On January 26<sup>th</sup>, we did receive a letter of Permission to Extension the US Army Corps of Engineers Permit to construct these breakwater repairs by December 31, 2029.

I copied the Port Commission members on an email I sent on Saturday February 17<sup>th</sup> in which I copied Michael Cloud's office to see if they can help track down the status of this federal review of the project plans.

From: Mott McDonald:

I wanted to reach out to inform you that our subcontractor, Gray and Pape, is gearing up for the cultural resources data collection effort and is planning to mobilize the project site the week of February 26<sup>th</sup>. Amanda Evans will be on site and the point of contact for this work. I will follow up with you if anything changes with the schedule. As always, you can reach out to Josh Carter or me if you have any questions regarding this.

We are trying to schedule a meeting with TCEQ, Kim Griffith and myself for next week to look at the next steps with this grant. To clarify, we do have the executed contract for this grant and are working to recap all conversations and decisions made to date to make sure we are all on solid footing with the grant requirements before moving forward with writing the Scope of Work document.

  - ➤ The following is a memo from Interim City Manager Weaver:

As previously reported, we have applied to use funds from our CDBG-MIT - Round 2 allocation to fund this project. There is no new information to report. We hope to hear back from GLO regarding our application in March. If awarded, the engineer for this project will be Urban Engineering.

#### b) Status report regarding GLO CEPRA Grant - Presenter Jody Weaver

➤ The following is a memo from Interim City Manager Weaver:

Received from Joshua Carter of Mott McDonald on February 5<sup>th</sup>: I was able to talk with Kevin Frenzel (GLO) and Abigail Richardson (GLO) this morning. We came to an understanding that we will have <u>GLO remain as the lead</u> if that works best for you. I still need to have a brief follow up with Kevin and Abigail and then I believe Abigail will reach out to you to reconfirm. If its ok, I'll work to get this finalized out with GLO early tomorrow and then Abigail will be back in touch.

I did speak with Abigal Richardson and confirmed that GLO has worked out an agreement with Mott McDonald so that GLO can remain the lead for these CEPRA grant projects and I agreed that is what we wanted. I am waiting for more details from GLO regarding the engineering contract and our payment of our committed matching funds of \$275,000 (\$200,000 of which are coming from a MBMT fund grant).

# c) MBMT Grant Project Downtown Waterfront Public Access Improvement - Presenter Jody Weaver

➤ The following is a memo from Interim City Manager Weaver:

At the Council meeting on February 12, Council approved the contract with the Matagorda Bay Mitigation Trust for \$400,000 toward the proposed Downtown Waterfront Public Access Improvement Project with an estimated total cost of \$700,000. Half of the match funds will come from the General Fund and the other half from the Ports & Harbors fund.

At this same meeting Council approved Urban Engineering Task Order No. 36 in the fixed fee amount of \$75,000 for the engineering design, surveying, permitting, bidding, and contract administration. The first \$50,000 of this will be paid for with MBMT trust dollars.

This project was discussed at a recent Green Infrastructure Workshop hosted by the City of Port Lavaca and presented by GLO Clean Coast Texas, and we are making plans to apply for Clean Coast Texas grant funding to go towards the \$100,000 budget in this project for Green Infrastructure drainage elements for the parking lot improvements.

  - ➤ The following is a memo from Interim City Manager Weaver:

The current rate schedule provides for only a monthly rent for commercial Fishing Vessels. This is because normally we do not have any boat slips available for rent besides those 2 slips next to Big Bear, which are on a monthly rate, but because Tract 9 is not currently leased, recently we had many boats come and go along the dock of Tract 9 for periods of days or weeks. Let's discuss how we want to address this for any future similar occurrence.

The question was brought up about whether we should be collecting tariffs for materials brought in by truck at the Harbor of Refuge. Our current Standard Form Lease states:

"Section 5.02. Cargo Dockage Charges. In addition to such Land Rent, Tenant shall pay all dockage charges for Tenant's use applicable under City's Tariffs as those charges accrue. Said charges are due on the first of each month and shall be assessed a late fee if paid after the 10th day of the month."

A close look at the language of the older version of the lease entered into with Helena in 2018, clarifies that the per ton of BULK materials tariff is for "material that crosses the dock".

I recommend we consider adding a specific fee for a "Bulk product liquid or dry per ton carried by rail" for clarification and to reflect what has historically been paid by Helena, being the same bulk rate whether it came by barge or rail.

