USU Create Better Health (SNAP-Ed)

- Continuing programming throughout San Juan County
- CBH has just completed Phase one with the Navajo Nation Human Research IRB protocol process
- Partnering and Expanding CBH with new community stakeholders in San Juan County to include
 - San Juan Public Health: Sharing resources with Health Promotions, Epidemiology statistic gathering sharing, potential funding partnerships
 - Utah Navajo Chapter Houses and Communities
 - Oljato/Monument Valley
 - Create Better Health has been very active in the Oljato Chapter area conducting CBH events, Food Demonstrations, and Food, Fun, and Reading Events
 - Mexican Water Chapter
 - Create Better Health will collaborate with Officials and Community members to begin conducting CBH events
 - Red Mesa Chapter
 - Create Better Health was able to secure In-Kind funding from the Navajo Nation "Unhealth Food Tax" which taxes foods with little to no nutritional value, from the Red Mesa Chapter allocation. The secured In-Kind funding was then used to purchase Food and Cooking Equipment for a CBH event held on FEB 14 and for future events.

 - Utah Navajo Health Systems "Hoozho'go lina 365" Programing

Community Health Worker Certification program

- Working with USU Faculty, Dr. Eduardo Ortiz and the San Juan Health Department on a USU project to develop and implement culturally responsive programming in the birth to 8 system in San Juan
- Currently working through the USU IRB process
- Preparing for the next CHW Cohort

CYFAR Grant/TRY Teams Initiative



SEEKING 2023 PARTICIPANTS



Irrigation Evaluation/Plans

USU Extension and irrigation dealers or your choosing will conduct irrigation evaluations and help participants develop a 5-year IMP (irrigation management plan).



Irrigation Support

Participants will receive equipment and training on a soil moisture sensing station, automated weather station, and flow meter to assist in water management. These are valued at over \$9,000 per farm.



Alternative Crop Seed

Participants will receive up to S200 per acre for a total of 10 acres in seed costs for new crops with lower water use.



Compensation for Reporting

Participants who report on their IMP progress and share water use data will receive an annual S750 credit at irrigation dealer of their choosing.

Requirements

Participation is voluntary and will not obligate participants to participate in any other water management program. Participants need to farm/ranch within the Jordan, Sevier, Utah Lake, or Uintah Basins or in the greater Colorado River Basin. Participants will make a 5-year commitment to develop and report progress on a farm or company IMP and collaborate with USU.
