18. County Manager Report

County Manager Van Haute reported the following:

- Employees of the Public Works Department were present and recognized. The Board of Commissioners recently received a letter from a citizen commending them, which is well earned and deserved. Recent work includes helping DOT remove a tree early one morning and clearing trees over the holidays in cold weather and high winds. He thanked them for what they do.
- The Planning and Development Department has been getting busier:

for John T. Mitchell. Commissioner Wooten voted for John T. Mitchell.

- o In 2020, 2000 total permits were issued; in 2022, 2400 total permits were issued
- In 2020, 200 site built home permits were issued; in 2022 there were 290
- In 2020, 14 commercial building permits were issued; in 2022 there were 31
- In 2020, revenue was 450K; in 2022 it was 778K
- Ambulance calls have experienced a 10% growth. We are almost at enough volume to support another ambulance, which would need 18 fulltime people to staff it.

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January 6, 2023		

- Fire Chief McClain commented on some stats for the Fire Department
 - In 2020 they answered 1839 calls; in 2022 they answered 2097; a 12% increase
 - In addition to answering calls, his staff also works with Planning and Development in plan reviews and does short term rental certificate and alcohol license inspections, just to name a couple. He thanked the board for their support
- DOT information regarding Highway 44 was received this week
- Bridge reports from DOT were also received
- DOT LMIG (local maintenance improvement grant) request is due soon. This will be added to the next agenda to decide on a project one suggestion is to redo Sammons Parkway because the concrete supply chain issue is better now.

PUTNAM COUNTY

AGREEMENT AS TO TERMS OF CONTRACT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into on this 1st day of January, 2023, by and between PUTNAM COUNTY, GEORGIA, by and through its Board of Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as the "County"), and PAUL VAN HAUTE (hereinafter referred to as "Van Haute").

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of O.C.G.A. §35-5-22, the position of County Manager was created by "Resolution Enacting County Manager Position" dated February 21, 2003 (hereinafter referred to as the "Resolution"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Putnam County, (hereinafter referred to as the "Board"), has appointed Paul Van Haute as County Manager and Paul Van Haute desires to accept such appointment according to the terms set forth herein;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions acceptable to each party, the parties do agree as follows:

1.

The County agrees to re-appoint Van Haute by and through the Board and Van Haute agrees to accept such appointment in the capacity as County Manager to serve at the pleasure of the Board as that position is defined in the Resolution dated February 21, 2003. The term of this Agreement shall begin on January 1, 2023 and shall continue for four (4) years, ending on December 31, 2027.

2.

Either party may terminate Van Haute's appointment at any time after execution of this Agreement by written notice to the remaining party to this Agreement. When employment termination is initiated by Van Haute, a sixty (60) day notice shall be provided to the Board by the same. In the event of such termination by the County, the County shall compensate Van Haute six (6) months of severance pay at a rate equal to Van Haute's base salary as of the date of notice, plus an amount equal to six (6) months of the cost of health coverage in effect for Van Haute as of the date of notice with said severance period commencing immediately following the County's written notification to Van Haute.

In the event of termination at the election of Van Haute, the County shall pay to Van Haute his gross annual compensation, pro-rated through the date of his termination, which has not already been paid to Van Haute, including the monetary value of his accrued benefits as of the date of termination and Van Haute shall receive no further amount of severance or benefits.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event the County terminates Van Haute as the result of any act or acts by Van Haute, whether or not in the performance of his official duties, which result in Van Haute being sentenced for any felony or misdemeanor offense involving moral turpitude, Van Haute shall receive no severance or benefits upon termination with the exception of the payment of his salary through the date of termination. Van Haute may be suspended, with pay or without, by the County, in its discretion during the pendency of any such criminal investigation or trial and shall be considered employed regarding his pension.

3.

All notices required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be given by hand delivery, certified mail, return receipt requested, or overnight mail effective upon the date of delivery or on the date of mailing, to the parties at the following addresses, or to such other addresses as either may designate in writing to the other:

If to the County:

Chairman, Board of Commissioners Putnam County Board of Commissioners 117 Putnam Drive Eatonton, Georgia 31024

If to Paul Van Haute:

Mr. Paul Van Haute County Manager Putnam County Board of Commissioners 117 Putnam Drive Eatonton, Georgia 31024

4.

Van Haute shall perform such duties and responsibilities as outlined in the Resolution, as may from time to time be amended, as well as perform such other duties as may be required of him by the Board.

5.

Van Haute shall receive approval by the Board before engaging in non-employer connected business activities.

