City of Moberly, Missouri Council Minutes

Council met in regular session at 6:00 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers with Mayor Jeffrey presiding.

All stood and recited the pledge of allegiance led by Mayor Jeffrey.

Council Members answering the roll call were: Jerry Jeffrey, Tim Brubaker, John Kimmons, Cole Davis, and Austin Kyser.

A motion was made by Kyser and seconded by Brubaker to approve the agenda. Ayes: Jeffrey, Brubaker, Kimmons, Davis and Kyser. Nays: none.

A motion was made by Brubaker and seconded by Kyser to approve the minutes of April 5, 2021, April 7, 2021, April 13, 2021, and April 14, 2021 Council meetings as presented. Ayes: Jeffrey, Brubaker, Kimmons, Davis and Kyser. Nays: none.

The canvass of ballots for the Municipal Election of April 6, 2021 was performed by County Clerk, Will Ellis and the verification board.

For Council Three Year Term County Clerk Ellis certified that the canvass for "Moberly Councilman" is as follows:

Jerry C. Jeffrey received 529 votes, and Tim L. Brubaker received 580 votes. The certification shows Jerry C. Jeffrey and Tim L. Brubaker are elected for Council for three-year terms at the Municipal Election of April 6, 2021.

City Clerk, Shannon Hance, administered the oath of office for Councilmen, Jerry C. Jeffrey, and Tim L. Brubaker.

A motion was made by Jeffrey and seconded by Kimmons to adjourn sine die and appoint City Manager, Brian Crane, as temporary Chairman. Ayes: Jeffrey, Brubaker, Kimmons, Davis and Kyser. Nays: none.

Chairman Crane called the meeting to order.

Council answering the roll call were: Jerry Jeffrey, Tim Brubaker, John Kimmons, Cole Davis, and Austin Kyser.

Chairman Crane stated the first order of business would be the election of Mayor.

A motion was made by Brubaker and seconded by Kimmons to nominate Jerry Jeffrey for Mayor. There being no other nominations, Chairman Crane declared the nominations closed and called for a vote on the motion. Ayes: Jeffrey, Kimmons, Brubaker, Davis and Kyser. Nays: none.

Mayor Jeffrey stated the next order of business will be the election of Mayor Pro Tem. A motion was made Kimmons and seconded by Kyser to nominate Tim Brubaker as Mayor Pro Tem. There being no other nominations, Mayor Jeffrey declared the nominations closed and called for a vote on the motion. Ayes: Jeffrey, Kimmons, Brubaker, Davis and Kyser. Nays: none.

A request was received from Kelly Pedigo, for Safe Passage, to hold the Taste of Missouri Wine Stroll, 3:00 - 8:00 p.m., August 14, 2021. A motion was made by Kyser and seconded by Kimmons to approve the request. Ayes: Jeffrey, Brubaker, Kimmons, Davis and Kyser. Nays: none.

The following bid was received for a new 2021/2022 tandem axle dump truck with plumbing and hitch for snowplow and salt spreader: **Scheppers International Truck Center**, \$120,706 with some additional options in the amount of \$6,559 for a total bid of \$127,265. What is the source of my water?

Source Water Assessment

The Department of Natural Resources conducted a source water assessment to determine the susceptibility of our water source to potential contaminants. This process involved the establishment of source water area delineations for each well or surface water intake and then a contaminant inventory was performed within those delineated areas to assess potential threats to each source. Assessment maps and summary information sheets are available on the internet at <http://drinkingwater.missouri.edu/swip/swipmaps/pwssid.htm>. To access the maps for your water system you will need the State-assigned identification code, which is printed at the top of this report. The Source Water Inventory Project maps and information sheets provide a foundation upon which a more comprehensive source water protection plan can be developed.

Why are there contaminants in my water?

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

- A. Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife.
- B. Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban stormwater runoff, industrial, or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming.
- C. Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban stormwater runoff, and residential uses.
- D. Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are byproducts of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban stormwater runoff, and septic systems.
- E. Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally-occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the Department of Natural Resources prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. Department of Health regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which must provide the same protection for public health.

Is our water system meeting other rules that govern our operations?

