#### Scope of Products and Services:

Portable radios are to operate on the LWIN (Louisiana Wireless Information Network) Statewide 700/800 MHz system.

All items must meet the following minimum specifications and functionality:

- Manufacturer must be approved by LSP Radio Communications representing Louisiana SIEC for the LWIN system.
- Must be able to operate on 700/800 MHz frequencies.
- Must be able to operate on conventional frequencies as well as on mutual aid frequencies.
- Must meet or exceed P-25 standards.
- Must meet or exceed Mil-specs standard.
- Must be FCC type accepted.
- Must have a minimum three-year manufacturer's warranty.

All items to be furnished must be the manufacturer's current state-of-the-art and must be certified to be in current new production. All items delivered under the contract must be new. Refurbished items are not acceptable for new purchases.

**Vendor's Forms:** The purchase order is the only binding document to be issued against the contract. Signing of vendor's forms is not allowed.

**Brand Name Contracts**: Brand name contracts are expected to have \$50,000 usage annually. This usage amount may be waived in whole or in part due to extenuating circumstances, in the state's best interest. The Office of State Procurement will consider contract purchases from both state agencies and political subdivisions. The inability or failure to timely produce usage reports evidencing adequate sales volumes may result in cancellation of your brand name contract for a period of two (2) years.

**Invoices.** Invoices will be submitted by the Vendor to the using agency as indicated on the purchase order and the invoice shall refer to the delivery ticket number, delivery date, purchase order number, quantity, unit price and delivery point. A separate invoice for each order delivered and accepted should be submitted by the Vendor in duplicate directly to the accounting department of the using Agency. Invoices shall show the amount of any cash discount and shall be submitted on the Vendor's own invoice form.

Using Agencies are directed to pay the Vendor upon presentation of a properly executed invoice after goods have been received, inspected and accepted. Invoices will be paid within thirty (30) days of receipt of a properly executed invoice, or receipt of goods, whichever is later. Payment will be made on the basis of unit price as listed in the contract or the invoiced price, whichever is lower. Such price and payment will constitute full compensation for furnishing and delivering the requested contract commodities. In no case will the using agency refuse to make partial payments to the Vendor although all items have not been delivered. This payment in no way relieves the Vendor of his responsibility to effect shipment of the balance of the order.

PAYMENTS WILL BE MADE TO THE VENDOR AND TO THE ADDRESS AS SHOWN ON THE PURCHASE ORDER. ADVANCED PAYMENTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE CONTRACT.

Cooperative Purchase.

It is the intent of the Office of State Procurement (OSP) to accommodate cooperative purchasing in this contract.

As described below, Political Subdivisions of the State, Quasi State Agencies, and Agencies of the United States Government are to be authorized (potential) users of the contract, subject to the pricing and terms set forth in the contract.

- Political Subdivisions of the State include, but are not limited to, parish governments, municipal governments, school districts, human service districts, local governments and public utilities.
- Quasi State Agencies include, but are not limited to, non-profit or for-profit organizations created by the State of Louisiana or any political subdivision or agency thereof, or any special district or authority, or unit of local government, to perform a public purpose.

**Delivery.** Delivery to any agency of the State government eligible by State statute and/or authorized to purchase from the contract. Delivery is to be made upon the issuance of a purchase order.

Contractors will have access to an adequate supply of all items in order to meet deliveries of not more than ninety (90) business days.

**Non-Exclusive Contract.** This agreement is non-exclusive and shall not in any way preclude State Agencies from entering into similar agreements and/or arrangements with other vendors or from acquiring similar, equal, or like goods and/or services from other entities or sources.

**F.O.B.** Destination: All prices and terms shall be net.

**Orders.** All State Agencies are directed to issue purchase orders for a supply of the items required, as and when needed. Political Subdivisions of the State and Quasi Agencies who have been authorized to purchase from contracts made by the Office of State Procurement, are directed to issue their regular purchase orders directly to the supplier, making reference to the contract and line item numbers.

