# 1. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH OROVILLE CITY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Council may consider a Memorandum of Understanding with the Oroville City Elementary School District for School Resource Officers (SRO).

#### RECOMMENDATION

Adopt Resolution No. 8836 - A RESOLUTION OF THE OROVILLE CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE OROVILLE CITY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER SERVICES FOR THE 2020/2021 SCHOOL YEAR–(Agreement No. 3253-2).

# 2. LOWER WYANDOTTE CULVERT REHABILITATION EMERGENCY REPAIR - CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT

The Council may consider approving the project budget for construction and awarding a contract to Lamon Construction Company, Inc to construct the Lower Wyandotte Culvert Rehabilitation Emergency Repair Project.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends awarding a contract to Lamon Construction for \$242,476 and authorizing the signature of the contract.

# 3. LOWER WYANDOTTE CULVERT REHABILITATION REPAIR – CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT CONTRACT

The Council may consider approving the project budget and construction management contract with Flaherty Engineering.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends awarding a construction management contract to Flaherty Engineering and authorizing the signature of the contract.

#### 4. REPLACEMENT OF OROVILLE FIRE DEPARTMENT ENGINE 2 MOTOR

The Council may consider an increase in cost to replace the motor of Oroville Fire Department Engine 2.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Approve the replacement of a remanufactured motor in Engine 2 in an amount not to exceed \$60,000.00.

#### 5. REVISED JOB DESCRIPTION FOR PERMIT CENTER ADMINISTRATION STAFF

Currently, the administrative staff at the front counter are divided into 3 distinct job descriptions. The job descriptions are as follows; Building Counter Technician, Administrative Assistant and Staff Assistant. Our goal is to consolidate these 3 jobs into a single job description with an entry level, mid-level and top-level category (Community Development Tech I, II, & III).

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends approval for staff to replace the 3 existing positions into one job description offering 3 skill levels