The Missouri Department of Natural Resources regulates our water system and requires us to test our water on a regular basis to ensure its safety. Our system has been assigned the identification number MO2010533 for the purposes of tracking our test results. Last year, we tested for a variety of contaminants. The detectable results of these tests are on the following pages of this report. Any violations of state requirements or standards will be further explained later in this report.

Do I need to take any special precautions?

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Terms and Abbreviations

Population: 12101. This is the equivalent residential population served including non-bill paying customers.

90th percentile: For Lead and Copper testing. 10% of test results are above this level and 90% are below this level.

AL: Action Level, or the concentration of a contaminant which, when exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

HAAs: Haloacetic Acids (mono-, di- and tri-chloroacetic acid, and mono- and di-bromoacetic acid) as a group.

LRAA: Locational Running Annual Average, or the locational average of sample analytical results for samples taken during the previous four calendar quarters.

MCLG: Maximum Contaminant Level Goal, or the level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

MCL: Maximum Contaminant Level, or the highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

nd: not detectable at testing limits.

NTU: Nephelometric Turbidity Unit, used to measure cloudiness in drinking water.

ppb: parts per billion or micrograms per liter.

ppm: parts per million or milligrams per liter.

RAA: Running Annual Average, or the average of sample analytical results for samples taken during the previous four calendar quarters.

Range of Results: Shows the lowest and highest levels found during a testing period, if only one sample was taken, then this number equals the Highest Test Result or Highest Value.

SMCL: Secondary Maximum Contaminant Level, or the secondary standards that are non-enforceable guidelines for contaminants and may cause cosmetic effects (such as skin or tooth discoloration) or aesthetic effects (such as taste, odor or color) in drinking water. EPA recommends these standards but does not require water systems to comply.

TT: Treatment Technique, or a required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.



COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR MANHOLE REPLACEMENT

THIS COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR MANHOLE REPLACEMENT (this "**Agreement**") is made and entered into as of the 23rd day of April 2021 by and between the **CITY OF MOBERLY, MISSOURI** a third-class city and a Missouri municipal corporation having a principal office at 101 West Reed Street, Moberly, Missouri 65270 (the "**City**") and **ORSCHELN MANAGEMENT CO.**, a Delaware corporation located at 2000 US Highway 63 South, PO Box 280, Moberly, Missouri ("**Orscheln**" and together with the City the "**Parties**").

RECITALS

A. Sections 70.210 through 70.320 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, as amended, authorize Missouri municipalities to contract with any private person, firm, association or corporation for the planning, development, construction, acquisition, or operation of any public improvement or facility, or for a common service, provided, that the subject and purposes of any such contract or cooperative action are within the scope of the powers of such municipality.

B. Orscheln has requested the replacement of a manhole owned by the City and known as Manhole No. W1-203 ("**MH**") located at the alley on Washington Street west of North Ault Street in the City of Moberly, Missouri.

C. City has agreed pursuant to the terms of this Agreement to coordinate the replacement of the MH and Orscheln has agreed to reimburse the City for the cost of replacement due to the fact that the MH is located in a city street.

D. The Parties have received a bid quote from Willis Bros., Inc. ("**Willis**") for the MH replacement in the amount of Thirteen Thousand, Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$13,250.00) to complete the replacement per City specifications (the "**Bid**").

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto do hereby covenant and agree as follows:

1. The Project. The City agrees to undertake the replacement of the MH as provided in the scope of work provided in the Bid by contracting with Willis and supervising the installation project. The City agrees to make payment to Willis for the estimated cost of the replacement in addition to any necessary change orders for completion of the replacement to meet all city code requirements. The City shall provide Orscheln advance notice as it relates to any change orders where feasible.

2. Reimbursement. Following completion of the MH replacement and payment of the installation cost to Willis, Orscheln agrees to reimburse the City for all funds paid to Willis directly related to the replacement of the MH. The City will notify Orscheln in writing of the amount of

reimbursement and provide all invoices and paid receipts and Orscheln agrees to pay said amount within thirty (30) days of receipt of notification. If the reimbursement amount differs from the Bid then the City will provide documentation to Orscheln explaining the difference including invoices and paid receipts paid by the City for costs directly related to the replacement of the MH.

