Through dynamic partnerships, quality family services, advocacy, and education, NEICAC advances community development and improves social and economic conditions for individuals and families with limited resources.

NEICAC's vision is to create inclusive communities with equitable access to resources and opportunities where all individuals and families thrive.



The Heart of Our Work

America was built on the promise that every family should have opportunity for success. Whether our neighbors are experiencing a temporary setback or face a continuous challenge to meet their basic needs – too many struggle to achieve a good quality of life. On a national level, nearly 40 million people are still living in poverty, and even more are just one missed paycheck away from hardship. We believe everyone should be able to take care of their families and have an equal opportunity at success. Community Action Agencies serve 99% of all American counties with life-changing services to help families achieve stability. All agencies are locally controlled and represented by the private, public and low-income sectors of the community.





Who Are We?



NEICAC provides the support and resources to improve the stability and quality of life for individuals and families with limited resources.

The organization began in 1965 and continues today to serve the northeast Iowa counties of Allamakee, Bremer, Chickasaw, Clayton, Fayette, Howard and Winneshiek.

We assist those who need it the most. Our work enables individuals and families in Northeast Iowa to live, work, and contribute to their communities.



Grisis Program & Food Pantries

Operated out of NEICAC's Family Services Outreach Offices

Food Pantries –Bremer, Howard, Winneshiek

Direct Assistance through the Crisis Program may be available for:

- Past-due or disconnected utility
- Past-due rent or mortgage
- Vehicle repairs
- Emergency medical, dental, or mental health services
- Transportation
- Emergency Shelter
- Assistance gaining or maintaining internet or phone service



Referrals to other community partners

Payments go directly to vendors

Current eligibility guidelines are at 200% of the FPL



Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

- Designed to aid qualifying low-income households with a supplemental payment of a portion of residential heating costs for the winter heating season
- Encourages regular utility payments and promotes energy awareness reduction
- Eligible households may also receive financial assistance with a past due heat and/or electric account and repair or replacement of a nonworking heating system



Eligibilty is currently 200% of FPL

Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP)

Provides assistance with past due water bills to avoid a disconnect from drinking water and wastewater

Households can receive assistance twice per year (10/1 - 9/30)

Eligibility guidelines are the same as LIHEAP

Partnered with city water vendors.

Cannot assist with deposit of a new water service, repair of water equipment, or digging a private well.

Weatherization Assistance Program

- Helps to improve housing safety, comfort, and affordability to eligible households
- \bigcirc Services include a cost effectiveness energy audit, air leakage checks, insulation, and all combustion appliances inspection for repair and/or replacement
- All households who apply for LIHEAP are automatically placed on a waitlist for Weatherization services



Far more applications for LIHEAP than funding to weatherize homes

Priority based on energy usage and needs of individuals residing in the home

4,000+ LIHEAP applications & around 115 homes weatherized per year

HOUSING

NEICAC's housing program provides safe and affordable housing to seniors, individuals with disabilities, and individuals and families with limited resources

Own and manage rental apartments, duplexes, and single-family homes throughout northeast lowa

Head Start & Early Head Start

- Head Start and Early Head Start promote school readiness of children and teach parents that they are their child's first and most important teacher
- Early Head Start | Home Visiting Services are offered in Allamakee, Clayton, Fayette, Howard and Winneshiek counties for pregnant women and families with children 0-3 years old

Head Start Child Development-Classrooms (Preschool programming) for 3–5-year-old children are located in all seven of the counties we serve





Both services are 100% free to eligible households!



Child & Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)

- The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) is a federally funded program that is part of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA)
- Registered childcare providers in our seven-county service area are eligible for this program that:
 Provides financial support for offering nutritious meals and snacks for children in childcare settings
 - Provides educational resources and training to expand the knowledge of good nutrition and childcare



Significantly decreases the financial burden of operating childcare



Allows registered childcare providers access to money that they would not have access to until tax time

Family Development & Self-Sufficiency (FaDSS)

- FaDSS engages families in dynamic partnerships to address their basic needs, improve child well-being, and develop career opportunities that, in turn, improves lives, families, and communities
- Family Development Specialists do this by:
 Reducing sources of stress that destabilize families
 Strengthening core skills that are essential for work, school, and life
 - Creating responsive relationships that are safe and supportive