**Risk of Loss/Passage of Title**. Title to the equipment purchased under the Contract shall pass from Contractor to State on the date of installation for Contractor-installed equipment or on the date of delivery for State-installed equipment. Prior to the passage of title all risk of loss or damage shall be on the Contractor.

**Contract Period.** The Contract shall be effective for a period of two (2) months beginning May 27, 2019 and ending July 27, 2020 unless, otherwise terminated in accordance with the termination provision of the Contract.

**Renewal.** At the option of the Office of State Procurement and acceptance by the Contractor, the contract may be extended for one (1) additional twelve (12) month period and one (1) additional ten (10) month period at the same prices, terms and conditions. Contract not to exceed thirty-six (36) months.

**Contract Revisions.** Requests for revisions to the contract shall be addressed to the Office of State Procurement and shall refer to the contract item number (with brief explanation of request). Distributor vendor changes, price reductions and item deletions may be requested at any time during the contract period.

New item additions will be considered only on the anniversary date of the contract. Exceptions to this will be allowed only when the Office of State Procurement has determined additions will be of substantial benefit to the State and will justify the time, effort and cost required to make such additions.

Contractor must immediately notify the Office of State Procurement when any dealer on the contract is terminated, relocated, or added. All orders placed with dealers prior to receipt of such notification to the Office of State Procurement must be honored.

Revisions will become effective upon approval by the Office of State Procurement.

Contractor's Responsibility. During the course of the contract, any price reduction in the contract price must be immediately extended to the State by the Contractor. Failure to offer the benefit of these price reductions to the State within two (2) weeks after general announcement may result in the cancellation of the contract. These price reductions must be granted on any order not shipped. Contractor must maintain a list of equipment on order and be able to provide a list to the Office of State Procurement within 48 hours of the request.

**Proprietary.** Only brand names and numbers stated in the award are approved for delivery under the contract and any substitution must receive prior written approval of the Office of State Procurement.

Single Point of Contact. At a minimum, the Contractor shall assign one person and at least one backup within the Contractor's organization to serve as a primary contact person for the contract related activities. These activities include but are not limited to: resolution of contract issues, all pre-sale and post-sale activities, including system configuration and implementation, order processing and status, billing-related issues, operating feature and function questions of the products and contract, training coordination. This designated contact person should be prepared to handle routine tasks, answer inquiries, and resolve problems that arise on a daily basis. The Contractor shall designate this single point of contact within fourteen (14) days of award. The Contractor shall keep the contact list current during the term of the contract and provide updates to the Office of State Procurement.

**Contractor Utilization.** By submitting a bid, bidder acknowledges that he agrees to the following terms that will be a part of any resulting contract(s) from this solicitation:

The contract has been designated as a Louisiana Pricing Schedule ("LAPS") contract. The State intends to use the following process before placing orders under the contract, and the contractor explicitly understands and agrees to the use of this process before accepting orders under the contract. Where multiple LAPS contracts exist for functionally equivalent products and/or services and the procurement is above \$25,000, all eligible users of these contracts will utilize the following procedures:

- 1) Prepare a Request for Responses (an informal process used to make a best value determination) that include, if applicable:
  - A) Performance based statement of work that includes such things as
    - The work to be performed
    - Location of work
    - Period of performance
    - Deliverable schedule
    - Applicable performance standards
    - Acceptance criteria
    - Any special requirements (e.g., security clearances, special knowledge, etc.)

