"AN ORDINANCE TO ABANDON THE SERVITUDE AND RIGHT OF WAY GRANTED BY MARY ANNE CASKEY LAZARUS TO THE TANGIPAHOA PARISH COUNCIL-PRESIDENT GOVERNMENT BY DOCUMENT DATED JANUARY 11, 2008 AS DULY RECORDED AT CONVEYANCE BOOK 1128, PAGE 33 IN
