Assistant Mayor Linda Teeters called the meeting to order.

PRESENT: Ward 1 Assistant Mayor Linda Teeters, Ward 2 Director Laney J. Harris, Ward 3 Director Steven Hollibush, Ward 4 Director Travis Odom, Ward 5 Director Barbara S. Miner, and Ward 6 Director Terri Peavy.

ALSO PRESENT: City Manager Dr. Kenny Haskin, City Attorney George Matteson, City Clerk Heather Soyars, and Deputy City Clerk Jenny Narens.

5. Ordinance No. 23-2019 amending the *City of Texarkana, Arkansas Code of Ordinances* to allow food trucks in commercial and industrial zones. (This agenda item sponsored by Director Steven Hollibush) (PWD-Planning) (THIRD READING) City Planner Mary Beck

The applicant requests an emergency clause. An emergency clause requires a separate and distinct vote of the board and is valid only if there is a two-thirds vote of approval by the board. (Hdbk. Const. Amend 7)

Director Peavy asked Public Works Director Tyler Richards if anyone had contacted him to say they were against the food trucks.

Public Works Director Tyler Richards said no.

Director Harris asked if there were any buffer zones from an existing business.

Public Works Director Tyler Richards said the food truck vendor would need to have permission to be on the property before they could set up the truck.

Director Harris asked if they could set up across the street from an existing business.

Public Works Director Tyler Richards said yes.

Director Harris said he would like to see a 200 yard buffer zone from an existing business. He said there were other cities that had the buffer zone.

[Director Odom arrived at 6:16 PM]

Director Harris asked if the food truck vendor could set up in an apartment complex.

Public Works Director Tyler Richards said an apartment complex would typically be a R-4 Medium Density Residential zone and a food truck would not be allowed.

Director Harris said he wanted this to be tabled and sent back to the Planning Commission to address these issues.

Public Works Director Tyler Richards said the Planning Commission did consider the other businesses and this was the ordinance the Planning Commission decided on.

Assistant Mayor Teeters said this happened every year at the fairgrounds and it was not an issue. She said there were permanent structures that sold food and then the City allowed other food vendors to come in and they would set up within 10 feet of each other. Assistant Mayor Teeters said it was a free market and we were adding to it by giving people more choices. She said if some preferred the brick and mortar business, they would go there but let's give people the opportunity to try the other options.

Director Hollibush said every 3rd Saturday they had the food truck festival on Front Street, and he had not heard any complaints from any brick and mortar businesses downtown.

Director Peavy asked Director Harris if he could tell the directors what other cities had a buffer zone.

Director Harris said what was the point if the Board's mind were already made up.

Director Peavy asked could a food truck set up in Zapata's parking lot.

Public Works Director Tyler Richard said it would be up to the owner of the property.

Director Miner said it was free enterprise and there was competition all up and down Highway 82.

Motion to further suspend the rules and place the ordinance on its third and final reading in abbreviated form made by Director Hollibush, Seconded by Director Peavy.

Mayor Allen Brown called the meeting to order.

PRESENT: Mayor Allen Brown, Ward 1 Assistant Mayor Linda Teeters, Ward 2 Director Laney J. Harris, Ward 3 Director Steven Hollibush, Ward 4 Director Travis Odom, Ward 5 Director Barbara S. Miner, and Ward 6 Director Terri Peavy.

Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance given by Mayor Allen Brown

REGULAR

1. Ordinance No. 24-2019 approved the Section 108 Loan Agreement from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the rehabilitation of #1 Legion Drive. (PWD)

The applicant requests an emergency clause. An emergency clause requires a separate and distinct vote of the board and is valid only if there is a two-thirds vote of approval by the board. (Hdbk. Const. Amend 7)

Assistant Public Works Director Tracie Lee said the Boys and Girls Club building had been dormant since 2013, when the City received the building. She said the building had continually become dilapidated and it would cost the City \$400,000.00 to have it demolished. Assistant Public Works Director Tracie Lee said HUD asked them to do a new environmental study and update the Phase II. She said there was no need to update the Phase II because there were no findings in Phase I to cause any harm. Ms. Lee said if the asbestos were not disturbed there would be no health risk.

Public Works Director Tyler Richards said the new Phase I Environmental Assessment yielded no friable asbestos. He said asbestos was only hazardous in a friable state crumbled into a dust. Mr. Richards said if they did encounter asbestos in the tile or in the gym floor, they could retile and put a new gym floor over the existing one. He said it was not hazardous at all and he did not have any concerns about the safety of the building.