- The products required (using a generic description of products and functions whenever possible.)
- B) If necessary or applicable, a request for submittal of a project plan for performing the task and information on the contractor's experience and/or past performance performing similar tasks.
- C) A best value determination is one that considers, in addition to underlying contract pricing, such factors as:
  - Probable life of the item selected
  - Environmental and Energy efficiency considerations
  - Technical qualifications
  - Delivery Terms
  - Warranty
  - Maintenance availability
  - Administrative costs
  - Compatibility of an item within the user's environment
  - User's familiarity with the item or service
- D) A request for submittal of a firm-fixed total price for labor and/or products which are no higher than the prices in the LAPS contract.
- 2) Submit the Request for Response to at least three (3) LAPS contract holders, whenever available, offering functionally equivalent products and/or services that will meet the agency's needs.
- 3) Evaluate responses and select the Contractor to receive the order:
  - A) After responses have been evaluated, the order shall be placed with the contractor that represents the best value that meets the Agency's needs. The ordering agency should give preference to small-entrepreneurships or small and emerging businesses when two or more contractors can provide the services and/or products at the same firm-fixed price.
  - B) The ordering agency shall document in the procurement file the evaluation of the contractor's responses that formed the basis for selection. The documentation shall identify the contractor from which the services and/or products were purchased, the services and/or products purchased, and the cost of the resulting purchase order.
  - C) Purchases shall not be artificially divided to avoid the requirements of this section when recurring requirements for same products are known.

**Indemnification and Limitation of Liability.** Neither party shall be liable for any delay or failure in performance beyond its control resulting from acts of God or force majeure. The parties shall use reasonable efforts to eliminate or minimize the effect of such events upon performance of their respective duties under the contract.

Contractor shall be fully liable for the actions of its agents, employees, partners or subcontractors and shall fully indemnify and hold harmless the State from suits, actions, damages and costs of every name and description relating to personal injury and damage to real or personal tangible property caused by the Contractor, its agents, employees, partners or subcontractors, in the performance of the contract without limitation; provided, however, that the Contractor shall not indemnify for that portion of any claim, loss or damage arising hereunder due to the negligent act or failure to act of the State.

Contractor shall indemnify, defend and hold the State harmless, *without limitation*, from and against any and all damages, expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees), claims judgments, liabilities and costs which may be fully assessed against the State in any action for infringement of a United States Letter Patent with respect to the products, materials or services furnished by the Contractor under its bid response and the contract, or of any copyright trademark, trade secret or intellectual property right, provided that the State shall give the Contractor: (i) prompt written notice of any action, claim or threat of infringement suit, or other suit, (ii) the opportunity to take over, settle or defend such action, claim or suit at Contractor's sole expense, and (iii) assistance in the defense of any such action at the expense of the Contractor. Where a dispute or claim arises relative to a real or anticipated infringement, the State may require the Contractor at its sole expense, to submit such information and documentation, including formal patent attorney opinions, as the Commissioner of Administration shall require.

The Contractor shall not be obligated to indemnify that portion of a claim or dispute based upon: (i) the State's unauthorized modification or alteration of the products or materials; (ii) the State's use of the products or materials in combination with other products or materials not furnished by the Contractor; (iii) the State's use of the products or materials in other than the specified operating conditions and environment.

In addition to the foregoing, if the use of any item(s) or part(s) thereof shall be enjoined for any reason or if Contractor believes that it may be enjoined, Contractor shall have the right, at its own expense and sole discretion as the state's exclusive remedy to take action no later than six (6) months after the issuance of an injunction in the following order of precedence: (i) to procure for the State the right to continue using such item(s) or part(s) thereof, as applicable; (ii) to modify the component so that it becomes non-infringing equipment of at least equal quality and performance; or (iii) to replace said item(s) or part(s) thereof, as applicable, with non-infringing components of at least equal quality and performance, or (iv) if none of the foregoing is commercially reasonable, then provide monetary compensation to the State up to the dollar amount of the Contract. Any injunction that is issued against the State which prevents the State from utilizing the Contractor's product in excess of six (6) months and for which the contractor has not obtained for the State or provided to the State one of the alternatives set forth in the foregoing sentence is cause for the State to terminate the Contract. In the event of such termination, the State will not be obligated to compensate the Contractor for any costs incurred by the Contractor.

For all other claims against the Contractor where liability is not otherwise set forth in the contract as being "without limitation", and regardless of the basis on which the claim is made, the Contractor's liability for direct damages, shall be the greater of \$100,000, the dollar amount of the products or materials, or two (2) times the charges for services rendered by the Contractor under the contract. Unless otherwise specifically enumerated herein mutually agreed between the parties, neither party shall be liable to the other for special, indirect or consequential damages, including lost data or records, even if the party has been advised of the possibility of such damages. Neither party shall be liable for lost profits, lost revenue or lost institutional operating savings.