The County Manager is an exempt employee who is expected to engage in those hours of work which are necessary to fulfill the obligations of his position of employment. The position of County Manager does not have pre-established hours inasmuch as he/she is expected to be available at all times.

7.

Van Haute shall at all times discharge his duties in consultation with the Board, keeping them informed of his actions and decisions within the scope of his authority. He shall be responsible to the Board for the proper and efficient administration of all affairs of the County, except as may otherwise be provided by law.

8.

Effective January 1, 2023, the County shall increase Van Haute's annual salary eight percent (8%) from the last year term of the immediate prior Agreement between the parties, subject to withholding for appropriate items such as Federal and State Income Tax and FICA.

In addition to the annual base salary, the County shall pay \$10,806.76 to the County Manager as additional compensation for his services, which shall be deposited into the deferred compensation plan available through the County. Further, the County Manager may, at his election, convert excess accrued annual leave and sick leave, not to exceed 200 hours per calendar year, into the deferred compensation plan at the rate equal to his hourly rate derived from the then annual salary as determined by a 40-hour work week. Subject to any limitation within any other contractual obligations of the County, the County Manager may receive all deferred compensation earnings post-employment with the County and a request to receive said funds shall be initiated by the County Manager or his estate. Except as provided in paragraph 2 herein, the sum of the annual base salary and the deferred compensation is referred to in this Agreement as "gross annual compensation."

At each employment anniversary, Van Haute shall receive this deferred compensation, which may be paid in one lump sum. If termination occurs by the County within six (6) months of the initial date of employment, the deferred compensation will not be provided to the County Manager. If termination occurs by the County six (6) months after employment, the County Manager shall receive the deferred compensation plan on an annual prorated basis.

The annual compensation shall be paid in equal installments at such frequency as other County employees are normally paid.

9.

In addition to all other compensation herein provided, the County Manager's duties require that he shall have the exclusive use of an automobile provided to him by the County. The County leased automobile may be used for personal use inside the geographic area of Putnam County. The County shall be responsible for paying the operation, maintenance, repair, and regular replacement of said vehicle. Such vehicle shall be delivered to him as soon as possible after the effective date of his appointment. The County shall, to the extent permitted by Georgia law, indemnify Van Haute for any loss as a result of any claim for damages against him resulting from his use of said County vehicle; provided, however, notwithstanding any other indemnity contained in this Agreement, no indemnity shall apply to or cover the intentional or willful tort or willful and wanton negligence of Van Haute while operating said vehicle or any act committed while operating said vehicle under the influence of alcohol, controlled substances or dangerous drugs (other than those for which a valid prescription exists), each of said terms as defined by Georgia Law.

10.

In addition to any other compensation provided herein, the County shall budget, pay, and provide to Van Haute:

- A. Any and all benefits which are provided to full-time County employees as a whole.
- B. Such sick leave as may be provided to full-time County employees as a whole.
- C. Five (5) weeks of annual leave shall be provided and annual leave shall accrue on a monthly basis.
- D. Coverage under a professional liability insurance policy in amounts not less than provided to each of the Board of Commissioners indemnifying the County Manager against loss resulting from action taken by him in the course of his employment.
- E. Term life insurance coverage as provided to full-time County employees as a whole.
- F. Health insurance coverage as provided to full-time County employees as a whole.
- G. Professional dues and subscriptions of the County Manager for full participation in organizations necessary and desirable for continued professional growth and for the good of the County as approved by the Board.
- H. Travel, subsistence, and related expenses for Van Haute associated with official travel, meetings, short courses, seminars, and conferences adequate to continue the professional development of Van Haute and/or to pursue necessary official functions for the County provided Van Haute provides written proof of such expenditures and such expenditures are within the budget adopted for such expenses in any given fiscal year of the County. Expenditures to be reviewed and approved monthly by the Board.

If the County Manager dies prior to the termination of this Agreement, this Agreement shall then terminate, and the County shall pay to County Manager's estate as soon as possible all salary or expense reimbursement accrued, including any deferred compensation through the date of his death. The County shall not be under any obligation to pay any other amounts of any kind to his estate or heirs.

12.

The vehicle supplied by the County and all records and files of the County Manager shall be the property of Putnam County and shall remain such property during the course of this Agreement and upon termination.

13.

Except as limited in Item 2, the County, subject to the provisions of Georgia law, shall defend, save harmless, and indemnify Van Haute against any tort, professional liability claim or demand or any other legal action, whether groundless or otherwise, arising out of an alleged act or omission occurring in the lawful performance of his duties. The County shall pay the amount of any settlement or judgment rendered thereon.

14.

This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties.
