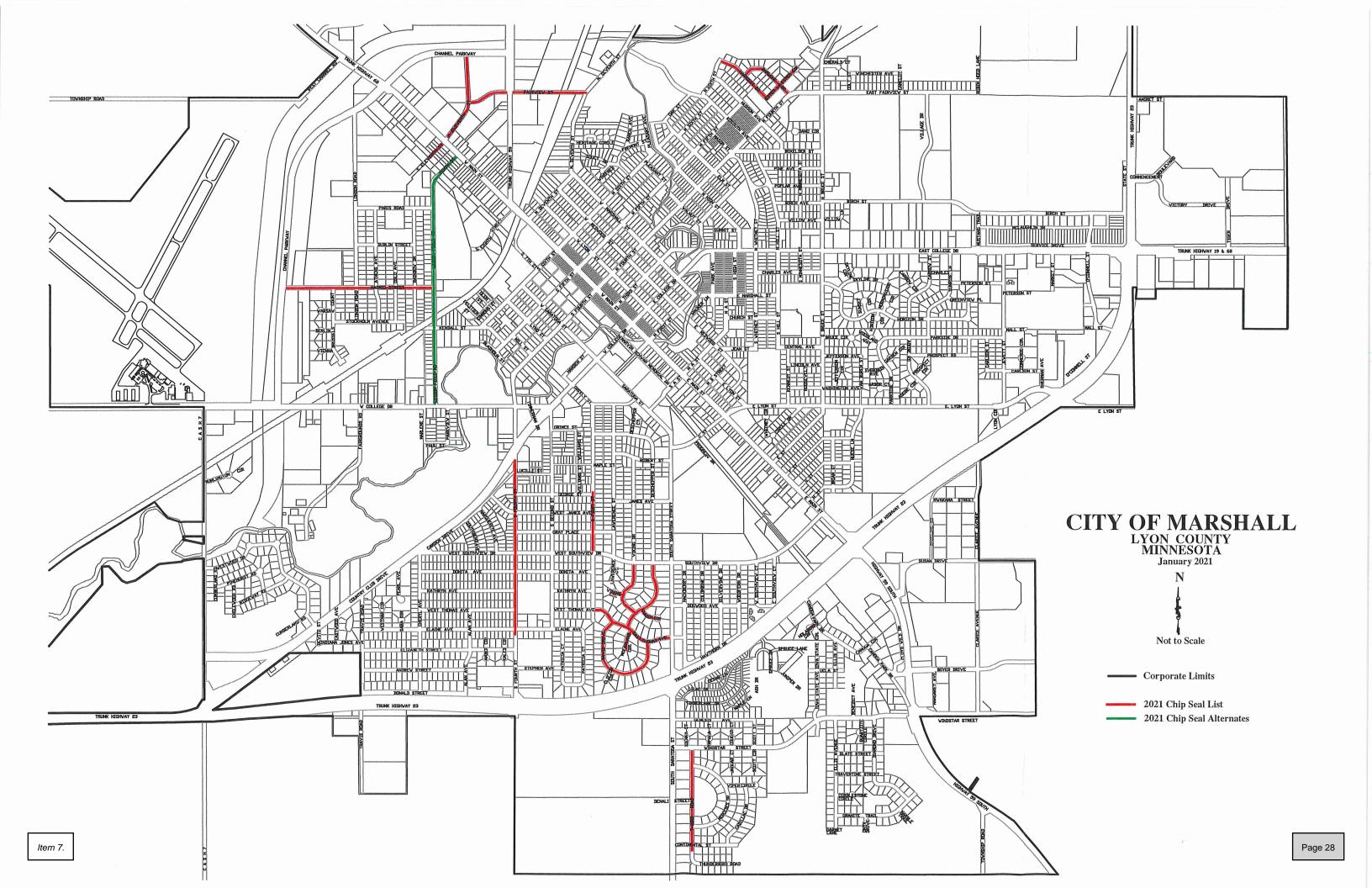

Subject:	Consider the request of Monte Buntjer for a Variance Adjustment Permit at 516A Main Street East.
Background Information:	The owner desires to use a shipping container as a permanent storage next to his building at the address listed above. The Ordinance prohibits using shipping containers as accessory buildings (Sec. 86-163 (10)) or permanent storages (Sec. 86-248 (f)).
	To grant a variance, City Ordinance and State Statutes require the presence of practical difficulties. The term "practical difficulties," as used in connection with granting a variance, means that the property owner proposes to use the property in a reasonable manner not permitted by the zoning ordinance, the plight of the landowner is due to circumstances unique (usually something related to physical characteristics of the property not allowing to comply with the Ordinance) to the property not created by the landowner, and the variance, if granted, will not alter the essential character of the locality. The State Statutes essentially forbid granting variances if those conditions are not met. The Findings of Fact, based on the League of Minnesota Cities template, is attached to this memo, and explains each item listed above in detail.
	Shipping containers do not meet building codes and do not fit into typical city environment, which may lead to reduction in surrounding properties' values. Based on the above information, staff does not believe that there are any practical difficulties in this case and therefore recommends that the variance be denied. It is the opinion of City Staff that allowing this variance will set a precedent for the entire city.
	The variance regulations and procedures are found in Section 86-29 https://library.municode.com/mn/marshall/codes/code of ordinances?nodeId=PTIICOOR CH86ZO ARTIIADEN DIV1GE S86-29VA . A property aerial photo is attached for reference.
	At the Planning Commission meeting on January 20, 2021, a public hearing was held and a motion was made by Knieff, second by Lee to recommend approval to the City Council of the request by Monte Buntjer for a Variance Adjustment Permit for a shipping pod as permanent storage at 516A East Main Street. All voted in favor of the motion.
	At the City Council meeting on January 26, 2021, the council tabled the item to allow the applicant to review his options.
Fiscal Impact:	None known.
Alternative/ Variations:	Deny the request, as recommended by staff, based on Ordinance and Statutory requirements for variance approval.
Recommendation:	Recommendation No. 1 Remove the item from the table.
	Recommendation No. 2 that the Council approve the request by Monte Buntjer for a Variance Adjustment Permit for a shipping pod as permanent storage at 516A East Main Street, as recommended by the Planning Commission.