The State may, in addition to other remedies available to it at law or equity and upon notice to the Contractor, retain such monies from amounts due Contractor, or may proceed against the performance and payment bond, if any, as may be necessary to satisfy any claim for damages, penalties, costs and the like asserted by or against them.

**Assignment.** The Contractor shall not assign any interest in the contract by assignment, transfer or novation without prior written consent of the State. This provision shall not be construed to prohibit the Contractor from assigning his bank, trust company, or other financial institution any money due or to become due from approved contracts without such prior written consent. Notice of any such assignment or transfer shall be furnished promptly to the State.

**Right to Audit.** The State Legislative auditor, federal auditors and internal auditors of the Division of Administration, or others so designated by the DOA, shall have the option to audit all accounts directly pertaining to the contract for a period of five (5) years from the date of final payment or as required by applicable State and Federal Law. Records shall be made available during normal working hours for this purpose.

**Late Payments.** Interest due by a State Agency for late payments shall be in accordance with La. R.S. 39:1695 at the rates established in La. R.S. 13:4202.

**Termination for Non-Appropriation of Funds.** The continuation of the contract is contingent upon the continuation of an appropriation of funds by the Legislature to fulfill the requirements of the contract. If the Legislature fails to appropriate sufficient monies to provide for the continuation of the contract or if such appropriation is reduced by the veto of the Governor or by any means provided in the appropriations act or Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 to prevent the total appropriations for the year from exceeding revenues for that year or for any other lawful purpose and the effect of such reduction is to provide insufficient monies for the continuation of the contract, the contract shall terminate on the last day of the fiscal year for which funds are not appropriated.

**Waiver Clause.** Waiver of any breach of any term or condition of the contract shall not be deemed a waiver of any prior or subsequent breach. No term or condition of the contract shall be held to be waived, modified, or deleted except by the written consent of both parties.

**Severability.** If any term or condition of the contract or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other terms, conditions or applications which can be given effect without the invalid term, condition or application; to this end, the terms and conditions of the contract are declared severable.

Code of Ethics. The Contractor acknowledges that Chapter 15 of Title 42 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes (R.S. 42:1101 et. seq., Code of Governmental Ethics) applies to the Contracting Party in the performance of products/services called for in the Contract. The Contractor agrees to immediately notify the State if potential violations of the Code of Governmental Ethics arise at any time during the term of the Contract.

**Applicable Law.** The contract shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana. Venue of any action brought with regard to the contract shall be in the Nineteenth Judicial District Court, parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana.

**Contract Controversies.** Any claim or controversy arising out of the contract shall be resolved by the provisions of Louisiana Revised Statutes 39:1673.

### Coinsurance Clause

Most property insurance policies contain a coinsurance provision. A Coinsurance provision requires the insured to insure the covered property to some specified percentage of its full value, either replacement cost or actual cash value – typically 80, 90 or 100 percent – in exchange for a coinsurance rate credit. If at the time of loss it is determined that the limits carried are less than those required by the coinsurance provision, the loss recovery will be limited to the same percentage of loss as the ratio of the amount of insurance carried to the amount of insurance required. The "Coinsurance Formula" Exhibit below shows the calculation of the amount payable after application of the coinsurance requirement.

 $$40,000 \times ($60,000/$80,000) - $1,000 = $29,000$

For the purposes of this exhibit, noncompliance with the coinsurance clause resulted in an \$11,000 penalty.

The coinsurance clause affects the amount of recovery only in partial loss situations. In the event of a total loss, the policy would pay the total limit of liability applicable to that property, in this case \$60,000.

**IMPORTANT NOTICE:** Flood coverage is typically not covered under a standard commercial property policy. We may be able to provide a quote for commercial flood insurance to a limit of \$500,000 for your building and to a limit of \$500,000 for its contents. You may be able to purchase excess flood insurance to rebuild properties valued above those limits.




