Modifications were made to eliminate that phrase and to correct a grammatical error in exception 3. Mr. Miller made a motion to include, in a future rule change package, the proposed exceptions with the modifications made to exceptions 2.2 and 3. Mr. Samuelson seconded the motion. The motions passed unanimously.

New Business

Mr. Johnson raised a concern with the committee that some inspectors are requiring only FSK-type insulation to be installed at the rim joist, even though there is no code requirement for that specific product. Allegedly, the manufacturer of the FSK has stopped making the product.

After discussion, the committee decided that the issue could be raised at the next OBOA Code Consistency video conference in hopes that the issue will be resolved through education of the code officials.

NB-1 Proposed 2023 Ohio Code Development Schedule

Staff discussed the status of the regulatory restriction statute, presented the tentative proposed code update schedule to the committee, and shared that additional code committee meeting dates would be needed to present the 2021 model code changes to the committee.

Board of Building Standards Duties / Report Organization and Purpose

Revised Code § 3781.10(E) directs the Board of Building Standards to certify municipal, township, and county building departments and their personnel to enforce the rules promulgated by the Board. As licensees of the Board, building departments and individuals certified by the Board are subject to review, investigation, and discipline by the Board for failure to properly enforce the Board's rules. Persons affected by the actions of Board-certified individuals and departments may file a complaint with the Board. Upon receipt of a complaint, Board Staff conducts an initial inquiry into the allegations and determines if there is enough basis to warrant further investigation. This information is provided to the Board which then determines whether to order staff to conduct the investigation. The Board has ordered an investigation in this matter.

This report provides a synopsis of the complaint, background, investigation findings and observations, applicable code requirements at issue, and presents a conclusion and recommendations. The intended use for the report is to provide adequate information to assist the Board in determining what actions, if any, it will take regarding the complaints giving rise to the investigation. It is not intended to address the rights or obligations of parties to any previous or pending enforcement action by a building department in the enforcement of the Board's rules. Parties should consult with their legal counsel regarding these matters.

Allegation / Complaint Summary

On August 3, 2020, a complaint was received from Mr. Charles Marshall alleging unprofessional conduct by Mr. Keith Foulkes, building official. The complainant alleges that Mr. Foulkes communicated to the owner of the building that as their representative was "shortening work to client' for project materials related to the foundation systems. Mr. Marshall also alleged that the building department was not reviewing and approving construction documents in a timely manner.

Background

Construction had commenced by Beacon Marshall Companies, the owner representative-contractor for a building addition to existing Mold Rite facilities in Twinsburg Ohio. A (Conditional) Phased approval was issued for foundations / footings only. Inspections were requested and being conducted at the time of the complaint. [Exhibit 1]

Investigation Findings & Observations

Board staff reviewed the statements provided by the building department and contractor and found the statements appeared contradictory. After review by Board staff, the OBBS certification committee recommended authorization of an investigation.

Board staff contacted the following individuals for the project verification details and enforcement activity, Mr. Keith Foulkes, Mr. Charles Marshall and Mr. Terry Noonan (Contractor), Ms. Carol Rinder, Mold Rite VP (Owner).

The complaint involved department communications related to an inspection that was performed on July 23, 2020. The inspection was documented as not being found in compliance with the approved construction documents.

The contractor was under an immediate deadline to pour the concrete slab based on their scheduled next day delivery of concrete material. If they rescheduled, the supplier would not be able to deliver for 2 weeks due to demand, thus setting back the project schedule.

Mr. Foulkes provided the following timeline information and background regarding the status of the enforcement of the project related specific to this situation: [Exhibit 2]

July 23, 2020 - Inspection of interior slab pre-pour - non-compliance.

July 23, 2020 - Submittal of Addendum No. 3 - omitting vapor barrier and perimeter insulation.

July 23, 2020 - meeting on site to discuss Addendum No. 3 as not approved and requirements of compliance relating to Energy Code. On site: Keith Foulkes, Building Official; Dan Cegelka, Building Inspector; Jason Pastorius City of Twinsburg; Brian Lapikus Mold Rite; Terry Noonan EM Construction. Discussion about approved plans and OBC Chapter 1 requirements. Explained the requirement of Energy Compliance and without support documents from Designer of record, Addendum No.3 could not be approved. Terry Noonan indicated E M Construction was moving forward at their own risk and pouring the floor/slab without vapor barrier and perimeter insulation per approved plans.