Marshall Planning Commission Findings of Fact – Request for Variance Permit 516A East Main Street, City of Marshall, Lyon County, Minnesota

- 1. Mr. Buntjer is the owner of a parcel of land located at 516A East Main Street.
- 2. The subject property is legally described as found on Exhibit A.
- 3. Mr. Buntjer has applied to the City for a variance to install a 40 foot shipping container as a permanent storage building.
- 4. The proposal would vary from Ordinance in that it requests using a shipping container as a permanent storage which is explicitly prohibited by Ordinance 86-163(b)(10).
- 5. Minnesota Statute Section 462.357, subd. 6 provides:
 - a. Variances shall only be permitted (a) when they are in harmony with the general purposes and intent of the ordinance and (b) when the variances are consistent with the comprehensive plan.
 - b. Variances may be granted when the applicant for the variance establishes that there are practical difficulties in complying with the zoning ordinance. "Practical difficulties," as used in connection with the granting of a variance, means that (a) the property owner proposes to use the property in a reasonable manner not permitted by the zoning ordinance; (b) the plight of the landowner is due to circumstances unique to the property not created by the landowner; and (c) the variance, if granted, will not alter the essential character of the locality.
 - c. Economic considerations alone shall not constitute practical difficulties.
- 6. City Ordinance allows variances if "(t)he applicant shall prove that the literal enforcement of the provisions of this chapter would cause practical difficulties because of circumstances unique to the individual property under consideration and the granting of the variances will be in keeping with the spirit and intent of this chapter" according to Section 86-29 (e). The practical difficulties are further defined according to the State Statutes as presented in Item 5 above.
- 7. City Ordinance Section 86-163 (b) (10) states that "Trailers, semi-trailers, and storage containers (including, but not limited to, cargo and shipping container and PODS or any structures made of the above components) must not be used as accessory buildings in all classes of residential or business districts." Additionally, Section 86-248 (f) states that "Storage containers, including, but not limited to, trailers, semi-trailers, cargo and shipping containers, PODS, and dumpsters, are not allowed as permanent storage structures in all classes of residential or business districts." Storage and shipping containers do not meet building code and do not fit into typical city environment, which may lead to reduction in surrounding properties' values.
- 8. Below is analysis of the Minnesota Statute Section 462.357, subd. 6 applicability:

- a. The requested variance is not in harmony with the purpose and intent of the ordinance because it will deviate from the purpose of uniformity and maintaining property values.
- b. The requested variance is unrelated to the comprehensive plan.
- c. The property owner does not propose to use the property in a reasonable manner because conventional storage building may be built to comply with the Ordinance.
- d. There are not unique circumstances to the property not created by the landowner because its size and location is not remarkable.
- e. The variance will not maintain the essential character of the locality because there are no other storage containers in the neighborhood.
- 9. Based on the above information, staff concluded that there are no practical difficulties in this case and recommended that the variance request be denied.
- 10. A public hearing was conducted at the special January 20, 2021, Planning Commission meeting. Notice of that hearing was published and was mailed pursuant to provisions of Marshall Ordinance Sec. 86-47 and in compliance with Minnesota Statutes.
- 11. Following a public hearing on the application, the Planning Commission has recommended approval of the variance based on the fact that there are already several such containers around town that are a lot more of an eye sore than this one, which is barely visible from the street.

At the conclusion of the public hearing, motion was made by Commission Member Lee, seconded by Commission Member Knieff to recommend approval of the variance permit to the City Council.

- 1) That the regulations, standards and requirements as set forth in the City Code and as pertains to the class of district in which such premises are located shall be conformed with.
- 2) That the City reserves the right to revoke the Variance Adjustment Permit in the event that any person has breached the conditions contained in this permit provided first, that the City serve the person with written notice specifying items of any default, and allow the applicant a reasonable time in which to cure any such default.
- 3) That the conditions contained in this permit shall be binding upon the successors and assigns of the applicant.