3. No Waiver of Sovereign Immunity; Limited Public Liability; No Personal Liability.
Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed or deemed to constitute a waiver of the City’s sovereign immunity. The parties hereto agree that in no event shall the City or any of its officials, agents, attorneys, employees, or representatives have any liability in damages or any other monetary liability to Orscheln or any successor, assign, heir or personal representative of Orscheln in respect of any suit, claim, or cause of action arising out of this Agreement and Orscheln hereby waives any such claim. No official, officer, agent, attorney, employee, or representative of the City shall be personally liable to Orscheln or the successors, assigns, heirs or personal representatives of Orscheln in the event of any default or breach by any party under this Agreement.

4. Notices. Any Notice required by this Agreement shall be deemed given if deposited in the United States Mail, first class, postage prepaid and addressed as hereinafter specified.

Each party shall have the right to specify that notice is to be addressed to another address by giving to the other party Ten (10) days written notice thereof.

5. Entire Agreement; Amendment. The parties agree that this Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between them and that no other agreements or representations other than those contained in this Agreement have been made by the parties. This Agreement shall be amended only in writing and effective when signed by the authorized agents of the parties and when authorized and approved by the Moberly City Council.

6. Relationship of the Parties; No Third Party Right. Nothing contained in this Agreement nor any act of Orscheln or the City shall be deemed or construed to create a partnership or agency relationship between the parties, or their agents or representatives and this Agreement is and shall be limited to the specific purposes set out in this Agreement. Other than as expressly provided in this Agreement, no party shall be the agent of, or have any rights to create any obligations or liabilities binding on, the other party. The parties do not intend to confer any benefit under this Agreement on any person or entity other than the named parties hereto.

7. **Severability.** In the event any term or provision of this Agreement is held to be unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder shall continue in full force and effect, to the extent the remainder can be given effect without the invalid provision.

8. **Binding Effect.** Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement, the covenants, conditions and agreements contained in this Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the Orscheln, the City, and their respective successors and permitted assigns.

9. **Choice of Law; Venue.** This Agreement and its performance shall be governed by and construed by the laws of the State of Missouri applicable to contracts made and to be performed wholly within such state, without regard to choice or conflict of laws provisions. The parties hereto agree that any action at law, suite in equity, or other judicial proceeding arising out of this Agreement shall be instituted only in the Circuit Court of Randolph County, Missouri or in the Federal District Court for the Eastern District of Missouri and waive any objections based upon venue or *forum non conveniens* or otherwise.

10. **Execution; Counterparts.** Each person executing this Agreement in a representative capacity warrants and represents that he or she has authority to do so, and upon request by the other party, proof of such authority will be furnished to the requesting party. This Agreement may be executed at different times and in two or more counterparts, and all counterparts so executed shall for all purposes constitute one and the same instrument, binding on the parties hereto, notwithstanding that both parties may not have executed the same counterpart. In proving this Agreement, it shall not be necessary to produce or account for more than one such counterpart executed by the party against whom enforcement is sought.



Summary: Request from Safe Passage for approval to hold the 2021 Taste of Missouri Wine Stroll to support Safe Passage on August 14th, 2021 from 3:00pm to 8:00pm. Safe Passage also requests the lifting of city ordinance 6-5 to allow public consumption of alcoholic beverages in event glasses only in the designated area in downtown Moberly. The requested area is the sidewalks on Reed Street from Johnson Street to Clark Street. 4th Street from the north side of Rollins to north sidewalk of Reed Street. Williams Street from the north sidewalk of Rollins to the north sidewalk of Reed St. Rollins Street north sidewalk from 4th street to the west sidewalk of Clark St. and Clark Street west side walk only from Rollins north sidewalk to Reed St north sidewalk.

Safe Passage also requests ordinance 6-5 lifted for the Municipal Auditorium parking lot and the alley west of the Auditorium and the lifting of city ordinance 6-4, public possession, in a designated wine garden on the parking lot of the Municipal Auditorium. No street closures are requested, but cones to close off the multiple entrances into the auditorium parking lot are requested.

This does not allow sufficient air from the blowers to allow both blowers to run at once (typical operation, especially during warm weather). These valves were last replaced in September of 2013. This is a sole-source supplier for a sole-source item. The quote is attached. This is too large of a project for City staff to accomplish, so a quote is being obtained for the labor of assisting in clean out of the tank and installation of the valves.