Assistant Mayor Teeters said she wanted to make sure it was not only Public Works Director Tyler Richards but also the experts that did not have any concerns with the asbestos. She said Public Works had performed two assessments and both said there were no hazards from the asbestos.

Jim Fowler with Rose Law Firm went over the interest rates the City would have with the HUD loan. He said HUD would be in control of setting the interest rates and the timing on when the fixed rate would occur.

Director Harris asked how much Mr. Fowler charged the City for his services.

Jim Fowler said \$9,000.00.

Director Harris asked where this money came from.

Assistant Public Works Director Tracie Lee said the money came from the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.

Director Harris asked what effect this loan would have on the CDBG funds.

Assistant Public Works Director Tracie Lee said the loan would be over a twenty-year period with the interest rate included in the payment of \$62,000 to \$63,000 a year.

Director Harris said the money came from the CDBG money allocated for the City of Texarkana. He asked when the last study was done on the asbestos.

Public Works Director Tyler Richards said the last study was done just a few weeks ago.

Director Harris wanted to make sure this was going to be a safe environment for the minority child coming from Ward 2 and Ward 1. He asked if he could have the latest study without doing an FIOA request. Director Harris asked if the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) were involved in the renovation of the building.

Public Works Director Tyler Richards said yes, they were required to notify ADEQ. He said both studies stated there were no friable materials and it was not hazardous for anyone to walk into the building. Mr. Richards said if they needed to abate anything in the renovation the cost was included in the estimate.

Mayor Brown asked about the ordinance and change to the collateral from the Boys and Girls Club to the grant funds and to the City refuse account, would the City have to freeze those accounts.

Jim Fowler said you only had to freeze the CDBG money coming out of the payment.

Mayor Brown asked when the City would get to the conversion rate.

Jim Fowler said he did not know when that would be. He said HUD would gather the loans and once they gather around \$700 million then they would decide.

Mayor Brown said the first anticipated rate increase would be in May 2020. He said he was not concerned about the rate increase due to it being under HUD. He wanted to make sure the City could do what the documents said it had to do. Mayor Brown asked where the 2.5% and 2.34% the City had to pay upfront was coming from.

Assistant Public Directors Tracie Lee said it was already budgeted in the 2019 CDBG funds and the City did not have to pay the full amount upfront.

Mayor Brown said he did not like that the City could not prepay the loan off.

Assistant Mayor Teeters said she understood why the Federal Government did this since they would be anticipating the interest over twenty years and then we pay it in five years, we have

cost them a ton of money. She said the government was looking at the result as well and not lose their appropriated income.

City Manager Dr. Kenny Haskin said the beautiful thing about this loan was it did not cost the taxpayers one dime. He said the City was taking federal subsidy funds and giving it right back to them and it was a great deal.

Assistant Public Works Director Tracie Lee said one of HUD's issues on how the City spent the money was they did not see anything tangible. She said for years the City spent the funds on demolishing structures and doing patch work on roads. Ms. Lee said HUD asked the City for something tangible that they could see. She said in the hearings one of the top things were programs for the youth and this was a way the City could do that.

Director Peavy said when she attended a meeting and they focused on renewing the Boys and Girls Club not only for the youth but for the entire age spectrum in our community. She said she asked the City Manager if he could investigate this and a year later this was what the City figured was the best way to refurbish the Boys and Girls Club and she was very excited.

Mayor Brown said he agreed. This was a learning experience for the City. We would learn the process together because there would be other opportunities the City could benefit from.

Assistant Mayor Teeters said she wanted to commend our staff and legal counsel and say thank you for everything they did. She said it did not matter what ward the building was in. The City staff would make sure it did everything to make this building right and would never put a child in danger. Ms. Teeters said she commended the staff for finding the funds and using their expertise to get it all done.

Motion to read the ordinance the first time in abbreviated form made by Director Peavy, Seconded by Assistant Mayor Teeters.

