Motion was made by Council Member Updike and seconded by Council Member Deichman to approve Resolution 22-R-24. Andrew Nelson provided an overview of the Resolution. The vote was 7 Aye-Franklin, Gerke, Grooms, Mitchell, Pool, Updike, and Wilson. O Nay. Motion Carried.

Reports from Staff

City Administrator David Cameron apologized to staff for throwing the curveball on the procedural change on the second read. Mr. Cameron added this is something that isn't uncommon but he wanted to help facilitate this development and not plug up the agenda next time. Mr. Cameron thanked staff for the ever evolving agenda as we had multiple items added and removed. He added he appreciates the flexibility of Council and hopes to evaluate this in the future regarding first and second reads. Mr. Cameron shared his appreciation for the work that goes into these meetings.

City Administrator David Cameron spoke about street cuts, which is a pet peeve for him. Mr. Cameron added he is thankful to see the fee change added to ensure these are fixed appropriately. He added it is



difficult to overlay a street and see a poorly filled patch, but we need them back to a standard. Mr. Cameron thanked staff for looking out for that and the citizens.

City Administrator David Cameron referenced Resolution 22-R-23 as it reflects our "R"-Regional value. This project will add value to the citizens and allow us to support our neighboring cities.. This project has an immediate impact to the region and we as a community need to support regional efforts instead of staying in silos. Mr. Cameron added this will ultimately lead to the MM corridor for us in the future.

City Administrator David Cameron referenced the question the Mayor asked last meeting to define "minimizing the impact". This is our job and we have used the term "favor" oten to describe the many blessings we have had. Mr. Cameron referenced the bond we issued in February. If we had waited until today with the market changes, it would have cost us \$2.7 million more. There has not been a day since we closed that the interest rate has gone down. Mr. Cameron shared there is a lot we continue to get right, including things beyond our control, adding we just saved \$2.7 million by being urgent and bold. Mr. Cameron reported it is unheard of to have something like this move so quickly from December to February.

City Administrator David Cameron referenced his report at the last meeting, presenting Mayor Russell and Council with the Trusted Leader Award in Government. Mr. Cameron reminded everyone that in 2017, Council adopted Our Mission, Vision, and Values. The clarity pillar from the Trust Edge emphasizes that people trust the clear and mistrust the ambiguous. We have adopted the eight pillars and the Parks Department's focus on the Connection Pillar in 2021 created great partnerships with Pumpkin Daze, Kiwanis for the parade, the Republic Chamber of Commerce, and Christmas on Main Street event. Mr. Cameron shared we sent our message back to the author and were recognized throughout the nation. Mr. Cameron commended staff for our pillar award, adding he is thankful for the trust of Council to adopt it and make it our framework.

Council Member Franklin thanked Council Member Grooms for his time on Council, adding he appreciated the input he gave and willingness to serve. Mr. Franklin showed Mr. Cameron his copy of the Mission, Vision, and Values he has kept since it was adopted. Mr. Franklin thanked staff for following the Mission, Vision, and Values, adding he appreciates staff's effort throughout the year to make this city great for the citizens. Mr. Franklin added he appreciates the great conversations we have had the last couple weeks.

Mayor Russell reported he was driving his kids to school and took a back road. Mayor Russell shared his truck was bouncing because of the poor condition of the road. Mayor Russell asked Andrew Nelson to come up to speak regarding the street issues now that the Sales Tax passed and returned the funds to the Streets Fund. Mayor Russell added that Mr. Nelson presented this information at the Chamber Luncheon today.

Andrew Nelson reported the bid for paving was re-advertised to get more bids and we are hoping to award the bid at the next meeting. The roads included in this bid are E. Hines from Basswood to Lincoln, Elm Street from Main to Bailey, Boston Lane from Highway 174 to Hines, and Hampton Avenue from 174 to Elm. Two roads are being widened along with the overlay: Miller from Lynn to Assisi Way and Illinois Avenue behind the police station. Mr. Nelson reported he hoped to get all the work in before August. Mr. Nelson added we have a long-term plan based on a conditional assessment done in 2018, ranking how bad each street was by a scale. There were so many, we could throw a dart and hit the bad ones for 10-11 years at our current funding rate. We are tackling the worst ones first with overlay as funding is added. Mr. Nelson reported the needed amount to invest in maintenance annually is \$1.2 million. Mr. Nelson added we have \$700,000 budgeted for this year. As the city grows, funding and revenue from the Street Fund should increase this in the future. If citizens have a specific issue, they can contact the BUILDS



department to let us know the priorities. Ultimately it is a matter of what makes the most impact based on traffic count.

