6. Consent Agenda a. Approval of Minutes - October 7, 2022 Regular Meeting (staff-CC) Motion to approve the Consent Agenda. Motion made by Commissioner McElhenney, Seconded by Commissioner Sharp. Voting Yea: Commissioner McElhenney, Commissioner Brown, Commissioner Sharp, Commissioner Wooten

7. Discussion and possible action regarding Senior Tax Relief (BW) Dr. Steve Hersey presented a proposal for property tax relief for seniors 70 years or older to increase the standard homestead exemption from \$10,000 to \$40,000.

Mr. Dale Bills commented that senior tax relief is a welcome idea, but more thought needs to be put into this proposal.

Motion to see what the school board would do, and we would probably go along with them if they decided they wanted to do this because it's affecting them also. Motion made by Commissioner Wooten.

Motion restated to present this to the school board and let them go over it and they come back to us and let us know how they feel about it and however they feel about it we would go along with them.

Motion restated by Commissioner Wooten.

Dr. Hersey advised that he spoke to Dr. Weiner of the school board, and he is against exemption from school taxes for seniors and feels the rest of the school board is of a like mind. He advised that Dr. Weiner is planning to do a public hearing in December on this issue and then have his board make a decision about which way to go. Dr. Hersey commented that a meeting of representatives from the school board and the board of commissioners before December would be a good idea.

Chairman Webster recommended tabling any action until meeting with the school board and seeing what their feelings are. After the meeting of representatives, a report can be given to the BOC for action at that time.

Commissioner Sharp inquired if the City of Eatonton needed to be involved in the discussions too. Dr. Hersey advised that the City does not have a Homestead Exemption on city property taxes.

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Commissioner Wooten added to his motion that if the school board and the Board of Commissioners can come to some kind of agreement, that it will not have to come back to the BOC for an ok, because whatever they are good with is okay.

Chairman Webster restated the motion for clarification: Motion to move forward with the resolution presented by Dr. Hersey contingent upon the school board also agreeing to the conditions that have been outlined. This was okay with Commissioner Wooten. Motion made by Commissioner Wooten, Seconded by Commissioner Brown. Voting Yea: Commissioner Wooten Voting Nay: Commissioner McElhenney, Commissioner Brown, Commissioner Sharp

Reports/Announcements

10. County Manager Report

County Manager Van Haute reported the following:

• Update on landfill status: the county has been working with EPD over the last nine months and have done various remediation at the landfill from minor to medium and now we are going to be at major renovations at the landfill site; we have received bids in excess of \$1.2M to redo the entire landfill cap; the products inside the landfill are a living micro organism and as the cap grows and shrinks there are breaks and the slope doesn't keep water running off anymore so water sits on top and disintegrates the clay cap; this will be on the next meeting agenda.

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• Asked Fire Chief McClain to come up and explain a situation that needs resolving before November 1st. Chief McClain explained that his 2023 budget includes funds for a replacement engine which we would plan to receive in 2025; when budgeted lead times were 24-27 months; today lead times are 32-38 months; the manufacturer has a price increase that takes effect on November 1st of 6.5%; the truck he would like to purchase to receive in 2025 is the same that he purchased to receive in 2023 which cost \$701,500; the same truck now comes in at \$744K and if we pay for it when we order it like we have done in the past we get a \$39K prepay discount which brings the price down to \$705K which is only a \$3500 increase over the same truck last year, but we have to get the PO to them before November 1st and that is why he's coming today a little early to ask for that money a little sooner in the budget year than anticipated; will be using SPLOST 9 funds for this project.

Chairman Webster inquired of the board if it is ok for the county manager to authorize the purchase of this vehicle and have the board ratify this at the next meeting. There were no objections.

• We are seeing trash pile up at all the convenience centers, most notably Dennis Station, Wards Chapel and Flatrock; this is also impeding the public works team from adding several cans in the ground at Flatrock; meeting with Waste Management area manager here on Thursday to get issues resolved; trash budget increased about \$600K last year and centers look as terrible as they ever have.

