2018-2019 FUNDING REQUEST

PROJECT OVERVIEW

This Project is part of a comprehensive effort by the Putnam Development Authority (PDA) (which will be accountable for the funds), to improve the entrance signs to Putnam County for visitors and tourists. Three signs already have been installed; one on GA Highway 44 near the Putnam/Greene Causeway Bridge, another approximately 3.1 miles north of Eatonton on U.S. Highway 441N, and another approximately 11.3 miles south of Eatonton on U.S. Highway 441S.

This application is requesting \$5,050 to cover half of the \$10,100 cost to manufacture and install an additional sign on U.S. Highway 129 approximately 9.6 miles south of Eatonton. This sign, the same as those referred to above, will be manufactured and installed by Oconee Custom Signs (819 Harmony Road, Eatonton, GA 31024).

Putnam County is undergoing a resurgence of its economic development efforts following the recession which began in late 2008. The closure of Georgia Power's Plant Harlee Branch and the demise of Horton Homes had also adversely affected the community and have had a significant negative impact on unemployment rates and the tax revenues in Putnam County. To offset the negative aspects of the recession and to increase Putnam County's appeal as a tourist and visitor destination, major efforts are being made by the County and City governments, the Putnam Development Authority, the Chamber of Commerce, the Eatonton-Putnam Tourism Arts Heritage Partnership (EPTAHP), and other organizations.

It became evident that the existing "announcement" of a tourist or visitor's entrance to Putnam County along the major highways was neither attractive, eye-catching, nor imaginative. To greatly enhance the importance and clarity of such signage, an effort was begun by the PDA, with the assistance of the EPTAHP, to create a completely new entrance sign, using the trademarked phrase "Welcome to the Briar Patch".

As indicated in the first paragraph, three signs have been manufactured and installed. We are now ready to initiate the manufacture and installation of an additional sign on U.S. Highway 129S. Those involved in this project were previously involved in the three prior signage projects (on Highways 441N, 441S and 44).

This project will fit into the overall tourism development plan for Putnam County as previously reviewed with representatives of the TPD Resource Team and reflected in the recommendations.