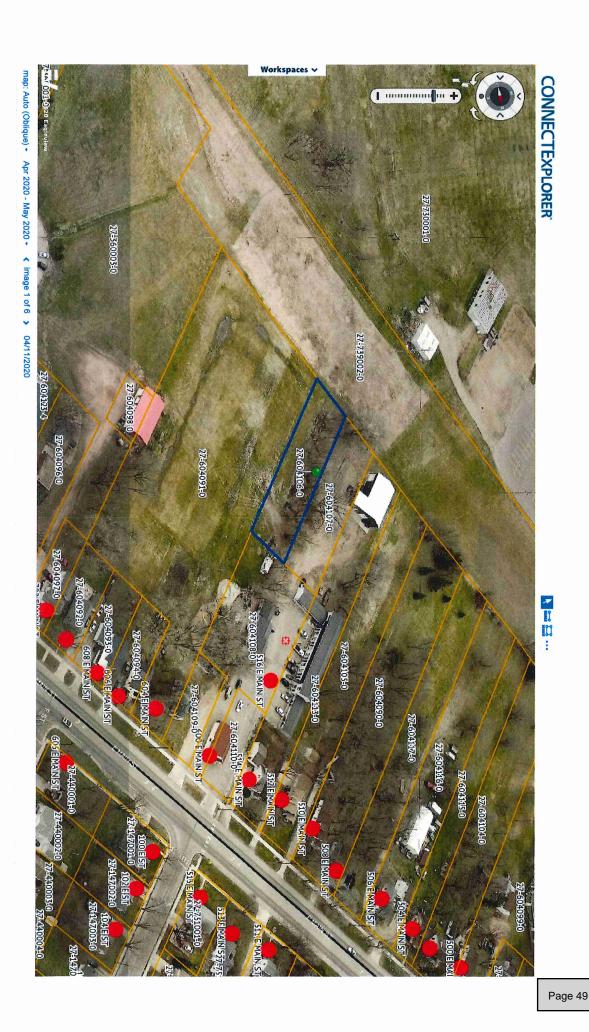

Background Information:	Mowers are essential pieces of equipment now only for maintaining our green areas in our Parks but also for snow removal and fall leaf clean up in the parks. Staff has worked with Kibble Equipment recently to secure pricing to keep all 72" mowers under warranty during the City's ownership and work toward trading in mowers every 2 years when the warranties expire. Last year the City purchased the first two mowers to initiate this program. In the 2021 CIP, two more mowers are budgeted for replacement. One mower is estimated at \$20,000 and the other at \$18,000. Background Information:	The City is currently in the process of applying for our new 2020 Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) General Permit. The MS4 permit is a 28 page permit that outlines numerous requirements that the city must meet as an operator of a storm sewer system. There are some other qualifiers, but generally this permit applies to all communities in our state with a population over 5,000. This permit is generally updated and reissued every five years. In this instance, the 2020 permit will replace our existing 2013 permit. MPCA has been working toward rolling this permit out since 2018.
	A large bulk of the changes to this permit revolve around record keeping and 'measurables'. There is a large push from the MPCA to ensure that each community is following through on permit requirements and documenting how the goals are being met. The MS4 is largely guided by meeting six different "Minimum Control Measures (MCMs), each with numerous requirements that must be met to be in compliance with the permit. The MCMs are as follows:
	MCM 1: Public Education and Outreach MCM 2: Public Participation/Involvement MCM 3: Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE) MCM 4: Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control MCM 5: Post-Construction Stormwater Management MCM 6: Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping for Municipal Operations
	As part of our application for new permit coverage, Engineering staff is reviewing our entire MS4 program to both audit ourselves and also update and amend our City Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP). Along with submitting the new application, we will need to convey to the MPCA whether we are meeting any applicable and approved Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) waste load allocations (WLAs). For example, the City of Marshall is required to show a reduction of 30% in Total Phosphorus (TP) output from our MS4 as compared to a baseline year of 1988. This is related to an EPA-approved Lower Minnesota River Dissolved Oxygen TMDL.
	City staff is currently working with Bolton & Menk on a stormwater modeling project. Within this project, we are creating a basic, cost-effective approach to reviewing our MS4 for compliance with our approved TMDLs. We believe that our work with Bolton & Menk will be adequate to satisfy the MPCA's desire to see measurable progress toward meeting our TMDLs.

Continued discussions and meetings on City Hall construction. We still anticipate the building construction to be completed 1st week in May. We have notified SMSU of our proposed leave date of May 31 to allow for time to move staff and furniture back to City Hall. ADULT COMMUNITY CENTER

• In-person activities resumed as of January 5th. Social distancing and safety protocols are still being practiced. Staff will continue monitoring activity with cautious optimism towards additional programming in February & March. Barb Lipinski, Coordinator, was recently recognized for her 25 years of service to the City of Marshall.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION

- Amanda has been working collectively with several community stakeholders in presenting the third annual Cultures on the Prairie of Southwest Minnesota Conference (Tuesday, February 23rd). The entire conference will be delivered virtually
- Driver Education and Behind the Wheel instruction has restarted with classroom instruction being delivered virtually. Sessions for 2021/2022 have been released to the public.

PARKS

Staff is currently preparing for two upcoming projects: 1) Adding a Restroom/Shelter at Patriot Park located on Windstar Street. (Currently the City provides a portable rental unit). 2) Implementing some inclusive playground amenities surrounding the new playground at Independence Park.

City Administrator Sharon Hanson will give our Advisory Board members an update at our April meeting regarding the status of the Aquatic Center project

RECREATION

Cam continues to adjust programming to meet the ever-changing requirements for safe recreational activities. Youth registrations have been steady and limited to individuals from the Marshall community only.

The Sticks & Stones Hockey & Curling Tournament is scheduled to take place at the Red Baron Arena on March 5th & 6th. This is becoming a popular annual adult event that the community has embraced.

STUDIO 1 TV

With hockey events being permitted to take place at the Red Baron Arena, staff has been working daily to keep up with live streaming events for the public due to limited attendance restrictions. Along with MAHA, Ice Dogs and Tigers hockey, Studio 1 TV continues to cover and provide access to Marshall High School basketball & wrestling teams throughout their modified seasons.