Regarding materials brought by truck, we can discuss this during the meeting on Tuesday. Note: Helena is still paying the \$1,000/month use of rail fee, which is intended to pay toward maintaining the rail.

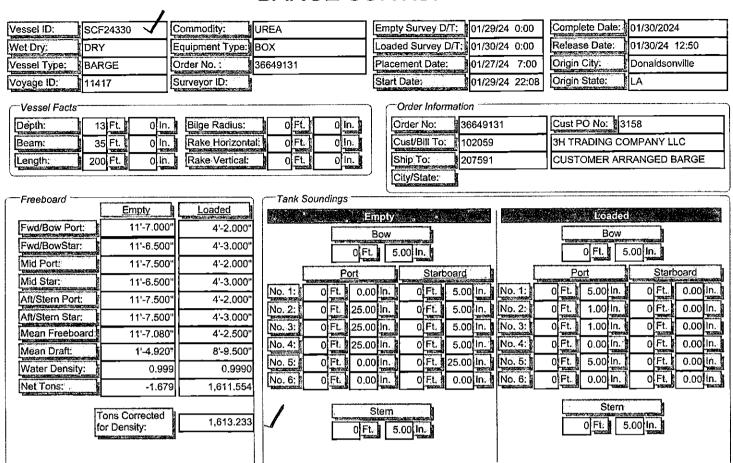

Below is the latest communication from Texas Parks and Wildlife regarding the back and forth review by the US Fish & Wildlife Service of the NMFS Endangered Species Act Section 7 requirements for the reconstruction of the breakwater in Nautical Landings. For further background, attached is the email string covering November 16, 2023 -January 8, 2024.

Julie is our newest contact with TPWL on this grant (our third). She has sent the latest of our responses back to USFWS. I spoke with her this morning and she says that she will contact USFWS weekly for an update until we receive approval or MORE comments that we must address. The USFWS is out of Albuquerque, NM. Julie tells me that the reviewer is relatively new in this job, but has been pretty responsive to her. He is responsible for reviews of projects in 4 states.

So once FWS state it is good for complete review, then Julie will have to send it through the TPWD biologists for review, once they sign off on it, it then gets sent back to FWS for final signatures. So we're still looking at some time.

Julie is going to keep me updated weekly. If we do not get any response within the next 2 weeks, I will reach out again to Mark Longoria to see if Congressman Cloud's office could provide a nudge to USFWS. As you recall it was USFWS that we waited a year for approval on the reconstruction of the Lighthouse Beach Fishing Pier. We've already had several back and forth reviews, so TWPL thinks we should be very near final approval.

I recognize that there are some that believe the fault of this delay rests at my feet. I have worked with Federal and State grants for over 40 years. Grants are great, but they do take time and any project, regardless of funding, that requires Army Corps of Engineers and/or USWFW approval I have found can take years.

I will do my best to keep you informed.

I've reviewed the attached docs. My comments for each follow...

- 1. Carl Park: In the first sentence of Section VII Determination of Effects, Matt mentions that there is habitat for the sea turtles in the first sentence but then goes on to say that there is no effect. If there is habitat for one or more sea turtle species then we can't go with a no effect call. See the attached PDF of example language to address each species in order to get to "no effect" which I think should be doable for this project.
- 2. East Bay: Suggest looking at the attached doc to discuss the sea turtle species. Also suggest modifying this sentence in Section VII: "The determination of "no effect" is proposed for the leatherback sea turtle due to the lack of preferred habitat being located far from at the project site."
- 3. Nautical Landing: Same suggestions as in #2 for East Bay.

I apologize for the delay. I checked with FWS, and the below is there questions. We are getting so close to getting the final approval. Please send me the updates and I will submit them to FWS.

- 1) How will the pilings be driven and what is their diameter. If you don't have this info at this time, let me know that too.
- 2) Determination of Effects:
  - a. Why is the manatee unlikely to be found with the project site?
  - b. I would agree that some sea turtles may be affected by the project, so a may affect, not likely to adversely affect call may be warranted, but that call may not be necessary for each turtle species. Again, a discussion for each turtle regarding it's habitat preferences like you did for each of the other species is needed to determine what call to make for each. If we do end up with a may affect not likely call we will have to get concurrence from NOAA.
  - c. In section B. the BMPs provided are good for the FWS species, but NOAA Fisheries' BMPs for sea turtles may also be needed, depending on the diameter of the pilings and how they are driven.

Seek feedback from USACE regarding permitting strategy, project design, and implementation.

