### OHIO BOARD OF BUILDING STANDARDS CODE COMMITTEE

The Code Committee met on August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019, with the following members present: Mr. Denk, Mr. Samuelson, Mr. Collins, Mr. Johnson, Mr. Miller, Mr. Pavlis, Mr. Schultz, and Mr. Stanbery.

The Committee's report is included in the August 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2019, Board Meeting Packet at tab **CR-1** for the Board's consideration.

**<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>** – The August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019, meeting was called to order by Mr. Denk at 1:12 PM.

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> - Mr. Stanbery moved and Mr. Collins seconded to approve the minutes of the May 16, 2019, Code Committee meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **PETITIONS**

#### 1. Petition #19-02 (OMC 908 Cooling Towers, Evaporative Coolers and Fluid Coolers)

After discussion by the committee of the petition and its intent to address the reoccurrence of Legionnaire's Disease caused by the cooling tower discharge vapor plumes, Mr. Stanbery moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to recommend adopting the petition using proposed staff changes and as modified by the committee. The motion passed with Mr. Schultz abstaining.

#### **2. Petition #19-03** (RCO Section 403.1.4.1)

After discussion and review of the recommendation from the RCAC, Mr. Stanbery moved and Mr. Collins seconded to recommend approval of the petition. The motion passed unanimously.

In between these two events, in 2002, there was an outbreak in a town in England, Barrow-in-Furness, that killed 7 people. In this incident, there were 180 confirmed cases of Legionnaire's disease and the smoking gun was actually a cooling tower located in an elevated parking deck, which was adjacent to an alleyway between shops and bus stops. In this case both the Borough Council and their Design Services Manager were convicted of offenses under the Health and Safety Act of 1974. More recently and closer to home, a church in Parma, Ohio installed a cooling tower that resulted in 10 confirmed cases of Legionnaire's disease with one death. ### Complaint and Investigation Consideration Status Report

July 25, 2019

To: Members of the Ohio Board of Building Standards (OBBS) for the August 2, 2019 Board Conference Meeting as reported by Board staff. The following is a list of new complaints received for consideration by the OBBS to determine if authorization of an investigation is warranted.

#### New Inquiries and Complaints:

#### A. Village of Camden Building Department

Board staff received a complaint from Mr. Tom Hicks regarding the condemnation of existing buildings by the Village property maintenance division. He has asked for an investigation to be conducted for real estate fraud connected to these condemnations.

Board staff contacted Camden building official Scott Young regarding the allegations. Mr. Young stated that the condemnations came as a result of structures not being maintained. He was requested by Camden property maintenance manager Rusty Wilson to conduct an inspection to verify if the buildings had any serious hazards. This was completed on July 17, 2019. Mr. Young indicated that there were no serious hazards per the building code but did observe potential sanitation hazards due to vast quantities of stored materials in the buildings. He indicated that Mr. Wilson was aware of this concern. Mr. Young said that it was unknown if the fire department or the health department has been notified of these issues.

Currently, the maintenance issues are being enforced by the Village under their maintenance code. Furthermore, the allegations of real estate fraud are outside the authority of the Ohio Board of Building Standards.

Board staff recommends the Board dismiss the complaint with no further action.
