RESOLUTION NO. C2022-011

RATIFYING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S APPROVAL OF A CONTRACT FOR EMERGENCY ELECTRICAL REPAIRS AT CRC

WHEREAS, on April 11, 2022, a complete failure of the 480-volt electrical panel occurred, interrupting power to the facility; and

WHEREAS, Peninsula Light was called and responded promptly, separating all power feeds to the building; and

WHEREAS, subsequent investigations identified the source of the damage to have originated within the building, leading to staff immediately obtaining contract services to make repairs in efforts to restore power and security surveillance to the building; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Purchasing Policy P40-102 Section 7.1, staff utilized the emergency purchase process to hire a qualified electrician to make repairs; and

WHEREAS, Purchasing Policy P40-102 Section 7.1 authorizes the Executive Director or her designee, to award public works projects under \$15,000 provided that the PenMet Parks Board of Park Commissioners shall ratify the Executive Director's approval at the next scheduled PenMet Parks Board of Park Commissioners' meeting by means of the consent agenda; and

WHEREAS, the District's attorney has reviewed the contract; NOW THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, by the Board of Park Commissioners that the Executive Director's award of the public works contract for Emergency Repairs for the CRC Electrical Panel with Boone Electric for an amount not to exceed \$10,000, which does not include Washington State sales tax, is hereby ratified.
