8. Approval of Local Legislation concerning Magistrate Court (BW)

The Board of Commissioners reserves the right to continue the meeting to another time and place in the event the number of people in attendance at the meeting, including the Board of Commissioners, staff, and members of the public exceeds the legal limits. The meeting cannot be closed to the public except by a majority vote of a quorum present for the meeting. The board can vote to go into an executive session on a legally exempt matter during a public meeting even if not advertised or listed on the agenda. Individuals with disabilities who require certain accommodations in order to allow them to observe and/or participate in this meeting, or who have questions regarding the accessibility of the meeting or the facilities are required to contact the ADA Compliance Officer, at least three business days in advance of the meeting at 706-485-2776 to allow the County to make reasonable accommodations for those persons.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

It is the intent of this Act to implement certain local prerogatives authorized by Chapter 10 of Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.

SECTION 2.

The number of magistrates authorized for the Magistrate Court of Putnam County shall be three magistrates, consisting of a chief magistrate and up to two other part-time magistrates.

SECTION 3.

- (a) The person serving as chief magistrate of the Magistrate Court of Putnam County on February 1, 1997, or any person appointed to fill a vacancy in such office shall serve for a term of office which expires on December 31, 1998.
- (b) At the state-wide primary and November general election conducted in 1998 and every four years thereafter, the chief magistrate of the Magistrate Court of Putnam County shall be nominated and elected by the qualified voters of Putnam County in a nonpartisan primary election. Persons elected to such office shall take office on the first day of January immediately following such election and shall serve for a term of office of four years until the election and qualification of their respective successors. The procedures for such nonpartisan primary and election shall be as provided in Code Section 21-2-139 of the O.C.G.A."

SECTION 4.

The magistrates other than the chief magistrate shall be appointed by the chief magistrate, provided that the total cost for the employment of such other magistrate does not exceed the amount specifically provided for by the governing authority of Putnam County for such purposes. The term of such other magistrate shall run concurrently with the term of the chief magistrate.

SECTION 5.

Vacancies in the office of the chief magistrate shall be filled as provided by general law. Vacancies in the office of the other magistrates shall be filled by an appointment by the chief magistrate, provided that the total cost for the employment of such other magistrate does not exceed the amount specifically provided for by the governing authority of Putnam County for such purposes.

SECTION 6.

SECTION 7.

The salary for the magistrates, other than the chief magistrate, shall be determined by the chief magistrate, provided that the total cost for the employment of such other magistrate does not exceed the amount specifically provided for by the governing authority of Putnam County for such purposes.

SECTION 8.

- (a) The collection of additional costs in cases before the Magistrate Court of Putnam County shall be made for the benefit of the Putnam County Law Library. The amount of such fees shall be \$1.00.
- (b) The clerk of the Magistrate Court of Putnam County shall collect the law library fees and remit the same each month to the treasure of the board of trustees for the law library.

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION TO AMEND LOCAL LEGISLATION RELATED TO THE NUMBER OF MAGISTRATES IN THE MAGISTRATE COURT OF PUTNAM COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Putnam County Board of Commissioners (hereinafter "Board") desires to amend local legislation related to the number of magistrates in the Magistrate Court of Putnam County; and

WHEREAS, local legislation was passed on March 12, 1984 (Ga. L. 1984, p. 3788), making certain provisions for the Magistrate Court of Putnam County and said local legislation has been amended on March 18, 1986 (Ga. L. 1986, p. 3953), April 4, 1991 (Ga. L. 1991, p. 4668), April 1, 1996 (Ga. L. 1996, p. 3723), April 4, 1997 (Ga. L. 1997, p. 3724), and on May 12, 2015 (Ga. Local Law 2015, No. 279);

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board requests local legislation be drafted to make the following amendments to the local law providing for the Magistrate Court of Putnam County, approved March 12, 1984 (Ga. L. 1984, p. 3788) and its amendments by striking through Section 2 in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new Section 2 to read as follows:

"Section 2. The number of magistrates authorized for the Magistrate Court of Putnam County shall be three magistrates, consisting of a chief magistrate and up to two other part-time magistrates."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Section 4 be amended by striking through Section 4 in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new Section 4 to read as follows:

"Section 4. The magistrates other than the chief magistrate shall be appointed by the chief magistrate, provided that the total cost for the employment of such other magistrate does not exceed the amount specifically provided for by the governing authority of Putnam County for such purposes. The term of such other magistrate shall run concurrently with the terms of the chief magistrate."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Section 5 be amended by striking through Section 5 in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new Section 5 to read as follows:

"Section 5. Vacancies in the office of chief magistrate shall be filled as provided by general law. Vacancies in the office of the other magistrates shall be filled by an appointment by the chief magistrate, provided that the total cost for the employment of such other magistrate does not exceed the amount specifically provided for by the governing authority of Putnam County for such purposes."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Section 7 be amended by striking through Section 7 in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new Section 7 to read as follows:

"Section 7. The salary for the magistrates, other than the chief magistrate, shall be determined by the chief magistrate, provided that the total cost for the employment of such other magistrate does not exceed the amount specifically provided for by the governing authority of Putnam County for such purposes."

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF PUTNAM COUNTY DECLARING THE RESULTS OF AN ELECTION HELD ON NOVEMBER 6, 2018 AND CERTIFICATE OF ELECTION SUPERINTENDENT

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Putnam County (the "**Board of Commissioners**"), the governing body of Putnam County (the "**County**"), a political subdivision of the State of Georgia, adopted a resolution on July 27, 2018, to reimpose, levy, and collect a one percent special purpose local option sales and use tax within the County and to authorize the issuance of certain general obligation debt by the County, conditioned upon approval by a majority of the qualified voters residing within the County voting in a referendum thereon to be held on November 6, 2018; and

WHEREAS, a copy of said resolution was delivered to the Board of Elections of Putnam County, as Election Superintendent the "**Election Superintendent**"), which issued a call for the election described in said resolution of July 27, 2018 (the "**Election**"); and

WHEREAS, the Election Superintendent caused notice of the Election to be published in the newspaper published in the County in which sheriff's advertisements for the County are published, notifying the qualified voters of the County that on November 6, 2018, an election would be held, said notice having been published for the time and in the manner, and containing the specifications and information required by law; and

WHEREAS, the Election was held on November 6, 2018, in accordance with said resolution, call, and notice, and the several managers of the Election brought in the returns from the Election as required by law, and these officers calling the Election, in the presence of and together with the several managers, consolidated the returns and the results thereof; and

WHEREAS, the consolidated returns found the results of the Election to be as follows:

Shall a special one percent sales and use tax be imposed in the special district of Putnam County upon the termination of the special one percent sales and use tax presently in effect, for a period of time not to exceed six years and for the raising of an estimated amount of \$16,560,00.00 for the purpose of completion of capital outlay projects as follows (1) (i) sheriff's office vehicles and building improvements, (ii) EMS ambulances and equipment, (iii) fire department trucks and equipment, (iv) public works heavy duty trucks and equipment, (v) Putnam General Hospital, (vi) recreation department field lighting and building improvements, (vii) community event equipment, (viii) golf course building and equipment, (ix) public building improvements, (x) Oconee Springs Park improvements, (xi) roads for Putnam County; (2) (i) fire vehicles, (ii) fire fighting equipment, (iii) gas line expansion, (iv) gas service computer equipment, (v) gas department vehicle, (vi) gas service equipment, (vii) police vehicles, (viii) police equipment, (ix) road improvements, (x) road department vehicles, (xi) road department equipment, (xii) city shop equipment, (xiii) building and grounds equipment,

(xiv) buildings and grounds vehicle, (xv) public buildings, (xvi) blight remediation, (xvii) broadband feasibility study, and (xix) improvements to City Hall for the City of Eatonton?

If re-imposition of the tax is approved by the voters, such vote shall also constitute approval of the issuance of general obligation debt of Putnam County, Georgia in the principal amount of \$5,000,000.00 for the purpose set forth in clause (1) above.

WHEREAS, a copy of the Election Summary Report and Consolidated Returns filed by the Election Superintendent with the office of the Secretary of State and the Commissioner of the Georgia Department of Revenue is attached hereto and made a part hereof as <u>Exhibit A</u>; and

WHEREAS, a majority of the qualified voters of the County voting in the Election voted in favor of the question submitted, which gives approval of the reimposition of a one percent special purpose local option sales tax and the issuance of certain general obligation debt by the County in the principal amount of \$5,000,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND CERTIFIED AS FOLLOWS:

1. To the extent that the Board of Commissioners may be considered as one of the officers ordering the Election under the provisions of Official Code of Georgia Annotated § 36-82-2, or any other provisions of law which may be deemed applicable, the Board of Commissioners does hereby declare the results of the Election to be in favor of the question set forth above which constitutes approval of the imposition of a one percent special purpose local option sales tax in the County and the issuance of general obligation debt of the County in the principal amount of \$5,000,000.