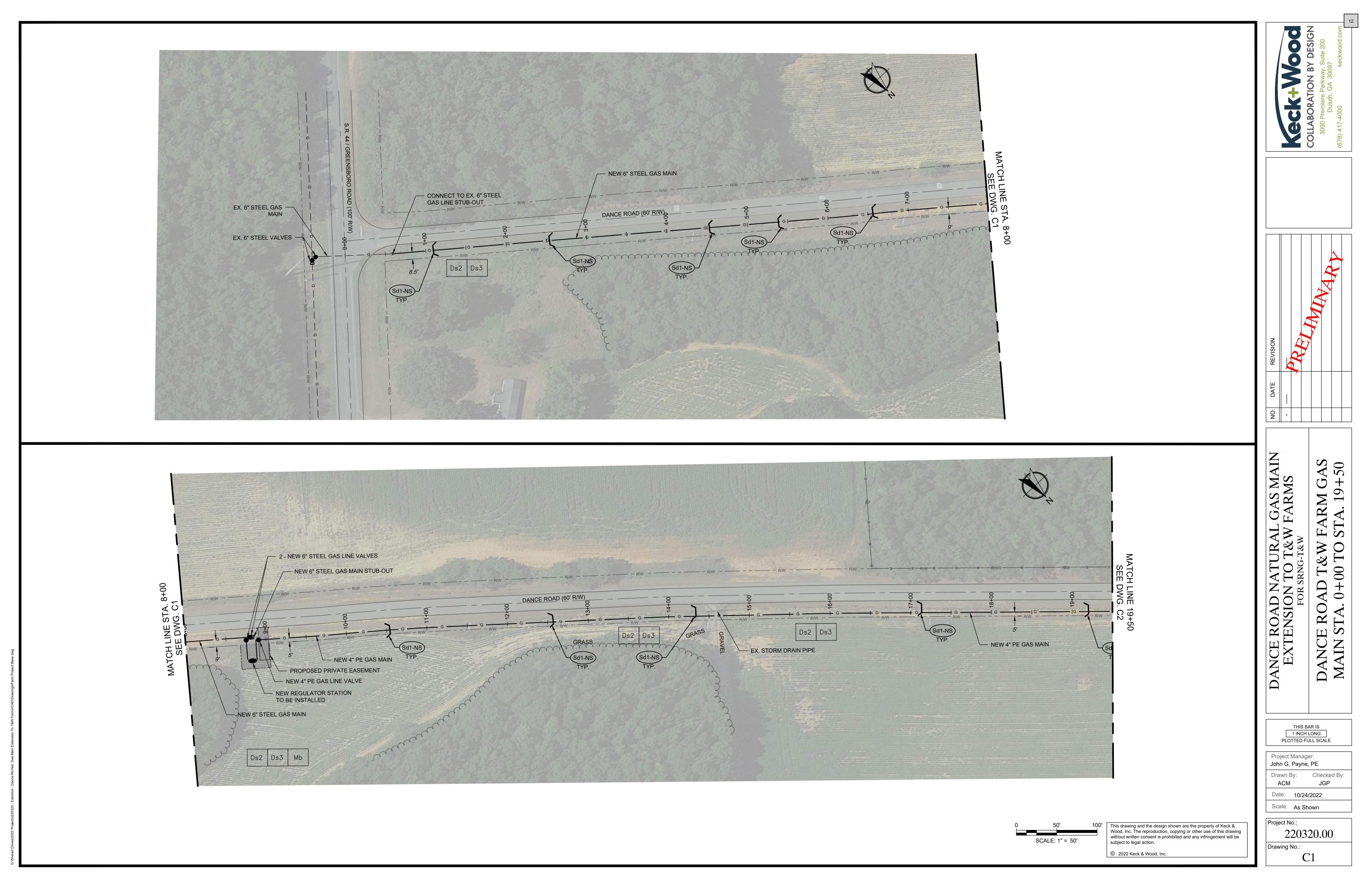