Andi Binion delivers PowerPoint presentation to meeting attendees to provide project background information, project need, purpose, preliminary design, and minimization and mitigation measures.

### **USACE Feedback:**

- Standard individual permit (IP) recommended.
- USACE Sect. 408 coordination may be necessary due to proximity and adjacency to the existing channel. States if 408 review is required, timelines can be extensive and cause project delays.
  - Triton to reach out to USACE 408 prior to Joint Evaluation Meeting (JEM) to initiate coordination.
- States National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) will likely have feedback regarding potential impacts to Essential Fish Habitat (EFH), threatened and endangered species, and project design recommendations.
  - o States she anticipates Endangered Species Act formal consultation request from NMFS.
    - Currently, a lengthy process. She has several projects which have been in NMFS consultation for an extended period.
  - Will likely suggest scour protection and/or gaps at specified intervals for fish passage.
    - Josh (Mott) expressed concern in a design with gaps and requested feedback on how to balance the fish gap request and primary project purpose. Primary project purpose is shoreline and infrastructure protection. If gaps are constructed, will not provide maximum protection and may not serve intended function in inclement weather and surge type events.
    - Cecilia recommended it be discussed during the JEM.
- Suggest adding notes and description regarding construction methods and processes would be useful.
  - o Examples: barge vessel depths (if known), BMPs to be implemented, etc.
- Presently, IP is typically issued 1-year after Public Notice, states will be important to confirm funding timelines to ensure project hits those timelines.
- Requested additional information be provided on the plans regarding marsh creation islands and borrow areas.
  - o Detailed methods of how materials will be transported including routes, BMPs, etc.

• States the pre-application submittal documents were thoughtful and well prepared. While will likely solicit regulatory feedback, the project is well designed and overall a great project.

## **Project Need**

- -In its current state, the project area shoreline is comprised of a mix of exposed shoreline unprotected from wind and wave energy and armored shoreline (i.e., bulkhead).
- -Historically, the exposed shoreline has retreated from natural erosive forces (i.e., wind, tidal currents), marine traffic and remains susceptible to further damage from these forces.
- -These forces are reducing available marsh and aquatic habitat used by wildlife and marine species, increasing land loss for the City of Port Lavaca, and reducing ecological and recreational values of the area.
- -The proposed project has been designed to protect and refortify the existing shoreline.



## **Project Purpose & Description**

- Provide offshore protection to project area shoreline;
- II. Reduce onshore wave energy;
- III. Increase sediment stabilization;
- IV. Establish and improve aquatic habitat conditions for oyster propagation; and
- V. Create and improve conditions for the establishment of coastal marsh vegetation.

The following improvements are proposed: one rock breakwater, one artificial (mitigation) reef breakwater, and two marsh creation islands along approx. 0.70 miles of shoreline waterward of Port Lavaca, Texas.

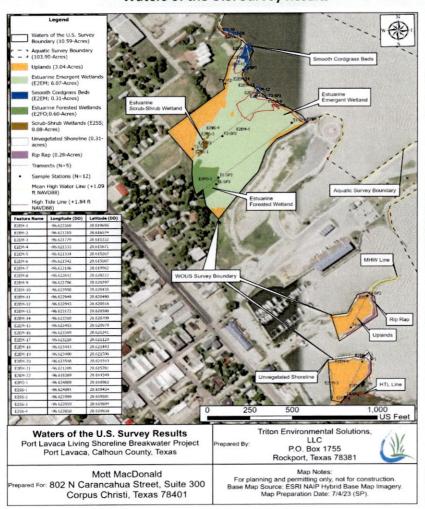
The project will utilize stone, artificial oyster reef units, beneficial use dredged material, and native vegetation plantings in the construction of two breakwaters and two marsh habitat islands seaward of Bayfront Peninsula Park.



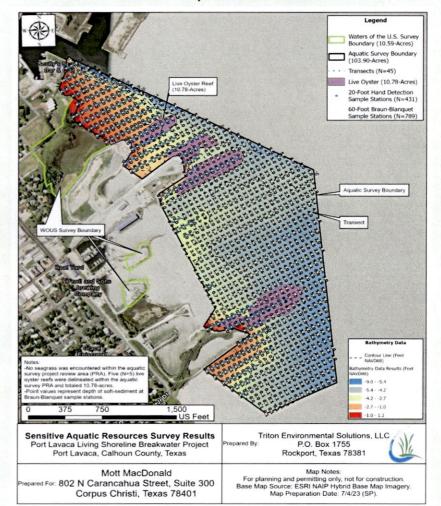


# **Natural Resource Survey Results**

## Anticipated Impacts to Jurisdictional Areas

- -There will be a total of 7.70-acres of permanent fill-related impacts waterward of the High Tide Line (HTL) within jurisdictional waters of the U.S.
- -Suitable fill material to construct the marsh creation islands will be sourced from nearby borrow areas containing historically placed dredged material (BUDM), sourced from nearby borrow areas.