EMERGENCY CLAUSE:	N/A	
SUMMARY:	The Water Utilities Department is preparing to make improvements to the Nix Creek Sewer Trunk Main between South Stateline Avenue and Arnold Drive. This section of sewer trunk main serves a majority of the Arkansas side residences. This sewer trunk main is constructed almost entirely of clay pipe. Most of the joint sealant is gone, creating an Inflow and Infiltration problem and there are sections that are extremely flat and, in some cases, inverted. Utility installed sewer flow meters to determine actual dry weather and wet weather flows. Proposed improvements consist of installing PVC and/or DIP, increasing the slopes to handle the design flows, and relocating sections for better locations. The Utility staff has determined that an outside engineering firm will be required to design the proposed improvements. The Utility recommends Spears Engineering Company for this project due to their familiarity with this type of work. The proposed contract is for \$150,000 based on the projected construction cost of \$2,000,000. This fee will include the plans and specifications required for this design. Engineering staff has reviewed the engineering fee and has determined that it is within the acceptable engineering fee range for this type of project.

WHEREAS, based on the projected construction cost, the proposed engineering contract is \$150,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager and TWU staff recommend Board approval;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Directors of the City of Texarkana, Arkansas, that the City Manager is authorized to enter into an engineering contract with Spears Engineering Company for the purposes and in the amount set forth above.

AGREEMENT FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES

This Agreement, made this <u>17th</u> day of <u>October</u>, <u>2019</u>, by and between <u>Texarkana Water Utilities</u>, hereafter referred to as the OWNER, and <u>Spears Engineering Company</u>, hereinafter referred to as the ENGINEER:

THE OWNER intends to construct the <u>Nix Creek Sewer Trunk Main Rehabilitation including replacing existing</u> sanitary sewer trunk main, manholes, laterals, and associated improvements in <u>Texarkana</u>, <u>Miller</u> County, State of <u>Arkansas</u> for which the ENGINEER agrees to perform the various professional engineering services for the design and construction of said system.

WITNESSETH:

That for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises between the parties hereto, it is hereby agreed:

SECTION A - ENGINEERING SERVICES

The ENGINEER shall furnish engineering services as follows:

- 1. The ENGINEER will conduct preliminary investigations.
- 2. The ENGINEER will attend conferences with the OWNER or other interested parties as may be reasonably necessary.
- 3. The ENGINEER will perform the necessary design surveys, accomplish the detailed design of the project, prepare construction drawings, specifications and contract documents, and prepare a final cost estimate based on the final design for the entire system. It is also understood that if subsurface explorations (such as borings, soil tests, rock soundings and the like) are required, the ENGINEER will furnish coordination of said explorations without additional charge, but the costs incident to such explorations shall be paid for by the OWNER as set out in Section D hereof.
- 4. Prior to the advertisement for bids, the ENGINEER will provide for each construction contract, not to exceed 5 copies of detailed drawings, specifications, and contract documents for use by the OWNER, appropriate Federal, State, and local agencies from whom approval of the project must be obtained. The cost of such drawings, specifications, and contract documents shall be included in the basic compensation paid to the ENGINEER.
- 5. The drawings prepared by the ENGINEER under the provisions of Section A-4 above shall be in sufficient detail to permit the actual location of the proposed improvements on the ground. The ENGINEER shall prepare and furnish to the OWNER without any additional compensation, three copies of a map(s) showing the general location of needed construction easements and permanent easements and the land to be acquired. Property surveys, property plats, property descriptions, abstracting and negotiations for land rights shall be accomplished by the OWNER, unless the OWNER requests, and the ENGINEER agrees to provide those services. In the event the ENGINEER is requested to provide such services, the ENGINEER shall be additionally compensated as set out in Section D hereof
- 6. The ENGINEER will interpret the intent of the drawings and specifications to protect the OWNER against defects and deficiencies in construction on the part of the contractors. The ENGINEER will not, however, guarantee the performance by any contractor.
- 7. The ENGINEER will establish baselines for locating the work together with a suitable number of bench marks adjacent to the work as shown in the contract documents.
- 8. The ENGINEER will be available to furnish engineering services and consultations necessary to correct unforeseen project operation difficulties for a period of one year after the date of statement of substantial completion of the facility. This service will include instruction of the OWNER in initial project operation and maintenance but will not include supervision of normal operation of the system. Such consultation and advice shall be furnished without additional charge except for travel and subsistence costs. The ENGINEER will assist the OWNER in performing a review of the project during the 11th month after the date of the certificate of substantial completion.
- 9. The ENGINEER further agrees to obtain and maintain, at the ENGINEER'S expense, such insurance as will protect the ENGINEER from claims under the Workman's Compensation Act and such comprehensive general liability insurance as will protect the OWNER and the ENGINEER from all claims for bodily injury, death, or property damage which may arise from the performance by the ENGINEER or by the ENGINEER'S employees of the ENGINEER'S functions and services required under this Agreement.