July 23, 2020- Email follow up to Terry Noonan regarding site meeting and approvals issued to date.

Mr. Foulkes also provided a copy of the phased approval that included information needed for further compliance for future approvals for the project. This included energy compliance requirements which would have included the information provided in the foundation phased approval. [Exhibit 3]

Mr. Noonan (Contractor) provided a timeline and background information as well. [Exhibit 4] In it he provided the extenuating circumstances of their concern and request of the building department. He provided that the foundation insulation and vapor barrier was not in the scope of their contract with the owner. The inspector was pointing out that the documents would need to be revised and resubmitted for review and approval. Board staff noted that the scope of the work and contract is not the responsibility of the building department, but to only address specific requirements of the approval. Board staff determined that everything was correctly enforced. However, the inspector could not guarantee as Mr. Noonan pointed out that it would be approved in time to allow them to proceed with the work the next day. Mr. Noonan also indicated they would proceed with work the next day. Board staff noted that the contractor was proceeding 'AT Risk' by doing so.

The site meeting on July 23, 2020 specifically addressed the concerns regarding the insulation and vapor barrier required to be installed per the approved documents. There was misunderstanding and miscommunication about the matter based on the concern of the

construction schedule. The contractor at the meeting requested the information needed to comply which was the ComCheck and the revised drawings. Mr. Noonan (contractor) provided they were submitted to the building department by the designer on July 29, 2020. [Exhibit 5]

Mr. Foulkes provided additional information regarding his correspondence with the parties of the project and the details of the events. [Exhibit 6, 7] Mr. Foulkes also provided a letter from the Twinsburg mayor, Mr. Yates, who provided that he has not heard from the owner about this issue, and had affirmed the process required to comply with the building codes and approvals that the building department personnel are enforcing. [Exhibit 8]

Code Requirements

104.2.1 Building official. The building official is responsible for the enforcement of the rules of the board and of Chapters 3781. and 3791. of the Revised Code relating to the construction, arrangement, and the erection of buildings or parts thereof. All building officials shall conduct themselves in a professional, courteous, impartial, responsive, and cooperative manner. The building official shall render interpretations of this code and to adopt policies and procedures in order to clarify the application of its provisions. Such interpretations, policies, and procedures shall be in compliance with the intent and purpose of this code. Building officials shall be responsible to assure that a system is in place to track and audit all projects, to assure that all building department personnel perform their duties in accordance with this section, and for the overall administration of a building department...:

Conclusion

Board staff, after having reviewed the information, determined that Mr. Foulkes and the Twinsburg inspectors followed the enforcement provisions of the Board's rules. It was appropriate to cite that the construction did not comply with the approved documents. They also communicated with the owner's representative (contractor) of the options available to comply. The designer (Architect) did revise and resubmit the documents. The documents were reviewed and approved based on the order received. It was also verified that Mr. Foulkes did communicate with the owner, Carol Rinder, as required by the building code. The owner provided that Mr. Foulkes left a voice mail message to her where he indicated that he believed it was not appropriate how the contractor was handling the project in that they intended to proceed with work that was determined by the inspector to not comply with the approved documents. Ms. Rinder indicated that she forwarded this information to her maintenance manager to address the issue with the contractor since she was not familiar with the circumstances and was not involved with the work. She did not communicate with Mr. Foulkes directly.

Board staff has determined that the communication from Mr. Foulkes may have been misinterpreted by the parties that received the information. Board staff communicated with Mr. Foulkes about the issue and he agreed that that he could have been more clear and direct about the building code compliance issue in his communication with Ms. Rinder to place emphasis less about his perception of how the contractor was responding, since the issue was specifically about the construction not complying with the approved construction documents. He expressed concern that the contractor communicated that they intended to proceed with the work before it was confirmed that the insulation and vapor barrier that was in the approved documents could be removed and not adversely affect compliance with the energy requirements

of the building design. Board staff also determined that the correspondence of Ms. Rinder did not indicate that Mr. Foulkes said 'the contractor was cheating the owner', only that he felt it was inappropriate for the contractor to proceed with work prior to code compliance through revised and resubmitted documents that were approved.

Board staff have determined that no violations to the Board's rules have occurred.

Recommendations

Board staff recommends closing the investigation against Mr. Keith Foulkes, Building Official, with no further action.