2. The consolidated returns of the Election and this resolution shall be entered upon the minutes of this meeting of the Board of Commissioners.

3. The Election Superintendent has prepared copies of the consolidated returns and certified and filed the same as required by law.

4. The Election Superintendent has complied with all other applicable provisions of the Georgia Election Code.

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UPPER OCONEE REGION

BACKGROUND

The Upper Oconee Regional Water Plan was initially completed in 2011 and subsequently updated in 2017. The plan outlines nearterm and long-term strategies to meet water needs through 2050. Major water resources include portions of the Oconee, Ocmulgee, Ogeechee, Savannah, and Altamaha river basins and includes various groundwater aquifer systems. The Upper Oconee Region encompasses several major population centers including Athens and Dublin.

OVERVIEW OF UPPER OCONEE REGION

The Upper Oconee Region encompasses 13 counties in the central-northeast portion of Georgia. Over the next 35 years, the population of the region is projected to increase from approximately 577,000 to 877,000 residents. The region's leading economic sectors include government, health care, services, manufacturing, retail and construction.

In 2015, the Upper Oconee Region withdrew approximately 166 million gallons per day (MGD) for water supply to meet municipal (44 percent), industrial (37 percent) and agricultural (18 percent) uses. Surface water and groundwater demand in the region are currently evenly split and projected to increase proportionally over the planning horizon.

KEY WATER RESOURCE ISSUES ADDRESSED BY THE COUNCIL

- 1. Efficient use of the water by all sectors, recognizing the diverse characteristics of the Upper Oconee.
- 2. Strategic wastewater management in fast growing counties (Barrow, Jackson, Oconee, and Walton Counties).
- 3. Potential limitations placed on future surface water supplies in existing impoundments.
- 4. Protecting the water quality of Lakes Oconee and Sinclair and the Oconee River by reducing both point and nonpoint source nutrient loads.
- 5. The natural capacity of the water bodies to process pollutants is exceeded in the middle (Morgan and Putnam Counties) and lower (Laurens and Wilkinson Counties) portion of the basin due to zones of low dissolved oxygen.



SUMMARY OF 2017 RESOURCE ASSESSMENT RESULTS

GROUNDWATER: At the regional level, there will be adequate supplies to meet the region's future groundwater supply needs over the planning horizon.

SURFACE WATER QUALITY: Water quality gaps were predicted to occur in Lakes Oconee and Sinclair due to excess nutrients in the future due to a combination of point source and nonpoint source pollutant loads from anticipated wastewater discharges and land use changes.

SURFACE WATER AVAILABILITY: Over the next 35 years, the modeling analysis indicates that forecasted surface water demand within the Upper Oconee Region is projected to cause stream flows in the Ogeechee River (at the Eden planning node) to fall below targets for support of instream uses (resulting in "potential gaps"). A map of the node locations, their drainage areas, and a summary of the potential gaps are provided below.

UPPER OCONEE MANAGEMENT PRACT

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The Upper Oconee Plan describes 25 management practices targeted toward current and future needs. Actions for surface and groundwater are grouped and listed by the water use sectors that will implement them. The Plan also includes practices for resources shared with other regions. Representative practices are summarized here.

WATER CONSERVATION: To

prevent potential shortages in meeting instream flow needs, the Upper Oconee Plan encourages conservation pricing and development of water conservation goals.

WATER SUPPLY: Practices include expansion of existing reservoirs and construction of new water supply reservoirs.

WASTEWATER & WATER

QUALITY: The Upper Oconee Plan calls for implementation of centralized sewer in developing areas where density warrants and development of local wastewater master plans to evaluate wastewater treatment and disposal options to meet future demands. Comprehensive land use planning and local government participation in construction erosion and sediment control are also encouraged.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO STATE:

Focus on incentives, collaboration and cooperation with state and local planning agencies, support plan implementers; fund water planning; focus funding and assistance on areas with shortfalls; continue monitoring to help conserve Georgia's natural, historic, and cultural resources.