Council Member Franklin asked for the number to call. Mr. Nelson reported their direct line is 732-3150.

City Administrator David Cameron reported he loved the presentation. This is a frustrating issue for Mr. Nelson because it is the hardest thing to explain without insulting someone. With such a small budget, \$12 million of work hasn't been done during the time the funds were reallocated. There isn't enough hours, staff, or machines to make up all that work. This need is like the Wastewater Treatment Plant, these are big projects and the ballot measure provided \$650,000.00. Mr. Cameron reported he is thankful to see Illinois on there as it is a frequent complaint. Mr. Cameron added there is patience and grace because it is going to take a while. Mr. Cameron reported we added about 25 miles in the last 10 years. That \$650,000.00 just provides a way to do maintenance as this is just overlay on the streets and not replacing them.

Mayor Russell asked about fixing the roads by Casey's and the schools. Mr. Nelson referenced the intersection as Highway 174 and Main Street, reporting we are actively working with the School District to assess that need. He added there are a multitude of options such as adding more length to their staging lanes, but Highway 174 and Main Street is a capacity problem even without the schools. Mr. Nelson added this will require a partnership between the city and MoDOT. Mr. Nelson added we won't see these roads addressed for a while even after funding is available. We are working with partner agencies and even after funding, it can still mean 2-3 years before it is addressed. Mr. Nelson added the best way to speed it up, is for citizens to voice their concerns to the other agencies involved including the OTO and MoDOT. We are advocating for this project, but there is a list of 200+ projects. When you rank this with other projects in other communities, it isn't even in the top 50 due to traffic counts. Citizens voicing concern prioritizes it and us participating in cost share agreements can help move it up the list.

City Administrator David Cameron referenced the cost share from the Governor, which we used to get MM Highway widened. We came up with a portion of it, but it would require a partnership to complete.

Mr. Nelson emphasized this need is on our radar and most improvements made will involve working with the school on planning and staging. He added that we have offered to partner in design and engineering efforts for staging lanes. Mr. Nelson reported the school is looking at adjacent properties and we have frequent conversations and emails with the school regarding this need.

City Administrator David Cameron added this is a regular agenda item and phone call issue we have with the School District, and we talk about this exhaustingly. Mr. Cameron added that Council Member Wilson had a great idea for staging and Olsson presented an option to it. This can't be fixed with pennies; it will take large bills. When you don't have money until now, the question is, is this the priority for funding? Which priority does the community want to address first? Illinois widening versus Highway 174 and Main Street. Mr. Cameron added this would be a great work session for 2023-2025.

Mayor Russell asked if the city can do a survey.

City Administrator David Cameron answered this is the Council's job to determine what is in the best interest of the community. A survey may move the priorities into less pressing needs which may be popular but less impactful in addressing the deficiencies. The appropriate survey would be with staff listing what is most pressing. Mr. Cameron advised Council may get feedback from citizens to bring to the discussion, adding what is important is communicating what those most pressing needs are. Mr. Cameron added rebuilding Miller would be the most costly project.



Andrew Nelson added we are working on a transportation publication for projects in 2023-2025. We haven't publicized the plan yet but would not want to do a survey until the programmed work is put out for the citizens to see.

Council Member Mitchell asked if it would be better to do less roads and do one big project instead of patching.

Andrew Nelson emphasized thatwe have to strike a balance with overlay to repair other streets which are too far gone. Mr. Nelson added the microseal on Miller bought us 5-10 years before the need of a major repair, taking the major repair money somewhere else.

Council Member Mitchell asked Mr. Nelson, if he could redo Highway 174 and Main Street, what would he do.

Mr. Nelson added based on the space available, a roundabout would be the best option and is the preferred option for MoDOT, as they don't want to add signals.