Rock Breakwater	Stone (33,500 CY)	3.51
Reef Breakwater	Artificial Oyster Reef Units (4,000 CY)	0.63
Marsh Creation Islands (N=2)	BUDM (10,000 CY)	3.56

-Additionally, 3.01-acres of temporary impacts associated with creation of a temporary access corridor for construction of project features. Total temporary fill volumes are approximately 6,300 cy of BUDM.



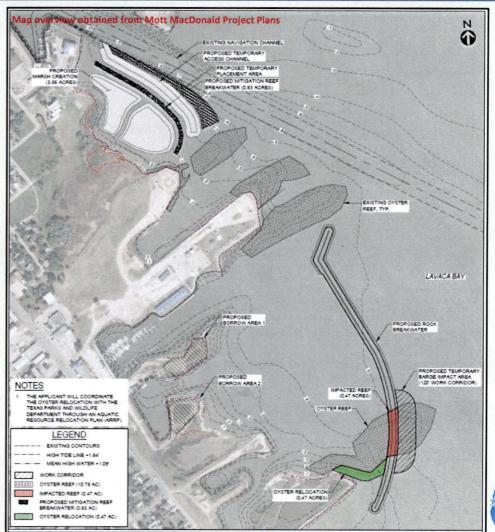
## **Avoidance and Minimization Measures**

-The proposed project has been designed to avoid impacts to jurisdictional areas and special aquatic sites (SAS) to the maximum extent practicable while still attaining the primary project purpose.

-In the southern portion of the project area, 0.47-acres of oyster reef will be relocated to the southern edge of the impacted reef. This effort will be coordinated w/TPWD through an ARRP.

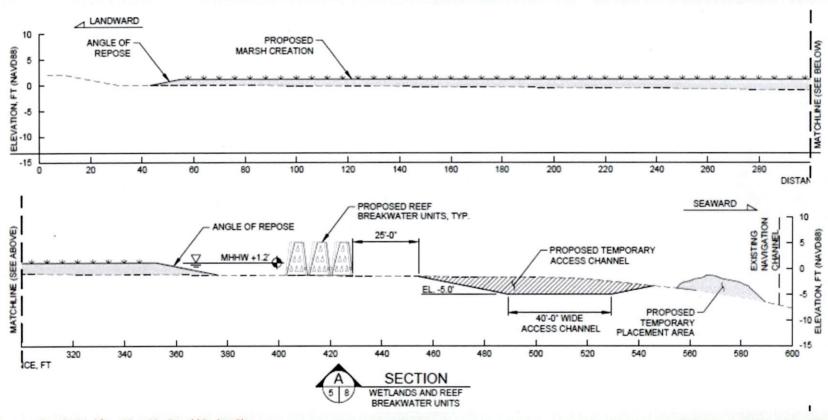
-In the northern portion of the project area, 0.62acres of oyster reef habitat will be created through the construction of the artificial reef breakwater.

-Finally, in the northern portion of the project area, two marsh creation islands will be constructed, totaling 3.56-acres. Each island will be contoured and planted with native vegetation for the creation of marsh habitat.

## **Avoidance and Minimization Measures**

- -Conservation measures and best management practices (BMPs) will be implemented to minimize impacts water quality and adjacent special aquatic sites.
- -Conservation measures include reasonable and practical measures that have largely been incorporated by USACE regulatory throughout the project area and greater region. Further, NOAA's Southeast Regional Office (SERO) Protected Species Construction Conditions and Vessel Strike Avoidance Measures (NOAA 2021b) will be strictly adhered.
- -Other BMPs such as silt curtains, matting, and silt fencing will be utilized during construction activities (as applicable).
- -On-site contractors will transit from borrow areas to the marsh creation islands using existing street access or preapproved temporary vehicle access routes.

### GLO CEPRA GRANTS (HARBOR OF REFUGE SHORELINE PROTECTION)

<u>Attached</u> are copies of the draft workplan received from the GLO for the Harbor of Refuge project. These will be used to write up the CEPRA Project Cooperation Agreement (CPCA). Joshua Carter, the project engineer, has submitted a Scope of Work to GLO and they are reviewing that.