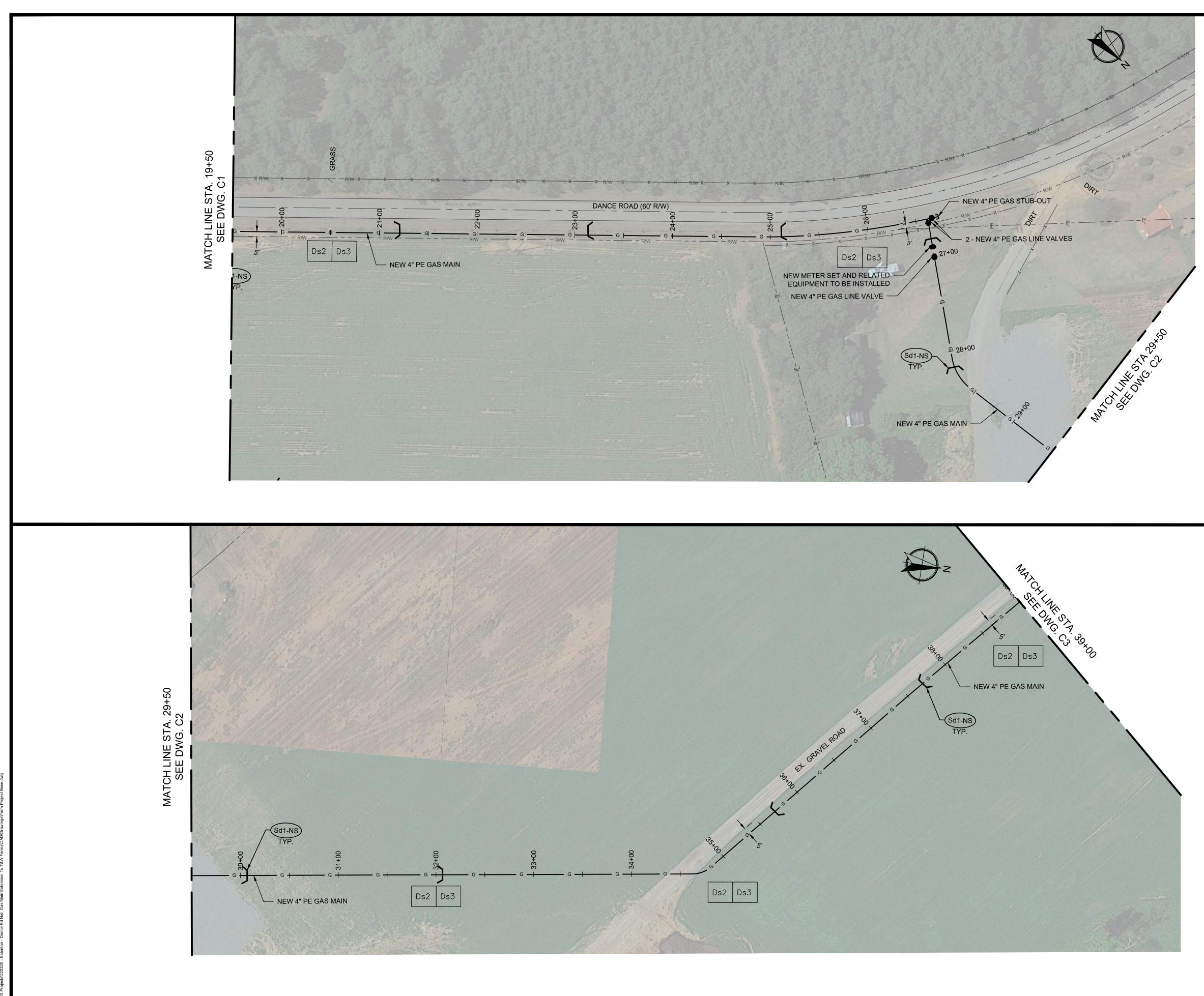