City Administrator David Cameron said the school has talked about building a road across the park at Boston Lane for staging, adding we have these discussions exhaustingly. Mr. Cameron reminded everyone we haven't been able to talk about repairing streets for 6 years due to funding, so this is a huge win for the citizens. Mr. Cameron asked if Hampton was on the list.

Mr. Nelson responded that it was on there between Highway 174 and Elm.

Issue Statement

The BUILDS Department received a Voluntary Annexation Application from Timberline Land Co. LLC for the Annexation of approximately one point three-eight (1.38) acres of land located at the 6700 Block of West US Highway 60 and adjacent Right-of-Way.

Discussion and/or Analysis

The property owner, Timberline Land Co. LLC, has submitted a Voluntary Annexation Request for the subject parcel.

City of Republic sanitary sewer and water services are available adjacent to the property. The subject parcel is compact and contiguous with the city limits of the City of Republic, as the subject parcel is surrounded by properties located in the City in all directions.

The Annexation, if approved by City Council, will effectively zone the subject parcel as Agricultural (AG), as the property has a current Greene County Zoning Designation of Agricultural, in accordance with City Code Section 435.010.B, which requires all annexed properties to be classified in the zoning district corresponding to Greene County's zoning designation.

Recommended Action

Issue Statement

Consideration to approve Amendments to Chapter 805 Fee Schedule, relating to fees administered and collected by the BUILDS Department.

Discussion and/or Analysis

BVD Table:

The BUILDS Department utilizes the Building Valuation Data (BVD) published by the International Code Council (ICC) for the calculation of both residential and commercial Building Fees; the BVD is published twice a year and typically adopted by the City on an annual basis. The BVD Table provides multiplication factors based upon the Group (Assembly, Storage, etc..) and Construction Type (IA, IIB, VB).

Building Fees for both residential and commercial are calculated by multiplying the total square footage by the BVD Factor by the Local Multiplier, in the following manor:

- Square Footage of Building x BVD x Local Multiplier
 - The Building Valuation Table (BVD) provides the "average" construction costs per square foot, updated every six months

Local Multiplier:

The Local Multiplier is a factor, used in the calculation of Building Permit Fees, based upon annual fiscal projections to fund the Building Services division of the BUILDS Department; the Local Multiplier will be adopted with the Budget annually.

- Local Multiplier: 0.0035
 - The Local Multiplier reduces the per square foot construction cost

Commercial Building Shell Multiplier:

The Commercial Building Shell Multiplier is a factor, used in the calculation of Building Permit Fees, for commercial structures designed without infill buildout; infill buildout will be reviewed and permitted separately.



- The Commercial Building Shell Multiplier will reduce the total per square foot construction cost
 - Commercial Building Shell Multiplier: 75%

Liquor Catering Permit:

The Liquor Catering Permit will allow any person who has a current State Business License to obtain a permit for liquor sale by drink at a location other than the location permitted on their State Liquor License for a period not to exceed 72 consecutive hours; this type of permit will allow for liquor for sale by drink at special events, temporary events, and catered events.

Liquor Temporary License Fee:

The State of Missouri may issue a Temporary Liquor License to establishments; the City of Republic's Temporary Liquor License will correspond with this type of license issued by the State.

Right of Way Fees:

The ROW/Street Repair Fee allows for the BUILDS Department to provides a temporary patch of 20 square feet of Cold Mix and 20 square feet of Hot Mix Asphalt; additional coverage will be charged at a per square foot basis.

ROW/Street Repair: \$1000 + \$25/square foot overage

Liquor Catering Permit Fee:

The Liquor Catering Permit was adopted as a recent Code Amendment to Chapter 600, allowing for a licensed entity to sell or serve alcohol somewhere other than the premises described in the State Liquor Permit; the Fee will be collected during the review process.

Temporary Liquor License:

The Temporary Liquor License allows for a permit to sell intoxicating liquor, on a temporary basis, for consumption on the premises where sold; the Fee will be collected during the review process.

Recommended Action

Staff recommends the **approval** of the referenced Amendment.

Issue Statement

This ordinance would authorize City Staff to close a portion of Farm Road 101.