10. Upon written authorization from the OWNER, the ENGINEER will complete final plans, specifications and contract documents and submit for approval of the OWNER and all State regulatory agencies within <u>90</u> calendar days from the date of authorization unless otherwise agreed to by both parties.

If the above is not accomplished within the time period specified, this Agreement may be terminated by the OWNER. The time for completion will be extended by the OWNER for a reasonable time if completion is delayed due to unforeseeable causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the ENGINEER.

SECTION B - COMPENSATION FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES

- 1. The OWNER shall compensate the ENGINEER for design and engineering services in the Lump Sum amount of:
 - (a) <u>One Hundred Fifty Thousand</u> Dollars (\$ <u>150,000.00</u>)
- 2. The compensation for design and engineering services shall be payable as follows:
 - (a) The portion of the Lump Sum amount billed for Engineer's services will be based upon Engineer's estimate of the percentage of the total services actually completed during the billing period. If any Reimbursable Expenses are expressly allowed, Engineer may also bill for any such Reimbursable Expenses incurred during the billing period.
 - (b) A remaining sum which equals one hundred percent (100%) of the total compensation payable under Section B-1, shall be billed after completion and submission of the construction drawings, specifications, cost estimates, and contract documents, and the acceptance of the same by OWNER.

SECTION D - ADDITIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES

In addition to the foregoing being performed, the following services may be provided UPON PRIOR WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION OF THE OWNER. FEES SHALL BE BILLED HOURLY PER ATTACHMENT 1.

- 1. Site surveys for water treatment plants, sewage treatment works, dams, reservoirs, and other similar special surveys as may be required.
- 2. Laboratory tests, well tests, borings, specialized geological, soils, hydraulic, or other studies recommended by the ENGINEER.
- 3. Property surveys, detailed description of sites, maps, drawings, or estimates related thereto; assistance in negotiating for land and easement rights.
- 4. Necessary data and filing maps for water rights, water adjudication, and litigation.
- 5. Redesigns ordered by the OWNER after final plans have been accepted by the OWNER, except redesigns to reduce the project cost to within the funds available.
- 6. Appearances before courts or boards on matters of litigation or hearings related to the project.
- 7. Preparation of environment impact assessments or environmental impact statements.
- 8. Performance of detailed staking necessary for construction of the project in excess of the control staking set forth in Section A-10.

Payment for the services specified in this Section D shall be as agreed in writing between the OWNER prior to commencement of the work. Barring unforeseen circumstances, such payment is estimated not to exceed \$5,000. The ENGINEER will render to OWNER for such services an itemized bill, separate from any other billing, once each month, for compensation for services performed hereunder during such period, the same to be due and payable by OWNER to the ENGINEER on or before the 10th day of the following period.

SECTION E - INTEREST ON UNPAID SUMS

If OWNER fails to make any payment due ENGINEER within 60 days for services and expenses and funds are available for the project then the ENGINEER shall be entitled to interest at the rate of ten (10) percent per annum from said 60th day, not to exceed an annual rate of 12 percent.

SUMMARY:	On October 24, 2019, the City received notice from Municipal Health Benefit Program that based on our claims, the medical rate class for Texarkana would move from Class 4 to Class 5 effective January 1, 2020. Prior to January 1, 2018, the City's rate class was a Class 2 and the City had not received an increase in insurance premiums in several years. On January 1, 2018, the City's medical rate class increased to a Class 3 and employee medical premiums increased from \$369 per month to \$405 per month. Due to the financial situation the City faced; the employee paid the \$36.00 per month increase in premium. On January 1, 2019, while the medical rate class did not change, the City received a \$2.08 per month increase in premium due to changes in the vision coverage. The City absorbed the cost of the increase at that time. On July 1, 2019, the City's medical rate class increased to a Class 4 and medical premiums increased from \$407.08 per month to \$447.58 per month. The City absorbed the cost of the increase. Beginning January 1, 2020, the City's rate class will increase to a Class 5 and employee medical premiums will increase by \$44.50 to \$492.08. This will result in an additional \$93,984 in expenditures for the General Fund, \$16,554.00 for the Public Works Fund, and \$7,476 for the Bi-State Fund. No appropriations will need to be made at this time as they will be included in the year end 2020 budget.




