After the presentation and after committee discussion, Mr. Pavlis moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to table any action on the energy provisions of OBC Chapter 13. The motion passed unanimously.

2. Amendments Groups 98 & 99

Staff presented the anticipated procedure for moving these amendments packaged forward in light of new legislation and the Board's rule development process.

Staff discussed the new provisions enacted by the legislature addressing regulatory restrictions in the Ohio Administrative Code, presented the staff analysis related to these new provisions, and the process going forward for the Board's adoption of new or amended rules.

Mr. Regoli presented Petition 19-02 requesting amendment to OMC § 908 regarding requirements for cooling towers, evaporative coolers and fluid coolers.

Mr. Denk moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to approve Petition #19-02 requesting amendment of the Ohio Mechanical Code to address the reoccurrence of Legionnaire's Disease caused by the cooling tower discharge vapor plumes by amending OMC Section 908 using language proposed and as further modified by the committee.

Chairman Holland called for the ayes and nays.

Motion carried unanimously with Mr. Schultz abstaining.

NB-2 Petition 19-03 (RCO 403.1.4.1)

Mr. Richards presented Petition 19-03 submitted by the Ohio Building Officials Association requesting resinstatement of exceptions 1 and 2 in RCO § 403.1.4.1 regarding frost protection of residential accessory structures.

Mr. Denk moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to approve Petition #19-03 requesting amendment of the Residential Code of Ohio to reinstate two exceptions to the footing frost protection requirements by amending RCO Section 403.1.4.1.

Chairman Holland called for the ayes and nays.

Motion carried unanimously.

NB-3 Complaint Summary Report

Mr. Robert Johnson presented the complaint summary report included in the Board's packet at Tab NB-3:

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Village of Camden Building Department

Board staff received a complaint from Mr. Tom Hicks regarding the condemnation of existing buildings by the Village property maintenance division. He has asked for an investigation to be conducted for real estate fraud connected to these condemnations.

Board staff contacted Camden building official Scott Young regarding the allegations. Mr. Young stated that the condemnations came as a result of structures not being maintained. He was requested by Camden property maintenance manager Rusty Wilson to conduct an inspection to verify if the buildings had any serious hazards. This was completed on July 17, 2019. Mr. Young indicated that there were no serious hazards per the building code but did observe potential sanitation hazards due to vast quantities of stored materials in the buildings. He indicated that Mr. Wilson was aware of this concern. Mr. Young said that it was unknown if the fire department or the health department has been notified of these issues.

Currently, the maintenance issues are being enforced by the Village under their maintenance code. Furthermore, the allegations of real estate fraud are outside the authority of the Ohio Board of Building Standards.

Board staff recommends the Board dismiss the complaint with no further action.

Mr. Galvin moved and Mr. Collins seconded to accept the staff recommendation included in the complaint summary to dismiss the complaint related to the Village of Camden Building Department.

Chairman Holland called for the ayes and nays.

Motion carried unanimously.

NB-4 Late Submittal of Continuing Education Course

Ms. Foley stated that the Board received an application for continuing education course approval after the Education Committee met for a course that is scheduled to take place before the Board will meet next. Ms. Foley stated that technical staff reviewed the course and recommend approval.