Discussion and/or Analysis

Recently, the City of Republic acquired Farm Road 101 from Greene County in order to pursue this closure. This section of road has no driveway access and is not part of the City's Future thoroughfare plan.

According to the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials *A Policy on Geometric Design of Highways and Streets* (AASHTO Green Book) The design Decision Sight Distance for a left turn such as this onto a 55-mph highway is 610 ft. therefore, a driver sitting at this intersection would need to be able to see 610 feet down this road to have the adequate time to make the decision to wait or go. Currently there is only about half that distance.

Average Daily Traffic on Farm Road 101 currently is 243 vehicle trips per day averaging out to ~10 vehicles per hour. The peak VPH occurs from 4pm to 5pm and is ~25 vehicles, with a max recorded of 32. The distribution of vehicles is evenly split between north bound and southbound vehicles. AADWT on Highway M is currently 3652 according to MoDOT data zone, and according to staff projections may more than double in the next 5 years.

There have been 10 incidents at this location since 2012, 2 of which were minor injury. The proposed closure would be minimally impactful to overall traffic flow while increasing network safety.

As development occurs and traffic increases on the main road of M highway, the likelihood of an incident involving this side street continues to increase. It is staff's recommendation that this road be closed

Recommended Action

Staff recommends approval.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE PERMANENT CLOSURE OF FARM ROAD 101 BETWEEN STATE HIGHWAY M AND THE SOUTHERNMOST ENTRANCE TO OLD STONE APARTMENTS

WHEREAS, the City of Republic, Missouri, ("City" or "Republic") is a municipal corporation and Charter City located in Greene County, Missouri, being duly created, organized, and existing under the laws of the State of Missouri; and

WHEREAS, the City acquired Farm Road 101 between State Highway M and the southernmost entrance to the Old Stone Apartments ("Portion of Roadway") from Greene County for the purpose of pursing permanent closure of the same; and

WHEREAS, the Portion of Roadway has no driveway access and is not part of the City's future thoroughfare plan; and

WHEREAS, the City believes the Portion of Roadway poses an ongoing safety risk to the citizens as it is the site of at least ten (10) traffic incidents, two of which involved injuries, since 2012; and

WHEREAS, as ongoing development in the area surrounding the Portion of Roadway continues and traffic increases, the likelihood of additional incidents will rise.

WHEREAS, the Council finds it is reasonable and prudent to authorize the City Administrator to permanently close the Portion of Roadway due to the safety risk it currently poses and will continue to pose to the citizens, and due to the minimal impact on traffic flow as a result of the closure.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REPUBLIC, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1:

	Southernmost Entrance to Old Stone Apartments, as shown in the diagram attached hereto and labeled Exhibit 1.
Section 2:	The City Administrator, or his/her designee, on behalf of the City, is authorized to take the other, additional necessary steps to execute this Ordinance.

Issue Statement

The City of Republic's BUILDS Department received an Application for Mason Ridge Phase 1 Final Plat on May 09, 2022.



Issue Statement

To award a bid for paving to Blevins Asphalt Construction Co., Inc.

Discussion and/or Analysis

The City requested bids for paving of portions of Elm St., Hines St., Hampton Ave. and Boston Ave. as well as widening and overlay of portion of Illinois Ave. and Miller Rd. The City received four bids, the lowest of which was from Blevins Asphalt Construction Co., Inc in the amount of \$449,500. This is consistent with the estimated cost of the improvements and the street fund has adequate funds for the project.

Recommended Action

Staff recommends approval.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL AWARDING THE BID FOR PAVING OF THE 2022 CITY OVERLAYS TO BLEVINS ASPHALT CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, INC.



The maximum liability of the City shall be limited to the amount of money to be paid or received by the City under any agreement or contract awarded under the terms of this IFB.
- b. THE E-VERIFY PROGRAM FOR EMPLOYMENT VERIFICATION MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

ARTICLE I

PURPOSE AND AUTHORITY

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) sets forth the points of agreement between the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and <u>Blevins Asphalt Construction Co., Inc.</u> (Employer) regarding the Employer's participation in the Employment Eligibility Verification Program (E-Verify).