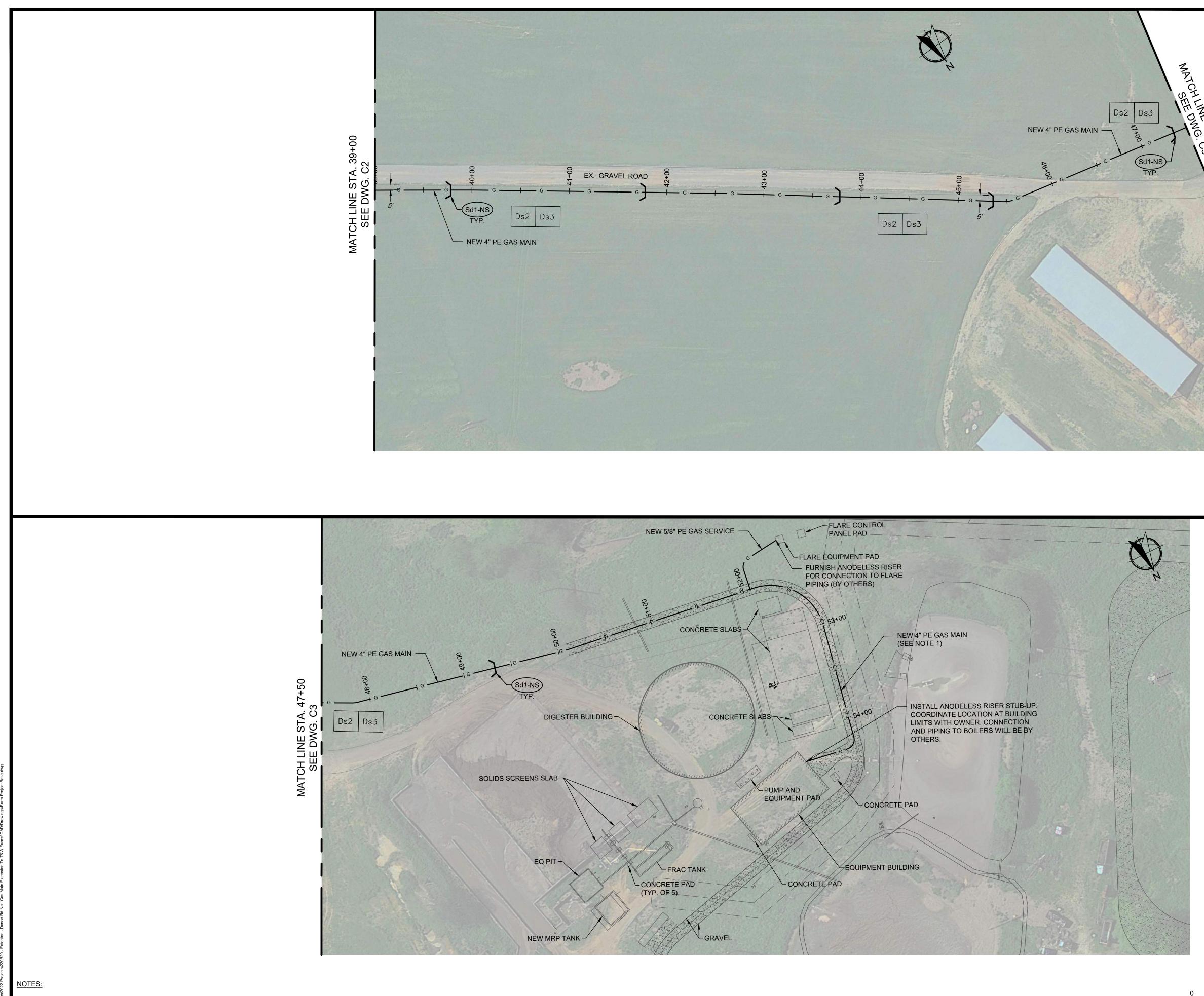