Finance

- 2020 Audit Staff have begun audit prep for the 2020 Audit, which will take place in April of 2021. The auditors will be on site in March to do preliminary testing.
- 2021 Bonding A work session will be scheduled in February to review capital items and the City's long-term plan. The bonding process will begin at the February 23rd council meeting.

PERSONNEL/OTHER

- Police/city personnel have assisted the State of MN with the pilot vaccination site held at the Marshall Middle School. Two more follow-up sites will be held at the same location by the MDH and assistance will be given to provide site security and traffic flow.
- Assistance will also be given to our local health care provider, AVERA Regional Medical Center, with their vaccination site.
- The two surplus squad cars that have been replaced were sold on the State of MN Auction site. \$16,725.00 was the total received for the vehicles.

DETECTIVE REPORT

- A Worthington man was arrested on Controlled Substance Crime charges following the
 investigation of a disturbance call at a Marshall motel. Approximately 30 pounds of marijuana,
 1341 grams of THC wax, 26 packages of marijuana edibles, 175 prepackaged marijuana cigars,
 and \$18,640 in cash were seized after the execution of a search warrant of the man's motel
 room. The Brown-Lyon-Redwood-Renville Drug Task Force assisted in this case.
- A Marshall man was arrested on Controlled Substance Crime charges after being found in possession of approximately 2 ½ pounds of marijuana.
- A Marshall man was arrested and charged with felony possession of stolen property after an investigation of a theft of a check from the mail. A multi-county investigation involving mail theft, check forgeries, and identity theft is active and additional charges are possible.
- The death of a 63 year old Marshall man found outside his home during a blizzard remains under investigation pending receipt of the final autopsy report. No foul play is suspected and there is no danger to the public.
- Four cases of criminal sexual conduct were investigated in the month of January. Two of those cases have been cleared, one case remains under investigation, and one case was determined to be a false report and was forwarded to the Lyon County Attorney's Office for falsely reporting a crime charges.
- Four theft by swindle cases involving scams are under investigation. The scams included an
 unemployment insurance benefits scam, a scam where the victim was told that their Apple
 iPhone was infected, a real estate scam, and a scam where the victim was told their computer
 was infected.
- Three assaults and six theft cases were investigated during the month of January.
- Four cases of check forgery are under investigation. Two of the cases involve forged checks passed in multiple jurisdictions. A case of the issuance of dishonored checks in the City of Marshall is also under investigation.
- Two cases of voter registration fraud were investigated. One case is cleared and the other remains under investigation.

- A residential burglary was investigated and the case was forwarded to the Lyon County Attorney's Office for charges.
- 26 child protection reports and 1 report from the Minnesota Adult Abuse Reporting Center were investigated in conjunction with Southwest Health and Human Services.
- Detective Kaylynn Sandgren joined the Detective's Division with her promotion on January 4th.

MERIT CENTER

- The MERIT Center continues to host the Marshall City Council meetings as well as any COVID-19 Emergency Management meetings/planning.
- The Department of Public Safety continues to utilize the driving track and skills pad for CDL exam testing. There were 13 exams completed on the track in January.
- Meier Electric conducted safety training at the MERIT Center on Jan 18th.
- Beck's Hybrid hosted their PFR insights training at the MERIT Center on Jan 20th. 24 participants attended this event.
- MN West conducted a CDL Preparation Course, Automated Systems course and a trained medical aide class in January.
- The MERIT Center was utilized 18 out of 30 days in January with 151 participants attending

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

- The Department of Public Safety continues to hold weekly briefings on Mondays and Fridays
 with all the CLEO'S (Chief Law Enforcement Officers) in the state. These meetings are conducted
 at the State Emergency Operations Center and cover a variety of topics related to COVID-19
 response and issues related to public safety.
- Recent meetings with CLEO's regarding the response to upcoming trials in the Metro and possible out-state assistance have been started.
- Many meetings were held with the Minnesota Department of Health and their leadership team for the Marshall vaccination site. A total of 2,314 vaccines were dispersed to those who were able to register through the Primary Bio site created for the State of MN.