Abigail Richardson is the CEPRA Project Manager for the GLO for this project. She tells me that the project is progressing. Recall this is an engineering project at this point — not construction yet. We will be applying for construction dollars under a future year's grant cycle.

It is my understanding that once the CPCA is executed, then we will submit our \$275,000 match payment (\$200,000 from MBMT fund grant and \$75,000 from General Fund reserves).

### Port Lavaca Harbor of Refuge Phase 1 CEPRA PROJECT No. 1783 WORK PLAN

- 1. To address the data collection, survey, analysis, preliminary design, sand source investigation, permitting and administration for the Port Lavaca Harbor of Refuge Phase 1 project, the GLO shall act as lead partner and fulfill the following tasks:
  - a. Expend from the CEPRA account Cycle 13 funds in the amount of \$412,800 to the project budget. This satisfies the CEPRA match requirement for shoreline protection.
  - b. Manage the project and identify, document, and confer with the Qualified Project Partner (the City of Port Lavaca) regarding the scope of work.
  - c. Contract with a Professional Services Provider (PSP) to:
    - i. Document existing conditions.
    - ii. Review and summarize historical data and engineering studies.
    - iii. Collect data as required to evaluate project feasibility and alternatives for shoreline protection and island restoration, including (but not limited to) topographic, bathymetric, hydrodynamic, and geotechnical survey data.
    - iv. Conduct a sand source investigation related to the identified alternative as necessary.
    - v. Provide to the GLO and the City of Port Lavaca an Alternatives Analysis and Feasibility Study Report.
    - vi. Provide 30% design and Opinion or Probable Construction Cost (OPCC)
    - vii. Conduct the appropriate level of public outreach as necessary.
    - viii. Cooperate with the City of Port Lavaca and USACE (as needed) to obtain access agreements and authorization for all work required by the scope of the project
    - ix. Aid in completing any required permits, including USACE Section 10/404 permit application.
  - d. Serve as the point of contact for communication and coordination with the PSP and any other GLO contracted entities
  - e. Communicate with QPP on project status and confer with QPP relevant decision points during the project
  - f. Serve as the source for all media advisories, inquiries, and press releases regarding the project
  - g. Provide financial point of contact
  - h. Comply with all federal, state, and local regulations, where applicable.
- 2. To address the Port Lavaca Harbor of Refuge Shoreline and Marsh Restoration/Protection Feasibility Study, the Qualified Project Partner (QPP) shall fulfill the following tasks:
  - a. Provide reimbursement to the GLO in the amount of \$275,200 a minimum of 40% of total project costs.
  - b. Confer with the GLO on the location, extent of the project area, scope of work and goals of the project.
  - c. Confer and cooperate with the GLO on the selection of the Professional Services Provider (PSP) and Scope of Work (SOW).
  - d. Assist GLO with the collection of information and obtaining/documenting local support as necessary to complete the project.
  - e. Provide cooperative review and approval of all products provided by GLO's contracted PSP as necessary or required.
  - f. Participating in project meetings with GLO.

- g. Cooperate with the PSP and the City of Port Lavaca to obtain property access agreements for all work required by the scope of the project.
- h. Coordinate with the City of Port Lavaca and cooperate with the PSP as necessary in the application of easements and necessary permits, including a USACE Section 10/404 permit and any other authorizations required by state, federal or local law to implement the project.
- i. Coordinate with the City of Port Lavaca and support its authority to hold and maintain all permits required to authorize the work necessary for the project and ensure compliance with all general and special conditions contained therein.

At the Council meeting on February 12, Council approved the contract with the Matagorda Bay Mitigation Trust for \$400,000 toward the proposed Downtown Waterfront Public Access Improvement Project with an estimated total cost of \$700,000. Half of the match funds will come from the General Fund and the other half from the Ports & Harbors fund.

At this same meeting Council approved Urban Engineering Task Order No. 36 in the fixed fee amount of \$75,000 for the engineering design, surveying, permitting, bidding and contract administration. The first \$50,000 of this will be paid for with MBMT trust dollars.

This project was discussed at a recent Green Infrastructure Workshop hosted by the City of Port Lavaca and presented by GLO Clean Coast Texas and we are making plans to apply for Clean Coast Texas grant funding to go towards the \$100,000 budget in this project for Green Infrastructure drainage elements for the parking lot improvements.
